## Thai Enquirer Summary

### Economic News

- Economists say that countries such as Thailand and India are likely to bear the brunt of the impact from the rising crude oil prices.
  - ❖ The cost of Brent crude oil has jumped to its highest level since March 2012, as Russia's attack on Ukraine continues to escalate, with Brent crude oil prices jumped to over \$119 per barrel yesterday and is expected to touch \$125 per barrel, pushed by tougher sanctions on Russia by the Western countries.



- ❖ It is expected that the geopolitical tension may push Brent crude prices further to US\$125 per barrel, as the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries

(OPEC) has refused to respond to the soaring oil prices by sticking to its 400,000 barrels per day increase in output in March 2022.

- The Thai Chamber of Commerce (TCC) sees the possibility of oil prices would hit \$120 per barrel easily after it exceeded \$115 per barrel, sending prices of oil in Thailand to rise by 5.0-7.5 baht per litre.
  - ❖ TCC chairman Sanan Angubolkul warned that the scenario will definitely affect the spending sentiment of Thai consumers as people are too worried to spend money on rising commodities.
  - ❖ The TCC chairman went on to thank the government over its move to cut taxes and cap prices of domestic oil prices.
- At Government House, Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha yesterday called a meeting of PM's advisory team to assess economic impacts from surging oil prices driven by the escalating Russia-Ukraine conflict. The Prime Minister ordered state agencies to find ways to help benzene users.
  - ❖ The meeting addressed 3 issues namely,
    - 1) Venerable groups of people affected by surging fuel prices.
    - 2) Rising debt facing the public in the wake of the COVID-19 outbreak and rising fuel prices.
    - 3) The speeding up of government investment to boost people's income.
  - ❖ Gen Prayut instructed the Finance Ministry and related agencies to come up with assistance measures on top of the government's latest measure to cap the price of diesel at 30 baht.
  - ❖ Gen Prayut gave directives to the team to find measures to assist Benzene users under the group of 13.45 million welfare card holders.
  - ❖ Benzene prices are set to rise by 60 satang today, causing prices of gasohol 95 to rise to 37.15 baht; gasohol 91 36.88 baht; gasohol E20 36.04 baht and gasohol E85 29.34 baht.
- Executives at the Federation of Thai Industries (FTI) want the government to freeze the fuel tariff (Ft) on power bills and maintain retail gas prices to ease the impact of soaring global oil prices on economic activities and the cost of living.

- ❖ Some 80.7% of FTI executives surveyed are in favour of the authorities holding steady the Ft rate for four months, from May to August this year. A cap on the Ft is viewed as one of the most effective ways of dealing with higher energy prices, according to the FTI, which interviewed 150 executives in 45 industries across Thailand.
- ❖ Encouraging businesses to save electricity was mentioned as a solution by 59.3%, followed by 53.3% supporting the maintenance of retail gas prices, covering compressed natural gas for transport operators and liquefied petroleum gas, or cooking gas, for households. A total of 52.7% agreed with specific help for small and medium-sized enterprises and low-income earners.
- ❖ “The findings reflect that energy prices are a key factor that can affect economic recovery and drive operating costs to very high levels,” said Wirat Unarumit, vice-chairman of the FTI.




- SET-listed developer SC Asset Corporation (SC) - which has former prime minister Thaksin Shinawatra’s daughters Pinthongta and Paethongtan Shinawatra holding a stake of more than 50% - has notified the Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) about resolutions

of the meeting of its board of directors to acquire a 5-rai plot of land located on Tiemruammit Road in Huaykwang, Bangkok.

- ❖ The plot which belongs to Pinthongta was acquired at a price of 310,000 baht per square wah, totalling 725.710 million baht.
- ❖ The transaction will be signed on April 29, 2022. This will lead to changes in the structure of SC shareholders including Paethongtan 29.04%; Pinthongta 28.10%; Bannapot Damapong 4.81% and Potjaman Damapong 2.80%.
- The Supreme Court yesterday acquitted 3 people, who were among 13 accused of involvement in the “zero-dollar tour scheme” exposed 6 years ago, citing a lack of evidence that their activities caused damage to the tourism industry and were criminal.
  - ❖ The lawsuit was filed after Thai tourism organisations cried foul over zero-dollar tourism surfaced during March 24-August 31, 2016, claiming that the business did not benefit the Thai economy or the Thai people, because the tourists’ money was instead diverted back to China as payments were made through apps instead of cash.
  - ❖ Thirteen people were charged with illegally operating tourism businesses which may cause damage to local tourism sector, money laundering and unfairly charging tourists among others.
  - ❖ The Criminal Court acquitted all the defendants, citing insufficient evidence to prove wrongdoing. The Appeals Court then also acquitted all but 3 of the defendants, who were each fined 500,000 baht.
  - ❖ Yesterday, the Supreme Court handed down an acquittal verdict for the last 3 defendants, saying that the group had covered up the true nature of their package tours, that they were, in fact, shopping trips and tourists were overcharged for the products they bought, and that such tours had caused damage to local tourism businesses, was mere conjecture and unsubstantiated.
- GRAB, which is based in Singapore but has a decent sized operations in Thailand, has come out to report a major loss during Q4 2021 with more than \$1 billion loss during the quarter.
  - ❖ This has prompted shares of GRAB to dip by as much as 63% since it made its debut on Nasdaq in December 2021.

## Political News

- The political temperatures are heating up and some senior members of the political circles have been calling on all political parties to get their acts together.
  - ❖ All political parties are being advised to hold their general meetings before the start of the new parliamentary session on May 22 because there is a likelihood that the parliament may be dissolved sooner rather than later.
- Meanwhile, the Opposition Pheu Thai Party sees the likely possibility of a “political incident”, citing those in power’s discontentment with the push to restore a single-ballot electoral system.
  - ❖ Pheu Thai MP for Ubon Ratchathani, Somkid Chueakhong, has pointed out a likely scenario that those in power may choose to dissolve the House of Representatives driven by frustration over the opposition’s push to return to a single-ballot system. He said those in power may think they stand to lose from the restoration of the 2-ballot system. He called for them to respect regulations and the public benefit.
  - ❖ Somkid, who is a member of the joint parliamentary committee scrutinising 2 organic laws related to the new election system, also commented that Deputy Public Health Minister Sathit Pitutecha, who serves as chairman of the committee scrutinising 2 organic bills, cannot wield influence over others in a vote for or against the 2 organic bills. He said the majority of committee members will have their say.

- ❖ Pheu Thai is ready to push certain points to seek amendments to the 2 organic bills although their votes might not be sufficient to win the fight, Somkid said.
- ❖ These points are such as having a political party used the same number MPs in the constituency and party-list systems throughout the country despite MPs' vote in principle to accept 4 draft amendments which maintain that candidates in the constituency and party list systems have different numbers.
- ❖ Somkid insisted that the country will see lesser number of spoiled ballot papers if MP candidates in the constituency and party-list systems were assigned the same number. This is also beneficial to the general public as it can prevent confusion. Political parties will also benefit from this point.
- ❖ The joint parliamentary committee scrutinising 2 organic laws related to the new election system chaired by Sathit is scheduled to meet for the 1<sup>st</sup> time at 10.30 hrs on March 9 and 2<sup>nd</sup> time at 9.30 hrs on March 10.
- Deputy Public Health Minister Sathit Pitutecha, who serves as chairman of the committee scrutinising 2 organic bills, shut down on the idea of returning to a single-ballot system.
  - ❖ Sathit came out to dismiss the likelihood to return to a single-ballot system as impossible. He said the process to amend organic laws to return to a single-ballot system will take at least 6 months. This timeline is not well responded to the government's remaining term in office.
  - ❖ Hence, it is impossible to seek amendments to return to a single-ballot system.
  - ❖ Sathit insisted that he would push for the House's committee vetting 2 organic laws related to the new election system to complete its task before the next parliamentary session.
- Suthep Thaugsuban, chairman of the Muan Maha Prachachon Foundation for Thailand's Reforms, urged Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha to do head count of MPs to ensure sufficient support, citing changes in MPs support he perceived on a daily basis.
  - ❖ On his Facebook live "EP 20", Suthep said Gen Prayut's major problems are internal turbulence risen between the Palang Pracharat Party (PPRP) and the coalition partners; turbulence outside the parties, a censure motion aimed at toppling the government scheduled in May.
  - ❖ Suthep went on to say he is not really worried about Gen Prayut despite many weak points of the government that make him an easy target. He is more worried

about support of government MPs after Captain Thammanat Prompao of the Setthakij Thai (Thai Economic) Party led 18 MPs to join the new party did not guarantee support for Gen Prayut in a censure motion. Suthep said it depends on Gen Prayut's team to calculate head counts of MPs who will support the Prime Minister.

- ❖ Suthep suggested Gen Prayut roll out various measures to assist the public amid economic woes in order to turn crisis to opportunity in the lead-up to the forthcoming no-confidence debate.



- The Secretariat of the Cabinet reportedly sent an urgent letter to the Election Commission's secretary-general over its proposed date for the election of Bangkok governor and the Pattaya mayor race.
  - ❖ The Secretariat of the Cabinet is set to propose the date to the Cabinet for approval on March 8. It is speculated that the election in Pattaya City and Bangkok's gubernatorial race will take place in May according to the timeline given by the Ministry of Interior.
  - ❖ Chamnan Chanrueng expects the elections of Bangkok governor and Pattaya Mayor to be held on May 29.
  - ❖ Bangkok deputy governor Sakoltee Phattiyakul plans to submit his resignation from his post next week and will hold a press conference about the prospect of running for Bangkok governor race as an independent candidate.
- The Supreme Court's Criminal Division for Holders of Political Positions will today read a verdict in irregularities involving former social development and human security minister Watana Muangsook's role in the Eua Arthorn low-cost housing project.

- ❖ The verdict by the highest court set to be issued at 14:00 hrs today will bring to an end to one of the most controversial cases in Thai political history.
  - ❖ On September 24, 2020, the Supreme Court found Watana guilty on 11 counts of corruption, which carry up to 99 years in prison. However, according to the law, he can only spend a maximum of 50 years behind bars for the crimes he committed. The Supreme Court then granted Watana a temporary, conditional release on 10-million-baht bail.
  - ❖ The court also handed down a 50-year prison sentence to Apichart “Sia Piang” Chansakulporn, a well-known rice trader, over the housing project case.
  - ❖ Watana insisted he would not flee the country to avoid corruption charges. The ex-Pheu Thai minister said charges against him were fabricated. He denied he had committed malfeasance while in office.
- The 23-billion-baht new swaggy parliament that took a decade to construct and has been constructed by Sino-Thai Engineering & Construction Plc (STEC) saw yet another major leak (this time not from rainwater seeping from the roof but from water pipes bursting).
  - ❖ There was no one who has taken responsibility, but the media has taken up the issue and highlighted it all over.
