#### Thai Enquirer News Summary

### **General News**

- Some areas of Bangkok's Bang Sue district have been declared 'dangerous zone' after 300 tons of cadmium were found stored in a storage facility in that area.
  - ❖ Bangkok Governor Chadchart Sittipunt visited Thai Metal Wheel Co Ltd after where around 300 tons of cadmium waste were being stored.
  - ❖ The company is located in Bangkok's Bang Sue district. The Bang Sue District Office has since declared the area a hazardous zone. A team of emergency responders from the Department of Industrial Works and the Health Department has been dispatched to the site to clean up any possible contamination.

- ❖ After the deceleration of the 'dangerous' zone those who live or work in the area would be subject to health check and Bang Sue District Office has issued an announcement regarding prohibition of living or conducting business in the designated area.
  - No details of the area was in the 'decree' issued by the Bangkok Metropolitan Administration (BMA) except saying 'areas around Thai Metal Wheel'.



- Cadmium has been found in various other provinces in Thailand over the past few days
  and Police have issued summonses for the partners in the company in Samut Sakhon
  province, on whose premises carcinogenic cadmium waste was initially discovered,
  Industry Minister Pimpatra Wichaikul said.
  - ❖ The partners in J & B Metal Co., Ltd., identified only as "Jessada" and "Wanna", are scheduled to meet with officers of the Natural Resources and Environmental Crime Suppression Division today. Both partners will be questioned regarding the storage of approximately 3,040 tonnes of cadmium waste in their company's warehouses. The police want to determine if similar waste has also been stored at other locations.
  - ❖ It has been confirmed that about 15,000 tonnes of the cadmium waste discovered at their warehouses originated from a factory in the border province of Tak. Initial

investigations have revealed that the firm in Tak holds a license to transfer the waste to Samut Sakhon, while the company in Samut Sakhon has obtained permits to conduct its business.

❖ 3,040 tonnes of cadmium waste have been found at J & B Metal, 4,400 tonnes at a factory in the Ban Bueng district of Chon Buri province, 1,034 tonnes at Cin Hong Cheng Inter Tech (2008) and 500 tonnes at a factory in the Kathum Baen district of Samut Sakhon.



### Songkran Holidays

Starting tomorrow (April 12) Thailand will be on holiday until April 16<sup>th</sup> to mark the Thai New Year (Songkran) break.

### **Economic News**

- The Bank of Thailand (BoT) has come out to make a statement that it continues to disagree with the planned 10,000 Baht digital handout of the Srettha Thavisin government.
  - ❖ The BoT, whose governor Sethaput Suthiwartnarueput, did not attend the 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting of the 'Digital Wallet' committee came out to say that it continues to stick with the notion that the handout should be only for those people who are in need and not a blanket payout of people who earn below 70,000 Baht/month and/or have less than 500,000 Baht in their bank account.
  - Chayawadee Chaianan, a spokesperson for the Bank of Thailand, raised concerns about the government's digital wallet project, citing a number of issues, including

the source of funding for the project, the need for a clear legal framework, and the potential impact on the country's financial stability.

➤ She said that the government should target the project to specific groups to ensure cost-effectiveness to avoid impacting the country's fiscal stability. She also noted that the new open-loop payment system used to run the project will be complex and require time to develop, adding the government needed to make sure that the system is able to protect personal data from cyber threats.



- Prime Minister Srettha Thavisin announced the official launch of the "digital wallet" scheme, saying that the estimated 50 million Thai citizens aged 16 and older will be able to register in the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter of this year and the 10,000 Baht will be wired to their accounts in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of this year.
  - ❖ Billed as the flagship policy of this government, the prime minister said that they have fulfilled their election promise to the Thai people to deliver a policy which will improve their livelihoods and stimulate growth in the sluggish economy of as much as 1.6%.
  - ❖ He reaffirmed that stores will be able to register to join the program in Q3, and the funds will be distributed to the public in Q4. The scheme will maintain financial discipline, is in compliance with the Constitution and relevant laws and regulations and will be operated transparently, cautiously and honestly to ensure the greatest benefit to the nation.





• Meanwhile Finance Permanent Secretary Lawaron Saengsanit explained that the funding will be split into three parts as follows:

- ➤ 152.7 billion Baht from the 2025 fiscal budget, with the budget deficit already adjusted to accommodate this amount.
- ➤ 172.3 billion Baht from the Bank for Agriculture and Agricultural Cooperatives' 2025 budget, intended for around 17 million farmers.
- ➤ 175 billion Baht from the 2024 fiscal budget.
- ❖ He disclosed the eligibility criteria for the scheme. Registrants must be 16 years old or over, with assessable income of not more than 840,000 Baht per annum, or combined cash deposits in bank accounts of not more than 500,000 Baht.
- ❖ The money can only be used in stores in their respective districts which are registered with the Commerce Ministry. Stores which participate in the scheme cannot withdraw cash immediately after a customer completes a purchase and will have to wait until the next settlement round.
- ❖ The Ministry of Digital Economy and Society and the Office of Digital Development will develop a "super app" to be used for transaction using the digital money.



- Deputy Finance Minister Julapun Amornvivat said that the 10,000 Baht in digital wallet money can be used at 7-Eleven because convenience stores are considered small stores. His comments came in response to reporters seeking clarification on the government's statement that only small stores would be eligible to register for the program in Q3.
  - "These details have yet to be finalized, but at this point, convenience stores are considered small stores, so large Makro stores or department stores are not

included," he explained when asked about the eligibility of 7-Eleven or Makro stores for program registration.



- ❖ The 7-Eleven franchise in Thailand is owned by CP All, a subsidiary of CP Group, which is Thailand's largest conglomerate. Similarly, Siam Makro also belongs to CP Group.
- ❖ All retail stores, including standalone and those in filling stations, will be eligible, while wholesale centers, department stores, and supermarkets will not.
- Piti Disyatat, Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) secretary, said the committee voted 5:2 on Wednesday to maintain the key rate, though two members voted to cut the policy rate by 0.25 percentage points, citing Thailand's lower growth prospects and the need to ease borrower debt burdens.



- ❖ Most committee members believe the current 2.5% policy rate already supports growth and macro-financial stability amidst persistent uncertainties, especially concerning export recovery, government spending, and fiscal stimulus measures.
- ❖ In the 2<sup>nd</sup> half of 2023, the Thai economy slowed due to sluggish exports, delayed government spending, and high inventories, the MPC said. Growth is projected to reach 2.6% in 2024 and 3.0% in 2025, supported by improving tourism and private consumption, along with increased government spending later this year. However, exports are expected to recover gradually.
- ❖ Headline inflation is forecasted to be 0.6% in 2024 and 1.3% in 2025, with core inflation at 0.6% and 0.9%.



- Sirikanya Tansakun, Deputy Leader of the main opposition Move Forward Party, has requested more information from the government regarding the 10,000 Baht digital wallet policy. She raised the following inquiries:
  - ❖ When does the government plan to present draft bills to increase the budget deficit for funding the policy?
  - ❖ When will the new application, intended to replace the Pao Tang application for money distribution, be completed?
  - ❖ When will the government finalize the list of eligible stores for program registration?
  - ❖ Will the 172.3 billion Baht loan from the Bank for Agriculture and Agricultural Cooperatives (BAAC) to fund the policy breach fiscal discipline laws?
  - ❖ Sirikanya emphasized that BAAC loans are designated for assisting farmers in boosting crop yields and reducing production costs, not for providing direct handouts to improve their livelihoods.



- The University of the Thai Chamber of Commerce (UTCC)'s consumer index decreased for the first time in 8 months. The index had risen for 7 consecutive months, reaching a 48-month high of 63.8 index points in February before dropping to 63 points in March.
  - ❖ The decline in March was attributed to concerns over slow domestic economic recovery, rising oil prices, a slowdown in the global economy, prolonged geopolitical conflicts, high living costs, increasing interest rates, drought, and delays in the disbursement of the fiscal 2024 budget.
  - ❖ Despite the decrease in March, the UTCC still expects consumer confidence to continue its upward trend. This optimism is fueled by the approach of the Song Kran holiday this month, anticipated disbursement of the 2024 budget, government clarity on the digital wallet policy, and recent measures introduced yesterday to stimulate the real estate sector.
- SABUY Technology Plc (SABUY) announced its plan to issue 1.3 billion new shares through a private placement (PP). Of the new shares, 1.2 billion will be allocated to Lightnet Pte. Ltd., a Singapore-based financial technology company, and 100 million will be allocated to Arnonchai Weeraprawat.
  - ❖ After the PP, Lightnet will become the largest shareholder of SABUY with a 40% stake. The PP shares will be priced at 2.30 Baht per share, which is below the current market price. Lightnet is expected to invest a total of 2.76 billion Baht in the PP.
  - ❖ Lightnet is a Singapore-based financial technology company. The company's main shareholder is Chatchaval Jiaravanon, part of the billionaire family that owns conglomerate Charoen Pokphand Group who owns a 69.54% stake in Lightnet.
  - ❖ SABUY currently has 4 outstanding bond issues with a total value of 3.99 billion Baht. The SABUY24DA bond, which has a total value of 1.5 billion Baht, will mature this year. Many bondholders have been concerned about SABUY's ability to repay the bond. However, the company's decision to bring in Lightnet as a major shareholder is expected to alleviate these concerns.



- The Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index closed at 1,408.17 points yesterday, up 7.06 points or 0.50%. Trading value was 44.37 billion million.
  - ❖ SABUY was the most actively traded stock on the day, with investors buying on speculation ahead of the company's announcement of a private placement. DELTA, another large-cap stock, also closed in positive territory. CPALL rose on speculation that it would benefit from the government's plan to distribute 10,000 Baht to each Thai citizen via a digital wallet.
- The Gold Traders Association announced that gold prices adjusted twelve times yesterday. Prices experienced significant volatility before entering a slight slowdown. The market closed down 150 Baht compared to the previous day.
  - ❖ The buyback and sellout prices for gold bars are 40,350.00 Baht and 40,450.00 Baht, respectively. The buyback and sellout prices for gold ornaments are 39,628.24 Baht and 40,950.00 Baht, respectively.
- Prime Minister Srettha Thavisin visited Bangkok Bus Terminal (Mo Chit 2) to inspect its facilities ahead of the Songkran holiday and assess its readiness. More than 700,000 people are expected to utilize the terminal during the holiday period.
  - ❖ He instructed relevant agencies to ensure that bus drivers are not under the influence of drugs or alcohol while driving. He expressed confidence that passengers are satisfied with the services and highlighted the cleanliness of the food center. He also noted that the one-year advance booking system helps reduce congestion, the fares are reasonable, and measures have been taken to address motorbike scams.
  - ❖ However, PM Srettha did not address several critical issues at the terminal. All five escalators remain non-functional, making it difficult for people with luggage to navigate the station. Additionally, there is no elevator, posing challenges for disabled individuals trying to move around. Out of 15 fire extinguisher stations, only five are operational.









### **Political News**

- Local media outlets have come out to speculate that a Cabinet reshuffle is likely to take place after Songkran from April 16-18.
  - ❖ It's noted that there will be no participation from the Democrat Party as previously rumored. The Palang Pracharat Party might still retain control of the Ministry of Agriculture and Cooperatives but reduce the number of its ministers from 3 to 2.
  - ❖ 'The Nation Insight' program has predicted that Thammanat Phromphao, the Minister of Agriculture and Cooperatives, will push for Phai Lik, a Kamphaeng Phet MP of the Palang Pracharat Party, to become the Deputy Minister of Agriculture.
    - ➤ Meanwhile, Prawit Wongsuwan, the leader of the Palang Pracharat Party, supports Chaiwut Thanakamanusorn to become the Deputy Minister of Agriculture.
  - ❖ As for the Ruam Thai Sang Chart Party, there are ministers who are expected to be forced out of their positions, including Krisada Chinavicharana, the Deputy Minister of Finance, and Anucha Nakasai, the Deputy Minister of Agriculture.
  - ❖ As for the Pheu Thai Party, ministers who are expected to be forced out of their positions are Suthin Khlangsaeng, Puangpetch Chunlaiad, Kriang Kantinan, and Chaiya Phromma.
  - ❖ The ministers who might change ministries include Srettha Thavisin from the Ministry of Finance to the Ministry of Defense, Sudawan Wangsuphakijkosol from the Ministry of Tourism and Sports to the Ministry of Culture, alternating with Sermsak Phongpanich.
  - ❖ The new ministers are expected to be Pichai Chunhavajira as Minister of Finance, Paophum Rojanasakul as Deputy Minister of Finance, and Teerarat Samretwanich,

a Bangkok MP for the Pheu Thai Party, and Pichit Cheunban as the Prime Minister's Advisor, with the opportunity to become the Minister of the Prime Minister's Office.



- The 3<sup>rd</sup> Army said any stray bullets from the Myanmar civil war landing in Thailand will be met with retaliatory measures, ranging from light to heavy responses. Additionally, the Air Force has deployed fighter jets to patrol Thai airspace along the border following intense fighting between revolutionary groups and the Myanmar junta in Myawaddy.
  - ❖ Lt. Gen. Prasarn Saengsirirak, commander of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Army, confirmed that Myawaddy remains under the control of the Myanmar military, with most of the fighting centered around the 275<sup>th</sup> barracks. The Thai army had increased security patrols along the border since the intense fighting began in Myawaddy.
  - ❖ Further reports from Thailand indicate that the Myanmar military has been using mortar rounds against revolutionary fighters, deploying MiG-29s, and sending around 20 tanks to reinforce junta troops.
  - ❖ The Thai Air Force has deployed at least two F-16s from Nakhon Sawan to patrol Thai airspace along the border and deter MiG-29s from violating Thai airspace.



- The main opposition Move Forward Party (MFP) has requested an additional 15 days to submit their statement to the Constitutional Court regarding its dissolution case, said Nakarin Mektrairat, the president of the court.
  - ❖ On April 3, the court agreed to consider a petition from the Election Commission to dissolve the MFP based on a ruling from January 31, which determined that the MFP had attempted to overthrow the constitutional monarchy system by proposing amendments to the lese-majeste law.
  - ❖ The court subsequently ordered the MFP to provide its statement within 15 days, with Nakarin indicating that the court will convene on April 17 and is likely to grant the MFP's extension request. This means that the verdict in the case will not be announced within April, contrary to some speculation.
  - ❖ Nakarin also clarified that the ruling on March 31 was based on Section 49 of the charter, whereas the dissolution case is grounded in the Organic Act on Political Parties—highlighting the distinction between the two legal contexts. He further emphasized that the current case seeking to dissolve the MFP differs significantly from the dissolution of the Thai Raksa Chart Party, as the circumstances and legal bases are entirely separate.



- Ruling coalition MPs, opposition MPs, pro-democracy activists, and families of the victims joined together in commemorating the victims of the 2010 Red Shirts massacre at the 14th October 1973 Memorial.
  - ❖ The event was organized by the People's Council Demanding Justice for 2010, which comprises former co-leaders of the United Front for Democracy Against Dictatorship.
  - ❖ The People's Council Demanding Justice for 2010 stated that nearly 100 people were killed during the military crackdown on Red Shirts protesters in 2010. They are currently calling on the Pheu Thai-led government to:
    - Establish a truth-finding committee consisting of families of the victims, academics, human rights experts, and legal experts. This committee would

investigate remaining cases where responsibility for the killings has yet to be determined by the courts.

- Amend all related laws to allow those responsible for the killings to stand trial in civilian court.
- ➤ Accept the jurisdiction of the International Criminal Court over the deadly military crackdown.



- This year's commemoration of the April 10 crackdown on red shirt protesters in 2010 revealed a rift within the movement, as evidenced by three separate rallies taking place.
  - Supporters of the Pheu Thai Party gathered at Democracy Monument to remember the occasion. However, another group, who have shifted their support to the Move Forward Party, held a rally at October 14 Memorial. A third group gathered opposite the Pheu Thai supporters at Democracy Monument.
- The Office of the Attorney General (OAG) has once again postponed the lese-majeste case against former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra.
  - ❖ Thaksin reported to the OAG in February, but Attorney-General Amnat Chetcharoenrak ordered additional investigation into the case before deciding whether to pursue it.
  - ❖ The Attorney-General was supposed to make his decision today but has postponed it, citing the need for further investigation. Thaksin's lawyer said the OAG is expected to reach a decision before May.
  - ❖ Thaksin was accused by the army of defaming the monarch during an interview with Chosun Ilbo in South Korea in 2015. In the interview, Thaksin alleged that the Privy Council was behind the establishment of the previous junta, the National

Council for Peace and Order, and the 2014 coup. He was released on bail pending the OAG's decision on the case.
