Thai Enquirer Summary

Political News

- ❖ 2014 coup leader and Prime Minister General Prayut Chan-o-cha has expressed readiness for a censure motion over its handling of economic issues including rising public debt, the COVID-19 outbreak, corruption and the African Swine Flu outbreak in pigs.
- ❖ At the Cabinet's meeting yesterday, Gen Prayut said his Cabinet will be ready for the grilling brought against the government by the opposition bloc during February 17-18 following a motion filed by opposition Pheu Thai Party leader Chonlanan and 173 MPs under Section 152 of the Constitution.
- ❖ Gen Prayut said he plans to answer questions and issues raised by the opposition in a general manner.
- ❖ After the Cabinet's meeting, Deputy House Speaker Suchart Tancharoen said he had called a meeting of government and opposition whips to discuss the date and timetable for the upcoming debate.
- ❖ Gen Prayut urged government MPs to love one another and work together. He also appealed to the coalition parties to continue to work hard and serve the public as he told them not to allow the outcome of the by-elections to divide them up. He told them to respect voters' decision.
- ❖ Meanwhile, Tony Woodsome, a Clubhouse alias of fugitive premier Thaksin Shinawatra, ruled that the government of Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha

might not have too long to stay in office, calling for Gen Prayut to dissolve the Lower House if he loves the country.

- ❖ During a Clubhouse session hosted by the CARE group last night, Thaksin said Gen Prayut who came from military career might have good intention but his old way of thinking has seen him fail to keep up with a fast-changing world.
- ❖ The ex-premier called for Gen Prayut to accept that his government is in a feeble state in terms of the ability to run national administration as the ruling party that supports him is losing its strength. As a result, the public's confidence in the government has been declining and no one is confident to invest in Thailand. He then urged Gen Prayut to dissolve the parliament if he loves the country and allow the public to decide.
- ❖ At the end of the session, Thaksin predicted that after the next general election, the Palang Pracharat Party (PPRP) will become divided. Its members will be parted away from one another. This can be seen from the current state in which the Captain Thammanat Prompao led MPs in his control faction to a new party, citing that this is because the PPRP was formed as a "spare" party. The ex-premier also pointed that the switching back to a 2-ballot system in the next election may prevent PPRP members from setting up new parties because the new election system will strengthen the political system.
- ❖ The ex-premier also ruled out the possibility of a coup as he doesn't think that Gen Prayut would have much time left in office. He expects a new general election to be called by the middle of this year.
- The key coalition Palang Pracharat Party (PPRP) has cancelled its planned meeting of MPs scheduled yesterday at the party's headquarters after the party lost in a by-election in Bangkok's constituency 9 on Sunday.
 - ❖ Coordinator of the PPRP's whip reportedly sent messages via Line accounts of its MPs to cancel the planned meeting and told them to attend a new meeting scheduled at 9.00 hrs today on the 6th floor of Parliament.
 - ❖ The meeting---which will be the 1st meeting of this year to be chaired by Deputy Prime Minister Gen Prawit Wongsuwan---is expected to discuss 2 key issues.
 - ✓ 1) The expulsion of Captain Thammanat Prompao from the secretary-general post and 20 MPs under his control.



- ✓ 2) The party's defeat in Sunday's by-election in Constituency 9 of Bangkok, by-elections in Songkhla's Constituency 6 and Chumphon's Constituency 1.
- ❖ The meeting is expected to reassess the losses in 3 constituencies which may be signals of a fall in popularity rating of Gen Prayut and Gen Prawit. The meeting will also focus on its candidate for the next Bangkok gubernatorial election following swirling rumours that Anusree Tubsuwan of the Ruam Palang Pracha Chart Thai was tipped as PPRP candidate for the city race, causing many PPRP MPs to worry about future direction of the party.
- Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha came out to explain the timeline for Bangkok gubernatorial race in May.
 - ❖ During a cabinet meeting held via videoconference yesterday, Gen Prayut reassured the public that the date for the Bangkok city election should not be beyond May. He said if city dwellers want the race to be held, they will get the race by May although the date for the Bangkok city election has not been set.
 - ❖ Gen Prayut then said he has never wanted to keep power to himself. He wants the city to have a good and talented person to run the city.
 - ❖ Deputy Prime Minister Wissanu Krea-ngam said the countdown to the elections will start in March as the Election Commission will need time to make preparations, such as the list of eligible voters in all districts of the capital, the exact timeline for the election, registration of candidates as well as the certification of local elections, which are still not completed.
- Another parliament official has tested positive for COVID-19, raising the number of infected personnel in the Parliament this year to 30, including 12 MPs, says Dr Sukij Atthapokorn, adviser to the parliament president.
 - ❖ From April 1 last year to Jan 31, there had been 128 people working in the parliament diagnosed with the virus - 22 MPs, 71 government officials, 20 cleaners and 15 other employees. He said 108 had already recovered and there was one death while 19 were still under treatment.
 - ❖ 12 MPs, 12 government officials, 2 cleaners and 4 other employees were infected since January 1.
 - ❖ Dr Sukij said there had been no Covid-19 infections transmitted during parliamentary meetings. Most infections occurred outside, and MPs admitted they had meals together. Parliamentary meetings would continue.

- The Cabinet yesterday approved, in principle, P-move activists and civic groups' 15-point demand for mechanisms to ensure the basic rights of ethnic minorities to land settlement, community land title deeds and settlement of land disputes with the State Railway of Thailand and with Ban Bang Kloi land in Kaeng Krachan national park.
 - ❖ Prime Minister's Office Minister Anucha Nakasai came out to inform the protesters that the cabinet had agreed, in principle, to their demands and to withdraw all the charges against the ethnic Karen villagers of Ban Bang Kloi settlement in Kaeng Krachan national park in Phetchaburi province.

Economic News

- The Ministry of Finance plans to seek a budget of 60 billion baht from the Cabinet to fund a new round of registration for the state welfare card scheme.
 - ❖ The ministry expects 20 million people eligible for a new round of registration, up from 13.45 million card holders in the previous round, Finance Minister Arkhom Termpittayapaisith said.
 - ❖ Present rules require eligible card recipients to be Thai and aged 18 or older. They must also have an income or combined income of no more than 100,000 baht. They must not have borrowed in excess of 1.5 million baht for a home loan or 1 million baht for a car loan. They must also never have owned property.
 - ❖ Newly registered individuals are expected to be able to start using them on October 1.
- The Ministry of Finance said it is pleased that the spending under the 4th phase of the government's half-half co-payment subsidy scheme rose to more than 500 million baht on the 1st day, sending total spending under the scheme to rise to more than 1.1 billion baht, with total eligible recipients of 16.93 million.
- Krungsri Research, a unit under Bank of Ayudhya, assessed that the government's co-payment subsidy scheme under a budget of 34.8 billion baht and the new round of the state welfare-card scheme and a scheme for vulnerable people who need special assistance under budgets of 8.070 billion and 1.352 billion baht, respectively, will help generate no less than 100 billion baht into the economy.

- ❖ Krungsri Research maintains that the stimulus schemes will help boost GDP expansion as forecast earlier although the spread of the Omicron outbreak will slow Thailand's economic recovery pace.
- ❖ The centre also predicted that Omicron infections will likely peak in the middle of February before dropping gradually. The tourism sector will be the hardest hit due to further international travel curbs. This will cause the overall Thailand's economic activity to drop by 0.6%.



- The Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) anticipates the number of foreign arrivals to reach 200,000 in February after the resumption of free-quarantine under the Test & Go scheme.
 - ❖ The resumption of the Test & Go tourism scheme should allow the country to attract 400,000 tourists in the 1st quarter of this year, says TAT Governor Yutthasak Supasorn.
 - ❖ Some 2,500 passengers from 46 flights arrived at Suvarnabhumi airport on the first day of the resumption of the Test & Go scheme yesterday.
 - ❖ From November 1, 2021 to January 31, 2022, 409,594 visitors arrived in the country by air. Russians were the largest group at 45,491, followed by 42,274 German, 33,397 British, 27,903 American and 21,404 French tourists.
- The Energy Policy Administration Committee (Epac) has decided to sell only diesel blended with 5% palm oil-derived methyl ester at petrol stations from this Saturday, instead of the 7% formula, as it is struggling to deal with soaring global oil prices.

- ❖ The change does not decrease the diesel price, but should ease the government's financial burden, as the state put a cap on diesel prices at 30 baht a litre since last year. Called biodiesel B5 because of the 5% methyl ester mix, the fuel is a single-grade biodiesel that Epac estimates will be sold domestically until the end of March.
- ❖ The mix of diesel with methyl ester aims to reduce dependence on oil and support palm oil prices, but the authorities need to reduce the methyl ester proportion as prices of both diesel and methyl ester have increased.
- ❖ The reference price of methyl ester, also known as purified biodiesel, or B100, currently stands at 57.28 baht a litre, while the ex-refinery price of high-speed diesel is 24.71 baht a litre, according to the Energy Policy and Planning Office (Eppo).
- Pork prices have started to fall.
 - ❖ The ex-farm prices of live pig have started to see declines, owing to price curbing efforts by the swine raisers association, slaughterhouses, grocery retailers and the Ministry of Commerce.
 - ❖ The Swine Raisers Association of Thailand said farm-front prices have also started to fall to 100 baht from 110 baht. Pork prices in the market should see the price staying at some 200 baht per kilo as a result of rising retail prices of pork in the market, causing pork demand to fall as consumers switched to other meat.
 - ❖ Worapoj Sajjawattana, President of the Swine Raisers Association in Nakhon Ratchasima, expects pork prices in the market to be stable and stop rising after the ex-farm price of live pigs dropped to 100 baht per kilo. He complained that pig farmers, in fact, has now earned an average of 90 baht per kilo, lower than the price set by the Commerce Ministry as middlemen keep pushing prices downwards.

- The Bank of Thailand (BoT) plans to allow banks to invest more than a current limit of 3% of their capital funds in Fintech, except in digital assets, an assistant governor said yesterday.
 - ❖ The Central Bank also expects to issue rules on virtual banks in the 1st half of the year, Roong Mallikamas told a news conference.
 - ❖ The introduction of such lenders are expected to increase competition in the system, while existing banks will also be allowed to apply, she said.
 - “Competition will stimulate changes to make it better for the public and business,” she said.

- People who want to have a third or fourth Covid-19 shot at the vaccination centre at Bang Sue Grand Station can choose to have a lighter-dose intradermal injection instead, as the centre adds more options for booster shots. It has arranged intramuscular injections with either 15mcg or 30mcg of vaccine per dose, and intradermal injections with a 10mcg/dose.
 - ❖ Administering half a dose under the skin has been found to maintain a high level of efficacy while causing fewer side effects, according to Dr Mingkwan Wichaidit, director of the Institute of Dermatology. However, recipients may develop skin irritation for a few days before they recover, she noted. These results have all been confirmed by domestic and overseas studies, Dr Mingkwan said.
 - ❖ Dr Mingkwan, who supervises the vaccination centre, said it began administering fourth shots on Tuesday for people who pre-booked online. Pfizer and AstraZeneca shots are available, she said.
