





#### Thai Enquirer News Summary

#### Political New

- The Ruam Thai Saang Chart Party (RTSC) will launch a big rally in the north-eastern province of Nakhon Ratchasima on February 25 spearheaded by 2014 coup leader and incumbent Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha.
  - ❖ The schedule, however, has been changed as Gen Prayut will visit the silk-weaving center in Pak Thong Chai district in the morning and then jump onto the rally stage in the evening at around 18.30 hrs. The general is also expected to announce his new motto "Done that − Doing that − Continuing to do it" and debut MP candidates in the 20 north-eastern provinces, which have over 132 constituencies.
  - ❖ Meanwhile, it is reported that on February 27, the RTSC will introduce former MPs who have resigned from their old parties, as well as other candidates, at 4.00 p.m. at the party's office.
  - ❖ The defectors consisted of 28 MPs, with the highest number coming from the

- > Democrat party @ 6.
- ➤ Other political parties will also be represented, such as Anumat Suwannarat from the Prachachat Party and Supol Chullasai from the Action Coalition Party.
- A wave of controversy has surfaced following the visit of the Prime Minister and his entourage to the Halal Science Center at Chulalongkorn University on February 23<sup>rd</sup>, which was posted on the "Thai Khu Fah" Facebook page a government communication channel.
  - The post showed pictures of Prayut touring the laboratory without wearing any protective gear such as gloves, goggles, or lab coats, and even sporting jewelry, prompting criticism that he may have flouted laboratory safety protocols.
  - The criticism spiralled to a point that the post had to be removed from the social media page,
  - ❖ Despite the removal netizens are still calling for an explanation from the relevant authorities.



- Director of the Pheu Thai Family program Nattawut Saikua announced that his party is preparing to hold rallies in Chiang Rai and Chiang Mai provinces on February 25-26.
  - ❖ On February 25, a large rally will be held in the Thoeng district, Chiang Rai, led by party leader Cholanan Srikaew and leader of the Pheu Thai Family program Paethongtarn Shinawatra.
  - On February 26, another rally will be held in the Mueng district of Chiang Mai, which is the birthplace of former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra.



- The Democrat Party will release "Chao Wan Mai", sung by crooner-turned-politician Metee Arun, as its election anthem on YouTube channel this Saturday at 08:00 hrs.
  - ❖ Metee is the frontman of Labanoon, one of the most popular Thai bands of the late 1990s and early 2000s. He is set to contest the upcoming election in the southern border province of Narathiwat under the Democrat banner.
  - ❖ A more youthful face could help the party woo back young voters who flocked to the Future Forward Party at the 2019 election, leaving the Democrats trailing in fourth with just 53 seats.
  - Continuing the musical theme, the Democrats' new campaign poster depicts former leader and ex-premier Chuan Leekpai holding drumsticks in front of a large Sabat Chai victory drum. Chuan currently serves as House speaker and Parliament president.



- Yesterday the Democrat Party held its annual 2023 general meeting.
  - ❖ Party leader Jurin Laksanawisit, along with Chalermchai Sri-on, Minister of Agriculture and Cooperatives, Banyat Bantadtan, party adviser, and the surprise guest, Abhisit Vejjajiva, former Prime Minister and former party leader, were spotted at the meeting.
  - ❖ Jurin told the press regarding the potential nomination of Abhisit as one of the Democrat Party's premier candidates, saying it depended on the party's resolution and that even if he was a leader, he could not simply change or order things.
  - ❖ Jurin, however, disclosed that Abhisit would definitely take part in the campaigning of the Democrat Party.
  - ❖ Meanwhile, Abhisit revealed that he had not received any formal invitation from Jurin to run as either a party-list MP or a premier candidate so far.
  - ❖ Despite this, he acknowledged the intensity of the upcoming election, and emphasized that as a party member, he would continue to support the Democrat Party and work towards benefiting the country, whether or not he ends up running for office.



- Spokesman and party-list MP for the Move Forward Party Rangsiman Rome submitted evidence to the National Anti-Corruption Commission, accusing Senator Upakit Pachariyangkun of allegedly falsely declaring his assets and practicing nepotism overa political party.
  - \* Rangsiman alleged that Upakit nepotized the Ruam Thai Saang Chart Party by allowing it to construct an office on his land.

- Thanathorn Juangroongruangkit, leader of the Progressive Movement, remarked on the resolved discord between Pita Limjaroenrat, leader of the Move Forward Party (MFP), and Piyabutr Saengkanokkul, founding member of the now-defunct Future Forward Party (which MFP succeeded).
  - ❖ He said Pita and Piyabutr had already taken steps back from confrontations. Having had discussions and seeing the benefits of the party had led them to better understand each other, Thanathorn said.

- ❖ However, it is reported that Piyabutr will be traveling to meet his wife who is living abroad. It is uncertain whether he will return to help the Move Forward Party with the campaigning in time for the election.
- ❖ Meanwhile political pundits say that the cracks in Move Forward is unlikely to be healed and it may prop up after the elections.

# **Economic News**

- Kriengkrai Thiennukul, chairman of the Federation of Thai Industries, has warned that several global economic analysis agencies have projected a decrease in economic expansion, indicating a potential global economic downturn.
  - ❖ The decrease in projections comes as the war between Russia and Ukraine marks its 1<sup>st</sup> anniversary today, February 24, with no end in sight. The ongoing conflict has escalated with both sides showing aggression, posing risks not only to the global economy but also to Thailand's export sector, Kriengkrai said.
  - According to the National Economic and Social Development Council, Thailand's exports expanded by only 5.5% and the economy by 2.6% in 2022, while in 2023, the economy is expected to grow by only 2.7-3.7% with exports projected to be at 1.6%.
- Santi Promphat, Deputy Minister of Finance, revealed that the Finance Ministry will announce the list of eligible recipients of the 2022 state welfare card, totaling 14.5 million people, on March 1.
  - The recipients can start using their cards from April onwards.
  - ❖ For those who are not included in the list, they can file a complaint with the Krungthai Bank within 60 days and will receive a response in May 2023, with retroactive benefits granted if their appeal is approved, according to Santi.



- Chaiyapat Paitoon, chief financial officer of Minor International Plc (MINT), announced the company's performance for 2022.
  - ❖ The company had a net profit of 42.86 billion Baht, reversing from a net loss of 13.16 billion Baht in the previous year. The total revenue increased by 64% to 124.34 billion Baht from 76 billion Baht in the previous year, thanks to the recovering business environment in most major regions
  - ❖ MINT's EBITDA for 2022 grew two-fold to 32.91 billion Baht, driven by the increased profit from raising room rates and effective cost management.
  - Nomura Securities (Thailand) suggests buying MINT stock, with a target price of 42 Baht per share. They estimate the company's normal profit for 2023 to be around 5.9 billion Baht, which is a 191% increase from the previous year. In addition, Nomura predicts a normal profit of 8.3 billion Baht for 2024, which is a 42% increase from the previous year.
- Shareholders of True Corporation and Total Access Communications (Dtac) approved a rights issue of 34.552 billion shares at 4 baht apiece at a joint meeting on Thursday. They also approved the conversion of 138.208 billion Baht in paid-up capital of the two companies into capital of the newly merged company.
  - ❖ On Wednesday, True and Dtac shareholders approved the new name of the merged company, "True Corporation Plc", and gave it a new stock symbol − TRUEE.
  - ❖ The meeting on Thursday agreed that TRUE shareholders would have the right to buy new shares at the ratio of 1 existing share to 0.60018 new share while DTAC shareholders could purchase at a ratio of 1 existing share to 6.13444 new shares.
