





Economic News


• Capital markets are set to go through yet another day of upheaval today after the global selloff seen overnight.




- ❖ To make matters worse the widely watched inflation information from the United States came in at 8.3% in April from 8.5% seen in March.
 - The 4-decade high level of inflation was the cause of capital market's dip



• The continued uncertainties in the capital market has also taken a toll on the crypto currencies with the crypto's bellwether – Bitcoin trading below the \$30,000 mark and hitting a 1-year low of \$27,736.62 earlier today.





• The government of 2014 coup leader – Prayut Chan-o-cha held meeting (before he flew to Washington DC yesterday) with Supattanapong Panmeechaow, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Energy, along with representatives of the Ministry of Finance and the National Economic and Social Development Council (NESDB) to extend the time to reduce the excise tax on diesel with a conclusion to expand the measures but has not specified a clear period of time, whether it be for 3 months or not, but will increase the tax reduction to 5 baht per liter.

- ❖ After this, the relevant departments will discuss to conclude the measure, the propose it to the Cabinet meeting next week, estimating that a reduction of 5 baht per liter will cause the state to lose nearly 10 billion baht per month.
- Higher oil price is taking a toll on the goods and services and now Thailand's staple food
 RICE, is set to see some price rise.
 - ❖ A source from a retailer and wholesaler revealed that they had been notified by a manufacturer and distributor of 100% authentic jasmine rice packed in 5 kg bags, of one brand, that the brand will increase the price from May 15 based on the wholesale cost price of another 4-6 baht.
 - As a result, the retail price has gone up by 4-6 baht per bag and another brand previously announced adjustment of 2 baht per bag from 153 baht to 155 baht late last year and it will be adjusted again to 170 baht per bag.
- The rising price of diesel has prompted the operators of inter province buses to seek an increase in fares.
 - ❖ A formal letter is set to be submitted to the Director-General of the Department of Land Transport requesting a fare increase to match the diesel price hike of 32 baht per liter. The bus operators say that for every 1 baht per liter they want to increase the fare by 1 satang per kilometer and asked to reduce fees such as insurance and car accident insurance.
- The meeting of the Joint Standing Committee on Commerce, Industry and Banking (JSCCIB) resolved
 - ❖ The JSCCIB proposes to the government to speed up 9 economic measures, which are:
 - Take care of production costs and liquidity in fixing diesel prices not more than 35 baht / liter for the next 3 months.
 - Extend the time to reduce the collection of diesel excise tax by 3 baht / liter for 3 months
 - Reduce the import duty on raw materials and increase the import quota.
 - Expedited VAT refund issue low-interest loan measures to enhance liquidity for entrepreneurs
 - Accelerate the project halfway through phase 5 immediately, with a limit of 1,200-1,500 baht.

- Expanding the number of rights for the project we travel together
- Full relaxation of economic activities including entertainment business
- ➤ Should not charge additional penalties for people who pay land and building taxes late.
- ➤ Completely open the country to foreign tourists and take care of the baht appropriately
- ❖ The JSCCIB also asked the government to support the business sector maintain competitiveness especially SMEs and the public during the second and third quarters before the economy fully recovered at the end of the year.
- PTT Plc (PTT) will announce the results of the Q1 2022 after the PTT group has gradually announced the results of the first quarter of 2022.
 - The 6 companies are PTT Exploration and Production Plc (PTTEP),
 - ❖ PTT Oil & Retail Business Plc (OR)
 - ❖ PTT Global Chemical Plc (PTGC)
 - ❖ IRPC Plc (IRPC)
 - ❖ Thai Oil Plc (TOP)
 - Global Power Synergy Plc (GPSC)

These companies had a total net profit of 27.57 billion baht, a decrease of 24% from the same period last year with a profit of 36.28 billion baht.

- ❖ Capital Nomura Securities indicates PTT's performance in the first quarter of 2022 is expected to net profit of 30.18 billion baht, a decrease of 7% from the same period last year.


Political News

- The main opposition Pheu Thai party, has come out to Thank the Thai army chief for saying that if there was no chaos in the country, then there would be no coup d'etat.
 - Cholanan Srikaew, the leader of the opposition Pheu Thai party, came out to say that he was thankful to the army chief Narongphan Jitkaewthae, who came out to say that there would be no coups if there was no chaos in the country.
 - ❖ But Cholanan also said that such statement could trigger an issue for some groups to come out to create chaos and give the pretext for a coup, especially after the bad taste of advertising in the marketplace portal of Lazada.
- Dr. Cholanan also mentioned the event. 'Family for Thai Samut Prakan, Big House, Same Heart' on May 14 at Imperial Samrong department store, Samut Prakan province to unite with people's brothers and sisters to make a big change and on the occasion of the 12th anniversary of the massacre of the people in 2010, Pheu Thai, he said, would like to join forces with the people and the Red Shirts to make change for the country and return liberty, restore democracy and restore justice for the Red Shirts again.
- General Prawit Wongsuwan, Deputy Prime Minister and leader of the Palang Pracharat
 Party (PPRP), came out to say that the issue of the 8-year term limit of 2014 coup leader
 Prayut Chan-o-cha, was already studied and there was no red flag raised.
- Today is the day that the committee set up to study the 2-ballot polling rules to make a call on whether the 100-party list MPs would see which method is used to calculate their election.
 - ❖ The 2 options are to use the votes that is cast by the people be

- Divided by 100 (the number of party list MPs)
 - A total of 40 million votes/100 would mean that each party list MP would need about 400,000 votes to be elected
- Divided by 500 (the number of MPs that are to be in the parliament)
 - A total of 40 million votes/500 would mean that each party list MP would need about 80,000 votes to be elected
- ❖ The committee, comprising of 49 people, are divided as they are trying to avoid Pheu Thai party from getting a landslide victory and therefore division by 500 would give smaller parties a better chance to able to make it.
- The Constitutional Court came out to turn down the petition by Rawee Machamadon, a party-list MP. New Phalang Dharma Party, who had sought the court's decision on whether the amendment of the 2016 constitution was constitutionally right or not.
 - ❖ The amendment of using 2 ballot papers was in violation, Rawee had claimed.
 - The court's rejection of the petition is in effect stating that Rawee's claims are not valid and the court's judges unanimously resolving leaves no room for bringing down the 2-ballot polling in the next elections.
- Palang Pracharath Party (PPRP) handed down punishments against MP Pichet Sathirachawal for turning against it by allegedly teaming up with the Pheu Thai Party in preparing a censure debate targeting the government.
 - ❖ Paiboon Nititawan, member of the party list MP and also the chairman of the Committee on Laws and Regulations of the PPRP, revealed after the meeting to consider the behaviour of Pichet, who moved with the Pheu Thai Party.

- ❖ Paiboon said that the committee decided to temporarily suspend Pichet's rights for a period of 6-months until November 12.
- ❖ He was kicked out of the LINE chat group of the party
- ❖ He can't use any of the stationary, logo, stamps etc of the party.
