Thai Enquirer News Summary

Economic News

- Prime Minister Srettha Thavisin announced Thailand's vision at the 'Ignite Thailand' event yesterday, encompassing 8 key areas. These include:
 - ➤ Hub for tourism
 - ➤ Hub for medical and wellness services
 - Hub for Agriculture & food
 - > Hub for aviation
 - ➤ Hub for regional logistics

- ➤ Hub for the future mobility
- Hub for the digital economy
- ➤ Hub for financial services



- ❖ The vision aims to propel Thailand to be the number one destination globally, starting by empowering the country as the top tourist destination. Currently, Thailand ranks 8th globally for international tourist arrivals, generating income that supports 1 in 3 Thai citizens. This contributes more than 2.3 trillion Baht to the country's economy, with further growth expected in the next 4 years.
- ❖ Srettha mentioned that there will be another update on the situation scheduled for March 1.





• The Prime Minister insisted that Thailand should cut interest rates and claimed that he is willing to talk to and persuade the Bank of Thailand (BoT) Governor to reconsider for the 4th or 5th time after he has yet to hear the governor acknowledge people's suffering.


- ❖ Prime Minister and Finance Minister Srettha Thavisin was asked about Bank of Thailand (BoT) Governor Sethaput Suthiwartnarueput's interview with NIKKEI Asia, in which he confirmed that there will be no rate cuts despite pressure from the government.
- ❖ Srettha said that he understood that it was the Governor's right to take such a decision, but it was his duty to explain to him the suffering of the people. He emphasized that while the government does not exercise direct control over the BoT, he believes that both parties respect each other.
- The PM stated that the 3 points mentioned by the Governor did not address the problem of the people. He emphasized that the suffering of the people is important and he wants the Governor to take this into consideration. He believes that fiscal and monetary policies can work together to help the people, and he hopes that further discussions can be held.



- Thailand could do a bit better trying to attract more investments in the high-tech area. Today alone NVIDIA Corp., saw its shares rise by as much as US\$ 300 billion in a single day, the largest gain in history of any company ever.
 - ➤ NVIDIA gained more than US\$ 277 billion during the trading session and another US\$ 30 billion+ after the market closed.

- The government will sell savings bonds worth 100 billion Baht within the fiscal year, with the first issue worth 40 billion Baht to be offered next month to help finance the budget deficit, says Patchara Anuntasilpa, director-general of the Public Debt Management Office (PDMO).
 - ❖ Patchara said the PDMO will launch the 1st tranche of savings bonds in fiscal 2024 worth 40 billion Baht via two channels, namely the Pao Tang application and commercial banks.
 - ❖ The 1st lot (March 11-13) will be opened to Thai nationals aged 15 and older. The bonds (worth 35 billion Baht) have a maturity of 5 and 10 years with a coupon of 3% per year and 3.4% per year respectively. Interest will be paid every 3 months. With a price of 100 Baht per unit, the minimum purchase amount is 1,000 Baht, with no limit on maximum purchase amount.
- Prajak Boonyang, the Auditor General, who is set to retire from his position this February after serving for 6 years, revealed that during his tenure, he had discovered inefficient budget spending totaling more than 100 billion Baht. This averaged to 20 billion Baht per year, with some years seeing nearly 40 billion Baht.
 - According to the old version of the law governing the auditing of government finances, if the auditor identifies any legal violations, it is considered a wrongdoing, regardless of whether any damages occur.
 - ❖ However, under the current law, the auditor must determine whether there are actual damages resulting from the identified irregularities. If credible evidence of misconduct is found, the case will be forwarded to the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) for further action.



- The Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index ended on a positive note yesterday, climbing 8.86 points (0.64%) to close at 1,402.47 points. The trading value reached 51.34 billion Baht.
 - Several factors contributed to the market's rise. BDMS shares gained traction after exceeding profit expectations for the 4th quarter of 2023, while AOT shares also experienced an upward adjustment. The tourism sector saw positive developments as well, with an increase in foreign tourist arrivals.

- In addition, foreign investors have been actively repurchasing Thai stocks for two consecutive days, with a total value of nearly 10 billion Baht. This follows strict control measures on short selling and trading programs. As of yesterday, they had purchased stocks totaling 3.42 billion Baht, and in the previous day, the net purchase amounted to 6.3 billion Baht.
 - ❖ The Thai Baht also remained strong, consistently testing the 35.7 Baht/US Dollar mark. This suggests potential for continued net buying by foreign investors.
 - Analysts expect the positive trend to continue in the near future, with support at 1,395 points and resistance at 1,415 points.




- The SET index announced a one-day trading pause for Miss Grand International Plc (MGI) stock, effective today, February 23rd. Trading will resume on February 27th. This comes after a previous one-day pause on February 20th in response to abnormal trading activities associated with the MGI stock.
 - ❖ Yesterday, MGI climbed by a staggering 19.76% or 8.25 Baht to reach a new high of 50 Baht per share. This represents a YTD adjusted price surge of 910% compared to its IPO price of 4.95 Baht per share. The trading value for the day reached 384.99 million Baht.



- Italian-Thai Development Plc (ITD) is reportedly exploring the sale of its 90% stake in Asia Pacific Potash Corp, which holds mining rights in northeastern Thailand, aiming to fetch around \$500 million.
 - ❖ ITD, a listed construction company on the SET, is said to be in talks with a consulting firm and negotiating with potential buyers from China.
 - ❖ ITD had acquired Asia Pacific Potash in 2006 and has exploration and development rights for high-grade potash deposits in Udon Thani province. The company applied

for government rights to the 10,500-acre site in 2003, receiving official approval in 2022 for a 21-year project duration.

- The potash mine, with an annual capacity of 2 million tonnes, was visited by Prime Minister Srettha Thavisin on Feb 19, where he inquired about project funding and met with local citizens opposed to the mine.
- ❖ ITD's market value has significantly declined from its 1990s peak of \$3 billion to the current \$100 million. The company reported a net loss of 44.7 million Baht in Q3 2023 and a loss of 4.76 billion Baht for the full year 2022. ITD shares closed at 0.72 Baht on Thursday, rising 2 satang, with a trade value of 7 million Baht.
- Low-cost airline Air Japan, a subsidiary of ANA Holdings, had to abruptly cancel its Bangkok-Narita flight after a delay of more than 3 hours on the night of February 22. This unexpected cancellation affected over 300 passengers from a Japanese tourist group.
 - ❖ In response to the incident, the Civil Aviation Authority of Thailand (CAAT) summoned Air Japan to explain the reasons for the cancellation. The airline reportedly cited aircraft technical issues and the need to wait for spare parts to be sent from Japan. The airline expected it will resume services for flight NQ2 tonight.
 - ❖ CAAT emphasized that if the airline is unable to repair and maintain its aircraft or resume flights, Air Japan must have measures to compensate passengers and develop contingency plans for flight cancellations in case similar incidents occur in the future.



Politic News

- Former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra met all the requirements for special parole, as insisted by Justice Minister Tawee Sodsong in Parliament.
 - ❖ His remarks followed a query from Nattacha Boonchaiinsawat, a Move Forward Party MP for Bangkok, seeking clarification on Thaksin's parole. To meet the criteria, Thaksin must have served at least 6 months or one-third of his sentence, which he accomplished while detained at the Police General Hospital. Additionally, he must be at least 70 years old, which he is, and must be afflicted with a serious illness.
 - ❖ However, Nattacha questioned the specific illness Thaksin had among the designated seven, which include incurable illnesses, kidney failure requiring dialysis, last-stage cancer, dementia, or Alzheimer's.
 - Nattacha also questioned Thaksin's ability to meet other conditions despite being over 70, such as physical incapacities assessed through 10 criteria, with a cumulative score requirement of less than 11. These criteria encompass the ability to eat independently, use the toilet, maintain personal hygiene, dress, move around the house, transition from bed to chair, climb stairs, control bowel movements, and manage urination.
 - ❖ Meanwhile Tawee responded that Thaksin's score was slightly below 11 but refrained from disclosing specific illnesses or conditions to protect Thaksin's rights. Tawee reiterated that the parole committee and doctors affirmed that Thaksin's case adhered to regulations, justifying the grant of special parole.



- Parliament voted 416-0 (3 were added verbally) to pass all 7 versions of the draft bill to amend the Fisheries Act in its first reading.
 - ❖ The government aimed to relax rules preventing IUU fishing due to its impact on traditional fishermen and the entire industry. The opposition, however, expressed concerns about overfishing and human rights abuses. Nevertheless, Parliament

managed to reach a consensus that the bill should be passed to protect the industry and traditional fishermen.

- ❖ Move Forward Party list MP Pita Limjaroenrat highlighted that the law, introduced by an emergency decree during the junta government in 2015, resulted in an 11% reduction in fishery product exports between 2017 and 2023. He emphasized that fishermen needed more time to adjust to the rules preventing IUU fishing. The hastily implemented law led to the prosecution of over 4,600 fishermen, many of whom were forced to sell their fishing boats due to the harsh penalties accompanying these prosecutions.
- ❖ Pita pointed out that exports to Europe constituted only 6.7% of the total fisheries product exports worth 200 billion Baht per year. He argued that fishermen required additional time to adapt, and the government should assist them by not only lowering the punishments but also implementing supportive measures to facilitate their adaptation.



- Pro-democracy youth activist Tantawan 'Tawan' Tuatulanon has been transferred from the Department of Corrections Hospital to Thammasat University Hospital after an 8-day hunger strike.
 - ❖ Tawan, along with Natthanon 'Frank' Chaiyamahabutr, faces charges of sedition and violation of the Computer Crime Act. These charges stem from their decision to drive through a temporary police blockade that was obstructing traffic for HRH Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn's motorcade in Bangkok on February 4. A conviction for sedition carries a maximum jail sentence of 7 years, while violating the Computer Crime Act could result in imprisonment for up to 5 years.
 - ❖ Both Tawan and Frank initiated a hunger strike upon their detention on February 14. The Criminal Court denied them bail and authorized their detention throughout the investigation process until February 25.
 - ❖ The Criminal Court has denied Tawan and Frank's second bail request. Their lawyers argued for bail, citing deteriorating health due to the hunger strike. The court stated that the Department of Corrections would determine the appropriate

medical care for the detained activists. The court maintained its previous decision to deny bail, finding no grounds for a change.





- Officials from PTT Raise, a subsidiary of the state-owned company PTT Plc, tested a smart robot guide to address the issue of people getting lost in the Parliament building yesterday.
 - ❖ The idea was initiated by Padipat Suntiphada, Deputy Speaker of the House of Representatives, after many people got lost in the building due to its massive size and numerous rooms. However, the system is still in the testing phase.



General News

- Deputy National Police Chief Surachate 'Big Joke' Hakparn clarified that no official charges have been pressed against him; they have been filed only against his subordinates.
 - ❖ This is due to the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC)'s pending decision on whether they will handle the case or let the police proceed. A case involving high-ranking officers is usually handled by the NACC.
 - ➤ "I am still 100% innocent, and the charges have been communicated to my subordinates only," he asserted.
 - ❖ He believes the NACC's delay in its decision, despite being informed by the police since last year, stems from their caution about being used as a tool by officers pressing charges against him.

- ❖ Pol Gen Surachate said that since Pol Maj Gen Jaroonkiat Pankaew, the deputy commissioner of the Central Investigation Bureau, claimed the case involved money laundering of assets exceeding 300 million Baht, the police lack the authority to investigate it, as such cases fall under the jurisdiction of the Department of Special Investigation. Investigative officers could face legal consequences for initiating an unauthorized investigation.
- ❖ Meanwhile, Pol Maj Gen Jaroonkiat urged everyone involved to discuss matters in court, assuring Pol Gen Surachate would be treated fairly. He also warned Pol Gen Surachate not to attack the police organization.



- The joint Thai-US operation to search for the remains of 5 crew members missing from the sunken HTMS Sukhothai commenced yesterday. The operation, anticipated to last 19 days, also aims to salvage any weaponry, if possible, and disable US-made military equipment.
 - ❖ Participating in the operation are the US offshore supply ship "Ocean Valor" from Hawaii, Thailand's Ratanakosin-class corvette, two mine sweepers, two frigates, a mid-sized carrier, along with 17 US divers and 40 Thai divers.
 - ❖ The corvette sank in stormy weather approximately 20 nautical miles or 32-35 kilometers off the coast of Prachuap Khiri Khan's Bang Saphan district during the night of December 18, 2022. Out of the 105 crew aboard the ship, 76 were rescued, 24 lost their lives, while five remain missing.





- The Criminal Court found the parents of 10 underage youths guilty of dereliction of duty after their children were caught racing on Samut Prakan roads.
 - ❖ Assistant National Police chief Pol Lt-General Samran Nuanma said on Thursday the 10 parents were found guilty of violating Article 26 (2) of the Child Protection Act of 2003 by failing to prevent their children from racing on roads. Each parent was initially fined 10,000 Baht but all the defendants pleaded guilty, so the court reduced the fine to 5,000 Baht.



- The Thai Meteorological Department (TMD) announced the official start of summer on Thursday, warning that temperatures would be 1-2 degrees Centigrade higher than last year. Daytime temperatures are set to rise above 35C until mid-May when the rainy season will start.
 - ❖ Last year, the hottest month of April saw temperatures exceed 40C across most of Thailand. The highest temperature was recorded in Tak province in the North, with 44.6C, followed by Udon Thani in the Northeast (43.2), Nakhon Sawan in Central region (42.2), and Prachinburi in the East (40.4). Bangkok registered a high of 40C in mid-April. In the South, Krabi topped the temperature charts last year with 38.8C.
