Thai Enquirer News Summary

Political News

- The Election Commission is set to forward the findings of the sub-committee looking at the breach of rules by Move Forward party leader and 30th Prime Minister hopeful – Pita Limjaroenrat, to the Constitutional Court on July 11th.
 - ❖ There are other reports that suggest that the filing would be done on July 12th but the Constitutional Court holds a meeting every Wednesday, which will be July 12th, therefore it is assured that the EC will forward the findings of the breach of electoral rules of applying for MP status while holding media shares.
 - ❖ Pita has been bombarded for holding 42,000 shares of now inactive media operator – iTV Plc, which he claims is an inheritance from his deceased father. His father had passed away in 2006 but the shares of iTV were still under Pita's

name without any reference to it being inherited or on behalf of 'trust' for the family.



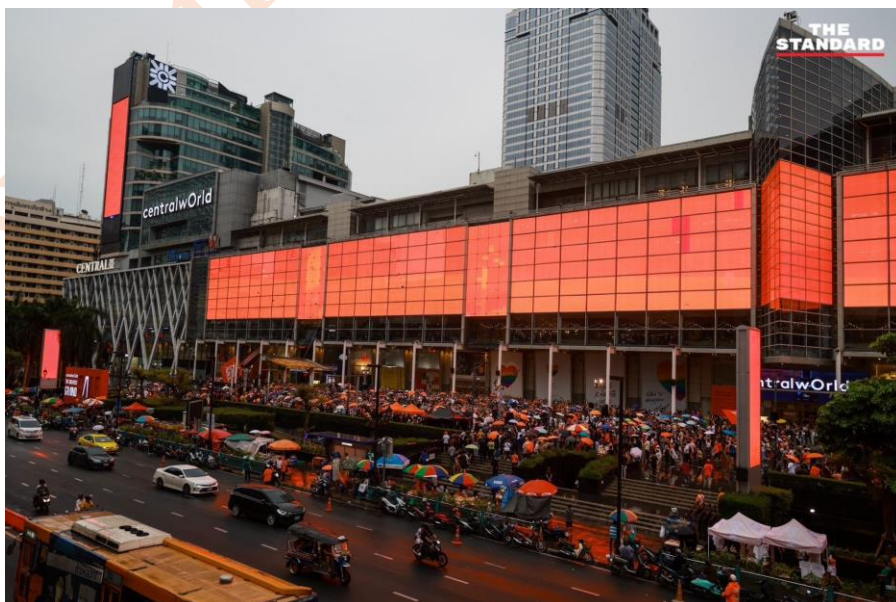
- 4 days to watch out for Pita
 - ❖ July 9 - Sub-committee completed its investigation into Pita's shareholding.
 - ❖ July 10 - Put forward the outcome of the investigation to the EC.
 - ❖ July 11 - 8 coalition parties meet to discuss the outcome of the Senator lobbying.
 - ❖ July 12 - Election Commission to meet to propose to Constitutional Court to consider his candidacy.
 - ❖ July 13 - Constitutional Court set to hold its weekly Wednesday meeting and could consider the qualifications of Pita that would have been forwarded by the EC on July 11 or July 12.
- Move Forward Party leader Pita Limjaroenrat on Sunday traveled to Suphanburi province, where he took to the stage to announce his readiness to become the Prime Minister.
 - ❖ Although in the previous election he did not secure a single constituency seat in Suphanburi, the party's party-list votes ranked 1st in the province, Pita stated.
 - ❖ He further mentioned that many senators wanted to vote for him as they wanted to see the government that came from a majority voice. Therefore, he encouraged and supported the bravery of those senators.



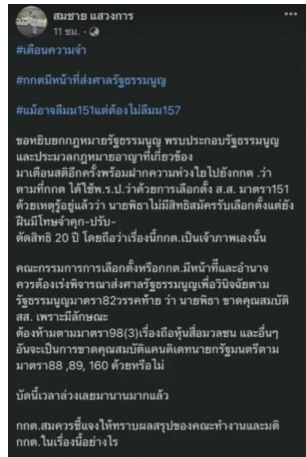
- ❖ In the evening, at the CentralWorld shopping complex, the Move Forward Party organized a rally to express gratitude to the voters. The event took place despite the rain, and the enthusiastic supporters of the party filled the entire area.
- ❖ This event marks the final stretch of the Move Forward Party's campaign to mobilize the public to pressure the Senate to vote for Pita on July 13.
- ❖ Pita will be thanking voters in Pathum Thani province today and in Samut Prakan province tomorrow.



- ❖ Pictures from the scene showed that the entire area was packed but then pictures taken by The Standard says a different story.



- Pita is set to travel to Pathumthani province today
 - ❖ Then he's set to travel to Samut Prakarn province tomorrow
- Pheu Thai secretary-general Prasert Chanthararuangthong revealed that the 8 coalition parties will gather at the Parliament on July 11 at 09:30 hrs. to prepare for the Prime Ministerial vote on July 13th.
 - ❖ He clarified that the discussions during the meeting will not include the possibility of Pita failing to secure enough votes in the first round. He added that the Pheu Thai Party has not received precise information from the Move Forward Party regarding the exact number of supporting senators for Pita yet.
 - ❖ Following this meeting, the Pheu Thai Party will organize a separate meeting of its party-list MPs on July 12 at 14:00 hrs, after the morning session of Parliament, to determine the voting resolution for the Prime Ministerial vote.
- Outspoken senator Praphan Koonmee, who clearly stated that he will not vote for Pita as a PM, revealed that he was not scared of a possible gathering in front of the Parliament on the day of the Prime Ministerial vote.
 - ❖ In his remarks, Senator Praphan criticized the Move Forward Party for its habit of mobilizing the masses to pressure others, which he viewed as undemocratic and autocratic. He believed that the party was essentially digging its own grave.
 - ❖ "If the Senate does not vote for Pita to become the Prime Minister, what law have they violated?," Praphan said. "As far as I have discussed with the others, no one is scared of the orange-clad protesters (Move Forward's supporters). No matter how many years they gather, they will not succeed. The police are already preparing detention facilities for them."
- Meanwhile senator Somchai Sawangkarn is so eager to see the Election Commission forward a complaint against Pita regarding his media shareholding to the Constitutional Court that he threatens to file a complaint against the EC itself for working too slow.
 - ❖ He said if the EC decides not to forward the case to the court, he will file a complaint against the EC for negligence of duty under Article 157.

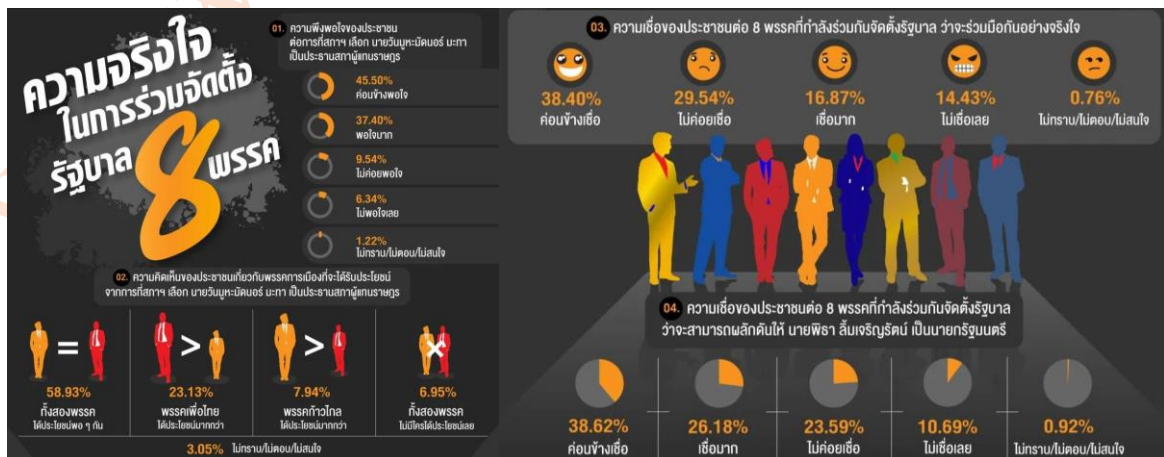


- Former Red Shirt co-leader Jatuporn Prompan urged the Move Forward Party not to organize a rally ahead of the voting day for the Prime Minister.
 - ❖ This is because there may be ill-intentioned individuals who tried to interfere and cause political turmoil, he said. Also, he mentioned that the Move Forward Party should not be fearful and try to mobilize people if they are confident about securing enough Senate votes.
- The Royal Thai Police is reportedly preparing a force of 1,360 personnel to ensure security and peace in front of the Parliament on the prime ministerial voting day.
 - ❖ Initially, there will be two groups of demonstrators, one led by Jatupat Boonpattaraksa, also known as Pai Dao Din, and the other led by Somyot Pruksakasemsuk. The estimated number of participants is over 1,000 people.
- General Prawit Wongsuwan is the most suitable person to take the prime ministerial position, Chaiwut Thanakmanusorn, Deputy Leader of the Palang Pracharat Party, stated.
 - ❖ Prawit, who is infamous for his multi million dollar watch borrowing from ‘dead’ friends, commented in reference to a possibility that the two largest parties in the current coalition, Move Forward and Pheu Thai, failed to gather enough votes from the Senate to form a government.
 - ❖ Chaiwut suggested that in such a situation, Pheu Thai should consider turning to the Palang Pracharat Party and assist in backing Prawit to become the Prime Minister because almost every political group and party respect him, which makes him the most suitable candidate for the prime ministerial role.



- A majority of people believe the 8 parties forming the next government will succeed in their push for Pita Limjaroenrat, the Move Forward Party leader, to be prime minister, according to an opinion survey by the National Institute of Development Administration, or Nida Poll.

- ❖ The poll was carried out July 5-7 by telephone interviews with 1,310 people aged 18 and over of various levels of education, occupations and incomes throughout the country.
- ❖ Asked which of the Move Forward and Pheu Thai parties would benefit more from Wan Muhamad Noor Matha's being made House speaker, 58.93% said the two parties would benefit equally ; 23.13% pointed to Pheu Thai.
- ❖ Asked whether they believed the eight parties were sincere in joining hands to form a government, a majority or 55.27% said "yes" and the other side, 43.97%, said "no". The rest, 0.76%, had no answer or not interested.
- ❖ A majority, 64.80%, said they believed the eight parties would succeed in pushing for Pita to become prime minister while 34.28% said otherwise. The rest, 0.92%, had no answer or were not interested.



- The extraordinary general meeting of the Democrat party, called to elect a new party leader and executive board yesterday, was abruptly adjourned after the meeting lacked a quorum.
 - ❖ The meeting, at the grand ballroom of the Miracle Hotel, started at about 14.30 hrs. Several former leaders, including Chuan Leekpai, Banyat Bantadtan and Jurin Laksanawisit, attended the meeting along with numerous party members.
 - ❖ The only agendum of the meeting was to elect a new party leader to replace Jurin, who resigned after the announcement of the May 14th election result, which saw the party routed in Bangkok and losing significant ground in its southern stronghold. Party secretary-general Chalermchai Sri-on also quit.
 - ❖ When the meeting resumed after a lunch break, it appeared that the number of people present had fallen short of a quorum, prompting Khunying Kalaya Sophonpanich, deputy party leader who chaired the meeting, to order a 20 minute break, hoping for more attendees.
 - ❖ A second head count was held at 3pm. There were only 201 participants present, which was fewer than the 221 in the first head count and short of a quorum. The meeting was, therefore, adjourned.
 - ❖ Jurin will call a meeting of the acting executive board on Tuesday, to discuss an exemption from the party regulation in order to hold another general meeting to elect the new party leader and executive board.



- Former Democrat deputy leader Prinn Panitchpakdi faces 12 sex-crime cases, the Office of the Attorney General said.
 - ❖ One of 13 cases received has been dismissed, while the office is investigating 11 cases and may appeal a provincial court's ruling to dismiss another, the office's deputy spokesperson, Kosolwat Intuchanyong, said.

- ❖ The case that may be appealed was dismissed by the Chiang Mai Provincial Court. "Officials are investigating 11 cases," Kosolwat said, adding that some cases under the Bangkok South Criminal Court's responsibility are waiting for witness examination.
 - ❖ Prinn resigned from his position last year after the first case was made public. Other allegations followed and the Democrat Party faced calls for an investigation of its executive board as well as the resignation of its leader. Prinn is the son of former deputy prime minister and former World Trade Organisation chief Supachai Panitchpakdi.

Economic News

- Ekniti Nitithanprapas, the Director-General of the Excise Department, provided an update on the new measure to reduce the excise tax on diesel fuel following the expiration of the current tax cut on July 20.
 - ❖ He mentioned that Arkhom Termpittayapaisith, the Acting Minister of Finance, has instructed the department to closely monitor the global oil situation.
 - ❖ Currently, there has been a decline in global oil prices, with an average of around \$70 per barrel. This has alleviated the pressure on domestic oil prices.
 - ❖ Ekniti said the status of the Oil Fuel Fund has also improved recently. However, the decision to extend the tax cut on diesel fuel is still under discussion. In such a scenario, the Oil Fuel Fund may need to step in and provide assistance.
- Arthid Nanthawithaya, CEO of SCB Express Plc (SCBX), urged the new government to address the worsening issues about debt of the Thai people.
 - ❖ He revealed that household debt in Thailand currently accounts for over 90% of GDP.
 - ❖ With a population of around 60-70 million people, only 30% of them borrow money from commercial banks and state-owned financial institutions. The remaining 60% rely on informal lending sources. Out of the 30% that borrow from formal institutions, 10% borrow from commercial banks, while 20% borrow from state-owned financial institutions.

- ❖ A major concern now is the need to increase the income of lower-income individuals so they can cope with the interest rates associated with informal debts.
 - ❖ These interest rates may reach over 100%, with calculations being made on a weekly or monthly basis. This issue requires urgent attention from the new government, Arthid emphasized.
 - 2014 coup leader and incumbent caretaker Prime Minister Prayut Chan-o-cha will today inspect the progress of the Pink Line, an elevated monorail train system under construction, prior to it going on a trial run, acting government spokesman Anucha Burapachaisri said.

General News

- Thailand's Customs Department leads in a new way, it is now auctioning FAKE watches.
 - ❖ The issue was revealed after a bidder purchased a 'Richard Mille' for 2.2 million Baht and suspected something is wrong. He went to get it checked and it turned out to be a fake one.
 - ❖ When the buyer chased up with the Customs Department, they admitted that they will take a look into this issue.



- The immensely popular “Matalada” drama on Channel 3, which raises the issue of LGBTQ+, is currently trending on social media, as is the political controversy.
 - ❖ Netizens praised the drama for demonstrating that a transgender guy could be an excellent father who cares for his daughter. However, the drama’s director, Miew Pawanrat Naksuriya, used to speak in support of violence in the event that a gunman fired at a group of red-shirt protesters campaigning for elections in Lak Si area, Bang Khen, on February 1, 2014, as a fun talk on the PDRC stage.
 - ❖ Since then, the female director has been criticised for failing to apologise for her conduct. She came under fire again after the success of Matalada’s production. Some netizens remarked that they would not watch it because of the director.
 - ❖ So some individuals have banned the drama, but others believe it ought not to be linked with the drama. Some ironically said that the more opposition there is, the more popular the drama will be. They posted on Friday a picture showing Matalada,” the recent Netflix most-watched series.



- A reward of 3 million Baht is being offered on social media to anyone who knows the whereabouts of a German real estate businessman, who has reportedly been missing from his home in Bang Lamung district of Chon Buri province, with his Mercedes Benz, since July 4th.
 - ❖ A 24-year old woman, “Phiraya”, who claims to have been living with the 62-year-old businessman, Hans Peter Ralter Mack, for five years, told that she filed a missing person report with Nong Prue police on July 5th, seeking their help in tracking down the man, who left home in the Sweet Paradise housing estate in

Nong Prue sub-district on July 4th, to meet a foreign broker regarding a land deal on Samui Island in Surat Thani province, and has not been heard from since.

- ❖ She also said that she offering 100,000 baht for information about what has happened to him, adding that she is concerned for his safety because he has never been away from home for several days.

Issues to be watched out for

- On July 9, 2023, the Democrat party is scheduled to hold a general meeting to select a new leader. This decision comes after Jurin Laksanawisit, who has been leading the party since 2019, resigned from his position following the party's reduced performance in the parliament. The party's seat count decreased from 52 in the 2019 elections to 25.
- July 10 - The media shareholding of Pita Limjaroenrat issue by the sub committee is put forward to the Election Commission for consideration.
- July 11 & 12 - The Senate is set to hold its meeting to decide on what to do with the voting on the Prime Minister position.
- July 11 - 8 coalition parties meet to discuss the outcome of the Senator lobbying.
- July 12 - Election Commission to meet to propose to Constitutional Court to consider his candidacy based on the investigation by the sub-committee on his media shareholding case.
- July 13 - Constitutional Court set to hold its weekly Wednesday meeting and could consider the qualifications of Pita that would have been forwarded by the EC on July 11 or July 12.

- July 13th (if Move Forward's Pita Limjaroenrat makes it beyond 375 votes out of the 750 members of both the Senate and the lower house, he would become the PM)
- July 19th - 2nd voting in case the 1st reading fails to elect a PM.
- July 20th - 3rd voting in case the 2nd reading fails to elect a PM.
- July 21, 2023 - If all goes well on July 13th, the new Cabinet is scheduled to be formed by July 21st.
- July 31, 2023 - The Ministry of Finance will announce its own GDP data.
- August 11, 2023 - The members of the new government will pledge their allegiance to HM the King.
- October 31, 2023 - The Ministry of Finance will announce its own GDP data.
