## Thai Enquirer Summary

### Economic News

- Today is the 1<sup>st</sup> day that the easing of restrictions of tourists into Thailand takes effect. This is likely to help the economy which has been reliant on the tourism industry with nearly 15 per cent of the gross domestic product (GDP).
  
- ❖ The Centre for the Covid-19 Situation Administration (CCSA)'s sub-committee is set to propose an adjustment to Thailand's quarantine rules set to take effect from April 1.
  - The CCSA's sub-panel has divided types of foreign visitors into 3 groups which will determine their quarantine period.
    - The quarantine period mandatory to enter Thailand will soon be reduced to periods between 7-10 days depending on the travellers ability to present a Covid-19 vaccine certificate, according to CCSA spokeswoman Apisamai Srirangsan.
  
- ✓ 1) For those who received the COVID-19 vaccine and reduce the quarantine period for foreign travellers with the vaccination certificate to 7 days. They have to go through 1-swab test.

- ✓ 2) Foreign visitors who have no vaccination certificate and there is only a sterile test result the reduced quarantine period is 10 days. They have to go through 2-swab tests.
- ✓ 3) Travelers from countries deemed “high risk” for coronavirus variants like the African strain will undergo the mandatory quarantine of at least 14 nights. They have to go through 3-swab tests.
  - Travellers from 11 countries where the South African variant of coronavirus is prevalent will still have to undergo the full 14-nights quarantine period, according to the Department of Disease Control.
    - Travellers from African nations including South Africa, Zimbabwe, Botswana, Zambia, East Africa, Kenya, Rwanda, Tanzania, Mozambique, Central Africa, Cameroon, DR Congo, West Africa and Ghana will also be required to undergo a 14-day quarantine period.
- Bank of Thailand’s economic review for February 2021 painted a more rosy picture in private consumption and investment.
  - ❖ BoT revealed private consumption shrank by 2.1 per cent year-on-year in February, easing from a 4.5 per cent contraction in the previous month. On a monthly basis, domestic consumption grew by 3.4 per cent from January, improving from a contraction of 3.6 per cent in January.
  - ❖ Chayawadee Chai-Anant, senior director of the economic and policy department, said higher private consumption is largely thanks to improvement in all spending categories, especially for non-durable goods because of the relaxation of containment measures as the outbreak situation improved.
  - ❖ The government's stimulus measures also supported a recovery in household consumption and overall economic activities.

- Thailand's manufacturing production index (MPI) continued to drop in February, falling 1.08 per cent to 99.68 points versus a year earlier due to lower oil production, the Office of Industrial Economics reported yesterday.
  - ❖ The industrial output figure of February was lower than Reuters' forecast of a 0.1 per cent rise. In January and December, the MPI fell 2.8 and 2.44 per cent year-on-year, respectively.
    - "Due to the recent Covid-19 infections in February, the government imposed containment measures in some areas, affecting economic activity and domestic demand was stagnated," said OIE chief Thongchai Chawalitpichaet.
  - ❖ Capacity utilization across industries in February stood at 65.08 per cent, down from 66.6 percent the month earlier.
  - ❖ The national production of sugar, electronics components, cars, plastic pellets, and steel increased but was not enough to turn the output positive as oil refinery production softened.
- Deputy Prime Minister Supattanapong Punmeechaow came out to dismiss reports that the government is broke after Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha instructed the Finance Ministry to study possibility of raising the value-added tax (VAT) from 7 per cent.
  - ❖ Supattanapong, also the Energy Minister, said there is no signs indicating that the government was broke. He said the cabinet meeting addressed issues of the government's revenue collection which fell short of target as part of its assessment to the fiscal risks facing the country. He said the government's current financial status is nothing to worry about and said it is normal that the government's revenue has fallen short of target in the wake of pandemic.

- “I don’t understand rumours that were leaked out that sent people to worry that the government plans to raise taxes or it has gone broke. There have been no signs that the government has fallen into such a situation,” Supattanapong said.
- ❖ When asked about the possibility that the government may raise the VAT rate, the DPM denied plans to hike the VAT rate in the next 2 years. He said the cabinet did not mention this issue at all and there is no whatsoever proposal on the issue at its meeting this week.
- Meanwhile, Finance Minister Arkhom Termpittayapaisith has insisted that Thailand still has 2.5 trillion baht in excess liquidity left in the financial system. His ministry is studying how to make use of this amount of liquidity to stimulate the economy.
  - ❖ The Finance Minister insisted that the government continues its investment in basic infrastructure projects to connect Thailand with countries in the Asean region and improve transportation mode among Thais.
  - ❖ The Finance Ministry has the idea of utilising this excess liquidity in the financial system amounting to 202.5 trillion baht to stimulate the economy, Arkhom said, adding that relevant agencies have been instructed to conduct a study on residential zoning or clusters to lay down basic investment projects to facilitate future transport system.
- The Treasury Department will launch online booking for its condominium projects for civil servants and state officials in 12 provinces starting from today to April 30.
  - ❖ The highlight is on a 28-storey condo project located on Sukhumvit road. This condo project comprises 650 rooms, with a floor area of around 34 square metre per room. Prices start from 999,999 baht for rooms located on the 4<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> fl, 1.25 million baht on the 7<sup>th</sup>-15<sup>th</sup> floor and 1.499,999 baht on the 16<sup>th</sup>-28<sup>th</sup> flppr. Prices are variant, depending on the height of the rooms.

- ❖ The Department also has condo projects in other 11 plots in Chiang Rai, Nakhon Nayok, Ubon Ratchathani, Udon Thani, Surat Thani, Yala, Pattani, Prachuap Khiri Khan, Nonthaburi, Nakhon Ratchasima and Chanthaburi.
  - IRPC Plc (IRPC) earmarked a 50 billion baht budget to refinance business and business expansion.
    - ❖ IRPC president and chief executive Chawalit Tippawanich said the 2021 annual general meeting of shareholders has approved a 5-year loan plan of no more than 50 billion baht to refinance its original loan and expand business under a 5-year investment plan under M&A.
    - ❖ Around 36 billion baht is expected to be used to fund M&A deals while the remaining amount will be used for future investment projects under ongoing negotiations.

### **Political News**

- The National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) said it found sufficient evidence to support its move to bring severe ethical misconduct against Supachai Phosu, Bhumjaithai MP for Nakhon Phanom and 2<sup>nd</sup> Deputy House Speaker, on charges of forest encroachment, according to a report by the NACC's fact-finding panel.
  - ❖ Supachai is among 60 MPs and senators (33 MPs, 5 senators, 2 ministers and 20 members of the National Legislative Assembly (NLA) who are facing investigations into their ethical standards by the NACC's panel assigned to look into whether they breach ethical standards for their alleged encroachment on reserved forests.

- ❖ The NACC's panel found sufficient grounds that Supachai has encroached on several hundred rai plots in Dongpratai reserved forest in Nakhon Panom since he served as deputy agriculture and cooperatives minister.
- ❖ The probe panel expects to report its findings in the case to the NACC's main committee within 2 weeks after it visited the reserved forest in question.
- Meanwhile, Palang Pracharat Party (PPRP)-list MP Virat Ratanasate could face the music if prosecutors decide to indict him in a graft-ridden futsal field projects for schools in the Northeast.
  - ❖ NACC deputy secretary-general Niwatchai Kasemmongkol said the NACC is now awaiting decision from the Office of the Attorney-General (OAG) whether to bring the case against Virat before the Supreme Court's Criminal Division for Holders of Political Positions after it had submitted evidence backing the case against Virat.
- Prosecutors indicted 5 pro-democracy activists yesterday on charges of attempting to harm the queen during a street demonstration last October in which some protesters shouted slogans critical of the monarchy.
  - ❖ The 5 individuals are accused of violating Section 110 of the Criminal Code, which says that whoever attempts an act of violence against the queen or the royal heir faces 16-20 years' imprisonment. They include Ekachai Hongkangwan, 45, a veteran activist and social critic who has been attacked several times by unknown assailants. Others facing the charge are Bunkueanun "Francis" Paothong, 21, Suranat Panprasert, 35, a coordinator for a youth group, and 2 others. All have denied the charges and are seeking bail.

- ❖ The encounter took place on a day that more than 10,000 people later staged a rally near the same site outside the offices of Prime Minister Prayut Chan-o-cha to demand that he and his Cabinet resign.
- ❖ Afterward, the Criminal Court granted the 5 men temporary release on bail on a surety of 200,000-300,000 baht each.
- Meanwhile, the Metropolitan Police Bureau (MPB) said it is examining video recordings of anti-government rally at Chamai Maruchet Bridge in Bangkok on Tuesday March 30 to see who they could charge. At the same time, 45 Wevo guards yesterday reported to hear additional charges against them in connection with another rally in front of the Criminal Court on March 6 this year.
  - ❖ The 45 Wevo guards are liable to 4 charges including assaulting officers doing their duty, obstructing officers performing their duty, and illegal possession of military equipment and walkie-talkies and violating the emergency decree and under the Communicable Disease Control Act.
  - ❖ Pol Maj Gen Piya Tawichai, deputy commissioner of the MPB, said the demonstrators were liable to at least 2 charges which are violating the emergency decree and under the Communicable Disease Control Act although he noted that minor skirmishes at the bridge opposite Government House during the rally involving protesters who ignored warnings but the situation had been under control.
- Student activist Panusaya “Rung” Sithijirawatanakul, who is currently detained at the Central Women’s Correctional Institution on lese majeste charge, has skipped dinner for 3 days since March 30, says Corrections Department deputy director-general Tawatchai Chaiwat.
  - ❖ Panusaya informed the Corrections Department that she would still have breakfast and lunch and continue other activities as usual.

- ❖ Meanwhile, Parit “Penguin” Chiwarak, who is now detained at Pathum Thani detention centre on the same charge, is going on a hunger strike for 15 days. Tawatchai said Parit refused to be transferred to the Corrections Department Hospital. He is weak but nothing is serious, Tawatchai said. Parit was given a medication for stomach discomfort. Parit’s relatives can request for him to be transferred to other hospital but the decision rests with the court, the Corrections Department’s deputy chief said.
- The Election Commission (EC) approved for its political party registrar to register “Ruam Thai Sang Chart” (Unite Thais Build Nation) and Mitimai (New Dimension) as new political parties.
  - ❖ The EC’s endorsement will be announced in the Royal Gazette.
  - ❖ The Ruam Thai Sang Chart Party will have Kraiphob Nakhonchaikul as party leader, with a blue hexagon as its logo featuring 3 lines of gold and yellow and the Thai alphabets that read “Ruam Thai Sang Chart”.
  - ❖ Rumour has it that the Ruam Thai Sang Chart Party is poised to become a spare party of the Phalang Pracharat Party (PPPR) as it is noted that Kraiphob is a former candidate in Nakhon Panom’s constituency 2 under the Ruam Phalang Pracharachat Party.
- On the issue of the parliament’s vote on the referendum bill which will be tabled for the 3<sup>rd</sup> reading, senator Wanchai Sornsiri said he is confident that the referendum bill is most likely to survive a deciding 3-reading vote in the Senate.
  - ❖ The referendum bill is expected to be voted on during an extraordinary parliamentary session will be convened on April 7-8 when the parliament address various bills.

- ❖ Senator Surachai Liangboonlertchai, chairman of a parliamentary committee vetting the referendum bill, and his committee plans to meet with representatives of the Council of State today to discuss the changes the Council of State wanted to make to Sections 10 and 11 of the bill. The meeting is expected to decide whether to approve changes made to the referendum bill.
- ❖ Surachai called a meeting with the Senate whips at 9.30 am yesterday to make sure that senators will join hands with MPs in voting to pass the referendum bill, Wanchai said.
- A reporter who reportedly upset Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha for sitting cross-legged before him at a press conference has been temporarily banned from Government House.
  - ❖ The reporter was only identified as a Thai employee of a foreign news agency.
  - ❖ The temporary ban followed an incident during a press briefing at Government House when the prime minister asked the reporter in question, who was sitting crossed legged with one leg pointing at the podium, to put her leg down.
  - ❖ Banyong Suwapong, chair of the ethics committee of the Thai Journalists Association, said that, although women sitting cross-legged is treated as normal these days, the Thai custom of being respectful towards people of seniority remains unchanged and reporters should treat senior figures with respect, through proper attire and conduct.
  - ❖ Natreeya Thaweewong, Director of the spokesperson's office of Government House, came out to explain that the notification to the Japanese news agency about the temporary ban had nothing to do with the inappropriate posture nor had it anything to do with the reporter's tough questions during the press conference.

Natreeya said the messages and photo posted by the reporter were distorted, resulting in a misunderstanding about the prime minister.

### **General News**

- Pol Col Siripong Timula, deputy chief of the Technology Crime Suppression Division, has warned netizens not to share fake new pranks on April Fool's Day which falls on April 1 of every year.
  - ❖ The deputy chief of the high-tech crime police division warned social media users not to spread or share fake messages or pranks, especially about the Covid-19 pandemic or they are likely to face up to 5 years in jail and/or a maximum fine of 100,000 baht under Section 14 (1) of the Computer Crime Act.
- The Centre for the Covid-19 Situation Administration (CCSA) reported 42 new cases of coronavirus infections in the past 24 hours.
  - ❖ Of the new cases, 24 were domestic infections and 18 others referred to imported cases, CCSA spokeswoman Apisamai Srirangsan said.
  - ❖ The domestic cases include 11 in Samut Sakhon, 10 in Bangkok and three in Samut Prakan, she said.
  - ❖ Thailand has so far confirmed a total of 28,863 cases, out of which 27,426 patients have fully recovered and been released from hospitals, while 1,343 others are currently hospitalized and 94 fatalities have been reported.
- Progressive Movement's leader Thanathorn Juangroongruangkit has come out to blast the government for its ineffective vaccination plans.


- ❖ He said that as many as 1 million doses of vaccine are in the storage facilities while the vaccination program is only effective with just about 5,000 vaccines being administered per day.
- ❖ This issue was shot down by the authorities who said that the vaccination plans were on as per previous plans.
