#### Thai Enquirer News Summary

#### **Political New**

- Pheu Thai party is leading in the latest polls that has been leaked out by the 'Santi Baan' or the secret services of the Royal Thai Police.
  - ❖ Santi Baan, whose polls are usually considered to be very precise showed that Pheu Thai party was on the way to winning as many as 265 seats out of the 500 seats in the parliament. This poll by 'Santi Baan' was done before the announcement of the 10,000 Baht giveaway announced by Pheu Thai on April 5<sup>th</sup>.

- Meanwhile the man infamous for 'borrowing' multi-million dollar watches from dead friends and who is also the caretaker Deputy Prime Minister Gen Prawit Wongsuwan, came out to say that he was confident that his political party Palang Pracharath, would win more than 70 constituency seats and no less than 10 party-list seats in the upcoming elections, judging from the recent "secret" poll conducted by military and police intelligence agencies.
  - ❖ The poll found that Prawit had a better chance than Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha by 3%. Nonetheless, Paethongtarn Shinawatra from Pheu Thai still ranked first at 24.43%.
  - ❖ The poll also studied the popularity of political party's policies, which found that the first-ranked policy was the raising of the minimum wage to 600 Baht and a salary to 25,000 Baht for bachelor's degree holders, also belonging to the Pheu Thai Party.
  - ❖ Pheu Thai also ranked first with 48.5% among northeast respondents as to the party to lead the formation of the next government.







- Paetongtarn Shinawatra once again left 2014 coup leader and incumbent caretaker PM General Prayut Chan-o-cha and all other rivals in the dust in a survey of voters' preferred candidate for prime minister, outranking him by a margin of four to one among the 1,100 eligible voters surveyed in the province of Ubon Ratchathani.
  - ❖ The Pheu Thai candidate was named the top choice for premier by 45.55% of respondents in the northeastern province, while Prayut was selected by a mere 10.82% in the telephone survey conducted by the National Institute of Development Administration (Nida) from March 27 to 30.
  - ❖ The 2<sup>nd</sup> Pheu Thai candidate for prime minister, former property tycoon Srettha Thavisin, ranked 4<sup>th</sup> in the Nida poll with the support of 7.45% of respondents.
  - Thailand's largest political party was also the 1<sup>st</sup> pick for both constituency and party-list elections, with more than 60% support, according to the results of the poll released by Nida on Sunday.
  - ❖ The party offering Prayut as its PM candidate, Ruam Thai Saang Chart Party (RTSC), was unable to surpass single-digit support.
  - The Northeast is one of Pheu Thai's strongholds. It was also a stronghold of Pheu Thai's predecessor, Thai Rak Thai, which was formed by Paetongtarn's father, former prime minister Thaksin Shinawatra who lives in self-imposed exile.



• A total of 4,781 constituency candidates and 1,898 party-list candidates have applied to contest the May 14 election nationwide, with 63 prime ministerial candidates, the Election Commission (EC) said on Saturday.



- Srettha Thavisin, Pheu Thai's Prime Ministerial candidate, said at a rally in Lampang province that the controversy surrounding the 10,000-Baht handouts could be because other parties struggle to match its impact with their policies.
  - ❖ In support of Srettha's statement, Paetongtarn Shinawatra, another Pheu Thai's PM candidate, promised to assist farmers in Lampang by deferring their debt and interest payments for three years, creating new agricultural markets, and increasing the daily wage to 600 Baht.






- Boonyod Sooktinthai, an MP candidate for the Ruam Thai Saang Chart Party, claimed that the budget Pheu Thai would use to fund its 10,000-Baht handout scheme would come from tax revenue collected during the administration of caretaker Prime Minister Prayut Chan-o-cha.
  - ❖ He also said Pheu Thai miscalculated the Value Added Tax (VAT) revenue that the government would obtain from the policy, adding it was impossible to reach 100 billion Baht as Pheu Thai claimed.
  - ❖ Meanwhile serial petitioner Srisuwan Janya revealed he will file a petition against Pheu Thai for its campaign promise of giving 10,000 Baht in digital currency to citizens over 16 years old nationwide.

- ❖ He claimed the promise could violate the election regulations because Pheu Thai reportedly did not disclose the fact that people may receive only 8,500 Baht after deducting a 15% withholding tax of 1,500 Baht.
- The Ministry of Interior's online registration system for the voters that ended at midnight last night CRASHED as millions of Thais living outside the borders tried to register themselves before the deadline.
  - ❖ As many as 2.2 million people were able to register before the system crash but many were left stranded and have been complaining on social media platforms.
  - ❖ Move Forward party is to hold a Press Conference @ 10:30 am today to state their stance on this issue.



- Wan Ubumrung, the son of firebrand Pheu Thai politician, Chalerm Yubamrung, has come out to accept on his social media account that his rating in the Bang Bon constituency, where he already is an MP during the past parliamentary term, is slightly below that of 'other'.
  - ❖ He did not say who that 'other' was but Move Forward party's candidate was a close competitor during the previous election in 2019.

- One of Pheu Thai party's 3 prime ministerial candidates, Chaikasem Nitisiri, was taken to hospital in the northern province of Nan for a CT scan Saturday, which revealed a small blood clot in his brain.
  - ❖ An informed party source said that doctors at the hospital suspect that the clot might have been in the brain for some time and the condition is mild, but recommended that he undergoes a more thorough examination at a hospital in Bangkok.
  - Chaikasem and other party members were campaigning in Phu Phiang district, but he did not take part in a rally held at the stadium of Rajamangala University of Technology in the evening.
- The Army has apologised to the mother of a young man kept alive by oxygen and feeding tubes after she was forced to take him by ambulance to a military-conscription site in Lamphun province on Saturday to prove he is unable to be a soldier.
  - ❖ Disturbing photos and videos of the young man taken at the conscription-centre in Lamphun's Muang district caused an uproar on social media and heated criticism of the Army, which is in charge of provinces in the North.
  - ❖ Colonel Rungkhun Mahapanyawong, deputy spokesman for the 3<sup>rd</sup> division of the Army, apologised on Sunday to the mother, Duangkamol Wutthirothong, and to her comatose son, Thanakrit. He promised no such incident would happen again.

#### **Economic News**

- Somchai Jitsuchon, research director for Inclusive Development Policy at the Thailand Development Research Institute (TDRI), pointed out that the political parties' policies were highly conflicting.
  - Several parties introduced welfare policies, such as raising the monthly allowance for the elderly by 3,000 Baht. However, the cost of such policies, which could exceed 100 billion Baht annually, has raised concerns about the lack of clarity regarding potential revenue sources.
  - ❖ As a result, political parties need to be transparent and inform the public about how they plan to finance such policies, Somchai stated.



- Meanwhile high-level executives from 4 economic agencies, including the National Economic and Social Development Council (NESDC), the Ministry of Finance, the Budget Bureau, and the Bank of Thailand (BoT), recently met to discuss economic proposals to propose to the new government.
  - They mainly discussed the country's fiscal status, ways to increase revenue for the government, and tax reform.
  - ❖ The economic agencies also talked about policies that political parties are using to gain popularity, which could significantly increase the budget deficit and have long-term financial consequences.
- The Revenue Department sent warning letters to 35,000 individual taxpayers who have income that meets the threshold for filing a tax return.
  - ❖ The letters urge them to come forward and submit their tax returns. There are 10,000 more people this year, the department said.
  - On another note, the Revenue Department's revenue collection exceeded the target by more than 70 billion Baht for the first five months of the 2023 fiscal year (October 2022-February 2023).
  - ❖ This was due to the country's improving economy, increased domestic consumption, and improved tax collection efficiency, the department stated.
- The Government Housing Bank (GHB) announced an increase in interest rates for savings accounts and fixed deposits by 0.05-0.40% per annum, as well as an increase in interest rates for all types of loans by 0.25% per annum, effective from April 10th, 2023.

- Charoen Pokphand Foods Plc (CPF) is expected to release weaker-than-expected financial results for the first quarter of 2023.
  - ❖ Brokerage firms estimated that CPF's net profit will be around 1.47 billion Baht, a 48% decline from the same period last year when the net profit was 2.84 billion Baht, and an 18.56% drop from the previous quarter's net profit of 1.81 billion Baht.
  - ❖ This is due to a drop in pork prices in China, as major producers have increased production, leading to an increase in supply while demand is still weak. In Thailand, the price of pork is currently at 82 Baht per kilogram, down from the same period last year and the previous quarter, and is also being pressured by the smuggling of pork and lower consumption.
  - ❖ Nevertheless, consumption will expectedly recover in the second half of the year. The sales volume of CPF is also expected to increase along with the recovery by up to 10%.
- Srettha Thavisin's previous record and his company's Sansiri Plc (SIRI), past use of digital currency has all come into question.
  - SIRI had a few years ago issued digital currency to build its 'Siri Campus' that has now become the headquarters of SIRI and a high-end gated community.
  - SIRI has issued 2.4 billion Baht worth of digital currency to build 'SIRI Hub'.



- ❖ Questions have also been raised on the 10,000 Baht handout, which is now being compared to the self-exiled former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra's comments in which Thaksin had said about a year ago that handing out free cash is not the way to go.
  - A total of about 54 million Thais are expected to be given 10,000 Baht in digital currency to be spent within 6-months and in a radius of no more than 4-kilometers of their official residence.
