Thai Enquirer Summary

Economic News

- The Bank of Thailand (BoT) voiced concern over the political vacuum at the Finance Ministry while seeing a clear recovery of the economy from the 2nd quarter of 2021, urging the government to accelerate fiscal disbursement for economic and social rehabilitation in a speedy mode.
 - ❖ Don Nakornthap, BoT's senior director of the economics and policy department, said the BoT expects the Thai economy to begin to recover in the 2nd quarter of 2021. However, he warned that the Thai economy will continue to contract in the 3rd and 4th quarter this year but not as bad as the 2nd quarter which saw the deepest contraction.
 - ❖ The BoT expects the Thai economy to contract around 8.5 per cent in the 3rd and 4th quarter and throughout the 1st quarter of next year, Don said. It expects the Thai economy to contract by 7.8 per cent for the entire year, warning that the prospect of another lockdown if a second wave of the COVID-19 outbreak hit the country could cause the economy to contract further.
 - ❖ Don said the country's economic situation rests with the government on the amount of disbursement budget and how fast the government can deploy fiscal

spending for the remaining months of this year and next year. The BoT expressed a particular concern about the finance minister's post that was left vacant by Predee Daochai, saying that the political vacuum at the finance ministry portfolio has brought several projects to come to a standstill, affecting the overall economic expansion.

- ❖ The BoT reported that the economy has shown signs of slight improvement in August, held up by lighter contraction in the value of merchandise export, manufacturing and private investment indicator.
- ❖ There are signs of recovery although the virus outbreak hit the export sector hard.
- Supattanapong Punmeechaow, Deputy Prime Minister and Energy Minister, said he will soon hold a meeting with representatives of the Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) about plans to set up some sort of funds to stabilise the domestic stock market and cushion it from the persistent high volatility, fluctuations and uncertainty.
 - ❖ Paiboon Nalinthrangkurn, Chairman of the Federation of Thai Capital Market Organizations (Fetco), disagreed with the idea, pointing that there are better ways to deal with the issue. Paiboon suggested measures like tax deduction privileges for long-term equity funds (LTFs) and Super Savings Funds (SSFs) to stabilise stock market volatility.
 - ❖ The Fetco chairman pointed that setting up a stabilisation fund requires a massive budget because the average trading value of equities in the Thai capital market is more than 60 billion baht per day. The set-up process is also complicated, Paiboon pointed.
- In yet another possible money spending spree, the government of Prayut has decided to undertake a 'study' of building a bridge connecting the east and west side of the Gulf of Thailand.

- ❖ The study is to connect the 80-100 kms gulf with a bridge that would link Chonburi on one side with Prachuab Kirikan or Petchburi on the other side (which is the west side that has the beach resort of Hua Hin).
- ❖ The project is slated to take 10-years to build and would cost 900 billion baht or more
- ❖ The statement was made by Pailin Chuchottaworn, the economic advisor to Prayut Chan-o-cha, came out to say that this was something that was being considered to revive the economic activities
 - He added that the bridge would be similar to those seen from Hong Kong to Macau.
- Embattled Prime Minister General Prayut Chan-o-cha will today (October 1) is scheduled to inspect the progress of investment in the Eastern Economic Corridor (EEC) and create confidence among EEC investors under a new normal.
 - ❖ Gen Prayut will also preside over the ceremony to receive the country's first monorail and will then meet with top executives of 16 industrial clusters invited by the Board of Investment (BoI). They include PTT Plc (PTT), Siam Cement Group (SCG), Amata Corporation, Mitsubishi Motors (Thailand), WHA Industrial Development, etc.
 - ❖ In the past 6 months (January-June), investment applications for the corridor rose 6 per cent year-on-year, totalling 225 projects in total, worth a combined 85.480 billion baht.
- The Association of Thai Travel Agents (Atta) plans to propose to the government an inbound tourism plan without a 14-day quarantine for tourists from low-risk countries free of virus cases for at least 60 days like China and Taiwan.

- ❖ Vichit Prakobgosol, president of Atta, said no inbound travellers want to visit the Kingdom if they are bound to be quarantine. Vichit said strict rules must be put in place to ensure that inbound travellers will not cause infections in the country.
 - ❖ Under the proposed scheme, Atta said tour operators would be responsible for accompanying tourists when visiting local destinations with measures in place to track tourist movement. Atta wants its proposed scheme to begin in December this year.
 - ❖ The number of tourists wanting entry to Thailand was growing to at least 100,000 per month, said the Atta president, adding that this will generate at least 5 billion baht in tourism revenue per month.
 - ❖ Tourism Council of Thailand President Chairat Trirattanajarasporn has come out to say that the number of tourists will depend on the reopening plan from the government, but the limited number of 1,200 tourists per month is inadequate to help the tourism industry recover.
 - ❖ The TCT is supporting a tourism plan without a quarantine from low-risk countries that have no new cases for at least 60 days.
 - ❖ The limited number of tourists will not heal the industry, which used to receive 10 million tourists each quarter, said Vichit.
 - In keeping with projections that the economy will take about three years to fully recover, Berli Jucker (BJC) has lowered its retail investment for the next three years.
 - ❖ Aswin Chareonvikul, chief executive of the SET-listed consumer goods maker and operator of Big C hypermarkets, said yearly spending for Big C Supercenter will be cut to 5 billion baht a year during 2021-23 from an average of 7 billion baht in previous years.

Political News

- Senators are showing a lack of enthusiasm to back a charter amendment call by embattled Prime Minister General Prayut Chan-o-cha who, reportedly, signalled coalition parties' leaders to be prepared to accept charter amendment bills.
 - ❖ Following reports that Gen Prayut yesterday (September 30) called a meeting prior to the cabinet meeting yesterday (September 30) with leaders of the coalition parties to ask them to accept the charter amendment bills proposed by the coalition and opposition parties, especially the bill to amend Section 256 of the charter to pave the way for the setting up of a constitutional drafting committee (CDC), now senators like Seree Suwannapanont and Somchai Sawaengkarn showed little support for the charter amendment bid.
 - ❖ Seree, a member of a tripartite panel charged with studying constitution amendment bills, told the press not to implicate the Prime Minister's opinion in the charter amendment issue. He said decision on charter amendments does not rest with the Prime Minister alone but all sides including MPs, the government, the opposition and 15 senators who represent the Senate in making a final decision.
 - ❖ Somchai said he supported amending Section 256 to pave the way for the CDC but disagreed that the CDC should be tasked with rewriting the entire charter, insisting that changing the whole charter requires a public referendum so citizens can decide what they want in a new charter or not. This kind of issue must be discussed before the panel.
- Still on the charter amendment bid, Paiboon Nititawan, a deputy leader and list MP of the Phalang Pracharat Party (PPRP), as deputy chairman of the panel charged with studying constitution amendment bills, said the panel plans to invite owners of the 6 amendment drafts to give opinions.

- ❖ Paiboon said the panel would not invite representatives of the Internet Law Reform Dialogue (iLaw), a human rights NGO, even though the group submitted signatures from 50,000 voters to sponsor a charter rewrite as he reasoned that iLaw's amendment draft has yet to be put in the House's agenda meeting.
- ❖ As for the Prime Minister's call for all coalition parties to accept charter amendment bills, Paiboon said the charter amendment issue has nothing to do with Gen Prayut. The matter is up to the parliament to decide because the cabinet was not the party that propose the amendment bills to the parliament. Nevertheless, it is likely that all members of the panel will vote to accept the drafts, Paiboon said.
- ❖ Paiboon even said that a referendum would be needed if there was a proposal to amend the entire constitution. If so, a study should first be held on whether to stage the referendum, he suggested.
- ❖ Paiboon insisted the possibility of a referendum also needed to be considered.
- The opposition Pheu Thai Party's general assembly is scheduled at 09:00 hrs today (October 1) to select new party leader and executive committee members. The general assembly is expected to see Sompong Amornwiwat be reinstated as party leader but it is Khunying Potjaman na Pombejra, ex-wife of fugitive former prime minister Thaksin Shinawatra, who will be taking the party's helm.
 - ❖ Pheu Thai will slash the number of deputy leaders by more than 50% from 15 in the previous line-up to 7-- but all factions would still be represented. The number of executive committee members will also be reduced from 29 to 20-24 members who will be recruited from all factions within the party across all regions.
 - ❖ Prasert Chanruagthong, an MP for Nakhon Ratchasima, is tipped as the party's new secretary-general, replacing Anudit Nakornthap, a source with the party said.

- ❖ Arunee Kasayanond will replace Anusorn Iamsa-ard as the new spokeswoman, according to the source.
- ❖ Reports have come out that a major shakeup of the party's executive committee under Potjaman's close supervision and her new team. The revamp is to help the party prepare for a future general election or a political incident. Potjaman is expected to come into the picture to consolidate her power as Pheu Thai's de facto leader and bring in her close associates who will be appointed a new team comprising high-calibre politicians such as former Pheu Thai secretary-general Phumtham Wechayachai, Prommin Lertsuridej and Surapong Suebwoonglee, both of whom were former executives of the now-defunct Thai Rak Thai Party (TRT).
- ❖ It is said that Pheu Thai will have an economic team led by another former key TRT figure, Pongsak Ruktapongpisal, and Pichai Nariphaphan, a former energy minister during the Yingluck Shinawatra administration.
- ❖ New-generation politicians expected to join the executive include Chakkrapol Tangsuthitham, a Pheu Thai MP for Chiang Mai, and Nop Cheevanant, an Ayutthaya MP.
- On local elections, the Interior Minister and Interior permanent secretary are scheduled to meet with the Election Commission (EC)'s secretary-general and EC executives at 14.30 hrs today (October 1) to discuss the prospect of local elections, says EC secretary-general Jarungvith Phumma.
 - ❖ The Provincial Administrative Organisation (PAO) elections is expected to be held first as the EC has finished the demarcation of constituencies in the provincial administrative organisations in all provinces, the EC secretary-general said.

- When asked about Pheu Thai candidate Surapol Kietchaiyakorn whose poll-fraud case was dropped after the Supreme Court’s Election Division ruled in his favour due to insufficient evidence to prove that he had breached the election law by giving 2,000 baht and a clock to a monk, Jarungvith said the EC would unlikely reinstate Surapol as an MP as the election outcome declared by the EC is deemed final.
- Students and teachers at Triam Udom Suksa School donned black in protest against school director Sophon Kamon yesterday (September 30) following transfers of 7 teachers who expressed differing views.
 - ❖ The rally against the school director was led by the “TUP Democracy Group” and attended by a large number of students and teachers.
 - ❖ Sophon, however, defended the transfer of 7 teachers as he said they were transferred because large number of teachers were due for mandatory retirement and some of them were embroiled in corruption allegations during 2016-2018.
 - ❖ The TUP Democracy Group plans to hold a rally at the school ground at 16.00 hrs today (October 1) to encourage students to express political views. The planned rally prompted the school management to close the school and the school will provide online learning instead. The school management said it did not try to stop students from expressing political views but it did not want students to touch on the Monarchy.



- The ‘Bad Students’ are going to hold an event on October 2, 2020 from 13:00 to head to the Ministry of Education to try to kick out the Education Minister
 - ❖ Some of the schools have ordered the schools to be shut as the students are looking to undertake activities.
- The students will hold a major rally once again on October 14th
 - ❖ Parit (Penguin) said that it will be a bigger gathering, but will it be 7-days and nights event, that will be decided during that particular day or time.



- ❖ **➤ The planned route of the students and the time they will go to each school tomorrow before heading to their final destination at the Ministry of Education.**

- The House environment committee looking into allegations whether the Sri Panwa Luxury Pool Villa Hotel may have encroached on forest land came out to say that evidence pointed that the owner of Sri Panwa Phuket resort has legal title to the land.
 - ❖ Committee chairman and opposition Move Forward Party MP Apichart Sirisunthorn said his committee met with representatives from relevant agencies including the Department of Land, Interior Ministry, Royal Forest Department and Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment officials, as well as the Phuket governor.

- ❖ Governor Narong Wunsiew told the committee that provincial land office documents confirmed the resort on the island was on land legally acquired with land title deeds and Nor Sor 3 land ownership documents.
 - ❖ Nisit Jansomwong, director-general of the Department of Lands, said he found no irregularities related to land transactions by the owner of the hotel. Nisit insisted that the resort owner acquired all land plots from locals. The land is not located in a forest reserve or the areas designated as state land or national parks.
 - ❖ The Sri Panwa Phuket Hotel is built on 50 rai of land held under Nor Sam 3 documents, and another 6 rai with standard land title deeds.

- Thailand logged 5 new COVID-19 cases in the past 24 hours, including 1 Thai soldier returning from South Sudan and another Thai arriving from Kuwait who had been infected by the virus before, according to the Centre for COVID-19 Situation Administration (CCSA).
 - ❖ The other 3 new infections are 2 Thais and 1 Indian.
 - ❖ A 31-year-old Indian man arrived on September 23 from India and entered hotel quarantine in Chon Buri. He tested positive 5 days later and was admitted to a hospital in Chon Buri.
 - ❖ The other 2 Thai returnees from India, aged 26 and 64, arrived on September 25 and tested positive 3 days later. Asymptomatic cases, they were admitted to a hospital in Samut Prakan.

- ❖ Cumulative infections in Thailand, to date, are 3,564. The death toll remains 59 and 131 others are still being treated in hospital.
 - Sarasas Witaed Ratchaphruek School has agreed to pay compensation to children and parents affected by teacher abuse.
 - ❖ At the Ministry of Education, Deputy Education Minister Kanokwan Vilawan, her adviser Kamol Rodkhilai, and secretary-general of the Office of the Private Education Commission Attapon Truektrong yesterday met the school's representative to discuss abuses against kindergarten students by the school's education personnel.
