Thai Enquirer News Summary

Economic News

• Prime Minister Srettha revealed that Paetongtarn Shinawatra, chairperson of the National Soft Power Committee, met with Jean-Marc Bellaiche, President of the Printemps department store, in Paris, France, to explore opportunities for showcasing Thai products and securing space for young Thai designers in the high-end Bon Marché store.





- * Responding to media reports regarding how he wore "ผ้าขาวม้า" in Paris, Srettha revealed that ผ้าขาวม้า serves as a symbol of fostering friendly relations and offers versatile colors that complement his suits.
- On the X platform, Srettha outlined his plans to bring Thai products to the international market.





- ❖ Srettha is scheduled to meet with French President Emmanuel Macron at the Presidential Palace today. During the meeting, the two will jointly inspect the honor guard military lineup and engage in discussions, which will involve executives from the French Alternative Energies and Atomic Energy Commission (CEA) to explore collaboration in clean energy investment. Later in the evening, Srettha will also meet with executives from the fashion industry.
- The Energy Regulatory Commission (ERC) has provided 3 scenarios for electricity prices during the May-August billing period.
 - The 1st scenario allows for the repayment of the 99.69 billion Baht debt incurred by the subsidy to lower electricity prices since September 2021 to the Electricity Generating Authority of Thailand in 1 installment. However, this will result in an increase in the electricity price from 4.18 Baht to 5.44 Baht per unit.
 - ❖ In the 2nd scenario, the debt will be repaid in 4 installments, leading to an electricity price increase to 4.34 Baht per unit.
 - ❖ The 3rd scenario involves repaying the debt in 7 installments, with the electricity price remaining the same at 4.18 Baht per unit.

- ❖ These scenarios are feasible due to the decline in global LNG (liquefied natural gas) prices. However, Thailand still heavily relies on LNG imports, and the demand for LNG to produce electricity has surged.
- ❖ The public can provide their opinions on the scenarios to the ERC's website from now on until March 22.



- The stock prices of major power generation companies in Thailand jumped on March 8 in response to the recent adjustment of electricity rates for the upcoming May-August 2024 billing period.
 - ❖ GULF's stock price rose by 1.75 Baht, representing a 4.07% increase. The company also saw a significant trading volume of 967.81 million Baht.
 - ❖ GPSC's stock price saw an increase of 2.25 Baht, equivalent to a 4.27% rise. The trading volume was 728.78 million Baht.
 - ❖ BGRIM's stock also rose by 1 Baht, reflecting a 3.64% increase. The trading volume was 486.63 million Baht.
- Kasikorn Research Center released its analysis for the SET index for the week of March 11 to 15, 2024, suggesting support levels at 1,375 and 1,355 points, and resistance levels at 1,400 and 1,415 points.
 - ❖ This comes after SET saw a positive close on Friday, March 8. The index ended the day at 1,386.42 points, marking a 1.39% increase. However, the average daily trading value was only around 40.15 billion Baht, representing a significant decline of 31.43% compared to the previous week.
 - ❖ The report highlights a mid-week rebound in the Thai stock market, fueled by renewed buying interest after a string of seven consecutive days of decline. This positive momentum continued towards the end of the week, mirroring a similar

trend across regional markets in response to signals from the US Federal Reserve regarding potential interest rate cuts. The upward trend impacted various sectors, including finance, technology, and energy.

- The Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) released its annual report on 817 out of 821 listed company performance for the fiscal year 2023.
 - ❖ 626 (76.62%) companies reported profits with a total sales volume of 17.23 trillion Baht, representing a 2.6% decrease from the previous year.
 - ➤ Their operating profit fell 12.4% to 1.65 trillion Baht, while net profit dropped 10.7% to 961 billion Baht. Analysts attributed this decline to a rise in selling and administrative expenses, which increased by 3.9%.
 - ❖ The Market for Alternative Investment (mai) saw a steeper decline compared to the SET. Overall sales volume on the mai market fell to 200 billion Baht. Operating and net profit also dropped significantly, with operating profit down 10.2% to 12.18 billion Baht and net profit plummeting 35.1% to 5.90 billion Baht.
 - ❖ Market experts pointed to a confluence of factors impacting including falling commodity prices, rising operating expenses, and high interest rates.
- 48,096 electric vehicles were registered between October 2023 and January 2024, marking a 324.13% increase compared to the same period in the previous year, which saw only 11,340 registrations, according to the Department of Land Transport.
 - ❖ The rise in EV vehicle usage is attributed to 2 key factors. Firstly, there's a growing national movement to reduce PM2.5 air pollution. Electric vehicles, which produce zero tailpipe emissions, are seen as a crucial part of the solution, the department reported.
 - Secondly, the government has introduced tax reduction measures specifically for factory-assembled electric vehicles. These incentives, set to expire on November

10, 2024, provide an 80% tax reduction to encourage individuals to transition to electric vehicles.

Political News

- Former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra is set to visit Chiang Mai this week that could create a lot of political repercussions.
 - ❖ Speculations continues on whether Prime Minister Srettha might meet with Thaksin during their tours of Chiang Mai province between March 14-16.
- Apart from this there are reports that Thaksin may engage in internal discussions with the political team of the Pheu Thai Party in Chiang Mai to discuss preparations for the upcoming local elections for the provincial administrative organization (PAO) presidents.
 - ❖ The discussion is expected to focus on ways to compete against Pheu Thai's main rival, the Move Forward Party (MFP), which continues to have significant influence in Chiang Mai.
 - ❖ It should be noted that following the 2023 general elections, the MFP secured 7 out of 10 constituency seats in Chiang Mai, while the ruling Pheu Thai Party only managed to win 2 seats. The MFP's party-list scores in the province also beat Pheu Thai by a large margin.
 - ❖ Meanwhile, the MFP revealed that it plans to unveil its list of candidates for the PAO presidents in April and officially launch the campaign in May. Pita Limjaroenrat, an adviser of the party, is expected to personally introduce the candidates himself.





- Worachai Hema, advisor to the Deputy Prime Minister and co-leader of the Red Shirt movement, announced that supporters of Thaksin will gather at Wat Rong Tham Samakkhi to welcome the former premier during his visit to Chiang Mai on March 15.
 - ❖ Worachai anticipated that more than a thousand people will show up.



- Thepthai Senphong, former MP for Nakhon Si Thammarat, posted on his Facebook page, stating that the meeting between Thaksin and Srettha was intentional and not beyond his expectation.
 - ❖ He mentioned that their encounter occurred in Thaksin's capacity as the owner of the Pheu Thai Party, which is supporting Srettha as the prime minister. Thepthai also alleged that Thaksin is discreetly providing advice to Srettha.
 - ❖ Meanwhile Thanathorn Juangroongruangkit, the leader of the Progressive Movement, stated that he does not have an opinion on Thaksin's situation. Still, he said there are thousands of political prisoners, many of whom remain incarcerated. "They are not thieves or murderers but political prisoners who should not be treated as criminals," Thanathorn said.



- Tomorrow (Tuesday March 12, 2024) the Election Commission is set to hold a meeting to discuss whether to push forward for the dissolution of the Move Forward Party for its campaign pledge to amend Article 112 (lese majeste).
 - ❖ The Constitutional Court in its ruling earlier this year had rule 9-0 (unanimous) to state that the move by Move Forward party was in breach of the Constitution and


fell short of dissolving the Move Forward party because that was not something not sought for in the petition filed with the Constitutional Court.

- Prime Minister Srettha Thavisin addressed public criticism regarding the allocation of 138
 million Baht for the renovation of the government complex. He clarified that the budget
 covers several aspects of construction, such as IT and security systems.
 - ❖ Deputy Secretary-General to the Prime Minister Natreeya Thaweewong explained that the cybersecurity system upgrade aligns with the national digital plan established in 2022 and has just received budgetary approval in the 2024 fiscal year. This investment aims to ensure the stability and security of government databases.
 - ❖ The criticism surrounding the renovation came after the Office of the Prime Minister unveiled that the renovation included the development of the government website, which cost 5 million Baht, handwoven wool carpets, which cost 10.5 million Baht, a digital office system, which cost 11.7 million Baht, and the installation of an air suction and smoke detection system, which cost 32.1 million Baht.




- Political activist Ruangkrai Leekitwattana is asking PM Srettha to look into the necessity
 of a 138 million-Baht renovation and procurement project at Government House. He argues
 that the plan defies Srettha's order to cut unnecessary expenses so funds can be diverted for
 crucial investments to drive economic growth.
 - ❖ He has sent his request to have the budget-worthiness of the renovation project assessed to Srettha via express mail.
 - ❖ The project aims to be financed using leftover funds from the previous fiscal year since the national budget for the current fiscal year has not been approved by parliament. The renovation project goes against an instruction issued by the prime minister during a cabinet meeting on March 3.

- Pheu Thai MP Wisarn Techatheerawat, a member of Parliament's committee scrutinizing the 2024 fiscal budget, said that no budget has been allocated to purchase the Chinese submarine, contradicting Defense Minister Suthin's earlier statement.
 - ❖ Wisarn clarified that there is no budget designated for acquiring the South Korean frigate, nor is there any allocation for procuring the Chinese submarine in the 2024 budget. He cited the ongoing unresolved issue concerning the submarine's engine as the reason for this decision.
 - Suthin said The Navy wanted to use 17 billion Baht of the 2024 budget to buy the Kwanggaeto Class Destroyer (KDX-I). However, the committee said the 2024 budget is limited and told the Navy to wait for the 2025 budget. The committee led by the Pheu Thai Party rejected the purchase because the ministry is already looking to buy a Chinese submarine with the budget.
 - ❖ He clarified that the Navy and the ministry are looking to progress with the deal to buy the Yuan Class S26T submarine worth 13.5 billion Baht instead of switching to buying a Chinese frigate.



- Two police officers and the mayor of a tambon administrative organisation (TAO) narrowly escaped injury when two improvised explosive devices, believed to have been pipe bombs, were thrown into a coffee shop at a petrol station in Thung Yang Daeng district of Thailand's southernmost province of Pattani on Sunday.
 - District police suspect that southern rebels are responsible for the attack, intending to harm the two officers, Pol Lt-Col Veerawat Darongkoon, the suppression inspector, and Sobri Pohsu, mayor of the Nam Dam TAO.
 - ❖ Thung Yan Daeng police say that one of the rebels entered the coffee shop through the back door and lobbed the two pipe bombs into the shop. One of them exploded without hurting anybody. The intended targets fled in different directions.
 - ❖ The other device failed to detonate, as police believe that it was timed to explode later, when more policemen would arrive to investigate the first explosion.

- The court has approved the police's request to extend the detention of pro-democracy activists Thantawan "Tawan" Tuatulanon and Natthanon "Frank" Chaiyamahabutr for another 12 days during the ongoing investigation.
 - The court stated that the extension was granted to allow the police to further examine two additional witnesses and review video evidence.
 - Currently, Tawan is held at Thammasat University Hospital, while Frank is detained at the Department of Corrections Hospital. Both activists' health has deteriorated due to the ongoing hunger strike.


- The Chiang Mai governor Nirat Pongsitthaworn is offering 10,000 Baht to anyone who can lead to the arrest of forest fire suspects and has ordered rainmaking operations to control PM2.5 pollution.
 - ❖ The PM2.5 pollution can be blamed on westerly winds blowing dust across from neighbouring countries. He said that due to these winds, five districts on the border, namely Mae Ai, Fang, Chiang Dao, Chai Prakan and Wiang Haeng, have been hit with high levels of pollution every day for about a week.

- ❖ According to the Geo-Informatics and Space Technology Development Agency, there are over 5,000 hotspots in Myanmar, over 1,000 in Cambodia, and 730 in Thailand. This marks a drop in hotspots in Thailand compared to the same period last year when there were some 3,000 fires. Most of these hotspots occur in forested areas, as farm fires have been generally controlled.
- ❖ Apart from offering a 10,000 Baht reward for information leading to the arrest of offenders, artificial rain operations are also being used.
- The Department of Meteorology forecasts that over the next 24 hours, there will be intense heat in some areas of the northern and central regions of Thailand, along with scattered thunderstorms in certain locations.
 - ❖ Additionally, in the northern, northeastern, and upper central regions, there is a moderate to high accumulation of dust particles/smoke due to weak wind circulation, leading to poor air ventilation.



- More than 11,000 students flocked to Impact Arena Muang Thong Thani in Nonthaburi on Saturday to vie for a little over 1,000 seats available at Triam Udom Suksa School.
 - ❖ Triam Udom Suksa said only 1,520 students will be enrolled in the school's eight programs, of which only 1,110 will be chosen based on their entrance exam results. The remaining 410 students will be taken in based on special quotas.

- ❖ The number of students vying for admission this year had dropped from 12,400 last year.
- ❖ Triam Udom Suksa, a state-owned school based in central Bangkok, offers uppersecondary classes (Mathayom 4-6 or Grades 10-12). It was founded in 1938 as a preparatory school for students hoping to further their studies in Chulalongkorn University and has earned a name for its highly competitive admission exams.
