Thai Enquirer Summary

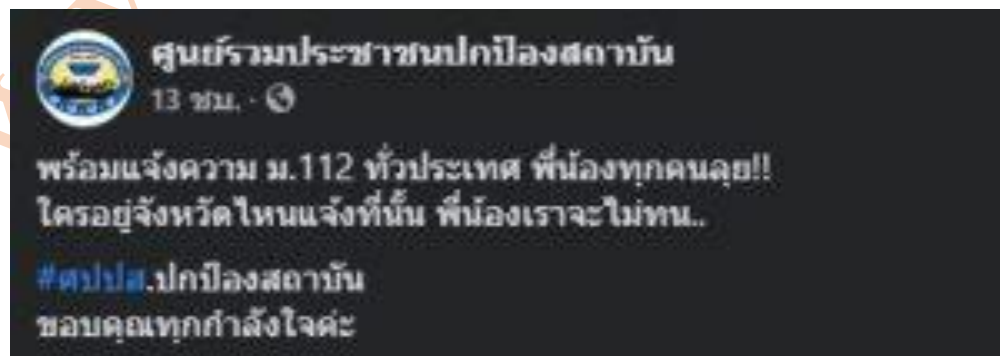
Political News

- Embattled Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha came out to dismiss a rumour of an imminent military coup d'état as a ploy to mobilise support for their planned rally outside the office of the Crown Property Bureau on November 25.
 - ❖ Gen Prayut's comment came after pro-democracy activist Parit "Penguin" Chiwarak and other protest leaders have been coming out to openly say that they can 'smell' a coup in the making.
 - ❖ Gen Prayut also denied the possibility of the invocation of a martial law in response to rampant speculation over an imminent coup.
 - ❖ A source with security agencies also reaffirmed Gen Prayut's dismissal of coup rumours, saying that the pro-democracy protest leader's claim is illogical. There is no reason whatsoever for the army to step in.
- Ahead of the pro-democracy demonstration outside the Crown Property Bureau, the prime minister also gave a stern warning that he would not allow a clash between the 2 groups and said legal action will be taken on both sides if they turn violent.

- ❖ Meanwhile, police are ramping up security at the Bureau.
 - The Metropolitan Police Bureau (MPB) has dispatched 10 companies of police officers to guard the Bureau to maintain peace & order.
 - MPB chief Pol Lt-Gen Pakkapong Pongpetra warned Khana Ratsadon group to abide by the law when they stage their protest at the office of the Crown Property Bureau. He suggested the Khana Ratsadon group not venture within 150 metres of the Crown Property Bureau.
- ❖ As for the leaked classified document claimed to be sent by the Ministry of Interior to provincial governors nationwide to block the masses from entering the capital during November 23-25, Interior Minister Gen Anupong Paojinda denied that the ministry issued any instructions. He said there is no need for the ministry to do so because it is all agencies' responsibility to carry out their duties as required by their roles to keep peace and order.
 - Although the document was confirmed to be genuine by the MPB
- ❖ At the same time barb wires have been installed on top of the walls of the Crown Property Bureau and a warning sign that says, "Palace Grounds" meaning the place is off-limits.



- Despite Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha's stern warning that he will not put up with a return of mob violence, the "Khana Phalang Pandin Siam (People's Power of the Land of Siam)" vowed to hold rallies to protect the monarchy.
 - ❖ Bancha Panniwat, leader of the People's Power of the Land of Siam, issued an ultimatum that his group will not let anyone offend the royal institution any longer. Bancha said his group will hold an overnight rally from 15:00 hrs today through 8:00 hrs tomorrow along a stretch of Khlong Phadung Krung Kasem canal to protect the monarchy in the wake of the Khana Ratsadon-led rally outside the Crown Property Bureau.
 - ❖ Bancha said the Khana Ratsadon group is free to hold rallies anywhere but it must not encroach on palace properties. Rallying at the Crown Property Bureau, which is deemed inappropriate. Bancha said his group does not condone any kind of violence and bloodshed.
- Meanwhile, the "People's Network for Protection of the Monarchy" pledged to file complaints with police against those who violate Section 112 across the country.
 - ❖ The group rallies public support for its move, telling all Thais to file complaints with police in their provinces.



- Police are said to speed up the process to bring fresh charges of lese majeste against protest leaders and protesters under Section 112 of the Criminal Code.

- ❖ Assistant national police chief Pol Lt Gen Jaruwat Waisaya will call a meeting with police investigators in charge of all cases connected with pro-democracy protests in order to bring additional charges under Section 112 against protesters. The Royal Thai Police Office also set up an investigation panel tasked with protesters who violated Section 112.
- ❖ The panel is headed by Pol Maj Gen Sukhun Prommayon, deputy chief of the Metropolitan Police Bureau (MPB). Many of the protest leaders who will be charged with violations of the lese majeste law have been charged with inciting unrest or sedition under Section 116 of the Criminal Code.
- Progressive Movement leader Thanathorn Juangroongruangkit will today report in to Thung Song Hong police to acknowledge a criminal charge filed by the Election Commission (EC) against him for applying to be an MP candidate knowing he was not qualified under Section 151 of the 2018 MP Election Act.
 - ❖ Thanathorn, the ex-leader of the disbanded Future Forward Party, may face a jail term up to 10 years and a 20-year ban from politics over his media shareholding in V-Luck Media Co Ltd after the EC decided to pursue criminal charges against him.
- On charter amendment bids, the 45-member extraordinary committee in charge of scrutinising the charter amendment drafts before their 2nd and 3rd readings is set for its first meeting to pick its chairman.
 - ❖ Phalang Pracharat Party (PPRP)-list MP and government chief whip Virat Ratanasate is expected to win the nomination for the chairman's post, Chinnaworn Boonyakiat, deputy government chief whip, said.
 - ❖ The committee Chinnaworn said the meeting will also discuss 4 issues including

- The composition of a new charter drafting assembly (CDA)
 - Whether the charter drafters should be given 120 or 240 days to finish the drafting process
 - How to amend the charter without affecting Chapters 1 and 2 on the monarchy
 - The election of CDA.

- ❖ The opposition Pheu Thai Party is planning to propose to the committee to cut the extraordinary committee in charge of scrutinising the charter amendment drafts before their 2nd and 3rd to less than 45 days. The party wants the formation of a CDA be placed on parliament's agenda for consideration in the 3 reading.
 - ❖ Pheu Thai will put forward these proposals to the extraordinary committee.
 - ❖ The party also proposed the election of CDA members. The CDA must be 100 per cent elected, according to Pheu Thai secretary-general Prasert Chantararuangthong.
 - ❖ The party also asked Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha to keep his word given to the public that the charter amendment process should be completed by December this year.
 - ❖ Meanwhile, Deputy Prime Minister Jurin Laksanawisit, as the Democrat Party leader, said he would call a meeting with party MPs who broke the party's resolution for accepting charter amendment bills today.

- Public Health Minister – Anutin Charnvirakul, whose gaffe during the outbreak of the Covid-19 virus made him the laughing stock of the Thai cabinet, has now come out to

outright deny that he is the possible candidate to be the next Prime Minister of the country after December 2, 2020.

- ❖ The name of Anuthin was popped as a Prime Minister in waiting by Red Shirt leader – Jatuporn Promphan, who came out to say that on December 2, 2020 there is a very high chance that Gen Prayut could be hung high and dry by the Constitutional Court when the court is set to rule on his continued occupation of the army housing that was allocated to him when he was the army chief but had to vacate it after he left the position in 2014.
 - The Election Commission (EC) has launched a new app called “Smart Vote” for voters to report poll code violations and E-war room to facilitate the provincial administration organisation (PAO) elections scheduled for December 20.
 - ❖ The EC has so far received 21 complaints related to PAO chairmen and council members in 11 provinces while 120 candidates were found to lack qualifications in running in the PAO elections as most of them failed to exercise their voting rights in the 2019 general election.
 - The cabinet yesterday approved a 45-day extension of the state of emergency from December 1 to January 15 next year, its 8th extension as proposed by the Centre for COVID-19 Situation Administration (CCSA)’s proposal in an effort to keep infections under control during the New Year holidays, government spokesperson Anucha Burapachaisri said.

- Thailand's exports in October shrank 6.71 per cent to US\$19.376 billion while imports fell 14.32 per cent to \$17.33 billion. This led to a trade surplus of \$2.046 billion, according to the Commerce Ministry's Trade Policy and Strategy Office (TPSO).
 - ❖ Thailand's exports contracted 7.26 per cent to \$192.372 billion while imports dropped 14.61 per cent to \$169.702 billion in the first 10 months of this year, resulting in a trade surplus of \$22.670 billion.
 - ❖ TPSO director-general Pimchanok Vonkorporon said exports of Thai goods saw better-than-expected growth than forecast as Thailand's international trade had improved as global economy was gradually recovering as reflected by Global Manufacturing Purchasing Managers' Index which stood at above 50 for the 4th consecutive month.
 - ❖ The ministry maintains full-year view of 7 per cent export decline given that the country must fetch \$18.329 billion a month in the remaining 2 months of the year. Overall exports are likely to see a contraction of less than 7 per cent if the value of exports in the remaining months of the year reaches 19 billion baht, Pimchanok said, adding that she was optimistic that Thailand's exports would continue its recovery trend as the United States' unofficial election results and COVID-19 vaccine development sent a positive signal on world trade.
- The Finance Ministry said it is planning to extend the 2nd phase of the co-payment scheme, to cover as many people as possible and the extension of an additional 500-baht cash subsidy benefit under the 1st phase co-payment scheme for state welfare cardholders' credit line as New Year gifts to the public.
 - ❖ The co-payment scheme is a program in which the government subsidises 50 per cent of food and goods purchased at small shops.
 - ❖ The Ministry is also looking for a New Year gift for the Student Loan Fund (SLF)'s debtors with good payment records.

- The Finance Ministry said it expects the Thai economy to grow 4 per cent in 2021 after a slump this year and fiscal policy will support a tourism-reliant economy struggling from the impacts of the coronavirus pandemic.
 - ❖ The economy had bottomed but recovery was not fast as the battered tourism sector, which accounts for about 12 per cent of gross domestic product (GDP), has also hurt supply chains, Finance minister Arkhom Termpittayapaisith said.
 - “Without the COVID, our economy could have expanded 3 per cent this year, he said. “As we expect a 6 per cent contraction this year, there is the output gap of 9 per cent,” he told a business forum.
 - “Next year, we expect 4 per cent growth, which is still not 100 per cent yet,” Arkhom said, adding it could take until 2022 to return to pre-pandemic levels.
 - ❖ There is still fiscal policy room to help growth from this year’s fiscal budget and some from rehabilitation spending. Arkhom said the government can take out an additional loan of 980 billion baht as there is still 30 per cent fiscal space left.
- The cabinet yesterday approved projects worth up to 152 billion baht earmarked for reviving the economy in the fallout of COVID-19 outbreak, government spokesman Anucha Burapachaisri said.
 - ❖ Of this amount, 16.46 billion baht will be spent on creating jobs and upskilling or reskilling workers, much like the Labour Ministry’s project of supporting the recruitment of new graduates. Another 45 billion baht will be set aside for projects aiming to strengthen grassroots economy, while 30 billion baht will be spent on stimulating local consumption. The remainder will be poured into infrastructure development, says Anucha.

- ❖ This spending is expected to boost the gross domestic product by 0.2 per cent this year and 0.25 per cent next year. It is also expected to maintain or create 310,000 new jobs, upskill 160,000 workers, generate revenue for some 100,000 vendors and inject an additional 60 billion baht into the economy.
- Sathien Setthasit, founder and chief executive officer of Carabao Group Plc (CBG), the maker of Carabao Dang energy drink, announced the readiness to list CJ Express Group on the Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) in 2022.
 - ❖ Sathien expects CJ Express Group to generate sales revenue of 17 billion baht in 2020, with a profit of more than 900 million baht. The company currently operates 530 CJ Supermarket stores located across the country, with the plan to add the number of stores to 580 by the end of this year.
 - ❖ Sathien said he had plans to revamp retail TD Tawandang's stores under a new convenience store format. TD Tawandang's stores cover an area of 50-100 square metres. There are now 200 TD Tawandang branches mainly in central provinces. It is estimated that there will be 300 outlets in operation by the end of 2020. The company aims to have 5,000 outlets by the end of 2021 and 10,000 outlets operating by the end of 2022 and 30,000 outlets within the next 5-6 years.
- PTT Plc (PTT) set aside a 5-year capital spending budget of 1 trillion baht (2020-24) for investments in 2 core businesses, according to Chief Financial Officer Pannalin Mahawongtikul. The 2 businesses are:
 - ❖ New investments in energy businesses including renewable energy and electricity business to accommodate Thailand's electrical vehicle (EV) market.
 - ❖ New Business investments in the healthcare industry, development of a medicine factory, the dietary supplementary business and medical equipment.

- The Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) Index rallied above 1,400 points yesterday as the market closed at 1,420.43 points, up 31.09 points or 2.24 per cent with a trading value of 105.036 billion baht, driven by the foreign fund inflow and news of successful development of 2 Covid-19 vaccines.
 - ❖ The surge is in line with global markets' uptrend, the sudden 100-point spike may result in a correction.
 - ❖ Foreign flow totalling 948 million baht moved to the bond market yesterday after a sharp turn with net sell offs worth 9.52 billion baht on the last 2 trading days stimulated by the Bank of Thailand's launch of measures to boost local purchase of foreign currencies.
 - ❖ Deputy Prime Minister and Energy Minister Supattanapong Punmeechaow yesterday said the market was buoyed by Standard & Poor (S&P)'s decision to keep Thailand's sovereign credit rating at BBB+. Improvement in the domestic political situation had also boosted the SET, Supattanapong added. Investors would gain more confidence if the turmoil ends peacefully, he said.

- Oxford University and AstraZeneca announced that Oxford/AstraZeneca vaccine is 70 per cent effective following positive results from trials of a new Covid-19 vaccine – the 3rd in as many weeks.
 - ❖ Although less than the 90 percent plus effectiveness of the other two vaccines developed by Pfizer and Moderna but the vaccine is cheap to produce.
- Thailand logged 7 new cases over a 24-hour period, according to the Centre for Covid-19 Situation Administration (CCSA)'s report yesterday.

- ❖ The new cases are a 58-year-old Thai woman returned from Germany on November 7 and tested positive on November 18 in an alternative state quarantine hotel in Bangkok.
 - ❖ A 30-year-old Thai female office employee who returned from Denmark on November 6 tested positive on November 20 in a state quarantine facility in Chonburi.
 - ❖ A 67-year-old Thai woman who returned from the United States on November 14 tested positive on November 18 in a Bangkok state quarantine hotel.
 - ❖ A 43-year-old Thai male chief who returned from the United Kingdom on November 16 tested positive on November 21 in a Bangkok state quarantine hotel.
 - ❖ A 43-year-old Thai female office employee, who had returned from Kosovo on November 16, tested positive on November 21 in a state quarantine facility in Chonburi.
 - ❖ A 45-year-old Thai woman who returned from Qatar on November 17 tested positive on November 20 in a state quarantine facility in Chonburi.
 - ❖ A 17-year-old Syrian boy arrived on November 8 and tested positive on November 20 in an alternative state quarantine facility in Bangkok with fever, sore throat and headache. The boy said his symptoms started from November 13.
 - ❖ To date, Thailand has recorded 3,920 COVID-19 cases with 60 fatalities.
- Atchariya Ruangrattanapong, chairman of the Crime Victims Assistance Club, on Monday filed a complaint with Anti-Corruption Division (ACD) police against Justice Minister Somsak Thepsuthin and Office of the Narcotics Control Board (ONCB) secretary-general Wichai Chaimongkol, accusing them of giving false information to the public over the seizure of 11.5 tonnes of ketamine from a warehouse in Chachoengsao province on Nov 12.

- ❖ The complaint was accepted by Pol Capt Ratchapol Tiamsakhu, an investigator from the 2nd Sub-Division of the ACD.
- ❖ Mr Atchariya alleged that Mr Somsak and Mr Wichai had committed malfeasance in violation of Section 157 of the Criminal Code. He attached to the complaint video clips and news reports of a press conference on the seizure of ketamine.
- ❖ After the seizure, sacks of what was said to be ketamine were transported from the warehouse in Chachoengsao to be stored at the ONCB Region 1 in Pathum Thani's Lat Lumkaew district.
- City Hall is to replace petrol-powered passenger boats on Padung Krungkasem with electric vessels this week.
 - ❖ Bangkok governor Aswin Kwanmuang and City Hall officials ride on an electric-powered boat on Padung Krung Kasem canal for its final test run yesterday. The new boats will replace petrol-powered vessels on Friday. (Photo by Pattarapong Chatpattarasill)
 - ❖ The electric-powered boats will be introduced on the canal between Thewes and Hua Lamphong piers this Friday, the Bangkok Metropolitan Administration said.
 - ❖ The new vessels for the service, which began in 2016, can carry up to 30 passengers.

Magic is Real now has created a headache for the authorities

- Investigation has been launched on how come the nearly 29-billion baht worth of drugs suddenly became sodium phosphate (used in detergent).
 - ❖ The magic was revealed over the weekend when 11.5 tonnes of ketamine drug was seized on its way to be shipped to Taiwan.

- ❖ The drug haul was so big that it became the single largest haul in Thailand's history and was confiscated at a warehouse in Chachoengsao. So big was the drug haul that the Justice Minister Somsak Thepsutin came out to announce the success.

- November 25, 2020 – Pro-democracy protesters plan to rally outside the Crown Property Bureau to reclaim public assets protest leaders said were transferred to HM the King by the government.
- November 26-27, 2020 – The Thai Chamber of Commerce plans the 38th annual meeting of the nationwide chambers of commerce to design a “white cover” book to present to Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha.
- December 2020 – The Federation of Thai Industries (FTI)’s “Faster Payment” scheme to increase liquidity for small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) during the pandemic is set to end.
- December 2, 2020 – The Constitutional Court is set to rule on the status of Prime Minister General Prayut Chan-o-cha PM for his prolonged stay in an army house since retirement.
- December 20, 2020 – Tentative date for elections of Provincial Administrative Organizations (PAOs) in 76 provinces.
- December 30, 2020 – The Generalized System of Preferences (GSP) for 3,500 products from the 119 designated beneficiary countries and territories are set to end.
- February, 2020 – A law amendment bill that allows women with pregnancies of not more than 12 weeks to get an abortion is to take effect.
