

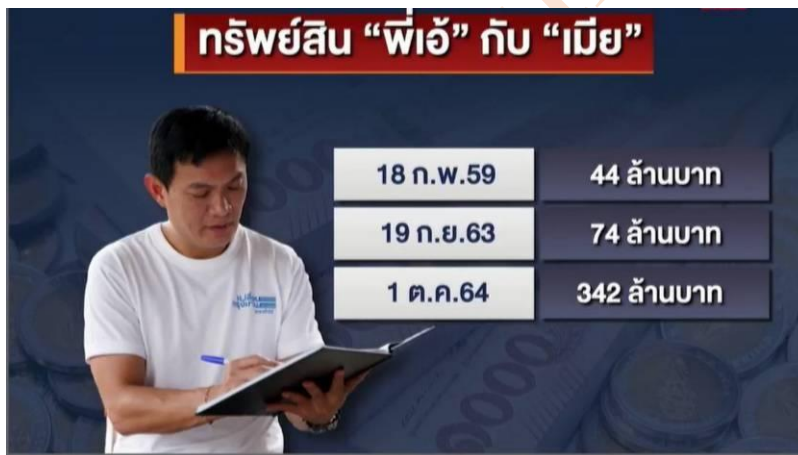

Thai Enquirer Summary

Political News

- Race for Bangkok governor election is heating up after Prime Minister General Prayut Chan-o-cha vowed to the people that the city's poll can be held in May. This time, former university rector Dr Suchatvee Suwansawat who will contest the Bangkok gubernatorial election under the Democrat Party's banner is now being targeted by a House committee on corruption suppression and prevention following calls for it to look into Suchatvee's unusual wealth.
 - ❖ The House committee on corruption suppression and prevention headed by Sereepisut Temeeyaves said it will look into Suchatvee's declaration of asset reaped during his time at King Mongkut's Institute of Technology Ladkrabang (KMITL).
 - ❖ The committee's move came following a petition filed by a complainer who wishes to remain anonymous calling for it to look into Suchatvee's asset
 - ❖ The committee will place the issue on its meeting's agenda today.
 - ❖ Suchatvee reported total assets of some 44 million baht to the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) on February, 2016.
 - ❖ He reported an increase of assets to 74 million baht on September 19, 2020.

- ❖ In the latest declaration of assets between him and his wife on October 1, 2021, Suchatvee reported total assets of 342 million baht. Thiratchai Panthumas, Kao Klai (Move Forward) list MP and spokesman of the House committee on corruption suppression and prevention, said the committee noted that Suchatvee's declaration of assets has indicated unusual increases of wealth. So far, the committee has received information from the complainer about Suchatvee's involvement in some procurement projects of the KMITL and other procurement deals with agencies under the Bangkok Metropolitan Administration (BMA) and private firms.
- ❖ Thiratchai said he noticed that meeting allowances and salaries of Suchatvee have mounted by several million baht during his time in office as KMITL rector while he and his wife accumulated assets from land transferred to him by his mother.
- ❖ The committee will also summon the Revenue Department's chief to explain if Suchatvee has paid tax as required by law and all related parties to appear before the committee.



- Uttama Savanayana, core leader and co-founder of the Sang Anakot Thai (Building Thailand's Future), hinted at the possibility of picking former deputy prime minister Somkid Jatusripitak as the party's prime ministerial candidate.
 - ❖ Uttama said he personally supports Somkid as the party's candidate but said he has to gauge opinions of others first and said the party has to wait for Somkid's decision as to whether he will return to politics and join a party. The ex-minister said Somkid supported the idea of the formation of Sang Anakot Thai; however, he has not applied for member yet.

- ❖ Uttama revealed that the party's structure and key positions in the party will become clearer in the next 2-3 months as he prepares to hold an annual general meeting soon.
 - ❖ When asked about growing rifts inside the Palang Pracharat Party (PPRP), Uttama refused to make a comment. He said it is time for him to serve the general public.
 - ❖ Uttama also said his party is preparing for the next general election with a plan to field candidates in all constituencies.
- Prime Minister General Prayut Chan-o-cha came out to say he will neither dissolve the House nor reshuffle his cabinet following rampant speculation of an early election as the Prime Minister may choose to dissolve the House amid mounting political pressure.
 - ❖ In the 1st interview with the media after completing his 7-day self-isolation upon his return from Saudi Arabia yesterday, Gen Prayut answer media questions to clarify a few issues including the government's readiness to face the Opposition in the general debate scheduled for February 17 and 18.
 - ❖ He also denied reports that Captain Thammanat Prompao and 20 other MPs who were expelled by the Palang Pracharat Party (PPRP) board sought to bargain for cabinet seats. The prime minister said that he was not aware of such a negotiation and said he did not expect to lead the PPRP as party leader himself.
 - ❖ When asked about the government's stability in the House following the departure of the 21 PPRP MPs to join the Setthakij Thai (Thai Economic) party, the prime minister said that he believes the sacked MPs are still in the coalition government, as had been told by Deputy Prime Minister Prawit Wongsuwan, the Palang Pracharat party leader.
 - ❖ He also dismissed the possibility of a cabinet shakeup, saying that it is not necessary.
 - Meanwhile, former Palang Pracharat Party (PPRP) Captain Thammanat Prompao took to his Facebook to defend the departure of his and 20 fellow MPs from the PPRP against criticism of them trying to use their removal to bargain for cabinet seats.
 - ❖ During self-isolation in Phuket after returning from his trip to Europe, Thammanat denied rumours swirling around that the departure of him and his group to a new party serves the purpose of his group's bargaining for a cabinet seat.

- ❖ The former drug smuggling convict said he had no intention of making a deal for a cabinet seat, slamming those who made such an accusation while he was away in Europe as being opportunists.
- ❖ Thammanat insisted that his departure with a group of 20 MPs is for the best interest as they intend to engage in creative politics to further development of the Thai political system.
- Pai Leeke, Kamphaeng Petch MP among 21 MPs expelled from the PPRP, came out to confirm that 18 MPs in Captain Thammanat Prompao control have applied for membership of the Settakij Thai (Thai Economic) Party but does not guarantee that the 18 MPs would vouch for the coalition government at parliamentary meetings.
 - ❖ Pai said he could not guarantee support for the coalition government and Gen Prayut. He urged the public to hear from Thammanat who will clarify the matter soon.
- Meanwhile, Gen Wit Devahastin na Ayudhya or “Big Noi”, chairman of the Palang Pracharat Party (PPRP)’s strategic committee, posted on his Facebook “Noi Wit Devahastin na Ayudhya” that he would like to seek permission from Deputy Prime Minister Gen Prawit Wongsuwan, in his capacity as the PPRP leader, and the Thai people to resign from the PPRP and take up the leadership post of the Settakij Thai (Thai Economic) Party in order to further the policy of Gen Prawit whom he revered and respect the entire time and forever.
 - ❖ Afterwards, Gen Wit’s post that says he will “take up the leadership post of the Settakij Thai (Thai Economic) Party in order to further the policy of Gen Prawit” got erased before Gen Wit himself came out to confirm that he had submitted his resignation to Gen Prawit and he is ready to apply for membership of Settakij Thai when the party is ready.
 - ❖ Not long after, Gen Wit again posted a message saying that he will uphold his original intention of working to his utmost ability regardless of where he stands.
- The National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) revealed asset and liability declarations of Election Commission (EC) secretary-general Pol Col Jarungwit Phumma after he left office on December 1, 2021.
 - ❖ Pol Col Jarunwit and spouse had total assets of 112.061 million baht with no liability as he reported to the anti-graft body. Most assets comprise Pol Col Jarungwit’s bank deposits worth 16,617,562 baht while spouse 95,443,837 baht; total investment 1,628,141 baht, 10 land title deeds mostly in Phasi Charoen in Bangkok, Muang district of Chachoengsao and Phrom Buri district in Sing Buri

worth 18,802,100 baht. Both have vehicles worth a combined 3,005,000 baht as well as luxury watches, jewellery and Buddha amulets.

- In a shocking move, former deputy attorney general Nate Naksuk, who make decision to drop a charge of reckless driving causing death against Red Bull scion Vorayuth “Boss” Yoovidhya, yesterday applied for a vacant position at the National Anti-Corruption Commission.
 - ❖ Nate, deemed a controversial figure, is currently under a serious disciplinary investigation conducted by the Public Prosecutors Commission (PCC)’s committee set up on September 21 last year for dropping a reckless driving charge against Vorayuth.
 - ❖ Nate yesterday showed up at the Secretariat of the Senate yesterday to submit his application.
 - The Supreme Court’s Criminal Division for Holders of Political Positions yesterday filed a lawsuit against 3 ex-Bhumjai Thai MPs for allowing fellow lawmakers use their voting cards in parliament.
 - ❖ The 3 ex-MPs are Natee Ratchakitprakarn, wife of the tourism minister, Chalong Thoetwiraphong, an ex-Bhumjai Thai MP for Phatthalung; Phumsit Khongmi, an ex- Bhumjai Thai MP for Phatthalung.
 - ❖ The 3 were accused of dereliction of duty for allowing other lawmakers to get hold of their MP cards to vote during a House deliberation of the budget bill in 2020.
 - ❖ The court has set March 10, 2022 at 10.00 hrs to examine lists of evidence and witnesses.

Economic News

- The general public staged a rally at the Ministry of Energy against rising fuel prices.
 - ❖ A large group of people gathered at the Energy Ministry’s headquarters to call for the ministry to tackle rising fuel prices, especially benzene and gasohol prices which have been adjusted up 8 times since the beginning of this year.

- ❖ Retail prices for benzene have already risen 2.80 baht per litre to 41.96 baht per litre while gasohol prices 3.20 baht per litre. The retail price of gasohol 91 currently stands at 34.28 baht per litre while gasohol 95 at 34.55 baht per litre.
 - ❖ Currently, diesel B7 and B 20 retails at 29.94 baht per litre, an increase of 0.90 baht after the State Oil Fund continues to subsidise the retail diesel price at more than 3.79 baht per litre.
 - ❖ As of January 30, 2022, the State Oil Fund had a total loss of 14.080 billion baht. It is still in question where the Fund will find financial sources while the government chose to use the Fund to keep diesel prices down.
- The Thailand Board of Investment (BoI) sees a rise in investment value in 2021.
 - ❖ The agency saw the combined value of foreign and local applications for investment promotion in 2021 totalled 642.7 billion baht, an increase of 59%, boosted mainly by foreign direct investments (FDI) in tech sectors and a continued increase in the value and number of projects in Bio-Circular-Green (BCG) industries, as well as the continued build-up of the power generation sector.
 - ❖ Electrics and electronics once again topped the list of target sectors which attracted the most applications with 104.5 billion baht in value, reflecting the soaring demand for electronics devices and parts, followed by the medical sector with 62.2 billion baht, petrochemicals and chemicals with 48.4 billion baht, agriculture and food processing with 47.7 billion baht, and automotive and parts with 24.6 billion baht. Overall, the 12 target sectors attracted a combined value of 340.5 billion baht, representing 53% of the total pledges.
 - ❖ The fastest-growing sector was digital which saw the value of applications soar almost 9-fold to 14 billion baht in 2021, from a modest 1.61 billion baht a year earlier, BoI Secretary General Ms. Duangjai Asawachintachit revealed.
 - ❖ Foreign Direct Investments represented 71% of total pledges with 455.3 billion baht for a total of 783 project applications, a nearly 3-fold increase in value from the 169.3 billion baht worth of applications filed in 2020.
 - ❖ Japan once again topped the list of FDI source countries with a combined investment value of 80.7 billion baht for 178 projects, followed by China with 38.6 billion baht in investment pledges for 112 projects, and Singapore with 29.7 billion baht for 96 projects. The top three sectors for FDI applications were electrics and electronics, petrochemicals and chemicals, and the medical cluster.

- The University of the Thai Chamber of Commerce (UTCC) estimates an increase in economic growth by 1-1.3% buoyed by the 4th phase of the government's "Khon La Khrueng" co-payment subsidy scheme and the "Shop Dee Mee Kuen" tax rebate programme.
 - ❖ Thanawat Phonwichai, director of the UTCC's Center for Economic and Business Forecasting, said the 4th phase of the cash handout scheme that will run from February 1-April 30 and the tax rebate scheme to increase circulation by stimulating domestic travel and spending with estimated around 90-100 billion baht circulated, increasing economic growth by 1-1.3%.
 - ❖ However, the UTCC estimates that 40-50 billion baht circulated, increasing economic growth by a 2.5-3% in the 1st quarter driven by the stimulus schemes because of the ongoing Omicron outbreak posed negative impacts on the economy, especially in the Chinese New Year that will see spending drop to an 11-year low.
 - ❖ The centre however maintain its GDP growth forecast for 2022 at 4%.
 - ❖ Thanawat called for the government to extend economic stimulus schemes again with more cash handout amount.
 - The Government Lottery Office (GLO) saw demand for its lottery tickets exceeding 1 million.
 - ❖ GLO chief Lt-Col Nun Sansanakhom revealed that a total 1.03 million lottery bookings for government lottery tickets during January 1-31, 2022, exceeding its expectation of around 400,000-500,000 while a quota to sell lottery tickets was marked at 200,000.
 - ❖ Provinces saw the highest registrations for lottery tickets are Bangkok, 99,772; Loei 85,589; Nakhon Ratchasima 38,545; Nonthaburi 27,109 and Khon Kaen 26,119.
 - ❖ The GLO insisted that it will not raise lottery ticket quotas from 200,000 to be in line with the number of tickets and buyer demand. The agency expects to spend around 2 months to screen and announce successful lottery vendors. The whole process is expected to be completed in April before it can start a new registration round on May 2.
