Thai Enquirer News Summary

Political News

• Srettha Thavisin, received the royal endorsement on Wednesday thus officially becoming Thailand's 30th Prime Minister.



- ❖ The Royal Gazette published the royal endorsement of His Majesty the King on Wednesday. A ceremony was held at the Pheu Thai Party headquarters in Bangkok, in the presence of politicians from the Pheu Thai-led coalition.
- ❖ Following the royal endorsement, Srettha said: "Dear people, I affirm that I will work with integrity and prioritise the interests of the nation and the people. I am confident that the next four years will be four years of change."
- ❖ "I, Srettha Thavisin, will work tirelessly and will be a government that works hard and listens to the people to bring about harmony in society, move Thailand forward, and build a better future for our children," he said.










• As mandated by law, after the royal endorsement, the PM is required to appoint his Cabinet. Once the Cabinet gets royal endorsement, the PM must take the oath of office and declare his government's policies to Parliament within 15 days.



- As per the schedule, the entire Cabinet should be sworn in and be active by the end of September 2023.
 - Outgoing Deputy Prime Minster and legal expert Wissanu Krea-ngam, has come out to say that
 - Mid-September Prime Minister Srettha selects the Cabinet ministers to be in his Cabinet.
 - Mid-Late September Cabinet is vetted for their credentials and background checks.
 - Mid-Late September Prime Minister forwards the names to HM the King for his endorsement to appoint the Cabinet.
 - Late September Once HM the King endorses the names, the Cabinet is in place and able to perform their duties.



• The gathering of coalition partners to receive the endorsement of HM the King for Srettha saw some unusual pictures, especially the likes of Anutin Charnvirakul and Srettha.



- There are reports that suggest that the endorsement of Srettha came out at a lighting speed because the changes in the Royal Thai Police, the various chiefs of armed forces are set to retire at the end of September 2023 and their appointments are set to take place within the next couple of weeks.
 - ❖ 2014 coup leader Prayut Chan-o-cha reportedly is calling for meetings to appoint his own people but that could be a herculean task.
 - ❖ Gen Prayut chaired a seven-member panel to appoint new military chiefs yesterday, initially, Gen Prayut appointed Gen Songwit Nunpakdee as Supreme Commander, Gen Charoenchai Hinthao as Commander-in-Chief of the Royal Thai Army, Air Chief Marshal Punpakdee Pattanakul as Commander-in-Chief of Air Force.
 - ❖ However, the decision for the Chief of the Navy has not been concluded.
 - ❖ Another meeting to appoint a new police chief will take place on Friday, with Gen Prayut expected to propose Deputy Polic Chief Pol. Gen. Torsak Sukwimol as the next National Police Chief.
- Palang Pracharat Party (PPRP) is reportedly facing challenges in its bid to secure the position of Minister of Agriculture and Cooperatives for its party member and drug dealing convict Thammanat Prompao.
 - This is because a number of senators, who are seen as being aligned with PPRP leader Prawit Wongsuwan, refused to vote for Srettha Thavisin. This situation has led the Pheu Thai Party to reconsider its position and potentially give up the Agriculture and Cooperatives portfolio to the Bhumjai Thai Party instead.
 - ❖ Meanwhile, the Palang Pracharat Party will be given the Minister of Natural Resources and Environment position.
 - The Ruam Thai Sang Chart Party will be given the Minister of Energy and the Minister of Industry position as reports said.
- As the squabbling of the Cabinet sets continues, there is one confirmation (as of now) which is that outgoing Deputy Prime Minister Anutin Charnvirakul, is not getting the Ministry of Public Health.
 - ❖ In a video that has gone viral, Anutin is seen as walking up to the Move Forward party's zone in the parliament and telling the MPs of Move Forward something. Then one of the key leaders of Move Forward, Taopiphop Limjittrakorn, then came out to reveal the details of the conversation on his X (Twitter account).

❖ He said that during the conversation Anutin confirmed that he was not getting Ministry of Public Health.



- Reports suggest that Gen Natthapon "Biglek" Nakpanich, former Secretary of the National Security Council (NSC), will assume the position of Minister of Defense.
 - ❖ Biglek has a close relationship with Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha as they were both members of the NSC during the year 2020.



- Jailed former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra remains hospitalized in Police General Hospital after being transferred out of prison overnight on Wednesday for chest congestion and high blood pressure.
 - ❖ Bangkok Remand Prison Commander Natthee Thongplad confirmed that Thaksin is still being treated at the police hospital, with multiple officers on duty. He said that any potential transfer to a private hospital would require his approval.

- ❖ Additionally, Natthee denied that Thaksin is receiving any special privileges. He said that Thaksin is receiving the same care as other inmates in accordance with the policies of the Department of Corrections and human rights principles.
- ❖ Today, political activist Srisuwan Janya will file a complaint with the Office of the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) to interrogate all relevant officials for allegedly providing preferential care to Thaksin.
- The Police General Hospital's chief insisted that former PM Thaksin Shinawatra was not getting any special privileges.
 - Thaksin is being closely monitored by a team of six doctors after he was rushed to hospital early on Wednesday.
 - ❖ Pol Lt-General Soponrat Singhajaru, the hospital's director-general, denied Thaksin had been placed in a VIP ward on the 14th floor of a 20-storey building.
 - ❖ He said Thaksin had actually been placed in a non-airconditioned room on the 14th floor, where Covid-19 patients were once treated. "Air-conditioning on that floor is out of order, so two fans are being used for ventilation," he said.
 - Soponrat also insisted that Thaksin's room does not have a good view of the city either, because rooms on that side got direct sunlight and heated up during the day. The Royal Thai Police had not been informed in advance of Thaksin being admitted to hospital, adding that his transfer was an emergency.
- Acting Democrat Party leader Jurin Laksanawisit has called on 16 Democrat MPs who
 defied the party line and voted for Srettha Thavisin to explain themselves at the next
 party meeting.
 - ❖ Jurin said that if he is asked, he will order an investigation against the 16 renegade MPs. "The party has its pride. We worked both as a coalition partner and an opposition party. We can perform all types of duties, but we have never been a spare parts party," he said.
 - ❖ An investigation appears imminent after deputy Democrat leader Satit Pitutecha said some 20 party members have signed a petition seeking one.
 - ❖ Without naming names, Satit said some of the 16 MPs had travelled to meet former PM Thaksin Shinawatra in Hong Kong earlier.

- ❖ He added that it would depend on the party's executive board and MPs to decide how these 16MPs should be dealt with, adding that the severest penalty would be expulsion from the party.
- The Internet Dialogue on Law Reform (iLaw) announced that it will move forward with its attempt to collect 50,000 signatures to petition the Parliament for a people-drafted constitution.
 - ❖ The group has scheduled two signature-gathering events today and tomorrow from 16:00 to 20:00 hrs at Bangkok Art and Culture Centre.



Economic News

- Bank of Thailand (BoT) Governor Sethaput Suthiwartnarueput announced that the BoT will revise its forecasts for the Thai economy in September 2023.
 - The previous projection was for a 3.6% expansion. However, the Thai economy is currently facing fluctuations due to both external and internal factors, particularly the issue of household debt, which stands at over 90.6% of the country's GDP.
 - ❖ This situation could affect domestic consumption, thus necessitating a forecast revision, Sethaput stated.
- Budget Bureau Director Chalermpol Phensoot revealed that the Budget Bureau had recently requested approval for a provisional budget of 1.5 trillion Baht from acting Prime Minister Prayut Chan-o-cha. It is expected that this request will be approved and an announcement will be made either this week or early next week.

- ❖ The provisional budget will serve as an interim measure while the official budget for the 2024 fiscal year is expected to be finalized, potentially as late as May 2024, Chalermpol said.
- Phue Thai party's key people have come out to say that 'Digital Wallet' of 10,000 Baht per person would likely to be ready by early next year and be usable by April 2024
 - Anyone above the age of 16 would be able to use it for purchasing things within 4 kilometers from their registered residence.
- The stock price of Indorama Ventures PCL (IVL) fell 1.25 Baht or 4.14% yesterday to close at 29 Baht. The trading volume was 954 million Baht.
 - ❖ Morgan Stanley downgraded its investment stance on IVL from overweight to underweight and lowered its target price from 53 Baht to 27 Baht per share. The downgrade is due to the anticipated downside risks for the PET plastic business market in the United States over the next two years.
 - This could limit IVL's debt reduction opportunities and potentially affect profitability.
 - ❖ IVL's earnings for the years 2023 to 2025 are expected to be lower than the market consensus by 40-50%. Over the past 10 years, IVL has not had a year-on-year decrease in debt. Currently, the net debt stands at 1.4 times the market capitalization and 4 times the EBITDA.
- Prasert Prasarttong-Osoth, Chairman of the Executive Board and CEO of Bangkok Dusit Medical Services Plc (BDMS), sold a total of 13.00 million shares of BDMS for a total amount of 390.27 million Baht. The sales were conducted as follows:
 - ❖ On August 21, 10 million shares were sold at a price of 28 Baht per share
 - ❖ On August 22, 3.90 million shares were sold at a price of 28.25 Baht per share.

• The stock price of Esso (Thailand) Plc (ESSO) rose 0.25 Baht or 2.70% to close at 9.50 Baht yesterday, with a trading value of 573 million Baht. The increase was driven by the successful acquisition of ESSO's ordinary shares by Bangchak Corporation Plc (BCP) from ExxonMobil.

- ❖ Kasikorn Securities Initially assessed the fair value of ESSO's shares to be in the range of 9.30 to 9.60 Baht per share. The target price for ESSO is set at 10.30 Baht. This valuation is based on ESSO's strong financial performance in the 3rd quarter of 2023, which was driven by higher refining margins of USD 13.4 per barrel.
- Additionally, Kasikorn Securities expects ESSO to pay higher dividends in the 2nd half of the year compared to the 1st half.
- A day after the euphoria on the Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) has died down and yesterday the SET Index rise but only slightly.


