Thai Enquirer Summary

Political News

- At least 41 people were injured following scuffles between police, anti-government protesters and royalist groups outside the parliament yesterday.
 - ❖ Police reportedly used tear gas solution and water cannon against pro-democracy protesters outside the parliament.
 - ❖ Protesters protected themselves with inflatable rubber ducks which they had planned to float along the river behind parliament whilst inside MPs discussed reform.
 - ❖ Out of the 41 at least 12 people injured suffered from tear gas and 5 people had gunshot wounds, according to the Erawan Medical Centre of the Bangkok Metropolitan Administration.
 - ❖ Police fired water cannon and tear gas at protesters who cut through razor-wire barricades and removed concrete barriers outside parliament. Deputy Metropolitan Police Bureau (MBB) chief Pol Maj Gen Piya Tawichai came out to defend police action, saying they followed universal standards on crowd control. He denied that they had opened fire with live ammunition or rubber bullets, and said they were investigating who might have used firearms.

- ❖ Apart from a confrontation between police and pro-democracy demonstrators, there was also a fight between pro-democracy protesters and a group of royalists without any intervention from riot police.
- Social media users questioned the police's use of high-pressured water cannons at the crowd that contained a purple chemical claimed to irritate and burn the skin and make protesters' eyes sting.
 - ❖ Student activist Parit "Penguin" Chiwarak announced to end rally at 21.00 hrs. "I hereby announce the escalation of the protests. We will not give in. There will be no compromise," he told the crowd at the gates of parliament before protesters dispersed.
- Social media and also the leaders of the anti-government questioned the double standard used by the police during the protest yesterday.
 - ❖ Yellow shirt or the pro-monarchy group were allowed to enter and move around the area without any action from the police while those who were pro-democracy were bombarded with tear gas and water cannons.
 - The contrast - Yellow shirt were allowed while tear gas used for pro-democracy protestors



- The situation was worse as many people in the area were impacted from the crackdown by the police and the violence that preceded it.

- ❖ Many bystanders and local were injured with the youngest being in elementary school who was on his way back to his house.



- The student movement have said that they are not going to give up and while the parliament debates on the issue today before they vote on the various versions of the amendment that they plan to undertake, the Khana Ratsadorn has announced a gathering of its supporters today @ 16:00 hrs @ Ratchaprasong junction.
 - ❖ Anon Nampa, the human rights lawyers and one of the key leaders of the movement came out to make the announcement last night after they managed to get their way to near the parliament.
 - ❖ Anon came out to say
 - “No more compromises after what happened today”
 - “From here on we will not talk to the dogs but will only talk to the owners of the dog”
- The biggest loser among the political parties from yesterday’s fiasco was the Pheu Thai and Bhumjai Thai party.
 - ❖ The Pheu Thai party’s key leader – Somphong Amornvivat, was seen taking a speed boat out of the parliament as soon as violence broke out, only to return to the parliament after social media blasted him for running away from what was happening inside and outside the parliament.
 - ❖ Another politician Wan Ubumrung came out to run away as well and to go on social media to say that ‘even if I went to stop the police, the police would not stop’

- ❖ Another party that lost out was Bhumjai Thai party, whose key leader Supachai Chaisamut, came out to say ‘outside there is a warm up happening for the planned holiday that is slated to happen on 19th as a lieu day for the Songkran break.’
 - Social media blasted him for his insensitivity to the feelings of the people who were outside and instead was joking on their pain.

- ❖ Social media went on top gear to blast the Pheu Thai and compared the party to Move Forward which saw many of its MPs come out to support the student and also its leader Pita Limjaroenrat being in the middle of the tear gas being fired by the police.

- Progressive Movement leader Thanathorn Juangroongruangkit later posted a message, “This is not a compromise. #Mob 17 November” in the wake of violent clashes between riot police and pro-democracy protesters yesterday evening.

- Inside the parliament, the Internet Dialogue on Law Reform (iLaw)’s director Jon Ungphakorn admitted during the House’s deliberation of 7 charter amendment bills that iLaw accepted money from foreign organisations but denied that they wield influence over iLaw’s operations.

- ❖ Jon who attended the House's deliberation on charter amendment bills told the sitting that his organisation accepted foreign funding but said the donors do not have any influence over the organization and 100,000 people who signed their names to support the iLaw draft.
- ❖ Following Jon's admission, deputy leader of the Phalang Pracharat Party Paiboon Nititawan asked fellow MPs who want to protect the monarchy to reject iLaw, claiming that it is unconstitutional because the organization accepts financial support from foreign sources and, hence, cannot get involved in political activities.
- ❖ Senator Seri Suwanpanont also questioned the iLaw representative. Seri expressed concerns over 11 key points in the iLaw draft. He said all of them concern Thai security such as the proposed scrapping of the 20-year national strategy, the proposed dissolution of the Constitutional Court, the National Human Rights Commission and the National Anti-Corruption Commission.
- ❖ PPRP MP for Bangkok Koranit Ngamsukhonrattana slammed the iLaw draft and accused iLaw and the Khana Ratsadon group of having direct and indirect connections as they both demand the monarchy reform.
 - She said the iLaw draft was design to thwrat the country's key pillars. She also accused iLaw of accepting funding from billionaire financier George Soros who made large profits betting against the Thai baht in early 1997 before the Tom Yum Kung or Asian financial crisis and was accused of being responsible for the 1997 Asian financial crisis.
 - Koranit said although iLaw did not break the law by accepting funding from foreign sources but the organisation campaigned for political activities against the government in support of the monarchy reform. She also said the group's charter amendment bills was designed to allow foreign entities to meddle in the Thai constitution.

- Meanwhile, a report said embattled Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha held a closed-door meeting with the 2 generals, his deputy Gen Prawit Wongsuwan and Interior Minister Gen Anupong Paojinda around 13.20 hrs after the cabinet meeting.
 - ❖ During the cabinet meeting at Santimaitri building, the Prime Minister instructed officials to play a list of patriotic songs such as “Prao Ther Kua Prathet” (Because you are the country) which he composed since he headed the National Council for Peace and Order (NCPO). Gen Prayut is said to have re-composed to include messages like Please do not fight. I want all Thais to reunited and love one another the same. We are ready to walk together. We shall not fight, not divide and not complete” in the lyrics.
- Thought that police were supposed to bust drugs?
 - ❖ Well at yesterday’s protest a police officer from Bukkhlo police station’s vehicle had all it takes to get ‘high’. Protesters while were moving forward and the police officers retreated saw drug ‘ICE’ in the police officer’s vehicle while there to control the crowd.



Economic News

- The Federation of Thai Industries (FTI) came out to express serious concerns about the baht's appreciation and its impact on the export sector, which covers farm produce, food and consumer products.
 - ❖ It called on the government to manage the baht's value and its exchange rates in order to help local industries struggling to deal with the pandemic's impact.
 - ❖ FTI chairman Supant Mongkolsuthree said the baht's value has been getting stronger rapidly since early this year, rising from 33 baht to 30 baht per US dollar. The recent baht rise hurt businesses and Thai entrepreneurs' competitiveness in global markets, Supant said, demanding the Bank of Thailand to look into the exchange rate.
- Thailand's Industries Sentiment Index (TISI) improved for the 6th consecutive month to 86 points in October from 85.2 in September, buoyed by stronger domestic demand that supports a recovery of the manufacturing sector, according to Federation of Thai Industries (FTI) chairman Supant Mongkolsuthree.
 - ❖ Meanwhile, the country is expected to produce 1.42 million cars this year, exceeding the target by 20,000 units, according to the FTI's Automotive Industry Club.
 - ❖ Production for domestic sales is also set to meet the target of 700,000 and climb as high as 720,000, said club vice president and spokesman Surapong Pisitpattanapong.
 - ❖ Production for exports is also expected to meet the 700,000 target, as long as there is no severe 2nd wave of the outbreak in Europe.
 - ❖ Total production in October was 149,360 units, down only 2.24 per cent year on year.

- ❖ Production for domestic sales, which accounts for more than half of total production, rose 18.81 per cent year on year to 82,157. The figure reflects growth for 2 consecutive months.
- ❖ Surapong attributed the high sales to Thailand's success in curbing the Covid-19 pandemic, resulting in a speedy economic recovery.
- The Public Debt Management Office (PDMO) is preparing to issue 50-billion-baht savings bonds early next year to fund the government's fiscal stimulus incentives.
 - ❖ The plan to issue government savings bonds under the fiscal 2021 budget is capped at no more than 100 billion baht, said Patricia Mongkhonvanit, the PDMO's director-general.
 - ❖ The 50-billion-baht savings bonds are the first batch of issuance.
 - ❖ The issuance of government savings bonds, however, will have to be assessed in accordance with the government's financial needs, she said.
- Srisawad Corporation Plc (SAWAD) agreed on a deal with the Government Savings Bank (GSB) in forming a joint investment in SAWAD's wholly owned subsidiary, in order to operate the business of auto title loans, according to a source with the Finance Ministry.
 - ❖ The GSB's board of directors yesterday approved the bank's plan to operate a vehicle title loan business by entering into a joint venture with SAWAD's subsidiary.
 - ❖ SAWAD board of directors are said to approve in principle a joint investment transaction. The approval enabled GSB to hold a 49 per cent stake, valued at 1.5 billion baht in this new joint investment along with Noble Development Plc (NOBLE) that also holds a stake in SWP Asset Management Co., Ltd., which offers personal loans made against all kinds of vehicles.

- ❖ The bank will allocate a 1.5-billion-baht investment sum to purchase shares of a vehicle title loan company in a bid to lower loan interest in this loan segment through market forces.
- After cutting the number of new launches this year to 13 projects, SET-listed developer Pruksa Holding (PSH) aims to resume revenue growth next year by launching 30-35 new sites worth a combined 30 billion baht.
 - ❖ Piya Prayong, chief executive officer of Pruksa Real Estate, a PSH subsidiary, said one of the new projects will be a condo worth 2-3 billion baht in the middle-end segment, a joint venture with a Japanese developer.
 - ❖ "The joint venture will help us diversify financial risk," he said yesterday. "We will ink the deal in the first quarter next year after having postponed from this year due to the pandemic."
 - ❖ He said the impact of the pandemic on the residential market was very huge, with a year-on-year fall of 31% in presales to 209 billion baht in the first nine months.
- Although the Centre for Covid-19 Situation Administration (CCAS) has come out to say that they will not lower the number of days for the quarantine to 10-days from 14-nights (15-days), the hotel industry is pushing for the government to cut quarantine period to facilitate the speeding up of the reopening of the country for tourists along with calls for financial assistance to offset the shortfall of foreign tourists before they collapse while the government is voicing readiness to set aside a budget of 50-100 billion baht to set up a relief funds for private operators and SMEs in the tourism sector.
 - ❖ Supawan Tanomkieatipume, president of the Thai Hotels Association (THA), made a plea for help from the government. The Association wants the government to speed up the opening process for tourists, warning that the hotel industry will collapse if the country cannot reopen within 6-10 months. She asked the government to study the case of Singapore in which its

government allowed tourists from Hong Kong to enter the country without quarantine.

- ❖ Suphajee Suthumpun, group chief executive of Dusit International, called for financial measures for operators to help protect the industry and maintain jobs while the country is awaiting reopening mechanisms. She suggested the government prepare facilities for tourists by connecting vaccine certification with electronic visas to restart tourism once the vaccine is available.
- ❖ Chaiyapat Paitoon, chief strategy officer at Minor International Plc (MINT) urged the government to settle a travel bubble agreement with potential markets such as China and consider cutting the quarantine period or relaxing more rules for inbound visitors.
- ❖ Tourism and Sports Minister Phiphat Ratchakitprakarn said he will gather hotel operators' suggestions and discuss them with the Public Health Ministry, the Finance Ministry and Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha. Phiphat said Gen Prayut has instructed him to proceed with the idea of a relief fund for the industry with the budget between 50-10 billion baht.

General News

- Thailand logged 3 new COVID-19 cases; all foreigners who flew into Thailand from overseas, taking the accumulated total to 3,878 yesterday, according to the Centre for Covid-19 Situation Administration (CCSA).
 - ❖ One of the new cases is an Indian man, 20, who worked as a crew member on a cargo ship. He arrived on November 8 after sailing from the Philippines.
 - ❖ The other 2 cases are male British nationals who arrived via connecting flights from Dubai. One of the men, aged 51, arrived on Nov 9 and tested positive on

day 5. The other man, a 70-year-old, flew into Thailand on Nov 15 and tested positive on arrival. All 3 new cases were asymptomatic.

- ❖ Of the 3,878 total cases, 3,724 have recovered. The death toll remained at 60.
- The cabinet on Tuesday gave permission for the Public Health Ministry to pay six billion baht and reserve 26 million doses of Covid-19 vaccine from AstraZeneca.
 - ❖ Government spokesman Anucha Burapachaisri said the money would come from its emergency budget reserved for the procurement of the vaccine now being tested by the large British biopharmaceutical company.
 - ❖ AstraZeneca is among a few companies -- the others are Pfizer and Moderna -- to have reportedly achieved strong efficacy for their Covid-19 vaccine projects.
- The cabinet yesterday approved legislation on the planned legalization of abortion with women who may have been pregnant for or less than 12 weeks.
 - ❖ The legislation is yet to pass approval from parliament to become law, effective from February next year, according to deputy government spokeswoman Ratchada Thanadirek.
 - ❖ Those who may have been pregnant for more than 12 weeks and have undergone abortion would be subject to a maximum of 6 months in prison or a maximum fine of 10,000 baht, she said.

- November 26-27, 2020 – The Thai Chamber of Commerce plans the 38th annual meeting of the nationwide chambers of commerce to design a “white cover” book to present to Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha.
- December 2020 – The Federation of Thai Industries (FTI)’s “Faster Payment” scheme to increase liquidity for small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) during the pandemic is set to end.
- December 2, 2020 – The Constitutional Court is set to rule on the status of Prime Minister General Prayut Chan-o-cha PM for his prolonged stay in an army house since retirement.
- December 20, 2020 – Tentative date for elections of Provincial Administrative Organizations (PAOs) in 76 provinces.
- December 30, 2020 - The Generalized System of Preferences (GSP) for 3,500 products from the 119 designated beneficiary countries and territories are set to end.
- February 28, 2021 – Tentative date for municipality elections and the election of tambon administrative organizations (TAOs).
- April, 2021 – The central bank plans to officially implement the new rule on the rate of penalty imposed on loan defaulters in a bid to ease borrowers’ burdens and motivate them to repay their debts.
