Thai Enquirer News Summary

Political News

- Prime Minister and Minister of Finance Srettha Thavisin took his Cabinet to take the oath of office before His Majesty the King at Ambara Villa in Dusit Palace yesterday, officially marking the end of the previous government's tenure.





- Today Prime Minister and Minister of Finance Srettha Thavisin will convene an extraordinary Cabinet meeting to prepare to declare the government policies to Parliament on September 11.
 - ❖ He said that on September 8, he will visit the provinces of Khon Kaen, Udon Thani, and Nong Khai to listen to the public's concerns and plights.
 - ❖ He emphasized that his government could not afford such a thing as a honeymoon period because they need to start working immediately. He also mentioned that he plans to launch the 10,000-Baht digital cash handout by February 1 next year.



- At the same time the policy of pegging mass transit train fares at 20 Baht per ride will not be part of the government's upcoming policy announcement in parliament, as confirmed by the new Transport Minister, Suriya Juangroongruangkit.
 - ❖ He admitted that it may take up to 2 years for the policy to become feasible, while emphasizing that the most pressing priority at the moment is to reduce the high transportation costs for goods, which have risen by over 15%.
 - ❖ The pegging of the price was part of the move by the government of Pheu Thai in its election campaign and has been a policy that it has been trying to push since 2011 when Yingluck Shinawatra was elected to the government.
 - ❖ Suriya came out to say that he's sorry that he miscommunicated the information and that the process needs a lot of steps before it can be implemented as the

concessions have all been granted and it is not easy to just implement it right away, therefore there is a need for time to negotiate with the concession owners.

- ❖ Different agencies and companies are operating and the common ticketing etc. all needs to be worked out before the 20 Baht policy can be implemented.
- ❖ “This is a policy of Pheu Thai and the strength of Pheu Thai is that we do whatever we promise, and it will be for all lines, and we need time to implement this policy,” Suriya said in an interview today at around 08:30 hrs.

- The policy statement that was to be delivered by Srettha on Monday September 11 has been leaked to the public late last night.

- The Cabinet meeting today is set to start in an hour or so.
 - ❖ The list of Deputy Prime Minister in their rank and file are as follows
 - ❖ Phumtham Wechayachai as the 1st Deputy PM
 - ❖ Somsak Thepsutin as the 2nd Deputy PM in seniority
 - ❖ Parnpree Bahiddha-Nukara as the 3rd
- A personal security team of Minister of Defense Suthin Klangsaeng, led by Lieutenant General Taweesak Maneewong, reported to Suthin at his residence yesterday.
 - ❖ The team consisted of two squads, totaling 14 individuals.
 - ❖ Suthin, now nicknamed “Sanamchai One” due to his ministerial position, stated that he will be entering the Ministry of Defense on September 13 at 09:00 hrs.



- Yesterday, a group of people submitted a letter to the acting leader of the Pheu Thai Party, Chusak Sirinil, requesting that he consider reinstating Cholanan Srikaew, the former leader of the Pheu Thai Party, as the party leader once again, as they believe he has done nothing wrong.
 - ❖ Cholanan previously resigned to keep his promise after vowing that he would do so if the Pheu Thai Party joined a coalition with the military-backed parties.
- On another note, Pol Gen Patcharawat Wongsuwan, the advisory chairman of the Palang Pracharath Party and the new Minister of Natural Resource and Environment, said he has not taken control of the party from his brother, Gen Prawit Wongsuwan, after reports emerged that Prawit is planning to step down from the party leader once again.

- ❖ Prawit remains the party's leader, Patcharawat insisted.
- Prinya Thaewanarumitkul, a law lecturer at Thammasat University, is planning to request detailed information concerning the treatment of former PM Thaksin Shinawatra, who is currently staying at Police General Hospital outside prison, from relevant authorities.
 - ❖ He wrote on Facebook that he is doubtful about the duration that Thaksin is allowed to remain at a hospital, citing that if he is to stay more than 30 days, he will require approval from the Director-General of the Department of Corrections and a medical opinion from the hospital.
 - ❖ Furthermore, if the stay exceeds 60 days, the ex-premier will require approval from the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Justice. If it extends beyond 120 days, the Minister of Justice must grant approval.
 - ❖ Sources within the Ministry of Justice reported that the Director-General of the Department of Corrections will discuss Thaksin's situation with the hospital's medical team, as his stay approaches the 30-day deadline.
 - ❖ It is also still possible that Thaksin might be transferred to a private hospital if the police hospital lacks the necessary medical equipment, the sources said.

- The Criminal Court for Corruption and Misconduct Cases in Rayong province has issued an arrest warrant for Itthiphol Khunpluem, the former Minister of Culture and the Mayor of Pattaya City.
 - ❖ This warrant is related to a case involving Itthiphol's issuance of an allegedly illegal building construction permit to Bali Hai Company Limited on September 10, 2008. The permit was for the construction of the Waterfront Project building at the base of Pratumnak Hill in Pattaya City, Chonburi province, which allegedly encroached the public space.

- ❖ This 15-year-old case is scheduled to conclude on September 10.



- Pita Limjaroenrat, the leader of the Move Forward Party, met with his supporters at the party headquarters yesterday afternoon. People gathered to extend their birthday wishes to Pita, who was celebrating his 43rd birthday.
 - ❖ In another development, Move Forward Party Secretary-General Chaithawat Tulathon said the party will await the Constitutional Court's verdict on Pita's media shareholding case before making a decision on whether they will assume the position of the leader of the opposition.
 - ❖ Chaithawat expects that the court will deliver its verdict on the case within the next 2-3 months.



Economic News

- The Bank of Thailand (BoT) is preparing to revise down its economic and inflation forecasts for 2023 at the upcoming Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) meeting in September, said BoT Governor Sethaput Suthiwartnarueput.
 - ❖ The revision came in response to the sluggish economy in the second quarter, with the gross domestic product (GDP) growth expanding by only 1.8%, due to

low tourist spending, a lower-than-expected number of Chinese tourist arrivals, and a contraction in the export sector. The GDP growth for 2023 was originally estimated at 3.6%, general inflation at 2.5%, and core inflation at 2.0%.

- ❖ Nevertheless, private consumption has shown a positive sign, growing significantly by 7.8% - the highest level in 20 years.
- ❖ Reports suggest that the MPC meeting will take place on September 27, and the BoT is scheduled to release the economic outlook on September 29.
- Yesterday The Thai National Shippers' Council (TNSC) has further lowered its export target for 2023 from -0.5% to -1%, in response to an economic deceleration in China, the United States, and the European Union, TNSC chief Chaicharn Charoensuk said.
 - ❖ Thailand's exports are struggling to recover despite multiple efforts to boost them. Chaicharn suggested that the export situation will need to be monitored on a monthly basis.
 - ❖ "This year's exports will surely be in negative territory, possibly -1% or even lower, because there are too many negative factors," he said.
- Meanwhile the Commerce Ministry on Tuesday said that domestic inflation in August increased by 0.88% due to a surge in oil prices despite stable fresh food prices.
 - ❖ The Commerce Ministry's Trade Policy and Strategy Office Director, Poonpong Nainapakorn, said the Consumer Price Index (CPI) in August was 108.41 compared to 107.46 in August 2022. This has resulted in a general year-on-year (YoY) increase in the inflation rate of 0.88%, slightly up from 0.38% in July, due to the rising prices of energy-related products.
 - ❖ While the prices of fresh food, meat, and food components remained stable, other categories, excluding food and beverages, increased by 0.98% (YoY) due to the rising prices in transportation and communication, especially fuel prices, which have adjusted upwards following global market trends, except for diesel, which saw a decrease.
 - ❖ The overall CPI for August this year increased by 0.55% month on month (MoM) compared to July.

- Yesterday, the stock prices of beverage companies saw a significant decline, led by CBG, which closed at 82.50 Baht, down by 4.75 Baht or a decrease of 5.44%. The trading value was 1.07 billion Baht.
 - ❖ SAPPE concluded at 83.75 Baht, down by 2.50 Baht or a decrease of 2.90%. The trading value exceeded 289.22 million Baht. OSP closed at 29 Baht, down by 0.50 Baht or a decrease of 1.69%. The trading value surpassed 120.53 million Baht.
 - ❖ The decline was primarily in response to the suspension of sugar exports by India, which has led to a decrease in global sugar supply and an increase in sugar prices.
 - ❖ Nevertheless, brokers anticipate that this situation will not significantly impact the cost for beverage companies. If sugar prices increase by 5%, it is expected to affect the profits of beverage companies by only 2-5%.
- Bandit Thamprachachit, the CEO and President of Thai Oil Plc (TOP), revealed that the estimated amount of leaked crude oil in the company's refinery in Chonburi is only around 60,000 liters, a significant reduction from the initial estimate of 100,000 liters.
 - ❖ He said that the incident is covered by the company's insurance policies, which total more than 62 billion baht.
 - ❖ Kasikorn Securities estimated that the company would bear less than 1 billion Baht in damages from this incident, with the majority covered by insurance.
 - ❖ On the other hand, TISCO Securities mentioned that this incident could have an impact on the fundamental factors of TOP stock, reducing its price by 0.7 Baht per share. However, they still recommend buying the stock at a target price of 61 Baht.

General News

- 86% of nearly 1,500 police stations nationwide have failed to pass integrity and transparency tests, according to the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC).
 - ❖ Pol Gen Watcharapol Prasarnrajkit, the NACC chairman, released the results of the annual integrity and transparency assessments (ITA) of government services that closely serve the public, including police stations and district offices.
 - ❖ Each agency must receive a minimum ITA score of 85 to pass, while a score of 95 and over is considered excellent. But police stations were an area of concern as their average score was too low. The average ITA score for all 1,484 stations was 67.43. Only 208 stations passed the ITA test, while a total of 1,276 failed.
 - ❖ The highest-scoring station was Yan Nawa Police Station, attached to Metropolitan Police Division 6, with 99.02 points. 24 stations received zero points.
