Politic News

- Thailand's Election Commission (EC) has come out to officially announce the results of the May 14th elections giving Move Forward 151 seats followed by Pheu Thai party with 141 seats.
 - The announcement of the results means that the entire timetable of Parliamentary meetings has been expedited.
 - MPs now have to report within 10-days to report to the parliament and then a voting of the speaker of the house is also expedited.



- ★ As many as 75.71% of the 52.195 million eligible voters turned up.
- The announcement by the EC to certify the candidates is surprising because no electoral rules were broken by any of the candidates (a surprising move especially when considered the amount of money used during this election).
- The battle for the position of the House Speaker continues to remain a big issue between the 2 largest parties Move Forward and Pheu Thai party.
 - The issue is leading to a possible breakup of the coalition as both sides are unwilling to back down.
 - Move Forward party is not willing to give up because there is a fear that its leader – Pita Limjaroenrat, would be banned from politics for holding shares in media company – iTV Plc, and therefore the Prime Ministership would end with Pheu Thai party's candidate for Prime Minister.
- At yesterday's press briefing, deputy leader of the Move Forward party (MFP) Sirikanya Tansakun revealed that 16-20 senators had agreed to vote for her party's prime ministerial candidate Pita Limjaroenrat as PM.
 - She continued that every coalition partners were still on good terms after signing a memorandum of understanding (MOU) on May 22th.
 - Regarding the position of the House Speaker, Sirikanya insisted that it should be held by someone from the MFP to allow her party to control the parliamentary meetings and propose agendas.
 - "If people still focused too much on the issue of seniority, it would be difficult to bring about changes," she said
 - She added that negotiations with the coalition parties should be concluded within the next 2 weeks.
- The Move Forward party posted an open call on its Facebook, insisting that the House Speaker seat needed to be allocated to the party so that it could push forward its 45 legislative bills to revive the country.
 - Also the Move Forward party recently launched an online community called "กับว Geek Open.Keen.Agile" as a way to communicate with the public, said Natthaphong Ruengpanyawut, MP-elect and deputy leader of the party.
 - Currently, the group has about 200,000 members, and during late nights, there were 40,000 to 50,000 online users.



- Responding to reports that Pheu Thai might nominate leader of the party Chonlanan Srikaew as a House Speakers, Prasert Chanruangthong, secretary-general of the party, said it was appropriate as Chonlanan was a 6-time MP and was well-versed in parliamentary regulations.
 - Yesterday's evening, the Pheu Thai party also tweeted that the Speaker of the House has the responsibility to control the parliamentary sessions and push forward policies of all coalition parties, not just one specific party.
 - If one wants to look back when Pheu Thai secured both PM and House Speaker roles, they also have to take into account the fact that Pheu Thai won the election decisively at that time and had more than half of the total votes in Parliament, the party said.



• Furthermore, Pheu Thai's PM candidate Srettha Thavisin took to his Twitter account to retweet a picture of a dog and the text "Sometimes dogs are better company than people," with the comment "I agree, sir."



- Sita Divari, the Secretary-General of the Thai Sang Thai party, retaliated Chonlanan's remarks in the Thai media, where he said that he wanted to box with Sita and advised him to refrain from discussing disagreements within the coalition with the press.
 - Sita countered by highlighting the inconsistency in Chonlanan's statement, pointing out that Pheu Thai, in contrast, was allowing its party members to openly express their opinions on social media as they fiercely competed for the position of House Speaker against the Move Forward party.
 - He emphasized that despite having only six parliamentary votes, the Thai Sang Thai party stood firmly in support of democracy, unlike Pheu Thai, who seemed to be primarily focused on their own interests.

• Outspoken former politician Chuwit Kamolwisit yesterday held a press briefing criticizing the current political situation.

- ✤ He said there were attempts to create divisions within the coalition partners, particularly regarding the issues about the position of the House Speaker.
- According to protocol, this position should be decided through consensus within the coalition rather than by a vote. If a vote was used, it might indicate that the coalition was falling apart, Chuwit pointed out.
- In addition, Move Forward leader Pita eventually might not be able to become PM due to issues with his alleged holding of media shares. If this happened, the PM role would automatically fall to the second-largest coalition partner Pheu Thai, Chuwit explained.
- "I have received news that some people just held a talk at the Pinehurst Golf Field. These people tried to force Move Forward and Thai Sang Thai into the opposition camp while allowing Pheu Thai, Palang Pracharath, Democrat, and Bhumjai Thai to form a government to enable Thaksin Chinnawat to return home," said Chuwit.



- The Royal Thai Force (RTAF) is insisting on the need to acquire new aircraft to replace its aging F-16 fighter jets, which are about to be decommissioned, in order to maintain its combat readiness and to protect the country's air space, Air Vice Marshal Prapas Sonjaidee, spokesman for the RTAF, said Thursday.
 - The United States rejected Thailand's request to buy their state-of-the art F-35A stealth fighters. The RTAF was recently informed of the US administration's rejection by the US ambassador to Thailand Robert F. Godec, during his recent call on the Air Force commander-in-chief.
 - According to the explanation given by the US administration, it will take at least ten years for the US to approve the sale of the advanced jet fighters to a new customer like Thailand and there are numerous requirements that Thailand must meet before the sale can be approved.

He said that the US administration is prepared to sell its 4.5-generation fighters, such as the F-15 and the more advanced F-16, to Thailand, which could be delivered within shorter period of time. The RTAF will review its acquisition plan for new jet fighters cautiously, to ensure the most beneficial use of the defence budget.



- Self-exiled former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra, is in Singapore and his daughter and the Prime Minister candidate of Pheu Thai party Paetongtarn Shinawatra, has posted pictures of herself shopping with her father and aunty Yingluck Shinawatra.
 - She posted on social media account that she was leaving her new born baby with the 'grandmother' to go see Thaksin for a few days.

- Yesterday, the Ministry of Commerce met with 58 commercial attaches from 43 countries worldwide, along with provincial commerce officials and the private sector in Thailand, to discuss plans for boosting exports in the second half of 2023.
 - The meeting came after Thailand's export performance showed a negative growth from October 2022 to March 2023, with a decline of 4.5% in the first quarter of 2023. The country's total export value stood at \$US 70.28 billion, incurring a deficit.
 - Kirati Ratchano, Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Commerce revealed that the meeting concluded on 350 activities to develop the country's export in seven regions.
 - He anticipated that these activities would help generate more than \$US 550 million in revenue for the country, thus driving the export figure to reach the target of 1-2%.



- The Employers'Confederation of Thai Trade and Industry (EconThai) on Thursday voiced apprehension over the possible impact on businesses of the Move Forward Party's wage policy.
 - Private sector members, particularly small and medium enterprises, are perturbed after learning details of the discussions held on Wednesday between Move Forward leader Pita Limjaroenrat and the Federation of Thai Industries (FTI), said Thanit Sorat, vice-chairman of EconThai.

- Move Forward pledged during the election campaign to raise the minimum wage to 450 baht from the current range of 328 to 354 baht. If the minimum daily wage is made to increase sharply, many employers will be left with no choice but to replace as many workers as possible with robots, adding that it would probably happen in the manufacturing and the service sectors.
- Foreign investors continue to sell down Thai stocks and yesterday were net sellers of more than 2.7 billion Baht.
 - So far this month they have been net sellers of 24.4 billion Baht and a bulk of it has been after the May 14th elections.
