Thai Enquirer News Summary

Political News

- The newly appointed Cabinet line-up of Prime Minister Srettha Thavisin may have to (possibly) wait a little longer than expected to start their work, after Foreign Minister Parnpree Bahiddha-nukara, resigned within an hour after the official endorsement.
 - ❖ This is the 1st time that a minister who was endorsed by His Majesty the King, resigned even before the audience to take swear of oath for the office with HM the King before starting their work.
 - ❖ Complications on whether the incomplete line-up of Cabinet could go for an audience with HM the King could possibly delay the working of the new Cabinet.
- Parnpree Bahiddha-nukara, quit the job as Minister of Foreign Affairs citing the fact that stripping him off the 'Deputy Prime Minister's' position could lower his standing in the international arena and thus become a hinderance to his working.

- ❖ Internally though, rumors are that he was not satisfied with the working of Prime Minister Srettha and his way of handling the issues within the Cabinet and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
- In his official resignation letter, Parnpree Bahiddha-nukara has resigned as said that the
 decision to resign followed the recent cabinet reshuffle, which resulted in him losing his
 deputy prime minister portfolio. Parnpree has also resigned from all other positions in the
 government.
 - ❖ He stated in his resignation letter that the removal of his deputy prime minister position certainly did not stem from a lack of performance. He mentioned successful negotiations on visa fees, the establishment of a humanitarian corridor along the Thailand-Myanmar border, and the revitalization of relationships with ASEAN, the EU, India, the US, and China.
 - Arnpree told reporters that he is not sure whether he will also resign from the ruling Pheu Thai Party. "I will have to wait and see," he said when asked if he would continue working with the party.

- The Office of the Secretariat to the Cabinet (OSOC) announced that the Cabinet meeting scheduled for Tuesday, April 30, has been cancelled. However, Prime Minister Srettha will still chair a meeting of the Royal Thai Police Commission on the same day.
 - ❖ At the time of reporting, the OSOC has not yet released a schedule for the new Cabinet ministers to swear in before His Majesty the King.
- The reshuffle of the Cabinet with now former Public Health Minister Cholnan Srikaew, being removed has created a stir in the Pheu Thai party.
 - ❖ Cholnan, the former leader of Pheu Thai party who led the party through the troubled times of trying to form and then break up with the Move Forward party after the May 14, 2023 general elections, has promted many questions to be asked from Pheu Thai party's true leaders.
 - ❖ Questions of 'use and throw' methodology of the Pheu Thai party is prompting many to question on what's next for the party and its members. Cholnan was the man who faced the brunt of the criticism against the Pheu Thai party after the break up with the Move Forward party to form a coalition in 2023.


- Cherdchai Tantisirin, Vice Minister to Ministry of Public Health, revealed that the removal of Cholnan Srikaew from the Minister of Public Health could potentially disrupt and damage the governance of Srettha's administration.
 - ❖ He raised concerns that whether a new individual would be able to seamlessly continue the work, as leading the ministry can be challenging.



- Another appointment that is likely to create more problems than solve is the appointment of Pichit Chuenban, as the Prime Minister's Office, with his qualifications liekly to put to the court to decide.
 - * Rames Rattanachaweng, the spokesperson of the Democrat Party, stated that Pichit Chuenban, who was appointed as the Prime Minister's Office Minister, would undoubtedly face challenges ahead. This is because of his qualification issue related to a case of court-convicted abuse of power, which has already reached its final verdict in court.
 - ❖ Pichit Chaiyamongkol, a leader of the Network of Students and People for Reform of Thailand (NSPRT), posted on Facebook that the NSPRT will file a petition with the Election Commission (EC) on April 30, alleging that newly appointed Cabinet Minister Pichit Chuenban has violated the qualifications for office. The NSPRT is requesting that the EC refer the petition to the Constitutional Court.
 - ❖ He claimed that the new minister had been convicted of contempt of court and potentially bribery of a public official by the Supreme Court. He argued that Pichit lacks the qualifications to be a minister, Prime Minister Srettha Thavisin must also be held accountable. He contended that if the Prime Minister is disqualified, the entire Cabinet must resign as well.
- Phalang Pracharat Party (PPRP), the party that was the flagbearer of the 2014 coup leader

 Prayut Chan-o-cha, until the May 14, 2023, elections, is starting to see a split that will likely leave the infamous watch borrower from dead friends Prawit Wongsuwon, left with nothing but an empty shell.
 - ❖ A chronology of events leading up to the Cabinet reshuffle is a clear indication that the drug convicted (in Australia) politician − Thammanat Prompao, has the upper hand in the handling of the PPRP than the multi-million dollar watches borrower from dead friends (Prawit).

- ❖ Up until April 26th the watch borrowing frail Prawit continued to insist that Atthakorn Sirilatthayakorn was not on the list to be prompted in the Cabinet line-up but the convicted drug dealer had insisted that Atthakorn was on the list and that there was Anan Phol-amnuay's name that was proposed.
 - The result was that Atthakorn was made the Deputy Agriculture Minister (FYI – Agriculture Minister is Thammanat).
- Thanathorn Juangroongruangkit, the leader of the Progressive Movement, stated that encouraging people to apply for candidacy for the Senate election is not illegal.
 - ❖ He was referring to the Election Commission's announcement, which suggests that encouraging people to apply for the candidacy might violate the laws.
 - ❖ Yesterday the secretary-general of the Election Commission Office Sawang Boonmee warned those who eye the upcoming senatorial election not to beg for votes or exchange votes with other candidates. He said the Senate is a chamber of specialists, representing 20 professional groups, unlike the House of Representatives, which is a chamber of people's representatives.
 - Senatorial candidates caught campaigning or begging for support or promising to exchange votes with peer candidates could face election ban for life.
 - ❖ The elections for 200 Senate seats will be held in three levels. The election at the district level will be held on June 9, at the provincial level on June 16 and at the national level on June 26, Sawang said, adding the results would be announced on July 2. Candidacy registration opens on May 13.



- Former Thai Civilized Party leader Mongkolkit Suksintharanon has joined the Democrat Party.
 - ❖ He said he decided to join the party because it has no single owner, and he has known Chalermchai Srion, the party's leader, for more than 10 years. He also expressed his intention to attract new generations to the party.

❖ Mongkolkit gained attention for referring to himself as one of Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha's "protectors" in Parliament after the 2019 election. However, in 2021, he challenged Prayut to a Muay Thai fight when he called for the resignation of the 2014 coup leader. His party had only one MP in 2019, which was himself. Additionally, he advocates for the legalization of gambling, sex work, and sex toys.



- Nida Poll has released the results of its latest survey on the topic of preventing military coups in Thailand. The survey, conducted between April 22 and 23, involved 1,310 respondents aged 18 and above from across the country.
 - ❖ When asked about their belief in the effectiveness of the proposed Defense Ministry Bill in preventing coups, 51.83% of respondents stated that they did not believe it would be effective at all. This was followed by 25.73% who stated they did not believe it would be very effective, and 12.52% who stated they believed it would be somewhat effective.
 - Regarding their belief that the 2014 coup will be the last one in Thailand, 61.83% of respondents stated they did not believe this to be the case. 20.38% stated they did not believe this to be very likely, while only 8.24% stated they believed it to be somewhat likely and 6.11% stated they believed it to be very likely.

 Super Poll has released the results of its survey on the characteristics desired for the next National Police Chief. The survey was conducted between April 25 and 27 and involved 1,207 respondents from various professions across the country.

- ❖ According to the survey, 75.5% of respondents stated that they wanted the next national police chief to have honesty and integrity. This was followed by 71.4% who chose the ability to foster unity within the police force, 68.2% who chose someone with a background free from corruption or involvement in illegal activities, 66.8% who chose accessibility and dedication to public safety, and 63.2% who chose someone who could restore public trust in the police.
- ❖ In response to the ongoing news involving high-ranking police officers, a significant majority of respondents expressed weariness. 62.2% stated they were "very tired" or "extremely tired" of the situation, while 74.1% indicated that the issues within the police force should be resolved immediately.

Economic News

- Following the resignation of Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Panpree Phitthanukorn, Prime Minister Srettha is expected to adjust Cabinet responsibilities among his remaining deputy prime ministers.
 - ❖ According to sources, Srettha is likely to assign Pichai Chunhavajira, Deputy Prime Minister and Finance Minister, to oversee Panpree's former portfolios. His immediate duties may include:
 - > Driving the 10,000 Baht cash handout project
 - Expediting budget disbursement and preparing the 2025 budget
 - ➤ Implementing tax Measures to reduce people's burden

Addressing household debt



- Poonpong Naiyanapakorn, Director-General of the Office of Trade Policy and Strategy (TPSO), will hold a press conference to announce Thailand's trade figures for March and the 1st quarter of 2024 today at 10 AM. The press conference will be live-streamed via the TPSO Facebook page at https://www.facebook.com/TPSO.MOC.
 - ❖ Thailand's exports in February 2024 were valued at US\$ 23.384.9 billion, expanding by 3.6% compared to the same period last year. This marks the seventh consecutive month of expansion.
 - ❖ Meanwhile, imports were valued at US\$ 23.938.9 billion, expanding by 3.2%, resulting in a trade deficit of US\$554.0 million. For the first two months of 2024, exports were valued at US\$46.034.7 billion, expanding by 6.7% compared to the same period last year. Imports were valued at US\$ 49.346.6 billion, expanding by 2.9%, resulting in a trade deficit of US\$ 3.311.9 billion.



- The Subcommittee on Natural Gas Price Transmission Review will consider imposing a 2nd round of natural gas shortfall penalties on PTT, Thailand's national oil and gas conglomerate, amounting to 4.7 billion Baht. The penalties will then be proposed to the Energy Regulatory Commission (ERC) for consideration to be used as a discount on electricity bills for the period of September to December 2024.
 - ❖ This follows the use of the first round of PTT's shortfall penalties (October 2023-December 2025) amounting to 4.3 billion Baht as a discount on electricity bills for the period of January to April 2024, in accordance with the instructions of Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Energy Pirapan Salirathavibhaga. However, the final shortfall figure will need to be confirmed at the meeting.
 - ❖ Beyond Securities estimates that the second round of penalties will impact PTT's profit this year by 3-4%.
- Bangkok Bank is the 1st major commercial bank to announce the lowering of its Minimum Retail Rate (MRR) following the announcement by the Thai Bankers Association (TBA) of a 0.25% reduction in the rate for a 6-month period, made yesterday. The bank's MRR cut will take effect on April 29 for a duration of 6 months.
 - ❖ Meanwhile The Government Savings Bank, Government Housing Bank, and SME Development Bank have announced the lowering of their MRR rates by 0.25% effective May 1. Additionally, the Export-Import Bank of Thailand announced a 0.25% reduction in their prime rate on April 30.
 - ❖ The TBA's decision came after the government urged state-owned banks and commercial banks to lower their interest rates to assist SMEs and financially vulnerable individuals, following the Bank of Thailand's Monetary Policy Committee decision to maintain the benchmark lending rate at 2.5% in its previous meeting on April 10.

- The Customs Department is scheduled to commence the collection of value-added tax (VAT) for imported goods sent through postal services, regardless of the value of the goods, starting in May.
 - ❖ According to finance permanent secretary Lavaron Sangsnit, imported goods currently sent via postal services are exempt from import duties and VAT if the importers declare the cost, insurance and freight (CIF) value of each item as less than 1,500 Baht apiece.
 - ❖ However, low-priced goods from China are flooding the market, creating an unfair advantage as domestic producers are subject to taxes. To ensure fair trade practices, the Finance Ministry plans to collect VAT for imported goods sent via postal services irrespective of their value, while maintaining the exemption from import duties.
 - ❖ The Customs Department will issue an announcement of this tax collection, which can be done more swiftly than amending the Revenue Code.
- Palang Pracharath Party member Ruangkrai Leekitwattana has sent a letter to the National Anti-Corruption Commission, requesting an investigation into the feasibility, legality, and potential corruption of the 10,000 Baht digital wallet project by the government.
 - Ruangkrai raises several concerns in his letter, such as whether the project violates any laws, whether there is an underlying intention to favor large business groups, or whether the project incorporates anti-corruption measures.
- Four egg producer cooperatives have issued a notice to their members and egg farmers announcing the recommended price for assorted eggs being sold directly in front of farms at 3.80 Baht per egg (for eggs weighing 20.5 grams or more), effective today.



- Voice TV said it is shutting down after 15 years because of the saturated digital media market. They would properly compensate all of their employees before shutting down both TV and online operations in May.
 - ❖ The company has incurred losses between 2018 and 2022 as follows:
 - ➤ 2018: Revenue 60 million Baht / Expenditure 395 million Baht / Loss of 352 million Baht
 - ➤ 2019: Revenue 160 million Baht / Expenditure 304 million Baht / Loss of 157 million Baht
 - ➤ 2020: Revenue 44 million Baht / Expenditure 147 million Baht / Loss of 110 million Baht
 - ➤ 2021: Revenue 71 million Baht / Expenditure 157 million Baht / Loss of 92 million Baht
 - ➤ 2022: Revenue 97 million Baht / Expenditure 195 million Baht / Loss of 106 million Baht





- The 3.48-trillion-Baht fiscal budget for the 2024 fiscal year has been announced in the Royal Gazette, effective since the start of the fiscal budget year on October 1, 2023.
 - ❖ The budget deficit is 693 billion Baht. Approximately 718 billion Baht is earmarked for investments. The government has already disbursed nearly half of the fixed budget, and they are looking to use the investment budget to boost the economy after it expanded by only 1.7% YoY in Q4 of 2023.
 - ❖ After seasonal adjustment, GDP in Q4 of 2023 actually decreased by 0.6%. As a result, GDP in 2023 increased by 1.9%, decelerating from 2.5% in 2022, according

to the National Economic and Social Development Council. For 2024, the economy is expected to grow by 2.6%, according to the Bank of Thailand.







General News

- The 3 Thai power grids recorded a new peak power demand on April 27 at 36,356.1 megawatts. This surpassed the previous peak of 35,830 megawatts set on April 22.
 - ❖ There has been a total of 7 peak demand events in April so far. The Energy Policy and Planning Office (EPPO) expects the peak demand for the year to be between 35,000 and 36,000 megawatts.
 - ❖ Meanwhile, hot weather is expected to continue across Thailand today, with the highest temperatures reaching 44 degrees Celsius, according to the Thai Meteorological Department (TMD).
 - ❖ In Bangkok, the maximum temperature is expected to be 41 degrees Celsius.
 - ❖ TMD warned the temperatures in Thailand may keep rising until the end of this month, before the weather will later improve because of the onset of the rainy

season. The TMD has forecast that from April 28 to May 7, temperatures in Thailand will remain high.



- Thai Airways is back in the news, this time a social media post shows that a person who purchased 6 business class tickets were in for a rough ride (at least 2 of them).
 - ❖ The post on social media said that the Bangkok to Beijing flight saw that 2 (out of 6) seats were broken and could not recline, therefore the airline refunded 5,500 Baht per seat to the travellers as 'compensation'.
 - ❖ This is not the 1st time such an incident has happened, similar incident happened on yet another flight in which the aircraft (Boeing 777) was changed to a smaller configuration (Airbus A350) leaving some 'Business' class passengers having to sit in economy and getting even lesser compensation on the 6-hour flight.

- A forest fire broke out at Phu Thap Buek in Lom Kao district, Phetchabun province, on Sunday evening.
 - ❖ The fire started around 500 meters away from the Wat Pa Phu Thap Boek and forced the evacuation of hundreds of monks.
 - ❖ As of 10:00 PM, Phetchabun Governor Krit Kongmuang reported that firefighters and local residents had managed to control the main blazes. However, some areas of deep bamboo forests still smoldered.
