## Thai Enquirer Summary

### Country's Re-opening News

- The government is mulling a decision to ease Covid-19 restrictions to be proposed by the Centre for Covid-19 Situation Administration (CCSA) committee to pave the way for a reopening the country on **October 1**.
  - ❖ Thailand is hoping to open its doors to the world by October this year, according to the CCSA's assistant spokesperson Apisamai Srirangsan. Dr Apisamai said the decision will be mulled over during the CCSA's meeting next Monday on March 15 before proposing to the Cabinet at its weekly meeting on March 16.
  - ❖ Issues to be discussed at the next CCSA meeting are:
    - 1) The readjustment of the colour-tier labels for provinces on March 19 after only 10 provinces have been reporting infections.
    - 2) The relaxation of more measures may be considered before April 1 so people can enjoy Songkran festival this year.
  - ❖ Dr Apisamai said that even if the country isn't fully reopened by October, it could still see a wider opening, just in time for Thailand's high season.

- ❖ The reopening was also dependent upon other countries' Covid situations as well as the vaccine situation and the status of safety measures by airlines, the CCSA assistant spokesperson said. A reopening could also exclude certain countries if they still have a high rate of Covid infections.

### **Political News**

- On the political front, all eyes are on the Constitutional Court as it is scheduled to deliver its ruling today on whether the parliament has the authority to amend Section 256 of the Constitution to allow for the setting up of a new Constitution Drafting Assembly (CDA) to rewrite the existing charter, with the exception of Chapter 1, about general provisions, and Chapter 2 about the monarchy.
  - ❖ It is said that Constitutional Court judges will not read out its ruling but will instead hold an internal meeting to decide on the petition. Once a verdict is reached, the Office of the Constitutional Court will release the verdict in the form of a press release to the media @ 09:30 hrs (possibly).
  - ❖ The court's verdict can come out in 1 in 3 ways:
    - i. The court may rule that the parliament has the authority to amend the charter. This will enable the parliament to proceed with charter the amendment process.
    - ii. The court may rule that the parliament has no authority to amend Section 256 of the Constitution. What to follow is whether the court will issue an injunction to halt the entire charter amendment process and cause the 3 reading of charter amendment bills to be annulled.
    - iii. The court may issue guidelines for the parliament such as whether a public referendum should be conducted on the issue or whether it may allow a CDC to be set up under an amendment to Section 256 of the Constitution

but set a condition for the parliament to seek section-by-section amendments.

- Meanwhile, the opposition has set up a war room to convene at 14:00 hrs today to monitor the charter court’s ruling closely, says Suthin Khlangsaeng, the opposition chief whip and Pheu Thai MP for Maha Sarakham.

- ❖ Suthin admitted that he was worried about the issue pending the court ruling today after the court chose to take in written opinions of 4 former constitution experts who do not show keen support for charter changes. Moreover, the court chose to ignore opinions of others submitted by the opposition, Suthin added.

- ❖ Leader of the opposition parties will meet at Pheu Thai’s headquarters at 11:00 hrs today to consider its next move if the court rules against charter amendments bill.

- ❖ Meanwhile, an extraordinary session of parliament scheduled for March 17 has been endorsed by His Majesty the King and announced in the Royal Gazette.



- The Criminal Court in Thonburi has set the case of a man who photo shopped photos that of the monarch for others after it sentenced him to 4 years and 5 months in jail for being disrespectful to the monarchy.

- ❖ The Criminal Court in Thonburi said Supakorn Pinijbuth, 21, used two Facebook accounts to post several photo-shopped posts between April 10 and 23, 2020 that violated the country's strict lese majeste laws.
  - The court said his social media posts have caused social conflict and threatens stability of the nation.
- ❖ Initially, the court had sentenced him to 1 year in jail for each of the social media post. However, Supakorn confessed so the sentenced was reduced to 6 months for each post.
- On the protest front, another protest has been called for and this could see fuel added to the fire in case the constitutional amendments are shot down today.
  - ❖ Organiser of “Dern Talu Fah V.2 (March Through the Sky), believed to be a splinter faction of the pro-democracy Ratsadon (People's Movement) Group, posted on its Facebook page, urging people to join an overnight march this Saturday from the Victory Monument to Government House to demand a new Constitution. The group said it will camp in front of Government House for a prolonged protest, starting from 14.00 hrs.



- In regards to the upcoming cabinet reshuffle, Deputy Prime Minister Gen Prawit Wongsuwan, as the Phalang Pracharat Party leader, came out to confirm that a list of party candidates for the ministerial posts has now reached Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha.
  - ❖ The final decision rests with the PM, Gen Prawit said but dodged journalists' question on rampant speculation that Deputy Agriculture and Cooperatives Minister Capt Thammanat Prompao is tipped to take over the Ministry of Digital Economy and Society (DES).
- Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha, also the Defence Minister, will chair a high-level Police Commission meeting tomorrow. It is said that the reinstatement of Pol Lt Gen Surachate Hakparn (nickname – Joke) to a post at the Royal Thai Police is one of the key agendas at the tomorrow meeting.
  - ❖ The meeting is connected to a reshuffle of high-ranking police officers who hold the rank of police general to be considered at another meeting scheduled next week.
  - ❖ Pol Lt Gen Surachate is expected to be reinstated at the meeting next week. Pol Lt Gen Surachate had sued Gen Prayut for his transfer without any wrongdoing.
- The National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) expects to forward the case of Pareena Kraikupt, a Phalang Pracharat Party (PPRP) MP for Ratchaburi, who is found guilty of severe ethical misconduct, to the Supreme Court tomorrow or early next week in case of a day, NACC spokesman Niwatchai Kasemmongkol announced.
  - ❖ Pareena was found guilty of a severe infringement of ethics in connection with the land encroachment case against her.

- ❖ The NACC also found other 10 MPs guilty of committing severe ethical misconduct like Pareena, Niwatchai said, adding that the anti-graft body is compiling further evidence to submit to the NACC's main committee to consider.
  - Former prime minister Yingluck Shinawatra has opened a new account called “Yingla888” on the Chinese short-video app Douyin, which is TikTok's Chinese version, to please her fan club in China.
    - ❖ Yingluck uses the Chinese app which is hugely popular in China and dominated China's social media platforms. She has posted a number of video clips on her Facebook and Instagram accounts.

### **Economic News**

- Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha has instructed a newly appointed committee to solve problems among state enterprises during a meeting of the State Enterprise Policy Office (Sepo).
  - ❖ Sepo's Director-General Panthip Sripimol said the Sepo meeting had resolved to appoint a sub-panel to address liquidity problems of 4 key state enterprises namely the State Railway of Thailand (SRT), the Bangkok Mass Transit Authority (BMTA), the broadcaster MCOT Plc and National Telecom Plc (NT).
  - ❖ The meeting also instructed MCOT to present a rehab plan to the sub-panel headed by Pichit Akrathit within 30 days. MCOT has severe liquidity problems after facing stiff competition from digital TV channels.
- The Thai Chamber of Commerce (TCC) expects more than a million members to queue up for Covid-19 jobs.

- ❖ Kalin Sarasin, chairman of the TCC, said the TCC is compiling a list of its members who wants to receive Covid-19 vaccines to be forwarded to the government. At the stage, he expects the number to exceed a million. He said the TCC sees the need to purchase vaccines from the government, especially to protect its members in high-risk areas like Samut Sakhon.
- ❖ Kalin urged the government to come up with an action plan to speed up the vaccine program to cover at least 10 million people per month or the average daily toll of 300,000 people. Thailand only used up around 30 per cent of Covid vaccines in the 1<sup>st</sup> lot.
- Meanwhile Boon Vanasin, the owner of Thonburi Hospital Group Plc (THG) has come out to blast the government for saying something and doing nothing.
  - ❖ His comments were in relation to the vaccines that Prime Minister Prayut Chan-ocha, who said that private hospitals could bring in the vaccines.
  - ❖ Boon said that it was easier said than done because the waiting time for even the vaccines such as AstraZeneca is close to 3-months and therefore it is not something that would be available anytime soon for Thais.
- Consumer spending power is expected to gradually recover in the second half this year, helped by mass distribution of Covid-19 vaccines, the reopening of the country to foreign tourists, and the government's stimulus measures, according to giant retail players.
  - ❖ Sompong Rungnirattisai, chief executive of Ek-Chai Distribution System Co, the operator of Lotus hypermarket chain, said the company expects to see better consumer shopping sentiment from June. Though spending per bill has yet to increase, there have been some positive signs at Lotus stores.

- ❖ Earlier in the year consumers spent more money on food, but now there is rising sales momentum for electrical appliances and fashion, which are not essential goods, he said. However, sales in March are weaker year-on-year because this period in 2020 panic buying erupted as consumers were worried about the coronavirus outbreak.
- SET-listed Charoen Pokphand Foods (CPF) Plc sees a rise in net profit this year despite projection for stagnant growth of sales revenue.
  - ❖ CPF expects revenue from sales in 2021 to be stagnant compared to 589.712 billion baht in 2020 due to changes in revenue and profit realisation from Chia Tai Investment Co., Ltd. (CTI), a joint venture, after its holding in CTI was dropped from 100 per cent to 18 per cent, according to company secretary Kobboon Srichai.
  - ❖ The company remains upbeat that CPF's net profit will rise from 26.022 billion baht in 2020.
  - ❖ CPF has earmarked a budget close to that of last year of 26-27 billion baht for overseas investment, especially in Vietnam, a market with high potential for growth, Russia and the Philippines.
- The Ministry Tourism and Sports said it is improving its scheme to subsidize domestic tourism after the cabinet declined its request to extend the current scheme in the 2<sup>nd</sup> phase due to concerns of fraud.
  - ❖ Tourism and Sports Minister Pipat Ratchakitprakarn promised to make the procedure for checking participants' identity stricter in the application to make sure travel and tourism operators.

- ❖ Other changes to the programme were under discussion with involving agencies before being sent to be validated by the Office of the National Economic and Social Development Council and then sent to the cabinet for approval.
  - ❖ Pipat hopes that the new scheme will come out in March.
  - Central Plaza Hotel Plc (CENTEL) is upbeat on revenue growth this year driven by an increase in the number of domestic tourists and the return of international tourists
    - ❖ CENTEL expects its total revenue of this year to rise from 13.279 billion baht of last year driven by continued growth in both the hotel and food segments.
    - ❖ Senior vice-president of Ronachit Mahatthanaphruet said the company expects an increase in the number of domestic tourists from the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of this year and international visitors to return in the latter half.
    - ❖ The company has set aside a 3-billion-baht budget for the launch of the Centara Mirage Beach Resort Dubai, restaurant expansion and several M&A deals in the hotel and food sectors.

### **General News**

- The Centre for Covid-19 Situation Administration (CCSA) reported 39 new cases of Covid-19, 5 of whom are from overseas.
  - ❖ Of the 34 local infections, 21 were found via tests at medical facilities and 13 via proactive tests at high-risk communities.
  - ❖ Of the 34 local infections reported on Monday, 19 were found in Samut Sakhon followed by eight in Pathumthani, three in Tak and one each in Bangkok, Ayutthaya, Phetchaburi and Ang Thong.

- ❖ This brings the total number of infections since the pandemic began last year to 26,540 cases. While 25,946 people have recovered from the disease, 509 patients are still being treated. There was no new fatality, leaving the death toll at 85 people.
  - Security forces for Myanmar's military regime are using battlefield weapons on unarmed protestors and carrying out premeditated killings orchestrated by their commanding officers, Amnesty International said Thursday.
    - ❖ The human rights group collated graphic video clips posted on social media to document what it called a "nationwide killing spree" in the weeks since the military seized power on Feb 1.
    - ❖ "These Myanmar military tactics are far from new, but their killing sprees have never before been livestreamed for the world to see," Ms Joanne Mariner, Amnesty's director of crisis response, said in a new report.

- January 25-March 31, 2021 – The implementation of the 2nd-phase of the co-payment scheme will allow registrants to start spending.
- March 11, 2021 – The Constitutional Court set March 11 for its ruling on the legality of proposed constitutional amendments aimed at setting up a charter drafting body as petitioned by Phalang Pracharat Party (PPPR) list MP and deputy leader Paiboon Nititawan.
- March 12, 2021 – The rollout of AstraZeneca vaccines in Thailand is set to begin, with Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha to be the first to receive the vaccine.
- March 15, 2021 – Nok Air Plc plans to submit the rehabilitation plan to the Central Bankruptcy Court as planned.
- March 15, 2021 – The Central Criminal Court for Corruption and Misconduct Cases court is set to begin examining the Bangkok Mass Transit System (BTSC)'s petition, asking it

to bring a lawsuit against the Mass Rapid Transit Authority of Thailand (MRTA) over the cancelled bidding for the western extension of the MRT Orange Line.

- March 17-18, 2021 – The parliament is expected to hold an extraordinary session to vote for charter amendment drafts in the 3<sup>rd</sup> reading and consider a bill on national referendums.
- March 22 –April 4, 2021 – The 42<sup>nd</sup> Bangkok International Motor Show is to be held in Nonthaburi’s Impact Arena, Muang Thong Thani.
- March 26, 2021 – The test run for the Red Line railway is scheduled to commence.
- March 28, 2021 – Elections for the mayors and councilors of municipalities of all levels - tambon, muang and nakhon - throughout the country.
- March 31, 2021 – The government’s half-half co-payment scheme is set to end.
- March 31-June 30, 2021 – The deadline extension to file personal income taxes for the 2020 tax year.
- April 2021 – The government is set to launch “area quarantine” plan to open Thailand to foreign tourists.
- April, 2021 – Thai Airways International Plc (THAI) expects the Central Bankruptcy Court to consider its rehab blueprint for approval.
- April 2021 – The Batong Airport is scheduled to be opened after being postponed from February due to the resurgence of the Covid-19.
- April, 2021 – The central bank plans to officially implement the new rule on the rate of penalty imposed on loan defaulters in a bid to ease borrowers’ burdens and motivate them to repay their debts.
- May, 2021 – The 66<sup>th</sup> Bangkok Gems & Jewelry Fair (BGJF) Virtual Trade Fair is set to be held.
- May 7, 2021 – Thai Airways International Plc (THAI) is expected to hold a creditors meeting to inspect and vote for the rehab plan.
- June, 2021 – Bank for Agriculture and Agricultural Cooperatives (BAAC)’s debt holiday is due to expire.
- September 1, 2021 – The government will collect value-added tax from Netflix, Youtube, Google, Facebook as well as other e-commerce services.
