Thai Enquirer Summary

Covid-19 News

- Today the Centre for Covid-19 Situation Administration (CCSA) is set to make the call on the much awaited details about the ‘Phuket Sandbox’.
 - ❖ Despite the planned opening on July 1st there is much confusion on what the details are.
 - ❖ The CCSA will also consider the plan to open Koh Samui, Koh Phangan and Koh Tao in Surat Thani under the “Samui sealed route”, a plan to restart international tourism from July 1 in parallel with the pilot Phuket Sandbox scheme as proposed by the Ministry of Tourism and Sports.
 - ❖ In addition to discussing the Phuket Sandbox policy today, Gen Prayut will also consider easing restrictions enforced in Bangkok, including allowing people to sit and eat in restaurants as normal.
- After the CCSA meeting which will be chaired by 2014 coup leader – Prayut Chan-ocha, the incumbent Prime Minister is set to travel to Phuket on June 25th to see if the planned opening is still on track or not for quarantine free travel.


- To make matters worse, former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra, who has been calling for the country to open its doors to foreign tourism, has come out to say that he feels that the country needs to get its people vaccinated before it opens its doors to foreign tourists.
 - ❖ “How is the prime minister going to do it with his current vaccine program, it is good (to open) but as the prime minister you can't say (you will open) and then not do it,” Thaksin said during the question & answer session in a ClubHouse talk late last night.
 - ❖ “But if he is able to do it, then I have to chom churn (applaud) him,” Thaksin added.
- Before the statement by Thaksin, the opposition Pheu Thai party came out to blast Gen Prayut. The party believes the reopening dilemma between saving the economy and people's lives as it cast doubt on whether the government will get the country's outbreak under control or will be able to 105.5 million doses of Covid-19 vaccine will be delivered this year as promised by the general, Pheu Thai Party spokeswoman Arunee Kasayanond said.
- To complicate the issue, Phuket's own claims of vaccinated population seems to be sending confusing messages.
 - ❖ Phuket's readiness to welcome vaccinated foreign visitors is still in question, a report has come out that Phuket officials have claimed that about 74% of people on the island have received at least 1 vaccination injection in the mass vaccination campaign across the island.
 - ❖ Phuket's population figures may be tweaked to show higher vaccination figures (so claims this article - <https://www.thephuketnews.com/officials-change-definition-of-population-of-phuket-claim-island-74-vaccinated-80369.php>).
 - In the article it states that On Mar 10 Phuket had about 600,000 people, comprising 417,000 people registered as permanent residents in the civil registration database, 100,000 people from other provinces, and 81,000 foreigners and migrant workers. At that point it was expected that vaccination will be administered to about 77.6% [about 465,600] of people living in Phuket, to be able to open to welcome foreign tourists.
 - But in the latest announcement on the Public Relations Dept. website the number of residents are down by more than 133,000 to a mere 466,587



- Despite all the potential concerns about the opening of the ‘Phuket Sandbox’ and the 118 days before the country’s reopening on October 14, 2021
 - ❖ Major companies have hailed the country’s reopening plan within 118 (from 120) days as a good sign for an economic recovery.
 - Sansiri Plc President Srettha Thavisin hailed the Prime Minister’s reopening pledge as a good sign for the economy in parallel with the Thai public health management. He praised Gen Prayut for setting a clear goal and speeding up the country’s readiness for the reopening. This is a good sign for the private sector and small-and-medium-sized enterprises (SMEs), the key driver to the country’s economic development, the Sansiri boss said.
 - William Heinecke, chairman of Minor International Plc (MINT), issued a statement to praise and support Gen Prayut’s reopening plan within 120 days. Heinecke said Gen Prayut’s announcement echoed his strong determination in an attempt to provide remedy to the private sector and businesses affected by the outbreak.

VACCINE Rollout

- Bangkok Metropolitan Administration (BMA) has come out to say that it has received 35,000 bottles of AstraZeneca vaccines late yesterday which could help inoculate 350,000 to 420,000 people (10-12 doses per bottle).
 - ❖ BMA said that it would inoculate those who were left behind by the Mor Prom (age group of 60+ and have pre-existing conditions) as a priority.
 - ❖ The rest would go to the Thai Ruam Jai registrants (age group of 18-59)




- Another allocation of 1 million doses is expected to arrive later next week.
- The number of people vaccinated in the country is barely reached 7% of the total inoculation target of 100 million doses by the end of the year.
 - ❖ At the current rate of inoculation, the country would need to inoculate close to 500,000 people per day to achieve the target.
 - On June 16th just 222,967 doses (less than 45% of the target) were administered throughout Thailand



- The good news is that some areas in the country has higher inoculation than others

- The bad news is that the week of the opening of schools has also seen some schools being hit by the virus.
 - ❖ The 1st week of school term opening has seen some infections
 - Mahasarakham sees children from kindergarten upwards infected with the virus
 - ✓ As many as 9 kids (age 9-10) were infected.
 - ✓ All schools in Mahasarakham have been shut or gone online
 - Chiang Rai also children infected with the virus
 - ✓ 18 children from the age of 9 to 17 were infected.

- Former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra during a ClubHouse discussion yesterday took a shot at Public Health Minister Anutin Charnvirakul when question was raised on what he thinks about Anutin and his mismanagement.

❖ Thaksin said

- “People in the ministry like him when he was deputy minister at MoPH during my time, but since he became minister, he is not the Anuthin we knew.”
- “He only agrees with PM and doesn't give his opinion, so there is a glitch as the people at MoPH are being underutilized.”
- “The vaccines program is the most ridiculous thing that has happened to Thailand.”
- “He (Anutin) has been promoting SinoVac to a point that he forgot Sino Thai.”
- ✓ FYI – Sino Thai Engineering & Construction Plc (STEC) is a company that is owned by the family of Anutin.

Political News

- All eyes are on Deputy Minister of Agriculture and Cooperatives Thamanat Prompow who is predicted to take over the Phalang Pracharat Party (PPRP)'s general secretary post at the party's annual general assembly (AGM) in Khon Kaen today.

❖ It is said that the PPRP's AGM will see the restructuring of the party marked by an overhaul of its executive board.

❖ According to media predictions, Deputy Prime Minister Gen Prawit Wongsuwan will remain as the party leader but have only 4 deputy leaders on his side. The strongest candidates are Suriya Jungrungreangkit, Santi Prompat, Wirat Rattanaseth and Paiboon Nititawan while Capt Thamanat is tipped as the party's secretary-general, replacing Anucha Nakhasai.

- ❖ Meanwhile, Anucha himself came out to deny reports that he had tendered his resignation as the PPRP secretary-general. He said the report is just rampant speculation. The decision for him to keep his post resists with the party leader and members of the executive board. Anucha confirmed his plan to attend the AGM today but denied that the party's restructuring is on top of the meeting agenda as he said there has been no sign from the party leader.
 - ❖ Anucha's statement contradicts Suriya's and Somsak's statement that the party needs restructuring. Suriya and Somsak claimed after seeking a meeting with Deputy Prime Minister Gen Prawit Wongsuwan, as the PPRP leader, yesterday.
 - ❖ It is speculated that Somsak will rise as the PPRP's new strategic chairman, the post held by Gen Prawit prior to taking the party's helm.
 - ❖ The AGM is expected to be attended by 120 members from Nakhon Ratchasima and 250 from Khon Kaen.

- The Phalang Pracharat Party (PPRP)'s annual general assembly scheduled today has wreaked havoc a meeting of the House's committee vetting the budget bill yesterday since vetting panel members on the government side are said to ready themselves to attend the AGM in Khon Kaen today.
 - ❖ The issue of attendance of members in the House's committee vetting the budget bill for the 2022 fiscal year came into focus during the committee's meeting yesterday after Pheu Thai members who sit on the committee witness a lack of attendance among government MPs from the PPRP.
 - ❖ Yutthapong Jarassathian, a Pheu Thai Party MP for Mahasarakham, and Jirayu Huangsap, as members of the House committee vetting the budget bill for the next fiscal year, decried an absence of PPRP MPs, causing the meeting to be cancelled due to a lack of quorum.

- ❖ Yutthapong said the committee requires one-third support of 72 committee members to consider details of the budget bill. However, a head-count requested by Pheu Thai showed that there were not enough members of parliament present in the chamber to make up a quorum. The meeting was then forced to be cancelled due to a lack of quorum as ordered by committee chairman Wichien Chawalit. Wichien ordered the vetting committee to reconvene today.
 - ❖ The meeting witnessed merely 12 MPs on the government bench, says Jirayu who questioned government MPs' obligation to attend the vetting panel's meeting on the 3.1 trillion baht budget bill, deemed the most important legislation.
 - ❖ Jirayu went on to attack government chief whip Wirat Raththanaset who also failed to attend the meeting. The Pheu Thai MP questioned government MPs' role to push for the budget bill to sail through the House. He said among 10 government MPs who remained in the chamber yesterday were Democrat and Bhumjai Thai MPs while the only PPRP MP who showed up at the meeting is the committee chairman.
- The government, opposition and Senate whips have reached an agreement to set a timeframe for the parliament to deliberate draft charter amendments during June 22-24, Chinnaworn Bunyakiat, deputy chief government whip and Democrat Party MP, announced.
 - ❖ The Lower House is set to go ahead with the proceedings of the national referendum bill on June 22. The bill is among 2 unfinished bills.
 - ❖ The House will then table the 14 charter amendment proposals in the 1st reading. The debate is expected to end at 16.00 hrs on June 24 before a vote.
 - ❖ The opposition, government and Senate would be allocated 6 hours each for the and a vote was expected to take place on the afternoon of June 24, Chinnaworn said.

- ❖ Meanwhile, Sukit Atthopakorn, an adviser to the Parliament President, has come out to say that he had asked the parliament's legal team to look into the charter amendment draft submitted by the opposition block seeking to amend Section 256 of the constitution to make way for the setting up of a constitutional drafting assembly (CDA) in fear that the draft may violate the Constitutional Court's ruling on March 11, 2021.
- The Senate came under fire from the opposition amid its pledge to shoot down charter amendment proposals submitted by the opposition bloc and 3 government coalition parties but would vote for the Phalang Pracharat Party (PPRP)-sponsored draft, the only draft that will leave the Senate's power in joining the MPs in voting for a prime minister untouched.
 - ❖ Senator Somchai Sawaengkan asked opposition and government MPs what the Senate has done wrong to deserve being abolished when the clause which allowed the Senate to join MPs' vote for a future prime minister got the nod in a public referendum. He said the Senate normally agrees with whatever choice of PM candidate approved by the Lower House.
 - ❖ Chief opposition whip and Pheu Thai MP Sutin Klungsang said the Senate owed the public an explanation about why it would vote for the PPRP-sponsored draft but reject the others, especially when these drafts are almost identical, why the senators would accept only the PPRP's charter amendment proposal.
- The Office of the Ombudsman has come out to say that it has sufficient evidence that the procurement project concerning 6,000 solar-powered street lamps topped with mythical kinnaree figures of Racha Thewa tambon administration organization (TAO) is plagued with graft.
 - ❖ This means the Racha Thewa TAO could have overpaid for solar-powered light poles with a plane on top.

Economic News

- Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha's pledge to reopen the country within 120 days have got praised from the private sector.
 - ❖ Thai Chamber of Commerce (TCC) chairman Sanan Angubolkul said the Phuket Sandbox scheme scheduled to take effect from July 1 will show off to the world that Thailand can control the Covid-19 outbreak in Phuket. The pilot scheme is a test of Thailand's public health management system before other areas follow suit.
 - ❖ The TCC expects 1 million tourists to return to the Kingdom given the success of the 120-day deadline for the country's reopening, with each spending about 50,000 baht per trip per person, the TCC chairman said, adding that GDP could edge up by 0.3% this year, up from 0.5-2% in the previous prediction.

- ❖ Federation of Thai Industries (FTI) vice-chairman Kriengkrai Thiennukul said a full reopening in October will help generate more than 200 billion baht per month or 400-500 billion baht in the remaining months of the year.
- ❖ Kriengkrai though warned that the people and private operators must not let their guard down like the case of the US and the UK which saw new wave of infections in the wake of their countries' reopening.
- The Thailand Development Research Institute (TDRI) is predicting the Thai economy will start to generate 450-540 billion baht when the country's reopening starts within 120 days.
 - ❖ TDRI research fellow Nonarit Bisonyabut said Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha's pledge to reopening the country within 120 days, which is an aspiration goal, is in the best case for the economy's revival if the government can put the outbreak under control and the vaccination distribution plan to create herd immunity.
 - ❖ Nonarit said Gen Prayut's goal of reopening the economy, which is 4.5 months faster than the Bank of Thailand (BoT)'s prediction, will help put back around 450-540 billion baht into the economy driven by a recovery in the tourism sector and domestic spending if his plan goes according to plan.
 - ❖ The TDRI researcher, however, said the success of the reopening plan rests with the number and quality of vaccine doses. He said the government's goal of administering inoculating 60% of the population with at least 45 million doses starting in June and the next 4 months is far from the goal of achieving herd immunity (estimated at 70% of the population vaccinated).
- Tourism-related and aviation stocks reversed the market trend yesterday following Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha's announcement for his plan to reopen the country

within 120 days, especially on the back of the Phuket Tourism Sandbox policy that will take effect from July 1.

- ❖ Shares of Asia Aviation (AAV) rose 10.71% to end the day at 3.10 baht while Airports of Thailand (AOT) shares closed at 67.50 baht, up 0.37%. , Bangkok Airways (BA) closed up 1.01% at 10 baht.
- Global Power Synergy Plc (GPSC) announced investment in renewable energy aboard with a 20 billion baht budget to come from PTT Plc (PTT).
 - ❖ GPSC has established Global Renewable Synergy Company Limited (GRSC) to invest in solar energy projects overseas. Initially, GRSC plans to invest in a solar farm in India and a wind farm in Taiwan with a combined capacity of more than 2,000 megawatts (MW), said a source with the financial market.
 - ❖ It is reported that PTT will provide financial assistance to GPSC as a long-term loan worth around 20 billion baht for such investment projects.
- Thailand climbed one spot to 28th in the 2021 world competitiveness rankings conducted by the Institute for Management Development (IMD), boosted by improvements made in employment and public finances. However, among its peers within Asean, Malaysia and Indonesia made the greatest gains rising two places to reach 25th and three spots to reach 37th, respectively.
 - ❖ An issue of concern lies in Thailand's international trade in the sub-factor ranking of economic performance, which saw a significant drop from 5th in 2020 to 21st this year.
 - ❖ The IMD, an independent academic institution with Swiss roots and global reach, ranks 64 economies and assesses the extent to which a country promotes the prosperity of its people by measuring economic well-being through hard data and

survey responses from executives. This year, the rankings exposed the economic impact of the pandemic across the globe.

- March 31-June 30, 2021 – The deadline extension to file personal income taxes for the 2020 tax year.
- June, 2021 – Siam Bioscience to start mass production plan of Covid-19 vaccines.
- June, 2021 – 6,174 private firms including around 1 million employees said they want the vaccine distribution provided by the private sector in addition to the government's plan to inoculate factory workers.
- June, 2021 – Bank for Agriculture and Agricultural Cooperatives (BAAC)'s debt holiday is due to expire.
- June, 2021 – Thai Airways expects the bankruptcy court to hold hearings to consider and approve the plan and also appoint an administrator.
- June 18, 2021 – The Phalang Pracharat Party is set to hold an annual general assembly (AGM) in Khonkaen International Convention and Exhibition Center (KICE).
- June 20, 2021 – The 1st batch of 1 million doses will arrive in Thailand.
- June 23, 2021 – The Central Bank will hold the next meeting for key interest rate review.
- June 29, 2021 – The 3 coalition parties, Democrat, Bhumjai Thai and Chartthai Pattana, are planning to submit a charter amendment motion to return to a 2-ballot voting system and curb powers of the Senate.

- August, 2021 – A 3.1-trillion-baht budget spending bill for the fiscal year 2022 will be tabled for 2nd and 3rd readings.
- September 1, 2021 – The government will collect value-added tax from Netflix, Youtube, Google, Facebook as well as other e-commerce services.
- October, 2021 – Bangkok governor election is set to be held.
- October – December, 2021 - The 2nd doses of AstraZeneca would be administered.
- October 1, 2021 – The quarantine measure will be lifted in Krabi, Phang Nga, Pattaya and Chiang Mai.
