Thai Enquirer Summary

Political News

- The biggest news now seems to be the fact that the government of 2014 coup leader Prayut Chan-ocha, is looking to amend the constitution once again to back to the 2019 election methodology.
 - ❖ The coalition led by Palang Pracharath Party (PPRP) and its 2nd biggest ally – Bhumjai Thai party, are looking to put the amendment to the constitution undertaken over the past 18-months back in reverse gear.
 - ❖ The changes are taking place because these parties fear that they may not get any Party List seats and/or they may not be able to come back to power if the amended constitution is implemented.
- The reverse gear move comes just as the parliament is set to consider the 2nd reading of the amendment tomorrow (July 26th).
 - ❖ Paiboon Nititawan, PPRP's Party List MP and committee to consider the election bill, said that the parliament would discuss the election bill in its 2nd reading on July 26 and vote on the same day in the 3rd reading.

- ❖ The process of going back to the 100-party list calculation without having to look bad is to push it back to the Election Commission for consideration.
- ❖ The process would involve that after the passage in the 2nd and 3rd reading, the house speaker would direct the bill to the Election Commission for consideration before it would be redirected back to the parliament within 10 days.
 - Paiboon was certain that the commission would switch back to using 100 division as had already been agreed in the first place.
- ❖ The parliament would then have to follow the commission's final direction but those who opposed could still file a complaint to the Constitution Court during this process.



- Today (July 25), Gen Prawit Wongsuwan as the chairman of the National Water Resources Committee will visit Samut Prakan province to monitor the water management project and the construction of the Maha Wong canal.
- ❖ This visit is deemed as an intriguing political movement against six PPRP MPs who voted against Interior Minister Gen Anupong Paochinda and Labor Minister Suchart Chomklin in the latest no-confident debate that was undertaken on Saturday July 23.

- ❖ The six MPs were Krungsriwilai Sutinphuak, Thapakorn Kulcharoen, Prim Pooncharoen, Yongyuth Suwanbutr, Pailin Tiensuwan and Akarawat Asavahame. What motivated them to do so was the ongoing internal disagreements within PPRP, according to reports.
- Prime Minister Prayut Chan-o-cha and 10 other cabinet ministers, targeted by the opposition during a three-day debate, on Saturday won a vote of confidence held at the end of proceedings.
 - ❖ Gen Prayut secured 256 votes of confidence against 206 votes of no confidence with nine abstentions, while Deputy Prime Minister Prawit Wongsuwan received the highest number of votes with 268 and Deputy Prime Minister and Commerce Minister Jurin Laksanawisit the lowest, earning 241 votes of support.
 - ❖ Of the highest number of 212 votes of no-confidence received by Interior Minister Anupong Paojinda, for instance, six were later found to have come from MPs of the ruling Palang Pracharath Party itself.
 - ❖ These six MPs voting against Gen Anupong belong to a clique in the party called Pak Nam Group.

- The low votes that Democrat party leader – Jurin Laksanawisit, who is also the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Commerce, has created a lot of feather ruffling in the coalition partners.
 - ❖ As many as 3 MPs from Chart Thai Pattana voted to abstain for Jurin
 - ❖ Democrat party is not happy about this and ‘it damages the credibility of the party and whatever happens will happen from here on.’
 - ❖ This has prompted the Democrat party to come out and say that it is ready to go polls anytime
 - ❖ Democrat plans to raise this issue in the Cabinet and also ask PPRP’s Prawit
- The low turnout of votes for Deputy Prime Minister Anupong Paochinda has created a major problem in PPRP as well.
- PM Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha just came out to say that rumours of a possible Cabinet reshuffle after the debate, that he would make no adjustment to the Cabinet, until the end of August or September.
 - ❖ The bigger issues, according to the PM, were his eight-year premiership and the question of how long he could righteously stay in his position. Gen Prayut was also concerned about the unfinished consideration of the 2023 budget bill and the transfers of the state officials.
 - ❖ After all these matters were sorted out, Gen Prayut said then he would consider the reshuffle to prepare for the dissolution.
- The huffing and puffing ‘Group of Sixteen’ MPs of smaller 1-2 MP parties, came out to deny the allegations of taking ‘Bananas’ (bribes) to vote in favour of the government.
 - ❖ Kathathep Techadechruangkul, party-list MP and the Pheu Chart Thai’s leader, said on behalf of the group regarding the alleged disclosure that his group took the bribe to support the govt in the no-confidence vote that the Group of Sixteen had never sold their votes.
 - ❖ In fact, the disclosed financial transaction was real, but it was just a normal fellow Peerawit Ruangluedolphak, member of the Group of Sixteen, borrowing money for another fellow MP.

- ❖ Regarding other exposed pictures of the financial transactions with the Group of Sixteen MPs' signatures, Kathathep said they were all edited using their signatures from one meeting in 2021 to debase the Sixteen group.
- ❖ Peerawit Ruangluedolphak, list MP who was accused of borrowing money, revealed that he did borrow money from Thammanat Prompao, leader of the Srettakit Thai Party, but it happened since Thammanat was still the secretary-general of PPRP.

- Somchai Srisutthiyakorn, former election commissioner, said on Facebook that the financial transactions exposed on social media were bogus evidence that could be submitted to the Election Commission for an investigation.
- ❖ This action was similar to how the Thai Rak Thai Party was proven to be attempting to dominate the small parties in the 2006 election to gain the most MP seats, which ultimately resulted in the party getting dissolved.

- Yuthaphong Jaratsathien, Maha Sarakham MP of the Pheu Thai Party, revealed that on July 25 the subcommittee of the ICT Department of State Enterprise and Revolving Capital would consider the 2023 budget for the Minister of Defense.

- ❖ Yuthaphong urged the public to keep an eye on the ministry's request to purchase four new fighter jets labeled F-35A worth 13.8 billion baht despite the country currently struggling financially.
- Yesterday (July 24), Super Poll released its poll survey on which minister survived the citizens' no-confidence vote. The most supported person appeared to be PM Gen Prayut with 61.1%, followed by Public Health Anutin with 59.2% and Gen Prawit with 58.7%.
 - ❖ But 69.1% of the poll doers said that they wanted to see the Cabinet reshuffle to let someone with good economic skills in to help solve the economic downturn.

- The Federation of Thai Industries (FTI) has come out to say that it was starting to become more concerned as some of the indications are that imports are starting to slow.
 - ❖ The slowing import is not a good sign as Thailand imports a lot of goods to add value and then reexport it.
 - ❖ The weakening Thai Baht has helped the export sector but it also has an impact on the imported goods.
 - ❖ Kriengkrai Thiannukul, chairman of the Federation of Thai Industries (FTI), said the ‘strengthening’ dollar had affected other regional currencies. In Asia, including the depreciation of the Thai Baht by about 7%, all industries that rely on the import of raw materials and all types of capital goods, such as machinery.
 - He said that the depreciating Thai Baht and rising inflation are having an impact on the businesses.
 - However, although the depreciation of the baht will benefit exporters and importers with foreign markets, the industries that will be heavily affected are those that must be import raw materials and has a main market in the country, especially regulated products that cannot adjust the prices according to higher costs, such as instant noodles This causes operators to choose to produce smaller quantities to reduce losses.
- Meanwhile Bank of Thailand governor – Sethaput Suthiwartnarueput, has come out to say that the economy was still in good shape and even if things slowdown globally, it would still not have much of an impact on Thailand.

- ❖ He said that as of now Thailand's economic growth continued to remain sustainable and would unlikely head in recession.
 - Krisada Chinavicharana, permanent secretary of the Ministry of Finance, as the chairperson of the Subcommittee on Monitoring and Analyzing the Economic Crisis said that the subcommittee's first meeting concluded last week to propose to form an ad hoc committee with PM Gen Prayut as the chairperson to address the economic crisis on July 25.
 - Don Nakornthab, senior director of the Financial Stability Department of the Bank of Thailand, said the department recently studied two example scenarios between hiking the interest rate to 2-2.75% and to 1.5-2.25% from the current rate of 0.5%.
 - ❖ According to the study, both business and household sectors are still capable of repaying their debt at a 2.75% rate per year. The business sector will have to endure around 2-4% interest burden compared to the business cost, but the household sector will have to endure over 8% interest burden, which could be uncomfortable for some low-income SMEs or families. Consequently, the Bank of Thailand requested all financial institutions to assist their debtors in preparing for the imminent interest hike.
 - Today the shares of Thai Life Insurance Plc (TLI) is set to list on the Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET).
 - ❖ TLI is the largest Thai-incorporated life insurance company, and the company has a market capitalization at its initial public offering (IPO) of 183.20 billion Baht.
 - ❖ SET Senior Executive Vice President Manpong Senanarong said that TLI has a registered paid-up capital of 11.45 billion Baht. The company offered 2.32 billion IPO shares comprising 850 million newly issued shares, 1.17 billion existing shares held by V. C. Property Co., Ltd., 138.49 million existing common shares owned by Her Sing (H.K.) Limited, and 161.63 million shares for overallotment option, with a par value of 1 Baht each.
