



Thai Enquirer Summary

Top News

- The Centre for COVID-19 Situation Administration (CCSA) came out to warn that Omicron cases may hit 20,000-30,000 cases per day by the end of January as the highly-contagious variant is sweeping Thailand toward its 5th wave of infections.
 - ❖ Thailand has so far detected 5,397 cases of COVID-19 with the new variant having spread to 71 out of 77 provinces in the country, according to Dr Sumanee Wacharasin, an assistant spokeswoman of the Centre for COVID-19 Situation Administration (CCSA), citing confirmed lab tests.
 - ❖ If the daily number of COVID cases continues to increase in this trajectory, the number of cases could go up to around 20,000 cases per day by the end of January and around 30,000 cases per day by the end of February, Sumanee warned.

- Meanwhile, Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha yesterday came out to urge the people not to panic over reports of the new COVID-19 variant “Deltacron”, saying that the country’s public health system is prepared to tackle any outbreak.
 - ❖ Meanwhile, the Ministry of Public Health (MoPH)’s Medical Health Service Department said the new variant is yet to be recognised by any health authority on the global level.
 - ❖ The Prime Minister has assured the public that Thai health facilities are ready to cope with any COVID variant provided people take full precaution and adhere to measures set by the Public Health Ministry.

Economic News

- The Bank of Thailand (BoT) has come out warn of uncertainties caused by the Omicron variant that could disrupt economic recovery in the 1st half of 2022. The Central Bank said the new wave of the Omicron outbreak can push down gross domestic product to 3.4% for 2022.
 - ❖ The BoT yesterday said the country’s economy could see lower growth in the 1st half of 2022 than a baseline scenario due to uncertainties caused by the Omicron variant of the coronavirus.
 - ❖ The BoT is keeping a close eye on a number of downside risks on the Thai economic recovery including short-term impacts of the Omicron epidemic, a recovery of the manufacturing sector and the Thai labour market that remains fragile as well as domestic and external factors that will put pressure on the inflation, Piti Disyatat, an assistant governor at the Central Bank, said.
 - “If inflation needs to be managed, increasing interest rates will be our main tool,” Piti said.
 - ❖ Inflation is also seen increasing temporarily in the first half of 2022, but would still be within target, Piti said.
 - ❖ The Central Bank’s Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) is due to meet for the 1st time in 2022 on February 9.

- After coming out to deny that the African Swine Flu (ASF) was spread and killed large numbers of pigs in Thailand, the Department of Livestock Development at first the Department is said to prepare to seek a 500-million-baht budget to manage the ASF in Thailand.
 - ❖ Talking about reports that the ASF outbreak has wreaked havoc in piggeries across Ratchaburi, Nakhon Pathom, Chon Buri, Chachoengsao, Prachin Buri, Khon Kaen and some provinces in the north and south, the Department has now said it is awaiting results of the blood samples examined at the National Institute of Animal Health.
 - ❖ Results are expected to come out in the next 2 days, the Department said, adding that it will announce results to the public as soon as possible.
 - ❖ When asked about the next step to take, the Department said the government has in the past earmarked a budget of around 1.142 billion baht to assist small-scale pig farmers. The Department is now planning to seek an additional budget of 500 million baht from the Cabinet.
- Meanwhile, Surachai Sutthitham, president of the Thai Swine Raisers Association came out to reveal that the ASF outbreak has swept Thailand since April 2019.
 - ❖ The outbreak has wiped out 1,100,000 sows from the system, leaving merely 500,000 sows and 12-13 million piglets.
- Prices of fresh food products are gradually increasing with pork price rise not stopping the rise. The National Swine Raisers Association announced the recommended price. raise the price of pork to (Living pigs in front of the farm) that is to rise by another 4 baht per kilogram from January 2, moving up to 110 baht per kg.
 - ❖ The suggested price for wholesale at retail stores is 176 baht per kg and the suggested retail price is 218- per kg.
 - ❖ Pork prices have been on the rise and yesterday rose another 12 baht, and it is expected that in the next few days.

- Commerce Minister Jurin Laksanawisit will today seek a cabinet approval for a central budget to subsidise prices of pork in the Thong Fah (Blue Flag) low-priced shops set at 150 baht per kilogram and a budget to support small scale pig farmers.
 - ❖ The Office of National Farmers Council has assessed that more than 50% of pig farms across the country have been damaged from the African Swine Flu (ASF), Apisak Angkhasit, deputy chief of the Council, said, citing data that the ASF has caused deaths of 120,000 sows, leaving merely 500,000 in the system.
 - ❖ The Council did not oppose the prospect of pork meat imports from overseas but it must come from the European Union (EU), not from the US due to chemical growth hormone.
- To make matters worse all kinds of food prices are on the rise and poultry products such as chicken and eggs are all on a rise.

Thailand's leading media house, Thai Rath came out with this graphic in today's paper, it shows

- Eggs are prices as high as 6 baht per egg
 - Pork is at around 50+ baht per kg
 - Chicken @ 13 baht per kg
 - Expressway has seen the price rise of 15-35 baht per trip
 - LPG prices are set to rise on February 1, 2022
 - Electricity prices are to rise by 5%
- The operator of the Khlong Saen Saep commuter boats is set to raise boat fare by 1 baht from January 14, citing a rise in petrol prices.
 - ❖ Managing director Chaowalit Methayaprapas said fares for short trips along Saen Saep Canal will be raised by 1 baht after the company has keep the price fixed since 2020, accounting for more than 600 days.
 - Meanwhile PTT Plc announced that it will raise the price of all benzene oils by 40 satang per litre, except for E85 up by 20 satang per litre, effective from today.
 - ❖ The Energy Policy and Planning Office (EPPO) plans to propose additional measures to the National Energy Policy Council (NEPC) to look after retail prices of liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) for households after the subsidy to cap on cooking gas at 318 baht per 15 kilogram cylinder ends at the end of this month.
 - Clear criteria for calculating withholding tax on profits from cryptocurrency and digital asset trading are expected be finalised this month, the Revenue Department director-general said.
 - ❖ Ekniti Nitithanprapas said Prime Minister Prayut Chan-o-cha had instructed the department to brainstorm with all parties in clarifying the issue for investors and the public in general. Profits earned from cryptocurrency trading, Bitcoin mining and the dividends or interest gained from investment in cryptocurrencies were all subject to a 15% withholding tax, he said.
 - ❖ Ekniti said the department had discussed the matter with the Bank of Thailand, the Securities and Exchange Commission and the Stock Exchange of Thailand. It would hold a public hearing with private sector representatives and establish guidelines on tax collection.
 - Marisa Sukosol Nunphakdi, president of the Thai Hotels Association (THA), said that hotel occupancy rates are now down more than 90% from November-December 2021.

- ❖ The occupancy has dipped due to the outbreak of the new virus and the suspension of the ‘Test & Go’.
 - ❖ The association asked the government to expand the sandbox area to Hua Hin, Pattaya, Bangkok and Chiang Mai, as well as accelerate the ‘We Travel Together Phase 4’ project to attract Thai people to travel to Thailand.
 - ❖ According to the survey, more than 49% of hotels are worried about returning to lockdown. Most foreign tourists are prohibited from entering the country again.
 - ❖ She said that if businesses are hit again, more than 72% of hotels will cut labor costs through reduced hours, take unpaid leave, while 17% will decide to temporarily close their business.
- The problems of the poor are least of the concerns for those with money as the latest report from the luxury car market – Rolls Royce, shows that the car market has had its best year since its founding more than a century ago.
 - ❖ Rolls-Royce CEO Torsten Müller-Ötvös said the carmaker sold 5,586 vehicles to customers in more than 50 countries in 2021, the largest number in its 117-year history despite all the volatility wrought by the global health crisis.

Political News

- The opposition Pheu Thai Party came out to cry foul over claims of military boss’s wielding influence over army troops to vote for coalition party candidates in the Bangkok’s Constituency 9 (Laksi and Chatuchak districts) by-election. There are also reports that
 - ❖ Sorawong Thienthong, Pheu Thai Party deputy leader, as the party’s election director, said he received reports that some high-ranking state official is trying to influence army troops, their families and commissioned soldiers of some army units to vote for a certain political party, citing information from someone who resides in an army housing unit.

- ❖ Sorawong called on military commanders to ensure fairness and not interfere in the by-election process.
- ❖ Sorawong also called on Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha, in his capacity as the Defence Minister, to ensure that military commanders must uphold their neutrality and follow the rule of law. Sorawong urged military personnel and their soldiers who love democracy to record any electoral-fraud incidents as evidence to show the public.
- ❖ Sorawong said there are reports of attempts to induce voters with 1,500 baht each in exchange for their ID cards. The Pheu Thai deputy head called for the Election Commission (EC) to examine such a claim in fear that electoral fraud has been committed in the upcoming by-election.
- Deputy Prime Minister Gen Prawit Wongsuwan, as the Palang Pracharat Party (PPRP) leader, reportedly help the PPRP candidate in the by-election in Constituency 6 of Songkhla woo voters.
 - ❖ Despite mounting criticism of spending his office hours to help the PPRP candidate campaign for votes in the upcoming by-election, Gen Prawit visited the southern province to inspect state development projects in the southern border provinces. Gen Prawit then showed up at the campaign for Anukool Pruksanusak, the PPRP candidate, yesterday evening.
 - ❖ It is said that PPRP key members including Capt Thamanat Prompow, the party's secretary-general, Labour Minister Suchart Chomklin, as director of the by-election in Constituency 6 of Songkhla, and more than 20 MPs from Rayong, Chonburi, Ratchaburi, Sakaew and Kanchanaburi also showed up to join the campaign speech.
 - ❖ Suchart voiced confidence in the PPRP's chance to win before going on the PPRP's campaign rally last night. It is estimated that around 3,000 people turned up to attend the rally.



- Sanhapoj Srisukmuang, Palang Pracharat Party (PPRP) MP for Nakhon Si Thammarat, has come out to attack Democrat Party ministers for allowing prices of daily commodity products to rise amid the current economic woes.
 - ❖ Sanhapoj came out to put the blame on Commerce Minister Jurin Laksanawisit for the case of rising pork prices. The PPRP MP said the Commerce Minister failed to help small scale pig farmers cope with the African Swine Flu (AFS) outbreak in pigs and rising feed costs, attributing to an increase of pork prices. He suspected that Jurin may have known about the AFS outbreak that has been around for more than 2 years.
 - ❖ Sanhapoj then went on to criticise the Ministry of Agriculture and Cooperatives, which directly oversees prices of agricultural products, for its inefficiency in controlling the price movements of agricultural products. This portfolio again belongs to the Democrat Party.
 - ❖ Jurin still refrain from making response to criticism raised by the PPRP while he is helping campaign for by-elections in Songkla and Chumphon. Jurin said he did not want to say the by-election is around the corner because he did not want his remarks to draw criticism.
- The Democrat Party is set to lose another House seat following the resignation of Nattaya Benjasiriwan, its Bangkok MP for Saphan Sung and Prawet districts.
 - ❖ It is said that Nattaya has instructed her team to tender her resignation to the party's political registrar to be submitted to the Election Commission (EC).
 - ❖ Nattaya is said to apply for membership of the Thai Sang Thai (Build Thai) Party under the leadership of Khunying Sudarat Keyuraphan. It is said that Thai Sang Thai plans to field Nattaya to contest for a seat in Saphan Sung and Prawet districts under its party's banner.
 - ❖ It is said that Nattaya has twice submitted her resignation to the registrar of political parties on the same day. First time, she resigned from the Democrat Party to join the Bhumjai Thai Party and then returned to join the Democrats before deciding to leave the Democrat Party again on December 24, 2021 in order to defect Thai Sang Thai.
- Progressive Movement leader Thanathorn Juangroongruangkit has come out to talk about 10 changes that can be expected to happen in 2022 but refused to talk about criticism of him receiving 2 shots of the AstraZeneca vaccine.

- ❖ In his Facebook message, the Progressive Movement chairman urged Thais to keep an eye on 10 changes in key global and domestic political issues anticipated this year. Thanathorn said a new wave of COVID-19 around the world is another sign that this year will be another year of challenges and uncertainties, not only in terms of public health and economic issues but political challenges in many countries that will affect the entire world.
- ❖ Thanathorn, however, did not respond to criticism of him receiving 2 doses of the AstraZeneca vaccine.



Issues to be watched out for

- January 7, 2022 – The Ministry of Tourism and Sports is pushing to extend its "Sandbox" initiative to 6 more provinces the Centre for Covid-19 Situation Administration (CCSA)'s meeting.
- January 16, 2022 – The by-elections in constituency 1 Chumphon and constituency 6 Songkhla expected to be held.
- January 6, 2022 – April 5, 2022 – The government plans to ban exports of live pigs for 3 months to solve the problem of rising pork prices.
- January 17, 2022 - January 31, 2022 – The Ministry of Finance is set to sell new savings bonds worth 30 billion baht to raise funds for government policies aimed at relieving the economic and social impact of Covid-19.
- January 1 and February 15 – The government will offer shoppers a tax deduction of up to 30,000 baht per person on their goods purchased.
- January 30, 2022 – Confirmed date for by-election in Constituency 4 of Bangkok to fill in a vacant seat left by government MP Sira Jenjaka.
- February 2022 – The opposition is set to file a general debate without a vote under Section 152 of the constitution.

- February 17, 2022 – The Supreme Court’s Criminal Division for Political Office Holders, is set to decide on the fate of Suthep Thaugsuban, the leader of the People’s Democratic Reform Council (PDRC), the protest movement that was instrumental in the 2014 coup led by Prayut Chan-o-cha against the government of Yingluck Shinawatra, on the charges laid by the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC), citing that there was corruption in the construction of 396 police stations worth more than 5.8 billion baht during the 2008-2011 government of Abhisit Vejjajiva when Suthep was a Deputy Prime Minister in-charge of the Royal Thai Police.
- February 28, 2022 – The Ministry of Finance plans to reassess the impact of the outbreak on the economy and release official economic growth forecast.
- March-April, 2022 – The 4th phase of the half-half co-payment subsidy scheme to stimulate spending on goods are set to take effect.
- May, 2022 – Ordinary parliamentary sessions resume.
- May 31–June 2, 2022 – The budget bill for the 2022 fiscal year is scheduled to be debated in the House of Representatives.
- August 24, 2022 – The last day as per the current constitution for Prayut to be the Prime Minister under the 2016 constitution Article 158 which forbids a person to be in Prime Minister’s position for more than 8-years continuously or with breaks.
