## Thai Enquirer Summary

- The opposition has backed down from its plan to raise the issue of royal defamation law or the monarchy in the upcoming censure debate after it came under fire from several parties.
  - ❖ The opposition has agreed to remove a reference to the monarchy from its censure motion to avoid protests from coalition MPs, says Sira Jenjaka, a Phalang Pracharat Party MP for Bangkok.
  - ❖ Government and opposition whips met yesterday under the chairmanship of House Speaker Chuan Leekpai to resolve the conflict over some part of the no-confidence motion that says, “not upholding nor having faith in a democratic system with the King as the head of state; undermining and opposing democratic governance; destroying the good relationship between the monarchy and the people; using the monarchy as an excuse to divide the people and using the monarchy as a shield to deflect its failures in national administration.”
  - ❖ Opposition leader Sompong Amornvivat, also the Pheu Thai Party leader, promised at the meeting that he will withdraw and rewrite the motion.
  - ❖ However, another issue is that Sompong’s decision has met with resistance from Progressive Movement co-leader Piyabutr Saengkanokkul. Piyabutr came out to

criticise 2 MPs of the Kao Klai (Move Forward) Party who voted against the party's resolution seeking amendments to Section 112 of the Criminal Code or the lese majeste law in parliament.

- ❖ Kwanlert Panichmart, a Move Forward MP for Chon Buri, took to his Facebook page to seek an apology from the general public and Sri Racha residents for voting against the party's resolution on the issue. Kwanlert said he wanted to exercise his rights as a representative of Sri Racha people in voting against the party's standing on the issue. Kwanlert said he is willing to face consequences in that the party's resolution is against his personal ideology.
- ❖ Previously, Kao Klai party-list MP Karom Ponpornklang told the "Inside Thailand" program yesterday morning that he did not sign his name to support the motion to amend Section 112. Karom also said Piyabutr's opinion is not his opinion and conceded that he did not agree with all of the party's ideologies.

### **Economic News**

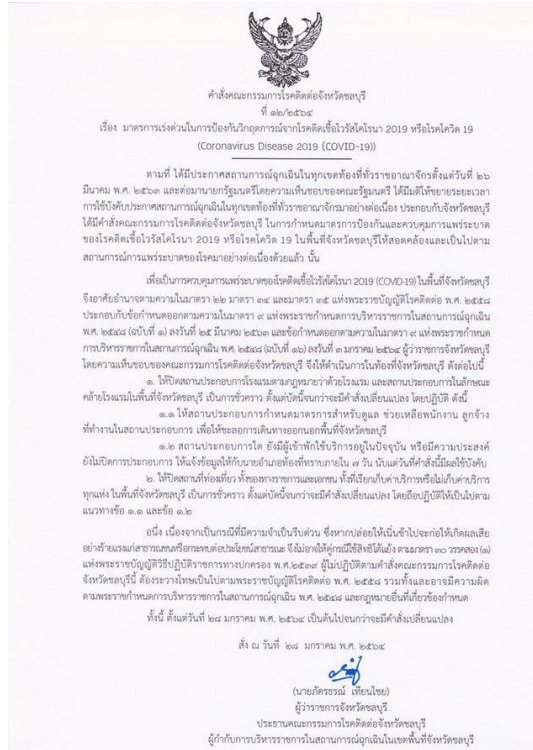
- Foreign media agencies reported the potential listing of Thai Beverage Plc (ThaiBev)'s plans to go public on the Singapore Stock Exchange (SGX).
  - ❖ ThaiBev is set to list its brewery business on the Singapore exchange as early as next week, in a deal that could be the biggest initial public offering (IPO) on Singapore's equity market in at least 8 years, according to a Bloomberg report.
  - ❖ Bloomberg cited sources with knowledge of the matter that the company is seeking a valuation of about US\$10 billion for the unit, with the listing possibly taking place as soon as the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter.

- ❖ The proposed offering could raise about \$2 billion, according to an earlier Reuters report, and would value ThaiBev's beer-making unit at up to \$10 billion (approximately 300 billion baht), said several people familiar with the matter.
- ❖ The Thai giant drinks makers which sells beers including Chang lager and spirits like Mekhong rum, initially targeted a mid-2020 listing but the Covid-19 pandemic forced the company to shelve the plan due to countries' restrictions on movement.
- PTT Oil and Retail Business's (OR) IPO---which has garnered strong investor demand since the 1<sup>st</sup> day of subscriptions on January 24, 2021---has sent the Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) to revamp its data backup systems to accommodate the OR subscription.
  - ❖ The OR's IPO has created a phenomenon in the SET's IPO history as it generated great deal of attention from the public and securities brokers.
  - ❖ OR expects the subscription from retail investors to hit 1 million after the company recorded more than 200,000 small investors subscribed to IPO in the first 2 days of the subscription period.
  - ❖ OR and the banks have announced through various channels subscription will continue until 12.00 hrs on February 2.
- There is some good news for workers insured under Section 33 of the Social Security Act (SSA) who have yet to receive financial aid under the government's relief packages after the Labour Ministry said it is now trying to form relief measures with the Finance Ministry amid the ongoing outbreak.
  - ❖ There is a total of 11 million workers are insured under Section 33 of the Social Security Act. The news came after Labour Minister Suchart Chomklin announced that the aid which is to be disbursed for one month is expected to be put to the

cabinet for consideration and given the green light as soon as possible, the minister said.

- ❖ The initial idea is to give a cash handout of 4,000 baht for 1 month to insured workers who have less than 500,000 baht in their bank accounts, similar criteria to the “Rao Chana” (We Win) handout scheme. The Finance Ministry also confirmed that it has sufficient budget to cover this aid plan.
- ❖ Kulaya Tantitemit, acting head of the Fiscal Policy Office as the Finance Ministry spokesperson, said the Labour Ministry will have to consult the idea with the National Economic and Social Development Council (NESDC) first. Kulaya expects the ministry to raise the issue with the Finance Ministry during the cabinet meeting next week.
- ❖ She said the Labour Ministry and the NESDC will have to discuss the the use of funds from the 390-billion-baht budget designated for economic rehabilitation under the 1-trillion-baht emergency loan decree.
- The Ministry of Finance has downgraded its economic forecast for 2021 to 2.8 per cent from the 4.5 percent expected in October, factoring in the resurgence of Covid-19 and fresh government stimulus measures.
  - ❖ Kulaya Tantitemit, acting head of the Fiscal Policy Office (FPO), said the main reason for the cut is a reduction in expected tourist arrivals. The impact of a new wave of outbreak is hurting the economy this year and contributes to the 2021 GDP downward revision.
  - ❖ The ministry also revised up its 2020 GDP estimate, saying the economy probably shrank 6.5 per cent last year compared to the 7.7 per cent contraction it previously forecast.

- ❖ The 2020 estimate was changed because of better-than-expected performance in the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter and the impact of fiscal stimulus measures as it pinned hopes on the government's cash-handout program in boosting this year's GDP by about 0.5-0.6 percentage point, while a programme that subsidises retail purchases can add around 0.12 percentage point.
- ❖ Exports are expected to grow 6.2 per cent this year, up from 6 per cent previously expected.
- ❖ Tourist arrivals, which already plunged from 39.9 million in 2019 to 6.7 million in 2020, are expected to fall further to 5 million this year, bringing in an estimated 260 billion baht in revenue.
- ❖ Government spending is expected to rise to 4.24 trillion baht, up 9.6% from last year.
- Governor of Chonburi Pakarathorn Thianchai has ordered the closure of all hotels & tourist attractions in the province (this includes Pattaya) from now until further notice. Hotels that want to remain open have 7 days to file a petition. Employees can now apply for government benefits.
  - ❖ The Chon Buri governor's order to shut down hotels is anticipated as part of the measures to save tourism operators and small hoteliers in the province. This way will allow employees to receive financial aid from the government as proposed by the Thai Hotels Association's (THA) eastern region and the private sector.



- Marigot Jewellery (Thailand) in Bangpoo Industrial Estate, Samut Prakan, yesterday announced decision to close its factory in order to cut expenses amid economic woes caused by the current outbreak, leading around 2,600 workers to lose their jobs immediately.
- ❖ The company also announced move to merge with a factory in Hi-Tech Industrial Estate in Bang Pa-in, Ayutthaya. In May 2020, Marigot Jewellery (Thailand) announced decision to lay off 300-500 workers at its factory in Hi-Tech Industrial Estate due to economic impacts of the 1<sup>st</sup> wave of the outbreak.



- Thai petrochemical producer Indorama Ventures Plc (IVL) says it expects to double its earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation and amortisation, delivering a double-digit return on capital employed by 2023.
  - ❖ The company announced the target at its annual event in Bangkok and said it plans to use the cash to meet its capital management goals, invest in lucrative projects, sustain its dividend policy to reward shareholders, and continue to deleverage its balance sheet from 1.46 to 0.6 times.
  - ❖ "Despite a challenging year, 2020 has given me even more conviction in our businesses," said Alope Lohia, group chief executive of Indorama Ventures.

- ❖ "Through the pandemic, we strengthened our platforms, empowered our people and advanced our systems agenda, positioning ourselves well to take advantage of opportunities in the recovery to unlock the full potential of IVL and ready the company for the next era."
  - ❖ IVL also detailed its cost savings plan to deliver a US\$610-million impact by 2023, comprising over 2,500 initiatives.
  - SET-listed developer Supalai plans to launch 31 new residential projects worth a combined 34 billion baht in Greater Bangkok and provinces, aiming to set a new high in presales and revenue of 27-28 billion baht.
    - ❖ Managing director Trithecha Tangmatitham said the housing market this year should return to normal after bottoming out last year, when the overall market declined by 30% and the condo segment fell 40%.
    - ❖ "The low number of condo launches will continue this year, with few land transactions for condo development last year," he said. The number of environmental impact assessment reports submitted was also the lowest in several years.

### **Political News**

- In the lead-up to the censure motion against the government, Pheu Thai MP for Bangkok Jirayu Huangsap has threatened to expose cabinet ministers with the initials "Jor, Or. Sor, Por and Dor" who are not on the list of ministers to be grilled in this round of the censure debate.



- ❖ Jirayu said these ministers---who have been opted out of this round of the censure debate---are involved in irregularities in government projects to benefit their associates.
- ❖ Jirayu warned that these ministers are likely to be probed by House standing committees while they will be questioned during parliamentary sessions. The opposition MP said he had concrete evidence to substantiate their involvement in alleged irregularities which will lead to an investigation with the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC). Jirayu said some information regarding alleged irregularities was leaked to the opposition by government MPs themselves.
- A by-election in Nakhon Si Thammarat's Constituency 3 is expected to be a fierce one.
  - ❖ Following the disqualification of Democrat MP Thepthai Senpong from parliament by the Constitutional Court, the Kla (Dare) Party leader Korn Chatikavanij came out to announce his party's readiness to field a candidate to contest the seat.
  - ❖ The party introduced Sarawut Suwannarat as its candidate to run for seat in this by-election under the party's banner. Sarawut is a new-generation businessman in Nakhon Si Thammarat who plays a key role in the silverware export industry.
  - ❖ The constituency is a stronghold of the Democrat Party. The Phalang Pracharat Party (PPRP) and Bhumjai Thai have announced readiness to field candidates.
  - ❖ While the Democrat Party reportedly asked PPRP not to field a candidate in this by-election, Deputy Prime Minister Gen Prawit Wongsuwan, as the PPRP leader, has yet to give a definite answer. Gen Prawit reportedly said he would have to wait for the resolution of the party's executive board meeting but he did not know when this meeting is going to happen.

- ❖ Deputy Interior Minister Nippon Boonyamane said the decision on the issue rests with Gen Prawit's judgement but said the Democrats plan to remind the PPRP of the tradition of not fielding a candidate in the by-election in Nakhon Si Thammarat's Constituency 3. He said in the past the Democrat Party decided not to field candidates to contest by-elections in Kam Paeng Petch and Khon Kaen to keep political etiquette.
  - ❖ The Democrat Party has asked its executive committee to approach the Palang Pracharat party and remind them of the tradition.
  - ❖ Thepthai and his supporters have proposed to the party to field his brother Pongsin Senpong to fill his seat.
  - Thailand slipped 3 places in global graft index.
    - ❖ Thailand fell to 104 from 101 in Transparency International's Corruption Perceptions Index (CPI) in 2019, scoring 36 points among 180 countries in Transparency International (TI)'s 2020 Corruption Perceptions Index (CPI).
    - ❖ Thailand's score was 36 out of 100 last year, down from 37 a year earlier, according to Patricia Moreira, managing director of international secretariat of Transparency International, adding that corruption undermines democracy, leads to a vicious cycle and weakens democratic institutions, eventually corruption becomes so ingrained in society that it cannot be eliminated.

### **General News**

- While Techin Ployetch aka "DJ Matoom" received negative criticism from society for being irresponsible and hosting private parties, an underwear party at Renaissance Hotel

in Bangkok has been reported on social media, fuelling fears that it may become another super-spread event.

- ❖ A social media user revealed information on the Facebook page “Ding Eu” about the underwear party with as many as 20 party goers at Renaissance Hotel. Among them were people from various occupations including TV anchor-person, flight attendant, condo salesperson, stylist, PR, tour operator and acupuncturist.
- ❖ The Facebook post captioned under photos that the underwear party is worse than DJ Matoom’s parties because the organiser managed to keep a low profile of the party.
- ❖ Poomipat “Tao TV Pool” Thamapan, an entertainment reporter and celebrity, posted a picture of male party goers pictured in their underwear.





- Thailand discovered 765 new COVID-19 cases and 3 deaths over the last 24 hours, bringing the total figures in the kingdom to 16,221 cases and 76 fatalities.
  - ❖ Of the 765 new cases, 746 were local transmissions – 724 cases from active case detection of 710 migrant workers and 14 Thais while 22 cases were patients seeking treatment at hospitals. The other 10 were imported cases, according to the Centre for COVID-19 Situation Administration (CCSA).
  - ❖ The latest outbreak in the kingdom since mid-December has spread to 63 provinces. However, 47 provinces have found no new cases in the last 7 days, CCSA assistant spokesperson Dr Apisamai Srirangsan said at the daily COVID-19 briefing yesterday.
  - ❖ Samut Sakhon now has a total of 8,845 COVID-19 cases after the province reported 765 new Covid-19 cases, with 3 new fatalities yesterday. The cumulative total of 8,845 confirmed patients, while the current hospitalized patients were classified as 189 in Thai people, 261 foreigners, and 3 cumulative deaths.
- Up to 600 factories nationwide are being ordered to closely monitor their emissions to better curb air pollutants as the Industry Ministry steps up efforts to cope with PM2.5 ultra-fine dust, now blanketing most parts of Bangkok.

- ❖ The mandatory requirement, with a maximum fine of 200,000 baht for violators, will be enforced under a new ministerial law expected to take effect next year, according to the ministry. It replaces the existing 2001 law that is considered outdated as it covers only large industrial estates in some provinces.
  - ❖ The new law will be applied to all factories countrywide, including those in Bangkok, Samut Sakhon and Samut Prakan, though 600 factories are priorities and ordered to install continuous emission monitoring systems (CEMS) that operate around the clock, officials said.

- January, 2021 – The parliament is set to deliberate the charter amendment bills in the 2<sup>nd</sup> reading.
- January 2021 – The World Bank will review Thailand's economic growth outlook.
- January, 2021 – Charoen Pokphand Foods Plc (CPF) is preparing to issue 5 series of debentures with tenors of 2 years to 12 years to retail, institutional and high net worth investors.
- January 25-March 31, 2021 – The implementation of the 2nd-phase of the co-payment scheme will allow registrants to start spending.
- February, 2021 – The Legal Execution Department plans to open the auction for the Dhara Dhevi Hotel Chiang Mai next month at a price of 2.116 billion baht.
- February, 2021 – A law amendment bill that allows women with pregnancies of not more than 12 weeks to get an abortion is to take effect.
- February 1 to 19, 2021 – The Public Debt Management Office (PDMO) will open its wallet app for subscriptions for 60 billion baht in saving bonds to raise funds for the government's Covid-19 relief packages for economic and social recovery.
- February, 2, 2021 – Thai Airways International Plc (THAI) said it will submit a rehabilitation plan to the Central Bankruptcy Court, postponed from the original schedule on January 2, 2021.
- February 3, 2021 – The Bank of Thailand (BoT)'s Monetary Policy Committee (MPC)'s next meeting to review policy interest rate.
- February 10, 2021 – PTT Oil and Retail Business Plc (OR) shares will be listed on the Stock Exchange of Thailand, with the offer price of 16-18 baht per share.
- February 14, 2021 – Valentine's Day, the government plans to begin its national Covid-19 vaccine rollout.
- February 16, 2021 - The increased maximum fare of 158 baht on the Green Line electric train was first set to be imposed.
- February 24-25, 2021 – Charter amendment drafts are expected to be tabled in parliament for the 2nd reading.

- April, 2021 – The central bank plans to officially implement the new rule on the rate of penalty imposed on loan defaulters in a bid to ease borrowers’ burdens and motivate them to repay their debts.
- June, 2021 – Bank for Agriculture and Agricultural Cooperatives (BAAC)’s debt holiday is due to expire.
