Thai Enquirer News Summary

Political New

- The possibility of a house dissolution starts to become more clear and now only awaits the endorsement of 2 bylaws that have been sent to HM the King.
 - ❖ There were 4 things that were awaited before the house is dissolved and out of those 4 things 2 seems to be nearly done
 - 1st is the announcement and the readiness of Ruam Thai Saang Chart party (RTSC), which is set to hold a meeting on January 9th to make its 'big' announcement.
 - 2nd thing that was needed was the announcement of the country's population, which as of end of 2022 stood at 66,090,475 people.
 - ✓ Out of this 65,106,481 were Thai citizens and 983,994 were foreigners
- Sources from the Ruam Thai Saang Chart (RTSC) Party reveal more details about the debut event of Prime Minister Prayut Chan-o-cha that will take place on January 9 at 17:00 hrs at the Queen Sirikit National Convention Center.

- ❖ Sources said the event's main attraction will be when General Prayut takes the stage to explain his reasoning for leaving Palang Pracharath party (PPRP), the ruling coalition party.
- ❖ About 40-50 MPs who are eyeing to quit their old parties will be joining the event to give a morale boost to Prayut. It is predicted that more than 5,000 people will be present at the event.
- ❖ Labour Minister - Suchart Chomklin, will showcase up to 12-15 MPs who would be switching
 - From
 - Democrat party
 - Palang Pracharat party
 - Action Coalition party
- ❖ As for MP candidate registration, the RTSC will have its MPs in each electoral district hold meetings to consider applicants every week. A total of 400 electoral districts will be covered.
- ❖ Additionally, the RTSC will conduct polls to finalize the decision when more than two candidates want to run for the same electoral district, especially in the Southern region.
- ❖ Meanwhile, Thanakorn Wangboonkongchana, the Minister of the Prime Minister's Office, will head a team of several provincial administrative administrators to actively seek votes across the country.
- Chayapa Sindhuprai, deputy spokesperson for the opposition Pheu Thai Party, came out to remind Gen Prayut about the Election Commission's (EC) rules after Prayut is scheduled to visit Singburi province along with several ministers today.
 - ❖ She said the EC's rules clearly state that political candidates and parties are prohibited from providing aid or assistance in the form of handouts to the public ahead of the poll. The fact that Gen Prayut can use state resources and budget for his political advantage creates an unfair advantage above others, Chayapa said.
 - ❖ In response, Tipanan Sirichana, deputy government spokesperson, came out to defend Gen Prayut, saying Prayut's visit to the area is simply a part of his duty as

Prime Minister. Caring for and listening to the problems of the people is a form of local governance, not politics

- Chinnaworn Boonyakiat, Democrat MP and deputy chief of the government, said that the most suitable time for a general debate without voting was around the start of February.
 - ❖ He said the debate should last 12 hours per day for two days, totalling 24 hours. This will be discussed at a meeting between the opposition and coalition whips held by Suchart Tancharoen, deputy parliament president.
 - ❖ It is reported that the cabinet is contemplating on preparing to answer questions from the opposition because this will be the final confrontation between the two sides in Parliament before the next election.
- Navy chief of staff Admiral Thaloengsak Sirisawat presided over a ceremony to take custody of the Thai Navy's new landing platform dock, "HTMS Chang", from China on January 4 at 13:19 hrs (local time).
 - ❖ Aranya Sirisawat, the wife of Admiral Thaloengsak, took charge of launching the warship at the 5th Shipyard of Huadong-Jinghua Shipbuilding in Shanghai, China.
 - ❖ HTMS Chang is Thailand's 3rd landing platform dock that will replace the old one with the same name.
 - ❖ This action aligns with the Navy's long-term plan to acquire four landing platform docks for use in operations such as amphibious warfare, marine rescue, and disaster relief. The strategy covers the period from 2017 to 2036.



Economic News

- The headline inflation increased by 5.89% year-on-year in December, the Ministry of Commerce said.
 - ❖ For 2022, headline inflation increased by an average of 6.08% year-on-year, the highest in 24 years when it reached 8.1% in 1998 which was a year after the Asian Financial Crisis.
 - ❖ Poonpong Naiyanapakorn, director-general of the ministry's Trade Policy and Strategy Office, said the increase in inflation in December was led by the prices of energy and food products that were higher than the low base during the same period in 2021 and the increase in domestic demand.
 - ❖ Comparing month on month from November to December, headline inflation slightly dropped by 0.06%, representing 2 consecutive months of decline as prices of fuel, pork, chicken, egg and fruit continued to fall from month to month. However, the prices of fuel, electricity, cooking gas, public transport and cleaning products were still higher than the same period in 2021.
 - ❖ At 6.08%, the average headline inflation for 2022 was in line with the ministry's expectation of around 5.5-6.5% and Thailand's inflation problem is still less than what was being seen in the US, UK, Italy, Mexico, India and some countries in Asean including Laos, the Philippines and Singapore, Poonpong said.

- The Parliament meeting is mulling over a question raised by Manop Keereepuwadol, party-list MP for the Move Forward Party, which asked Supattanapong Punmeechaow, Minister of Energy, about the electricity prices, which he said included several irregular costs such as the printing of the monthly bill, meter maintenance fees, and document delivery fees.

- ❖ He said these costs added over 38.22 Baht to each electricity bill and were unfair to citizens.
- ❖ Supattanapong responded that these costs were considered by the Energy Regulatory Committee, which were appropriate and not unfair.



- During yesterday's Parliament meeting, Jirat Thongsuwan, an MP from the opposition Move Forward Party, stood up to grill Saksayam Chidchob, Minister of Transport, about the 33-million-Baht redesign project of Bang Sue Grand Station's nameplates.
 - ❖ Jirat said the State Railway of Thailand (SRT), which is responsible for the project, is already deep in debt of over 200 billion Baht, making the project even more unreasonable and inappropriate to carry on.
 - ❖ He also said that the project's contractor, Unique Engineering and Construction Plc (UNIQ), once sued the SRT for 7.5 billion Baht in November 2022, which made it doubtful why the SRT was still trusted and hired UNIQ to change the nameplates.
 - ❖ Saksayam, in response, said that the redesign of the station's nameplate was a matter of tradition, not his personal need. It was similar to the change from Nong Ngu Hao Airport to Suvarnabhumi Airport.
 - ❖ As for why the SRT chose UNIQ, Saksayam said it was because UNIQ was the original builder of Bang Sue Grand Station and was still in the warranty period of the contract.
 - ❖ Meanwhile, the court fight between the SRT and UNIQ is still not over due to the SRT filing for an appeal.

 - ❖ The population was made up of 65,106,481 Thai nationals and 983,994 who are yet to receive Thai citizenship.

 - 31,755,032 males
 - ❖ Of the 983,994 who were yet to receive Thai citizenship, there were 515,583 males and 468,411 females.
 - ❖ Thailand's official population the previous year was 66,171,439, consisting of 65,197,783 Thai nationals and 973,656 non-Thais.
