Thai Enquirer Summary

Economic News

- The cabinet is scheduled to consider aid measures for small and medium-sized enterprises hit by the Covid-19 outbreak (SMEs) at today's meeting.
 - ❖ The cabinet is set to decide on measures to rehabilitate the ailing SMEs, especially the remaining 350 billion baht in soft loans aimed at helping smaller firms cope with the liquidity crunch, the implementation of an asset warehousing concept. As for the leftover 250 billion baht, the Bank of Thailand (BoT) has proposed to offer it in the form of low-interest loans to pass on to SMEs at 2 per cent interest.
 - ❖ Other stimulus measures to spur domestic spending such as the proposed extension of the "Rao Tiew Duay Kan" (We Travel Together) tourism promotion campaign and the half-half co-payment scheme in the 3rd phase will not be forwarded to the cabinet meeting for consideration today.
 - ❖ Central Bank Governor Sethaput Suthiwart-Narueput said he would update the progress of aid measures for SMEs today at 15.00 hrs on the BoT Facebook Live.

- Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha yesterday called a meeting of his economic ministers to discuss ideas on more economic measures to stimulate domestic spending and tourism in the latter half of the year.
 - ❖ Gen Prayut met with Deputy Prime Minister and Energy Minister Supattanapong Punmeechaow, Finance Minister Arkhom Termpittayapaisith and Bank of Thailand (BoT) Governor Sethaput Suthiwart-Narueput to brainstorm ideas on a number of issues including:
 - 1) Measures to maintain and increase liquidity among small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) with a soft loan and asset warehousing programmes.
 - 2) Following up on the results of the Rao Chana (We Win) and half-half co-payment schemes and the possibility of an extension for both schemes as well as measures to deal with fraud related to the schemes.
 - ❖ Supattanapong said he had asked the Finance Minister to come up with more ideas on economic stimulus measures similar to the “shop dee mee khuen” project but possibly without time constraints.
 - ❖ The Deputy Prime Minister and Energy Minister signalled that the government will likely push ahead with the “Rao Tiew Duay Kan” (We Travel Together) tourism promotion campaign and the half-half co-payment scheme after they started to expire on May 31, 2021, both in the 3rd phase, in the latter half of this year to stimulate the domestic economy.
- Household debts in Thailand will likely rise as Thais generally start their savings plans too late, the National Economic and Social Development Council (NESDC) said on Monday.
 - ❖ Jinangoon Rojananan, NESDC’s deputy secretary-general, said a Stock Exchange of Thailand study shows that Thais usually invest in savings schemes

when they are 42 years old, compared to Americans, who start saving from the age of 30. “Meanwhile, only 2.2 per cent of Thai households start investing, while most Thais have a high level of debt,” she pointed out.

- ❖ Household debt in the third quarter of 2020 stood at 13.77 trillion baht, accounting for 86.6 per cent of the country’s gross domestic product. Many households cannot save because they have to repay debts, especially the Generation Y, which spends 69 per cent of its earnings on luxury goods.
- The Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) is expected to leave its key interest rate unchanged at its meeting tomorrow.
 - ❖ Roong Sanguanruang, head of the global market research and analysis section at Bank of Ayudhya (BAY), urged investors to keep a close watch on export figures and the MPC’s meeting tomorrow. She expects the MPC to maintain its benchmark interest rate at 0.5 per cent for a 7th straight meeting. She also expects the rate setters to adopt tools to tackle the liquidity problems to be in line with an economic recovery.
- Nok Air looks set to resume international flights in the 3rd quarter of this year.
 - ❖ Nok Air CEO Wutthiphum Jurangkool said the airline should resume international flights on 5 pilot destinations including China, Japan, India, Myanmar and Vietnam in the 3rd quarter, followed by 2 additional destinations which are the Philippines and Malaysia in the 4th quarter.
 - ❖ The airline expects its average cabin factor for domestic flights to return to 80 per cent, especially Chiang Mai and Krabi routes given the progress of Thailand’s inoculation program.

- ❖ As for the airline's load factor for international flights, Wutthiphum said the airline will have to wait for government policies on the reopening plan and each country's travel restrictions.
- ❖ Nok Air's passenger volume has returned to 7,000 per day, still less than the average rate of 37,000 per day pre-pandemic.
- More than 13,000 employees have applied to continue working with Thai Airways (THAI) with 2,800 others calling it quits.
 - ❖ Chansin Treenuchagron, the airline's acting president, said those who expressed their intention to stay on would work under a restructured organisation which will take effect on May 1. In its latest update, 13,500 employees applied to carry on working while 2,800 others decided to join early retirement programme and a further 800 employees were undecided.
 - ❖ THAI's debt rehabilitation plan has been accepted by the Central Bankruptcy Court and will be put to the creditors who will decide its fate next month.
- SET-listed Jay Mart Plc (JMART) is confident that its 2021 net profit will continue to hit an all-time high or a growth of 50 per cent, driven by strong economic performances of its local and overseas business allies.
 - ❖ Chief executive Adisak Sukhumvitaya said the company adopted an aggressive strategy to tap into 2 new business segments, namely the logistics and centralized insurance and finance broker.
 - ❖ The company expects this prospect to become clearer in the 3rd and 4th quarters of this year. It has set aside an investment budget of 15 billion baht to tap into these new businesses.

- ❖ JMART's market cap on the Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index is now standing at 102 billion baht. Adisak expects the company's market cap to grow to 130 billion at year-end and 250 billion baht in 2023.
- The picture of a huge crowd waiting to apply for jobs at a factory in Samut Prakan province was shared online.
 - ❖ It is said that the large crowd of people arrived in front of the factory since midnight last night after a large number of people lost their jobs as a result of the economic fallout from the Covid-19 pandemic.



- Phuket will submit its reopening plan to the Centre for Economic Situation Administration (CESA) for approval this Friday in a bid to let inoculated tourists visit

without quarantine in July, while Samui also hastened the reopening process with a sealed model.

- ❖ Yuthasak Supasorn, Tourism Authority of Thailand governor, said the reopening plan, known as the Phuket Tourism Sandbox, will depend largely on vaccine allocation to the Andaman island as it must achieve herd immunity by inoculating 70% of the population before letting foreign visitors in by that date. The plan, to be submitted to CESA on March 26, will include a vaccination proposal, indicating the number of doses needed and the timeline of inoculation that will be suitable for a safe reopening.
- ❖ He said public communities tend to consent to this plan more than last year's Phuket model as it is equipped with a more elaborate plan that can convince them with health safety measures.

Political News

- 2014 coup leader and incumbent Prime Minister Prayut Chan-o-cha came out to say that the authorities did what was best for the 'security' of the area on Saturday's protest and that journalists who were caught in the line of fire needed to
 - ❖ Be not just on the side of the protestors
 - ❖ Have protective gear all the time and be ready for such possibilities
 - ❖ That he was 'saddened' to see reporters being hurt.
 - ❖ That journalists should not just cover the 'protest' side because 'it does not help the country's image'.
- The incident has prompted nearly all media bodies be it the Thailand Journalist Association (TJA), the Economic Reports Association of Thailand and the Foreign

Correspondents Club of Thailand (FCCT), to come out unanimously criticize the heavy-handed approach undertaken by the authorities in cracking down the protestors.

- Meanwhile HM the King has come out to put all those who have been injured in Saturday's protest to be patients under medical care of HM the King.
- On the political front, the much awaited Cabinet reshuffle is still in the making and that Gen. Prayut said his new cabinet line-up will be revealed soon. He said he is in the process of submitting a list of new cabinet members for royal endorsement.
 - ❖ He told the media that changes can be made anytime to his new line-up if nothing good has come out of it because no one knows what will happen in the future. Gen Prayut said he is more worried about peace and order in the country.
 - When asked if changes have been made to the vacant posts or the entire cabinet, he said, "only the vacant seats. Better not complicate things".
- On the issue of the amendment of the constitution, Gen. Prayut came out to say that it was something that was discussed in the past and that it will depend upon the people and that "go amend it and if you can do it do it".
 - ❖ When asked about the idea of charter amendments section-by-section as pushed by some coalition parties, Gen Prayut said he had no problem with that and said the government already proposed ideas on charter amendments.
 - ❖ He does not mind either one attempts to seek amendments section by section or the entire charter as long as they have the ability to do so. He challenged those who fear that he might try to prolong his power to use their ability to prevent that from happening.
- This did not go down well with those in Gen Prayut's own coalition members as disqualified Democrat Party MP for Nakhon Si Thammarat, Thepthai Senpong, came out

to call for the government to initiate the charter amendment process. He said the government must show responsibility to parliament as part of its policy manifesto declared to parliament.

- ❖ Thepthai said it is impossible for political parties will succeed in pushing for amendments to the constitution. The government must take the initiative and act to take the process forward. Political parties are still arguing over the amendment process should be a chapter-by-chapter approach or whether a new charter should to be drawn up.
- Parliament speaker Chuan Leekpai signalled the possibility of an extraordinary parliamentary session to be scheduled for April 7-8 to allow MPs and senators to proceed with the debate on a national referendum bill.
 - ❖ After a discussion with Senate speaker Pornpetch Wichitcholchai, Chuan said they agreed that the most suitable date for a special House session should fall on April 7-8.
 - ❖ Senator Wanchai Sornsiri, as spokesman of the Senate's committee considering a national referendum bill, said the committee will call a meeting on April 1-2 to review the content of the referendum bill before the bill is returned on parliament's agenda.
 - ❖ Wanchai warned that the referendum bill is a ticking time bomb because the bill is considered as a key legislation that could cause dissolution of the lower House or the government to resign if the bill is voted down at a joint session. This scenario already happened during the government of the late prime minister Gen Prem Tinsulanonda.
- The Criminal Court yesterday sentenced Ratsadon (People's Movement) core leader Parit "Penguin" Chiwarak to an additional detention of 15 days on a charge of contempt of court following his misconduct in the courtroom on March 15.

- ❖ The court, initially, sentenced Parit, who is already being held on remand, to 1 month but commuted his sentence to 15 days after he pleaded guilty and because he is a student who has not been convicted before.
 - Parit, who arrived in a wheel chair to hear his sentence, told the court that he had no intention to cause trouble but simply wanted to demand justice. He said he does not regret losing his freedom but feels disappointed for not receiving justice.
- ❖ On the same day, the court held an inquiry into human rights activist Arnon Nampa's letter asking the court to investigate an incident on the night of March 15 when officers at Bangkok remand prison tried to escort fellow activists Jatupat "Pai Dao Din" Boonpatthararaksa, Panupong "Mike Rayong" Jadnok and 9 others out of their cell for Covid-19 screening.
- ❖ Jatupat and Panupong told the court that they were suspicious of the prison officers' actions for carrying out Covid-19 tests on 4 occasions in the middle of the night on March 15 and early morning of March 16, causing them to be fearful for their lives.
- Meanwhile, the Criminal Court released 16 protest leaders of the anti-government Ratsadon group who were detained at the Border Patrol Police Region 1 office in Pathum Thani where 16 protesters are detained in connection with anti-government rallies on March 20.
 - ❖ The 16 were: Vachiravich "Safe" Thetsrimuang, who is leader of Khon Kaen faction of the Ratsadon group, Atthapol "Khru Yai" Buapat, Chaithawat Nammaroeng, Nitikorn Khamchu, Kornchanok Saenprasert, Pachara Santhiyakul, Thanasak Potemi, Veerapat Sirisunthorn, Panupong Srithananuwat, Sarawut

Nakmanee, Jatuporn Sae Ueng, Chettha Klindee, Siwakorn Namnuad, Jetsarit Namkhot, Issaret Charoenkhong and Wisalya Ngnamna.

- ❖ The 16 activists were unconditionally released on bail after their lawyers placed 35,000 baht as surety each.
- In a related development, protest leader Chukiat “Justin” Saengwong was arrested and taken to Chana Songkram police station yesterday on lese majeste charges, according to the Thai Lawyers for Human Rights (TLHR).
 - ❖ Chukiat was arrested at 20:15 hours yesterday after police received an arrest warrant from the Criminal Court on serious charges of royal insult under Section 112 of the Criminal Code in connection with the Redem rally on March 20 near Sanam Luang.
 - ❖ Chukiat put up a defamatory message on the portrait of His Majesty King in front of the Supreme Court.
 - ❖ Chukiat posted a message on his Facebook that read, “My game is over. See you at Chana Songkram police station” “Police are taking me to the Chana Songkram station on the violation of Section 112” “This is urgent! Urgent! My game is over. Chana Songkram police station.”
- The opposition Pheu Thai Party is set to kick off a tour of 4 regions from March 29.
 - ❖ The party will kick off its roadshow on March 29, with Chiang Mai being the 1st province scheduled on March 30 before travelling to other provinces across 4 regions, says Pheu Thai secretary-general Prasert Chanthararuangthong.
 - ❖ The purpose of the touring is to expand its membership base and exchange ideas with local people about charter amendments, bread and butter issues and economic hardships facing them.

- Complainer-in-chief Srisuwan Janya, secretary-general of the Association for the Protection of the Constitution, has petitioned the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) to take action against 208 MPs and senators who voted for a charter amendment bill during its 3rd and final reading last week.
 - ❖ Srisuwan alleged that the action of the 208 lawmakers is against the Constitutional Court's ruling that a national referendum must be held to determine first if the public wants an entirely new charter.
 - ❖ He accused the 208 lawmakers of ethical misconduct in breach of Section 92 (2) of the political parties' law.

General News

- Thailand recorded 73 new COVID-19 cases and 1 new death in the last 24 hours, according to the Centre for Covid-19 Situation Administration (CCSA).
 - ❖ Of the new cases, 66 are locally acquired infections, including 44 found during proactive screening and the rest among those under observation and treatment.
 - ❖ There were 7 cases among arrivals from abroad, including 1 each from Malaysia, Qatar, Poland, Denmark, the US, Germany and Italy.
 - ❖ Of the new locally-acquired infections, 33 are in Samut Sakhon, 21 in Bangkok, 6 in Pathum Thani and 1 each in Nakhon Pathom, Nonthaburi, Samut Prakan, Chon Buri, Phetchaburi and Ratchaburi.
 - ❖ Cumulative infections, since December 15th, are 23,639, with 22,486 recoveries. The death toll is 31 and 1,122 people are still being treated in hospitals.

- The alarming fact is a report that the cluster at the Immigration Detention Centre (IDC) has reached nearly 300 cases, prompting the IDC to stop taking new detainees.
 - ❖ A total of 297 cases had been confirmed from among 1,888 tests conducted at the IDC's facilities in Bang Khen and Suan Phlu between March 6 and March 20, said Dr Apisamai Srirangsan, deputy spokeswoman for the Center for Covid-19 Situation Administration (CCSA).
 - ❖ Those who tested positive are being isolated from the general population. A field hospital has also been set up for severe cases, while 70 staff within 2 facilities have been vaccinated.
- Thailand on Monday started the first human trials of a domestically developed Covid-19 vaccine, with the rollout expected to begin next year.
 - ❖ The vaccine, consisting of an inactivated virus to trigger immunity, is being developed by the Government Pharmaceutical Organisation (GPO) using egg-based technology. The GPO has been working on the project with Mahidol University's Tropical Medicine Department, the Programme for Appropriate Technology in Health (PATH), an American non-profit organisation, and the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai, New York. Together they have developed a pilot NDV-HXP-S vaccine and lab tests have been showing promising results.
 - ❖ Public Health Minister Anutin Charnvirakul said the development of the home-grown vaccine is a very significant step for the country's public health, as it would enable Thailand to be self-reliant and it would not need to depend on vaccines from foreign countries.

- On Saturday, pro-democracy protestors from five groups, mainly Free Youth and the United Front of Thammasat and Demonstration, gathered for a leaderless protest at Sanam Luang.

- March 24, 2021 – The Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) meeting to determine the direction of the Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) and the baht.
- March 26, 2021-July 28, 2021 – Trial runs on the Red Line extension routes, from Bang Sue to Taling Chan and from Bang Sue to Rangsit during which members of the public will be offered free rides.
- March 28, 2021 – Elections for the mayors and councilors of municipalities of all levels - tambon, muang and nakhon - throughout the country.
- March 31, 2021 – The government’s half-half co-payment scheme is set to end.
