Thai Enquirer Summary

Political News

- The opposition Pheu Thai Party is confident of having support of 30 MPs from small coalition parties. They are the key to the government of 2014 coup maker and Prime Minister General Prayut Chan-o-cha's fate in the upcoming censure debate, says opposition leader Chonlanan Srikaew, also the Pheu Thai Party leader.
 - ❖ After a special seminar at the Amari Watergate in Bangkok, Chonlanan told journalists that the opposition will have support of 30 MPs of the small coalition parties and the Setthakit Thai (Thai Economic) Party in the next censure debate under Section 151 of the Constitution.
 - Setthakit Thai is the party that has the former drug dealing convict and incumbent Phayao MP Captain Thammanat Prompao and a group of MPs who were removed from the Palang Pracharat Party (PPRP) as its key members.
 - ❖ Chonlanan said the 2 meetings among the coalition parties gave a clear indication that 30 members of small coalition parties will join the opposition.
 - ❖ He is confident that the opposition can bring down the government in the upcoming censure debate. Moreover, the opposition is planning to launch an online channel to allow the public to take part in this coming censure debate.
- Chonlanan Srikaew, as the leader of the Pheu Thai party, was also grilled on the hot topic of who the party's candidate for the next Prime Minister would be and whether the Pheu

Thai party plans to nominate Paethongtan Shinawatra, former prime minister Thaksin's Shinawatra's daughter, as one of the party's PM candidates, Chonlanan half-heartedly replied that it depends on support from the general public.

- The opposition Pheu Thai Party yesterday kicked off a seminar that questioned Prime Minister Gen Prayut's Chan-o-cha's 8-years tenure as allowed by the constitution.
 - ❖ At the Amari Watergate in Bangkok, Pheu Thai and opposition leader Chonlanan Srikaew presided over the seminar and said the opposition will return the power of the Prime Minister to the general public, citing that Gen Prayut's tenure is due on August 8 this year. He said Gen Prayut's time will be up this August. A large number of opposition MPs attended the seminar yesterday.
 - ❖ Chusak Sirinil, chairman of Pheu Thai's legal team, said he believed that Gen Prayut's time will be up soon, not like the government's claim that Gen Prayut still has time until 2023.
 - He called on the public not to give Gen Prayut any more time because he rose to power from a military seizure. Moreover, Gen Prayut appointed his close associate Gen Prawit Wongsuwan to chair a selection committee to arrive at a 250-member Senate to back himself. He asked the general public for fairness in Gen Prayut's premiership. Chusak also called on Gen Prayut to resign before August for his own dignity.
 - ❖ Kao Klai (Move Forward) Party deputy leader Pijarn Chaowpattanawong called on Gen Prayut to resign before August before the opposition petitions the Constitutional Court for an interpretation on his term of tenure. He said Gen Prayut is awaiting a time bomb if he decides to prolong time in office. He called on the general public to come out to show force against Gen Prayut's overstay in office.
 - ❖ Prachachart Party secretary-general Thawee Sodsong insisted that Gen Prayut's 8-year tenure is due on August 25 this year. His prolonged stay will lead the opposition to seek an interpretation from the charter court.
- To appease the smaller parties, Gen. Prayut is set to hold a dinner party with key members of the smaller coalition parties at 18:00 hrs on March 17 at the Ratchapruek Club on Vibhavadhi Rangsit Road, according to Democrat Party leader Jurin Laksanawisit.
 - ❖ Jurin said the move is a good move because the coalition parties are important regardless of whether they are big, medium or small parties. All of them are the key to the government's stability.

- Damrong Pidej, leader of the Thai Forest Conservation Party, a small coalition party, said he had received an invitation for a dinner from Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha to join a meal on March 17. Damrong said he had accepted Gen Prayut's invitation.
 - ❖ There are reports that Tewan Liptapanlop, list MP and leader of the Chart Pattana Party and Dr Rawee Machamadon, leader of the New Palang Dhamma Party, were also invited to join the planned dinner scheduled on March 17. Both of them have accepted Gen Prayut's invitation after they missed out on the 1st round of the meeting of the coalition parties.
 - ❖ Surathin Pijarn, list MP and leader of the New Democracy Party, said he had not received an invitation from Gen Prayut. Surathin said he didn't really care about being invited or not because he felt uncomfortable with the idea of having a dinner while the general public is facing economic woes.
 - Surathin also made clear his party's support for Setthakit Thai upon reports that some small coalition parties plan to join Capt. Thammanat's new party after the next general election.
- The Democrat Party is pushing for a cabinet team in the Bangkok Metropolitan Administration (BMA)'s management, with economic ministers to bring in new innovation.
 - ❖ During the party's event named "The 2 Leaders' Visions", Deputy Prime Minister and Commerce Minister Jurin Laksanawisit, as the Democrat Party leader, said his party was not daunted by the party's defeat in Bangkok in the last general election. He said his party has yet to be wiped out. The Democrats are planning big welcome for a new Bangkok governor under the party's banner.
 - ❖ Jurin outlined the party's new management under the "mini Thailand" concept, citing that Bangkok is Thailand's hub, especially economic and industrial aspects. Jurin pointed out that while Bangkok's GDP rests with trade, 87%, industries, 13%, and agriculture, 7%, Bangkok residents earn less than 100,000 baht per annum while the city hosts more than 500,000 state welfare card holders.
 - ❖ Therefore, there is the need for Bangkok governor to bring in new innovation. Such new innovation requires a BMA cabinet team, BMA economic ministers and a BMA joint private and state committee to drive Bangkok's economy along with the private sector. Jurin threw his full support behind the party's candidate Suchatvee Suwansawat as he said Suchatvee is capable of driving this policy.

- The Election Commission (EC) is set to consider the date for the election of local executives of Bangkok and Pattaya City today.
 - ❖ The EC is expected to pick the same date for elections of local executives of the 2 cities on May 22, with candidate registration on April 7-11. The EC is expected to make an announcement on March 28.

 - This week is also crucial as the 9-member judges of the controversial decision maker – Constitutional Court, are set to meet to make an ethical judgment on the tenure of their chief judge (President).
 - ❖ On March 16 – the panel from the Constitutional Court judges, are set to meet to decide on the future of Worawit Kangasatiam, who has reached 2 limits
 - He's hit 70-years of age (which can be extended up to 75 years of age)
 - He's also hit the 9-year term limit that is been put in place for any judge to be in that position.
 - ❖ There are talks that the decision is going to be tweaked to show that Worawit can continue the job because the new constitution came into effect in 2017 (after being passed in referendum in 2016) and therefore the 8-year term should be from the day the new constitution was put in place not from the day he was put in the position – in 2014.

Economic News

- The Federation of Thai Industries (FTI) warned that rising fuel prices would cause further economic woes to the general public if the government cannot control energy prices for the next 2 months until May.
 - ❖ FTI chairman Supant Mongkolsuthree said surging costs of petrol, natural gas and power bills depend on how long the government's ability to retain prices. If the


government manages to control costs until May, the initial impact will be only on energy prices.

- ❖ The FTI chairman urged the government to seek an additional loan to sustain energy prices and mitigate impacts on the general public. He is hoping that energy prices, especially global crude prices will fall within 2 months from now as he does not expect the Russia-Ukraine war to prolong or escalate more than what it has been now.
- ❖ Initially, Supant expects chances of crude oil price dropping near US\$70-80 seen during normal circumstances. He strongly supports the government's attempt to cap the price of diesel at 30 baht/ litre as this is an acceptable level which will not create burden to the general public and the private sector.
- ❖ Supant said he is most worried about electricity bills that may rise further and affect the general public amid the rising living costs while their incomes remain the same. Supant urged the government to conduct a serious study that utility costs should be adjusted up according to a ladder system. The FTI continues pushing for the reopening of the country to foreign visitors to bring more tourism revenue, export promotion policies and policies to attract foreign investments to Thailand targeted the US, China and Japan as the key markets.
- ❖ Energy Minister Supattanapong Punmeechaow on Saturday announced that the price of liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) will be raised by 1 baht per kilogram for a 15kg canister from April 1. He also said the government will cap the price of diesel at 30 baht/litre until the end of May.
- The Thai National Shippers' Council called on the government to continue capping diesel prices as long as possible.
 - ❖ TNSC chairman Chaichan Chareonsuk said the Council wants the government to try to extend the cap of diesel prices until at least 2nd and 3rd quarters of this year to allow more time for other oil producing countries such as Venezuela and Iran to boost their oil output to the world.
 - ❖ The TNSC chairman said the prices of commodities will have to be raised in a proper way in line with rising fuel costs according to market mechanisms.
- The Layer Chickens Association warned of rising prices of chicken eggs.
 - ❖ President Manote Chuthapthim said the Association had seek the Commerce Ministry's Internal Trade Department to raise prices of chicken eggs, protesting against the government's attempt to absorb rising costs and the impact on farmers.

- ❖ Manote said the Association had asked the Internal Trade Department to raise prices of chicken eggs from 3.10 baht apiece but had not yet settled on new prices, citing rising animal feed as the key reason.
- ❖ Currently, farmers are facing the cost of maize used in livestock feed which rose to 13 baht/kg while overall production costs for chicken eggs rose to 2.94 baht apiece, higher than 2.90 baht as of March 3.
- Thai Airways International Plc (THAI)'s panel overseeing a court-monitored debt rehabilitation plan sought a meeting with Finance Minister Arkhom Termpittayapaisith asking the Finance Ministry to clear its debts owed by key state agencies.
 - ❖ At the meeting, THAI's debt rehab panel Piyasvasti Amranand led his team to ask the Finance Minister, a THAI major shareholder, to help push for state agencies like the National Police Office, the Royal Thai Air Force, etc. to pay for repair and maintenance costs owed to THAI.
 - ❖ THAI also asked the ministry to coordinate with the Transport Ministry to speed up selling of 10 aircraft put up for sale after learning that the ministry has yet to sign its name to endorse the sale process. This has affected THAI's rehab process.
- The Excise Department stepped up efforts to lure electric vehicle manufacturers.
 - ❖ Nattakorn Utensut, deputy spokesman for the Excise Department, said the department will sign a memorandum of understanding on business relating to EVs with at least 3 car makers, namely Chinese automaker Great Wall Motor (GWM), MG and Japanese car maker Honda this week.
 - ❖ After the signing of MoU completes, these automakers will receive an array of incentives including lower taxes and cash subsidies to develop the market for electric vehicles for Bangkok International Motor Show 2022 scheduled during March 23-April 3, 2022. The announcement for tax measures will be made official and effective in the Government Gazette.
 - ❖ Currently, automakers plan to mark down prices of as many as 2,000 EVs; most of which will be Chinese-made EVs. Initially, consumers may see prices of EVs marked down to 700,000 baht from the initial price of 900,000 baht while those marked at 400,000-500,000 baht will be down to 300,000-400,000 baht. More expensive ones marked at 1.4 million baht will drop to 1.2 million baht.
- The volatility in the global markets is set to continue for a while as the world awaits the meeting of the Federal Reserve Bank (FED) of United States.

- ❖ The FOMC is set to hold its meeting on March 15/16 with market expectations of a 50 bps (0.50%) raise in rates although the situation in Russia/Ukraine may prompt it to raise the rates by 25 bps (0.25%), but the more than 7% rise in inflation during the month of February is unlikely to give the FED a breather and therefore a 50 bps is likely.
- Meanwhile the oil importing economies of Asia are facing problems as they reel from the surge in oil prices.

Surging oil brings bigger losses to some Asian markets


