Thai Enquirer Summary

Political News

- On the progress of a general debate without a vote sought by the opposition bloc, Parliament President Chuan Leekpai said he had received the motion from the opposition seeking a general debate without a vote under Section 152 last week.
 - ❖ Chuan said he has not put the motion on parliament's agenda as he has to call government and opposition whips for a discussion. The House President said the Cabinet has not coordinate with him on the matter.
 - ❖ There are 4 more weeks left before the current sitting in parliament goes into recess on February 28. Chuan said he has yet to be able to finalise the allocation of debate time for each side.
 - ❖ He has only learned from the opposition leader that the opposition wants the debate to be held in the middle of February.
- Campaigning for by-election in Constituency 9 of Bangkok to be held this Sunday turned into bitter rows. The by-elections are slated to take place this Sunday.
 - ❖ Sira Jenjaka, former Palang Pracharat Party MP who was disqualified by the Constitutional Court, took on Pheu Thai Party candidate Surachart Thienthong. Sira came out to petition the Election Commission (EC) to look into Surachart's campaign advertising a 20-baht flat rate fare for electric train commuters throughout electric train routes.

- ❖ Sira asked the poll agency to probe Surachart as to whether the latter breached the MP election law on campaigning. Sira claimed that Surachart may have violated Section 73(5) of the law. The clause involves prohibited campaigning methods -- deception, coercion, threat, slandering or enticement which leads people to misunderstand about the popularity of a candidate.
 - ❖ The disqualified MP said even if Surachart wins this by-election, he will be elected as an MP. Sira said that Surachart alone would not have power to make changes to state policy or cancel electric rail concessions with the private sector.
 - ❖ Pheu Thai sticks by Surachart as its spokesperson Theerarat Samretwanit came out to deny that Surachart is trying to entice voters with false information. She said Surachart's policy is possible. The policy has been taunted by the party since 2001 by the now-defunct Thai Rak Thai Party, again in 2007 by the People's Power Party and in 2019 as part of Pheu Thai's campaign policy.
 - ❖ Theerarat insisted that the idea is possible after consulting with several state agencies and experts such as the Thailand Development Research Institute (TDRI), the Ministries of Transport and Finance to prepare for financial readiness to materialise this campaign policy.
 - ❖ Pheu Thai is set to hold a major speech rally with Pheu Thai Party leader Chonlanan Srikaew, party executive members, MPs and party members to support Surachart on January 28 at Keha Laksi Park.
- An international polling agency has come out to predict that the Laksi by-elections will see Pheu Thai party winning the seat by a landslide.
 - ❖ The polls indicate that more than 70% of the eligible voters are set to come out to vote and the winning candidate may get more than 70,000 out of the more than 167,000 voters in the constituency.

- The opposition Kao Klai (Move Forward) Party yesterday ramped up campaign in the last leg of the by-election in Constituency 9 of Bangkok to assist its by-election candidate, Karunpol Thiansuwan.
 - ❖ Move Forward Party leader Pita Limjaroenrat along with executive members list MP Amarat Chokepamitkul, Rangsiman Rome to campaign for votes in support of Karunpol at the Army's Post Engineer Department in Laksi District. A large number of soldiers and families attended Move Forward's campaign speech rally.
 - ❖ During the speech, Pita pledged to reform and modernise the Thai armed forces in an attempt to prevent future coups which happens on an average of every 6 years in Thailand.
 - ❖ The Move Forward Party leader also spelt out the party's goal of creating better welfare for low-ranking soldiers and their families. The party intends to cut down excessive numbers of army generals and use the budget to fund their salaries to make better living for low-ranking soldiers.
 - ❖ Rangsiman Rome said if Move Forward rises to become government, he will again push for the abolition of military conscription after its draft bill on the matter failed to pass the parliament.
 - ❖ Karunpol said he understand economic hardships facing low-ranking army officers because he was born in a family of civil servants. He learned first-hand and understood the lives of low-ranking government officials who are neither wealthy nor have strings to pull.
- On the Palang Pracharat Party (PPRP), Deputy Prime Minister Prawit Wongsuwan, in his capacity as leader of the PPRP, yesterday signed an order to appoint Deputy Finance Minister and PPRP deputy leader Santi Promphat, as the party's new secretary-general, replacing Captain Thammanat Prompao who was axed along with 20 other MPs.
 - ❖ Santi will remain in his new position until there is a general election.
 - ❖ Party-list MP Surasit Nitivutvorrarak has been appointed the party's registrar, to fill the vacant post.
 - ❖ Other vacant posts in the ruling party will be filled by its executive committee when it meets again in April.

- The Palang Pracharat Party (PPRP) is facing a “bleed” of supporters again following reports that Anukul Pruksanusak, who represented the party to run for by-election in Songkhla’s constituency 6, has switched to the Democrat Party.
 - ❖ Dech-it Khaothong, Democrat Party deputy leader, said his family and Anukul’s family are familiar with each other. Anukul’s uncle is the Democrat Party’s provincial councillor. He then learned that Anukul told his uncle that he wants to work with the Democrat Party.
 - ❖ Dech-it insisted that Anukul had no problems with the PPRP. He also said there are more PPRP members who want to join the Democrat Party.
 - ❖ Previously, Dech-it posted a photo taken with Anukul after the PPRP lost to Democrat Party candidate in Songkhla’s by-election in Constituency 6. Dech-it again posted on Facebook that the Southern team welcomed Anukul to the party.
- Democrat Party MP for Ratchaburi Akradet Wongpitakrote announced on his Facebook that he had contracted COVID-19 but he had no idea where he may have contracted the virus from and asked people who have been in contact with him to observe their symptoms.
 - ❖ Akradet said he was puzzled when learning that he tested positive for the virus via an RT-PCR test. He said he had always followed strict parliamentary regulations to protect himself against the virus including wearing a facemask and sanitise his hands.
- The Criminal Court again postponed until May 26 its reading of verdict for the lawsuit against former People’s Alliance for Democracy Sondhi Limthongkul and 19 other members of the accused of inciting unrest and illegal assembly in connection with the blockade of parliament by PAD protesters on May 25 - October 7, 2008.
 - ❖ The case was brought against Sondhi who spearheaded massive protests to pressure the Thaksin-linked Samak Sundaravej government to step down.
- 2014 coup leader and current Prime Minister – Prayut Chan-o-cha, who is unable to communicate his thinking to the people of the country or talk properly to the journalist at the Government House, is now becoming famous globally to be able to communicate with animals.
 - ❖ Thailand’s social media has been buzzing after the government website came out to show picture of Gen Prayut talking to a horse during his visit to Saudi Arabia when the coup leader was taken to a UNESCO heritage site, where he saw a horse

and went to say 'hello' to the horse and talked for a short while before feeding the horse.

- ❖ The other times that he has talked to animals are
 - Talking to crabs during a visit to the Crab Cultivation Learning Center at Ban To Som, Bang Pu in Pattani province.
 - To cows during a visit to the Pracharat cow project in Sukhothai province
 - Talked to chicken while visiting Phitsanulok province
 - Talked to frog while visiting the learning center and driving the Sufficiency Economy Philosophy in Nakhon Ratchasima province
 - Talked to python while visiting Chonburi province.



Economic News

- The Insurance industry is closely monitoring the soaring COVID claims.
 - ❖ Anon Wangwasu, the president of Thai General Insurance Association, said the association is following numbers of COVID-19 claims as it is awaiting to assess the severity of the Omicron outbreak in the country which saw average daily tallies of 8,000 new cases, sending accumulating infections to soar to 170,000.

- ❖ Assessing claims using the outbreak scenario in 2021 which saw average daily tallies of 20,000-30,000 cases due to the quick spread of Delta infections over a 3-month period, causing total infections to hit 2.2 million, the figures have sent total COVID-19 insurance claims to hit 40 billion baht.
- ❖ From now until June, the association will keep a close watch on the Omicron outbreak which may cause infection tallies to reach 2 million. In this case, payments for COVID-19 insurance claims can hit 40 billion baht again, Anon said, adding that he hopes that cases from the Omicron virus will be lower than Delta cases.
- ❖ Meanwhile, the Office of Insurance Commission (OIC)'s data showed that payments for COVID-19 insurance claim had hit 41.2 billion baht as of January 15, 2022.
- The Office of Insurance Commission (OIC) said Southeast Insurance is not yet authorized to shut down after the company filed a request seeking to close down business due to a lack of liquidity.
 - ❖ The OIC said the financial-troubled insurer has to receive a permission from the OIC first amid concern among millions of the company's clients.
 - ❖ The OIC said an insurance company which wants to cease operations must seek permission from the Insurance Commission, in order to protect the interests of the insured, the beneficiaries of the insurance policies and other stakeholders, citing Section 57 of the Non-Life Insurance Act 1992.
 - Hence, Southeast Insurance is not yet legally dissolved.
 - ❖ Meanwhile, a group of former employees of the One Insurance rallied in front of the OIC office yesterday to demand their unpaid compensation.
 - About 300 former employees of One Insurance said they have not received any compensation almost 2 months after the closure of the company.
 - The protesters complained yesterday that their plight has been ignored.
- Lorry drivers are set to resume rallies at the Energy Ministry's headquarters on February 8 in protest against rising oil prices. This time, they will call for Deputy Prime Minister Supattanapong Punmeechaow, also the Energy Minister, to resign.

- ❖ Wasuchet Sophonsathien, president of the Thai Transportation Operators Association, complained about oil price surges which have taken a heavy toll on transport operators. The situation has forced 20% of rental trucks from a total of 40,000 units across the country to halt services after facing a rise of 60-70% in production costs, up from 50% as a result of a rise in oil prices to 30 baht per litre, from 27 baht per litre previously.
- ❖ The Thai Transportation Operators Association and the Land Transport Federation of Thailand (LTFT) will join hands to resume rallies at the Energy Ministry to demand its call for the last time. They will also call for Supattanapong's resignation.
- The Bank of Thailand (BoT) gave the greenlight for commercial banks to set up a joint venture with asset management companies (JVMC) to manage bad assets to handle their non-performing credits and assets.
 - ❖ The Central Bank said in a statement yesterday that the joint companies may operate for 15 years from their formation, or even longer with special permission. Commercial banks will have 3 years to set up the new enterprises, which can spearhead debt restructuring, according to Suwannee Jatsadasak, senior director of the BoT.
 - ❖ A licence is valid for 15 years.
 - ❖ The asset firms may also provide relief to some borrowers that cannot service their obligations or face the threat of assets being liquidated via distress sales, according to the central bank.
 - ❖ A JV AMC gives banks more flexibility in managing bad debts, helping both individual and commercial borrowers in the longer term, Suwannee said.
 - ❖ Payong Srivanich, President of Krungthai Bank Plc (KTB), said the bank is conducting a study on the matter and is currently seeking negotiations with 3-4 potential suiters to register in and outside the stock exchange of Thailand. Once it can reach a conclusion, the bank will propose to the KTB's board.
 - KTB plans to set up an AMC in the latter half of this year.
- Thai spending during the Chinese New Year festival, which starts on Sunday, is expected to remain tepid because of a moribund economy and pricier products.
 - ❖ In its annual survey of consumer spending during Chinese New Year, the University of the Thai Chamber of Commerce (UTCC) predicted a third

consecutive decline to an 11-year low of 39.6 billion baht, down by 11.8% from 44.9 billion in 2021, and a dip from 57.6 billion in 2020.

- ❖ Thanavath Phonvichai, the UTCC president, attributed the lower spending to consumer concerns about economic prospects, rising product prices, the ongoing pandemic and higher household debts. Lower consumer spending of more than 5 billion baht during the 2022 Chinese New Year is expected to result in a drop in GDP by 0.05 percentage points.
- ❖ The government's latest spending stimulus packages, including the Shop Dee Mee Khuen [shop and payback] scheme and the fourth phase of the Khon La Khrueng co-payment subsidy scheme, may help offset the drop. But a surprising cut in the cash handout of the co-payment scheme to 1,200 baht per person from 1,500 baht in previous phases is estimated to decrease money circulation by 18 billion baht, lowering GDP growth by 0.15-0.2 percentage points.
- SET-listed Siam Cement Group (SCG), Thailand's largest cement maker and industrial conglomerate, is gearing up for expansion and listing subsidiary SCG Chemicals on the Stock Exchange of Thailand. The company expects better prospects this year, projecting total revenue growth of 10% year-on-year.
 - ❖ SCG did not elaborate on an initial public offering date or other key details, saying only those shares to be offered to the public will not exceed 25.2% of SCG Chemicals' paid-up capital.
 - ❖ The fundraising is aimed to build sustainable growth for its chemical business in Asean. SCG has allocated 80 billion baht for investments this year in Thailand and abroad.
- AP (Thailand), leader in the creation of housing innovation for urbanites, set its sales target at 50 billion baht this year, up from 35 billion baht from last year.
 - ❖ The company also aims for revenue of 4.7 billion baht boosted by the launch of 65 new projects, worth a combined more than 7.8 billion baht. The numbers are at a record high of the company and the industry.
 - ❖ Throughout the year, AP plans to launch as many as 182 projects worth more than 149 billion baht in Bangkok and upcountry areas.
- Lawan Saengsanit, Director-General of the Excise Department as chairman of the Government Lottery Board revealed that the meeting of the Lottery Board agreed to create a lottery distribution system through an online platform under the name 'Digital Lottery' by scanning the real lottery and posting it for sale on the platform in which the

dealer must sell at a price of 80 baht, but in the case of near the date of the award Lottery consignor on the platform can adjust the price to drain the remaining number of tickets on the digital platform

- ❖ However, those who receive the lottery quota must register for sales via digital platforms and open an account with Krung Thai Bank. There is a wallet application. As for the buyers, they have to buy through the wallet app only. will try to make it in time for the period on May 2, 2022.

COVID-19 News

- The Thai government is looking to declare Covid-19 to be an endemic very soon based on the fact that the infection numbers remain below 10,000 and those in intensive care unit or on ventilators to remain low.
 - ❖ The government says that with nearly 80% of the population now vaccinated, it could be time to possibly make it the endemic.
 - ❖ This comes despite the WHO (World health Organization) which is yet to declare the virus to be endemic.
