Thai Enquirer Summary

Economic News

- The Thai government has come out to say that it was unlikely to lift the Test & Go ban in the near future.
 - ❖ This comes as businesses and tourists from around the world have been demanding the lifting of the ban that was put in place earlier this month, just a month or so after it was implemented.

- William Heinecke, the chairman of Minor International Plc (MINT), has come out to send yet another open letter to the government of Thailand to open the 'Test & Go' system for tourism.
 - ❖ Bill has asked for more 'sandbox' cities if the 'Test & Go' is not put in place while at the same time asked for restaurants to be able to serve alcohol.
 - ❖ He asked for restrictions on hours of alcoholic beverages to be lifted, especially for restaurants that have received SHA Plus hygienic safety standards, which will definitely benefit the country's tourism industry.

- The government is set to collect a 300-baht entry fee per person from foreign visitors, starting from April 1, 2022 to fund the development of local tourist attractions and for tourists' insurance coverage.
 - ❖ The Thai government is pushing ahead with a controversial proposal to collect a 300 baht tourism fee from all international visitors arriving in Thailand. The contentious proposal to go ahead with the scheme was initially approved by the National Tourism Policy Committee in 2020.
 - ❖ The fee will be added to air ticket prices, says government spokesman Thanakorn Wangboonkongchana.
 - ❖ However, relevant agencies have yet to decide method of collection for entry by land, said Thanakorn.
 - ❖ Initially, the government estimates that the new entry fee may generate 1.5 billion baht for state coffers as it projects 5 million international visitors will visit the Kingdom this year. Thanakorn also said Thailand is expected to welcome nearly 15 million visitors throughout the year, which will generate between 1.3 and 1.8 trillion baht in revenue.
 - ❖ Sittiwat Chiwarattan, the chief of the Association of Thai Travel Agents (ATTA) called on the government to drop its proposal for the collection in November.
 - “Collecting an additional fee will increase the travel budget of international visitors. It will affect their decisions to skip Thailand.”
- The Joint Standing Committee on Commerce, Industry and Banking (JSCCIB) yesterday maintained its growth outlook for the year to between 3% and 4.5% and export growth of 3% to 5% as it sees only a limited impact on the country's economy from the new wave of the outbreak driven by the Omicron variant.
 - ❖ During the teleconference, JSCCIB chairman Sanan Angubolkul said the body expect the impact from the Omicron variant to be felt in the 1st quarter of 2022 then economic recovery will continue in the 2nd quarter.
 - ❖ The body maintained its outlook for gross domestic product expansion this year of 3% to 4.5% and export growth of 3% to 5%. Inflation was seen rising at 1.2% to 2% this year, but short-term policies to support rising food prices were needed.
 - ❖ The group expects 5 to 6 million foreign tourists this year, it said in a statement. That compares to nearly 40 million in 2019.

- The Supreme Administrative Court overturned the Administrative Court of First instance's verdict to dismiss the case against Bangkok Entertainment Co., Ltd., the operator of Channel 3, which requested the revocation of the Office of the National Broadcasting and Telecommunications Commission (NBTC)'s order to suspend consumer exploitation advertisements during 2014.
 - ❖ In a dispute between Channel 3 and the Supreme Administrative Court yesterday ruled that advertising exceeds the actual specified ad time limit. The channel is deemed taking advantage of consumers in the broadcasting and television business.
 - ❖ Prior to the lawsuit, the NBTC claimed that it has received complaints that there are advertisements that exceed the law. It appears that on August 19, 22, 23, 24 2014, in every Channel 3 program, there are certain periods of the program that have an advertising period of more than 12 and a half minutes per hour as prescribed in Section 23 Broadcasting and Television Business Act 2551
- Thai President Foods, the manufacturer of "Mama", has confirmed that it will not raise prices of its instant noodles.
 - ❖ Manlika Boonmeetrakul-Mahasuk, adviser to the Commerce minister, said the ministry received confirmation from Thai President Foods that it will not raise the price of its packet instant noodles which are mass products. The company is committed to helping alleviate people's financial burden, Manlika added.
 - ❖ Commerce Minister Jurin Laksanawisit has instructed the Department of Internal Trade to negotiate with manufacturers who produce necessities to retain their price cap to reduce the burden of the people in the country.
- The Department is set to hold discussion on the day to clarify 3 issues before imposing the tax including how to calculate and pay such tax; how the tax rate can be relaxed; and whether the tax is considered a value-added tax, income tax or withholding tax, as well as how it will be collected.
- The Taiwanese government has imposed a fine on people who try to bring pork or pork products from Thailand into Taiwan of at least NT\$200,000 (approximately 240,000 baht) after a African swine fever (ASF) outbreak was confirmed by the Thai government, according to the International Community Radio Taipei.
 - ❖ Anyone caught trying to bring Thai pork into Taiwan will be fined NT\$200,000 (240,000 baht) while repeat offenders will be fined NT\$1 million (1.2 million baht), the source said.

- ❖ Visitors caught at airports or seaports trying to bring in Thai pork and who are unable to pay the fine upfront will be denied entry into Taiwan and deported.
 - ❖ A package from Thailand containing kunchieng (sweet Chinese-style) sausages was flagged by a post office in Tainan on December 15, and a lab test conducted on the package on December 17 revealed that the items had the ASF virus.
 - ❖ Department of International Trade Promotion (DITP) Director-General Phusit Rattanakul said he had instructed trade attaches at every Thai embassy to follow up on pork imports from Thailand and other countries. He said the case of the parcel of kunchieng from Thailand was a one-off as the parcel was sent by an individual in Thailand to their relatives in Taiwan. Taiwan normally bans imports of meat and meat products from other countries, Phusit said, playing down reports that the African Swine Flu will affect pork exports from Thailand.
- PSG Corporation Plc (PSG) won a construction project for XPPL Expansion Phase 1 in Lao PDR.
 - ❖ PSG Chief executive officer David Van Dau announced that the company has been selected as the successful tenderer for the construction of XPPL Expansion Phase 1 Project of Xekong Power Plant Company Limited, worth US\$263,955,452 (approximately 8.895 billion baht).
 - ❖ PSG is poised to be the contractor for construction works related to the expansion for the project owner to increase its coal production base from approximately 2.94 million tons per year to 15 million tons per year. The construction will have a construction period of approximately 32 months.
 - ❖ The share price of PSG yesterday rose from 0.11 baht/share or 9.57% to 1.26 baht/share, with a market value of 269 million baht.
 - Reports in local media ran a lead story for the front page today but please read the details.
 - ❖ The article states that a company which has assets of a mere 288 million baht (as of end of 2020) and 263.62 million baht as of end of its Q3 2021 (<https://www.settrade.com/settrade/stock-quote/financialstatement?symbol=PSG>) has won a mining deal worth 9 billion baht in Laos.
 - ❖ The surprising aspect of this company is
 - Market capitalization of 87.7 billion baht (bigggg B for billion there)
 - Net loss of 52.5 million (big M there) for Q3 ending September 2021.



- BCPG Plc, the power generation arm of energy conglomerate Bangchak Corporation Plc, has ventured into the cross-border transmission line business to support its overseas electricity sales, following an acquisition of US\$32 million (1.07 billion baht) worth of shares in Laos-based Nam Tai Power Sole Co (Nam Tai).
 - ❖ A 25% common share in Nam Tai, bought from Phongsubthavy Group Sole Co, will grant BCPG a right to operate the transmission system to sell electricity from Laos to state-owned Vietnam Electricity (EVN) in Vietnam. The investment, approved by the BCPG board late last year, was done through BCPG's wholly-owned BCPG Indochina Co.
 - ❖ BCPG said the share acquisition in Nam Tai would enable it to develop and operate a 220-kilovolt transmission line system and substations to supply "green electricity" from the Nam Tai hydropower project to EVN.
- Dr. Suthiphon Thaweechaikarn, secretary-general of the Insurance Commission (OIC), revealed that the OIC has sent a team of legal and litigation teams to investigate the facts in the case of an employment announcement on social media about child ligament.
 - ❖ It states that it must be a N child who has to be infected with Covid only. There is an ATK test confirming the result. The employer hopes to be infected with the covid in order to claim insurance money from the insurance company.
 - ❖ Recently, the person who posted the message has been found. which the poster has insured for covid with a company as well The OIC will expedite the investigation. for further legal proceedings

Political News

- Candidates in the upcoming by-elections have come out to complain about rampant vote-buying in the last leg of election campaign for the approaching by-election in Chumphon and Songkhla province while Deputy Prime Minister Gen Prawit Wongsuwan, as the Palang Pracharat Party (PPRP) leader, has come out to downplay rifts in the coalition parties in the wake of frenzied and fierce campaign rallies.
 - ❖ Gen Prawit said campaign rallies by rival candidates of the coalition parties have no impact on the government's stability because the upcoming by-elections have nothing to do with the government. The coalition parties have good understanding toward one another, pointing 5 by-elections in the past years that ended without any issues.
- The by-elections in Laksi constituency in Bangkok is also facing massive vote buying and claims are being made that the vote buying per person price has risen to as much as 3,000 baht.
 - ❖ Atavit Suwannapakdee, Kla Party candidate, said he had received reports that communities by canals are riddled with vote-buying. He said residents have been offered a one-off payment of 3,000 baht per person in exchange for their votes. Most people know who the main canvasser in Laksi district is.
 - ❖ When asked about the opposition Pheu Thai Party's claims of attempts to buy identification cards of voters with a 1,500-baht reward each, Gen Prawit said he had no knowledge of such incident and the PPRP was not involved.
- Drug smuggling convict Capt. Thamanat Prompow, who is the secretary-general of the Palang Pracharat Party (PPRP), could land himself in trouble after the Kao Klai (Move Forward) Party came out to accuse him of trying to make a campaign speech that violated the Election law in promotion of PPRP candidate to lure voters during the by-election campaign in Songkhla province.
 - ❖ Thiwach Damkaew, Move Forward Party candidate in the upcoming by-election in constituency 6 of Songkhla, filed a complaint with the Election Commission (EC) against Thamanat, accusing him of violating the Election Act.
 - Thiwach presented an audio clip of Thamanat's campaign speech as evidence to the EC.

- In the audio clip, Thamanat's speech on January 7, 2022, promoted PPRP candidate Anukul Prueksanusak. He promised to give money to people in trouble.
- ❖ Capt Thamanat's speech promising to give a handout in exchange for support might have violated Section 73 of the Election Act of 2018 which prohibits a candidate or party representative from promising to give a handout in exchange for support.
- ❖ The problem arises because the Australian drug convict Thamanat is also the secretary-general of the PPRP and (if) he's found guilty, the PPRP could be dissolved.
- ❖ Kusol Te-asan, chief investigator of the Songkhla election committee, accepted the complaint for consideration.
- The battle for voting seems to be bringing the 2 coalition partners on the brink of an all out war.
 - ❖ The PPPR & Democrats in logger heads on who came up with the policy of 'co-payment'
 - ❖ Gen. Prawit went on stage to take credit for the scheme and later came out to deny any rift in the coalition.
 - ❖ Jurin Laksanawisit, the leader of the Democrat party, also comes out to say that it was the coalition that thought through the scheme as it was a scheme that was put in place after Covid-19 hit the country.
 - "This is an issue of election and once the election is over, we will be back to our normal relationship" Gen. Prawit came out to say when asked if the rift could divide the coalition further.
- The National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) is taking aim at former prime minister Yingluck Shinawatra and 2 senior colleagues who served under her previous government.
 - ❖ The NACC said its committee resolved to bring a lawsuit against Yingluck, Suranand Vejjajiva and her deputy prime minister Niwatthamrong Boonsongpaisan for committing offences and abused their authority during a public relations roadshow campaign to publicise infrastructure development projects in 2013.

- ❖ The alleged offences are related to the 240-million-baht Building the Future of Thailand in 2020 project launched in 2013 at her instruction as prime minister.
- ❖ The NACC is set to file the lawsuit against Yingluck, her 2 former colleagues and 2 media companies commissioned to run the roadshow namely Matchon Plc and Siam Sport Syndicate Plc, within 2 weeks.
- ❖ The anti-graft body said it is currently drafting a statement.
- The National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) has published the declared assets and liabilities of 2 state officials including Korawat Panprapakorn, former director-general of the Department of Special Investigation (DSI) and new Senate Secretary Napaporn Jaisajja.
 - ❖ According to the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC)'s asset declaration lists, Pol Lt Col Korawat and spouse reported total assets of 21.060 million baht when left the post on October 1, 2021. Korawat's assets alone comprise 12.462 million baht, of which include 920,180 million baht in bank deposits, an investment sum of 1,454,196 baht, 2 plots of land in Samut Prakan and Chiang Mai worth a combined 4,370,800 baht, buildings and property worth 1.7 million baht, vehicles worth 944,000 baht and other assets worth 2.1 million baht.
 - ❖ Napaporn, who is single, has total assets of 10,339,640 baht and no debt upon taking office on October 1, 2021. Napaporn's assets comprise 153,408 baht in bank deposits; 834,827 baht in investments, 5 land title deeds in Pathum Thani, Chiang Mai and Nakhon Sawan provinces, etc.
- Local media organisations are gearing up for rallies against a media-control draft bill.
 - ❖ Pramed Lekpetch, former president of the Thai Journalists Association (TJA), revealed that 6-7 local media organisations including regional ones are studying details of a draft bill on the promotion of media ethics and professional standards passed the approval of the Cabinet on January 11. The groups will coordinate and seek opinions of members in preparation for next steps in opposition to the Cabinet's approval. The draft bill will still require many steps in the Parliament before it can pass into law.
 - ❖ After a cabinet review, the bill was amended to state that employees of state-run media outlets have the right to refuse a superior's order if they believe it goes against media ethics. If passed, the council will get at least 25 million baht in state funding each year.
- 2014 coup leader Gen. Prayut Chan-o-cha has continued to make changes to the Government House as a way to beef up his good fortunes.


- ❖ He now has ordered to adjust the landscape inside the Government House by planting 50 types of auspicious trees.

Issues to be watched out for

- January 16, 2022 – The by-elections in constituency 1 Chumphon and constituency 6 Songkhla expected to be held.
- January 6, 2022 – April 5, 2022 – The government plans to ban exports of live pigs for 3 months to solve the problem of rising pork prices.
- January 17, 2022 - January 31, 2022 – The Ministry of Finance is set to sell new savings bonds worth 30 billion baht to raise funds for government policies aimed at relieving the economic and social impact of Covid-19.
- January 1 and February 15 – The government will offer shoppers a tax deduction of up to 30,000 baht per person on their goods purchased.

- January 30, 2022 – Confirmed date for by-election in Constituency 4 of Bangkok to fill in a vacant seat left by government MP Sira Jenjaka.
- February 2022 – The opposition is set to file a general debate without a vote under Section 152 of the constitution.
- February 9, 2022 – The Central Bank’s Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) is scheduled its 1st meeting.
- February 17, 2022 – The Supreme Court’s Criminal Division for Political Office Holders, is set to decide on the fate of Suthep Thaugsuban, the leader of the People’s Democratic Reform Council (PDRC), the protest movement that was instrumental in the 2014 coup led by Prayut Chan-o-cha against the government of Yingluck Shinawatra, on the charges laid by the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC), citing that there was corruption in the construction of 396 police stations worth more than 5.8 billion baht during the 2008-2011 government of Abhisit Vejjajiva when Suthep was a Deputy Prime Minister in-charge of the Royal Thai Police.
- February 28, 2022 – The Ministry of Finance plans to reassess the impact of the outbreak on the economy and release official economic growth forecast.
- March-April, 2022 – The 4th phase of the half-half co-payment subsidy scheme to stimulate spending on goods are set to take effect.
- May, 2022 – Ordinary parliamentary sessions resume.
- May 31–June 2, 2022 – The budget bill for the 2022 fiscal year is scheduled to be debated in the House of Representatives.
- August 24, 2022 – The last day as per the current constitution for Prayut to be the Prime Minister under the 2016 constitution Article 158 which forbids a person to be in Prime Minister’s position for more than 8-years continuously or with breaks.
