Thai Enquirer Summary

Economic News

- The Omicron variant of Covid-19 virus is once again wreaking havoc in the domestic and global capital markets.
 - ❖ Yesterday the Stock Exchange of Thailand dipped 21 points to end at 1,568.69 points as investors panicked on what impact the new variant may have on the economy.
 - ❖ Internationally equity markets reacted negatively to the statement by vaccine maker Moderna's Chief Executive Officer – Stephane Bancel, who said that the current vaccines would not be effective against the Omicron variant.

- Meanwhile, Thailand has come out to deny that it will lockdown the country in case Omicron is found in Thailand.



- ❖ The reports that the country will lockdown emerged after the Cabinet meeting prompting a selloff in the stock market.
- ❖ SET index dropped by 21 points or 1.32%, on active trading value of 159.49 billion baht
- ❖ Over the past 3-days the Thai stocks has plummeted 79.77 points, prompting the market to see an erosion of its market capitalization by as much as 939.71 billion baht.

- The Bank of Thailand (BoT) came out to also state that it was monitoring the Omicron variant.
 - ❖ The BoT said that it was still awaiting data on the new variant similar to other organizations such as World Health Organization (WHO) who are also collecting the data on the new variant.

- Satit Pitutecha, Minister of Public Health, revealed that the Cabinet meeting has approved the Ministry of Public Health's proposal to use the RT-PCR method of testing for COVID-19 for travellers entering the country as was passed earlier.
 - ❖ The government of Prayut was thinking of swapping the RT-PCR to being antigen test but with the outbreak of Omicron variant, the Cabinet has decided to continue with the RT-PCR as a testing tool.
 - ❖ Thailand has opened its borders to as many as 63 countries since November 1, 2021

- The insurance industry continues to witness changes and liquidity issues
 - ❖ In a report Thai Group Holdings Plc (TGH), a company owned by the Srivadhanabhakdi family (owners of Beer Chang) has come out to say that it was merging 2 of its insurance firms – Southeast Insurance and Thai Insurance, in order to reduce duplication and complication.
 - ❖ As part of the move, Chotiphat Bijananda, the CEO of TGH said that the assets of Thai Insurance worth over 7.1 billion baht was being transferred to TGH's subsidiary company and Thai Insurance will honor the policies that have been issued until their expiration of the policy.

- Meanwhile Bloomberg News reported that group of shareholders of Syn Munkong Insurance Plc (SMK) is considering selling a majority stake worth around \$200 million and has selected several buyers, including Assicurazioni Generali and Liberty Mutual Group.
 - ❖ This was mainly due to the value of claims paid in the Q3 2021, was as high as 6.82 billion baht, an increase of 5.26 billion baht or an increase of 339.63% from the total amount of insurance claims paid for COVID-19. Especially the "find and pay" policy, more than 6 billion baht.
 - ❖ Ruangdej Dusadeesurapot, Chairman of Executive Committee and Managing Director SMK rejected the news of the sale of most of its shares but accepted that there is a plan for negotiating capital increase to support business expansion plans admit that the epidemic of Omicron covid variant as this is an added risk for the insurance business.

- Despite the possibility of higher infection, today is the 1st day of the 38th Thailand International Motor Expo 2021 which will last until December 12.
 - ❖ Kwanchai Paphatphong, the organizer of the event said that despite the pandemic he was confident that the number of bookings this year will be close to last year, of around 30,000 vehicles.
 - It is expected that the cash flow of more than 35 billion baht, about 1 million viewers, divided into 80% viewing at the event and 20 online viewing.
 - ❖ This year's automotive expo is witnessing the participation of 32 brands of vehicles and 12 motorcycle brands.
- Siam Makro Plc (MAKRO) is set to organize online roadshow starting December 3 before offering to retail investors and was ready to open for existing shareholders to check their rights to subscribe for PO shares from November 29th.
 - ❖ On December 3, from 15:30 hrs. to 17:00 hrs., one can watch the live broadcast online through Makro's Facebook live channel, or its business partner, Lotus's
 - ❖ The IPO will be offered to retail subscribers.
 - ❖ It can be subscribed through 3 selling agents, which are via the Bangkok Bank Mobile Banking application, SCB Easy application, or at branches nationwide of Bangkok Bank and Siam Commercial Bank. and the TrueMoney Wallet application by KTBST Securities.

Political News

- 2014 coup leader and incumbent Prime Minister Prayut Chan-o-cha is set to head to Udon Thani province to pray to monks and check on the various projects in the province.

- ❖ Prayut is set to travel to the province along with the Deputy Prime Minister Prawit Wongsuwan, the 1st such travel together between the 2 powerful figures of the government since the crack in their relationship was reported a few months ago.
- ❖ The duo were set to leave at around 07:00 hrs and back to Bangkok by late evening.
- Deputy Prime Minister Prawit Wongsuwan, who is famous for his millions of dollar worth watches from dead friends, yesterday had a slip of tongue when he admitted that the Palang Pracharat party (PPRP) had won as many as 4,500 Provincial Administrative Organization (PAO) that took place over the weekend.
 - ❖ “This is a decent showing” General Prawit, who is also the leader of the PPRP said.
 - ❖ The problem is that as a political party is that they are not supposed to send candidates for contesting PAO elections.
 - ❖ Realizing that he had spoken something that was not supposed to be spoken, Gen. Prawit corrected himself saying that ‘these people who won were member of PPRP party and not a candidate filed by the PPRP’.
- The reports that the Saam Mitr (3 friends) faction in the PPRP has been rumbling once again and this time around with the threat to move back to Pheu Thai party.
 - ❖ The Saam Mitr faction, which had moved from Pheu Thai to PPRP prior to the election on March 24, 2019, have been rumbling as their prominence in the PPRP has been eclipsed by Thammanat Prompao, the secretary general of the PPRP who was convicted of drug dealing in Australia.
 - ❖ Members of the Saam Mitr faction have come out to deny any such dealing of returning to Pheu Thai party but the Saam Mitr faction has been credited to being the ‘kingmaker’ in the past few elections.
- Meanwhile the key opposition party – Phue Thai, has come out to say that it was starting its campaign for general elections, on December 6th.
 - ❖ The party that won the highest number of seats in the parliament with 136 Constituency MPs, has come out to say that it would win at least 253 seats this time around.
 - ❖ The campaign will start in Ayutthaya province on December 6th.

- The planned dinner party of the coalition members that was slated later this week has to be postponed indefinitely due to the fear of the outbreak of Omicron variant around the world.
 - ❖ The planned party of the coalition members was supposed to be in late November but had to be pushed to early December but now the government has come out to say that it needs to stand as an example to the people and therefore holding a coalition members party was something that would not be a good move and therefore it is better to postpone the party.
- Yesterday, the Criminal Court ordered a lawyer to submit a request for temporary release Panassaya Sitthijirawatanakul (Rung), a leader of the student movement.
 - ❖ The request for temporary release was based on claim that the student is required to take an exam to graduate, and the defendant insisted that she would not escape or cause any other disturbance.
 - ❖ The Criminal Court considered it appropriate to grant a limited temporary release of the defendant from November 30 to January 12, 2022 and activities are limited and not to cause an impact on the institution, not to join the gathering and to be at the residence at all times unless there is a necessity with permission from the court such as going to hospital, studying and examination.
 - ❖ Rung cannot leave Thailand and has to wear an EM bracelet. If the contract is breached, she will be fined 90,000 baht.
- Meanwhile the Supreme Court's Criminal Division for Political Office Holders, is set to decide on the fate of Suthep Thaugsuban, the leader of the People's Democratic Reform Council (PDRC), on February 17th, 2022.
 - ❖ Suthep was the protest movement that was instrumental in the 2014 coup led by Prayut Chan-o-cha against the government of Yingluck Shinawatra.
 - ❖ The charges laid by the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) against Suthep was that there was corruption in the construction of 396 police stations worth more than 5.8 billion baht during the 2008-2011 government of Abhisit Vejjajiva when Suthep was a Deputy Prime Minister in-charge of the Royal Thai Police.

- The outbreak of the new Omicron variant has now been confirmed in more than a dozen countries.
 - ❖ Confirmed cases of Omicron variant of coronavirus have been found in: - South Africa - Botswana - UK - Netherlands - Germany - Hong Kong - Italy - Belgium - Israel - Denmark - Austria - Czech Republic - Australia - Canada - Portugal - Spain - Sweden – Japan
- At the same time the chief executive of Moderna has predicted that existing vaccines will be much less effective at tackling Omicron than earlier strains of coronavirus and warned it would take months before pharmaceutical companies could manufacture new variant-specific jabs at scale.

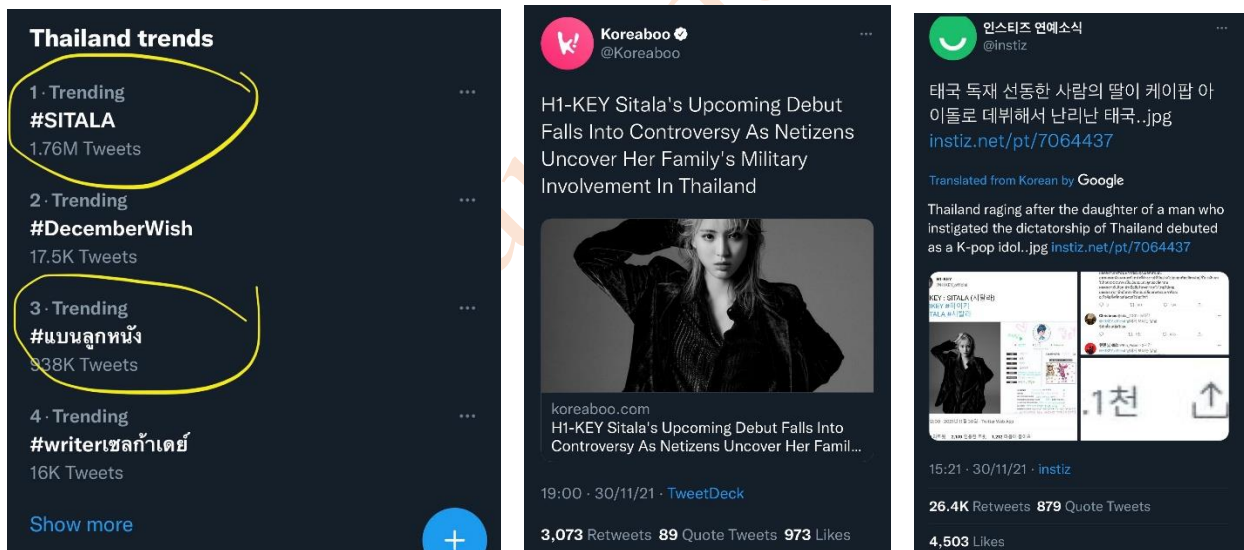
