Thai Enquirer News Summary

Political News

- May 23rd is the D-Day for Prime Minister Srettha Thavisin as the Constitutional Court is scheduled to decide on whether to accept for trial a petition against Prime Minister Srettha and his newly appointed Prime Minister's Office minister, Pichit Chuenban.
 - ❖ Forty senators had asked the Constitutional Court to adjudicate whether the ministership of Prime Minister Srettha and PM's Office Minister Pichit has ended based on Section 170 of the charter. The senators filed the petition via the president of the Senate, and the court received it on Friday.
 - ❖ The complainants' petition said that the prime minister violated the Constitution by appointing Pichit to the Cabinet despite his lack of qualifications and prohibited qualities.

- ❖ The Constitutional Court's judges are expected to decide whether to accept the senators' petition for trial and whether Srettha and Pichit should be suspended from their duties while a final verdict is pending.
- ❖ Srettha maintained that his appointment of Pichit was "legitimate and lawful", adding that he had consulted with the Council of State the government's legal advisory agency before coming to the decision.
- ❖ If the Constitutional Court does accept the case, Srettha would need to put on hold all political activities until the Court makes a ruling (similar to what 2014 coup leader Prayut Chan-o-cha had faced on August 24, 2022).

• Samart Jenchaichitwanich, former Deputy Minister of Justice, believed that on May 23, the Constitutional Court will accept the petition for consideration and issue an order for Srettha and Pichit to cease their duties.

❖ On May 29, the Attorney General will decide whether or not to prosecute former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra under Section 112. And on June 2, the Move Forward Party needs to submit all their documents to defend themselves from the ongoing case to dissolve their party.



- Today marks the 1st day for aspiring senators to submit their applications to the Election Commission (EC). The application period will be open until May 24.
 - ❖ EC Secretary-General Sawang Boonmee expressed his confidence in the readiness of the registration venues and instructed all districts to proceed with the registration process. He emphasized that each candidate is responsible for ensuring they meet the eligibility criteria, which have been clearly outlined in the EC announcement.
 - ❖ However, Sawang warned that in the event of any future complaints regarding a candidate's eligibility, the matter will be referred to the Supreme Court for adjudication. If any candidate is found ineligible, the candidate will face legal consequences.

- Somchai Wongsawat, former Prime Minister and husband of Yaowapa Wongsawat, the sister of former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra, will reportedly run for a senatorial position in the Mae Rim district of Chiang Mai.
 - ❖ This move is seen as an attempt to reclaim the province from the Move Forward Party, which currently holds 7 out of 10 seats in the province. The outcome of this election is also expected to have a ripple effect on the upcoming elections for the Chiang Mai Provincial Administrative Organization (PAO) Governor and the 42 PAO members, whose terms will expire on December 19 of this year.
 - Analysts believe that Chiang Mai is the stronghold of the Pheu Thai Party, and that Thaksin wants to restore the party's reputation. This election is also seen as a test of the party's strength and a chance to regain popularity with the public. However, if Somchai loses, it could damage the Pheu Thai 's image in the future.



- Pita Limjaroenrat, former leader of the opposition Move Forward Party, expressed confidence on Sunday that his party would grow larger in the next election despite an ongoing dissolution case against it. He was speaking during the Policy Fest event held to discuss general affairs within Thailand with party supporters at BITEC Bang Na.
 - ❖ Pita assured Move Forward supporters that the party would win at least 270 parliamentary seats in the next general election, or even as many as 300. The attempt to destroy Move Forward would never be successful.
 - ❖ He said that even if Move Forward is dissolved, "we party members can pick up a brick each to help build a new house together". He was referring to the pending dissolution case against Move Forward, which stemmed from Pita's earlier campaigns to amend or reform Article 112 of the Criminal Code, which is known as the lese majeste law.





- Yesterday, three separate groups affiliated with the United Front for Democracy Against Dictatorship (UDD) held events to commemorate the 14th anniversary of the violent crackdown on UDD protesters at the Ratchaprasong intersection in 2010.
 - ❖ The "People Demand Justice 2010" group, led by Thida Thavornseth, Weng Tojirakarn, and Nattawut Saikua, consisted mainly of former Red Shirts who have shifted their support to the Move Forward Party.

Nearby, two other groups held their own commemorations including the "New Red Alliance of the Four Regions" group and the "Red Shirt Supporters of Pheu Thai Party" group.






- The Department of Corrections has insisted its attempts to resuscitate for late activist Netiporn "Boong" Sanesangkhom were conducted professionally after a human rights lawyer alleged an endotracheal tube was misplaced.
 - ❖ The department's statement came after relatives and close friends of Netiporn made an emotional demand for a rapid autopsy report and straightforward investigation into the death from the justice minister, who attended a funeral rite for the 28-year-old activist on Saturday. They also rejected a wreath offered by the minister.
 - ❖ The Department of Corrections stated that professionals at the Medical Correctional Institution conducted the resuscitation attempts on Tuesday with standard equipment and according to normal procedure.
- Anutin Charnvirakul, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Interior, insisted that his stance on Prime Minister Srettha Thavisin's idea of reclassifying cannabis as a narcotic drug is not different from that of the Bhumjai Thai Party.
 - ❖ The remaining task is to push for the enactment of the Cannabis and Hemp Act. However, there have been attempts to portray this as a conflict between the Bhumjai Thai Party, Prime Minister Srettha, Public Health Minister Somsak Thepsuthin, and former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra.
 - Anutin said he did not have any conflict with anyone, adding if PM Sretha cannot remain in power, he cannot either.



- The majority of Thais support the government's plan to put cannabis back on the national list of Category 5 narcotics, an opinion survey has found. The survey by the National Institute of Development Administration (NIDA Poll) found that 60.38% of the respondents "totally agreed" with the plan and 15.27% "rather agreed" with it.
 - ❖ The survey was carried out nationwide among 1,310 respondents, at least 15 years old, on May 14-15.
 - NIDA Poll said 14.5% of the respondents "totally disagreed" with the relisting of marijuana as a drug and 8.93% "rather disagreed" while 0.92% of the respondents had no comment.
 - ❖ NIDA Poll said 68.93% of the respondents had never used ganja and 31.07% had somehow used it.



- The committee in charge of revising regulations related to the possession of meth pills or yaba has agreed that the minimum number of amphetamine tablets a person can be found to possess before it is considered a criminal act should be lowered from 5 to 1, said Health Minister Somsak Thapsutin.
 - ❖ Up next is a public hearing on the ministry's and other related agencies' platforms, which began 17 May and will run for 15 days.







Economic News

- The National Economic and Social Development Board (NESDB) is scheduled to release Thailand's first-quarter 2024 Gross Domestic Product (GDP) figures today.
 - ❖ Analysts predict that the economy will expand between 0.5% and 1.0%, driven by several key factors including declining exports, which contracted by 0.2% in the 1st quarter, subdued tourist spending, slowing domestic consumption, and prolonged manufacturing slump with the Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) remaining in negative territory for the 18th consecutive month.




• Today at 11:00 AM, Dr. Yongyot Thamwut, Director-General of the Department of Medical Sciences will announce the results of the 10-year rice inspection from the rice pledging project received from the Ministry of Commerce.

- Phumtham Wechayachai, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Commerce, confirmed that once all confirmation has been made, the auction for the rice will be held.
- ❖ Test results on the 10-year-old rice kept in warehouses, conducted by an investigative media program − Saam Miti (owned by Channel 3), showed no traces of harmful chemicals.
- ❖ Test results did not find any mycotoxins that are toxic to causing cancer or aflatoxins, in which all 4 substances were tested, including aflatoxins B1, B2, G1, G2, with the same results as 'Not Detected', meaning no toxins were found and from the examination by HPLC method, which is an advanced technique. It has a low value of only 0.25 micrograms per kilo, or 1 part per billion. While the standard is 20 micrograms per kilo.



- Meanwhile Kasetsart University scientists announced that they would call off their laboratory test of samples of rice from the government's 10-year-old stocks for fear that the issue would become politicised.
 - ❖ Weerachai Phutdhawong, a lecturer in Kasetsart's Faculty of Organic Chemistry, said the controversy over the 10-year-old rice was escalating into a political issue.
 - ❖ After Deputy Prime Minister and Commerce Minister Phumtham Wechayachai led reporters and representatives of rice traders and exporters to visit two warehouses in Surin storing the rice, a reporter took a bag of the rice to send to Weerachai for a lab test.
 - ❖ Weerachai earlier announced that a preliminary check of the 10-year-old stocks from the rice-pledging scheme of the Yingluck Shinawatra government was contaminated with aflatoxin but he would need to further check the rice for dangerous contaminations.

❖ The cancellation of his team's lab test had nothing to do with ongoing tests by the Thai Central Lab and the Department of Medical Sciences, whose results are expected on Monday.



- The Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index closed Friday, May 17, at 1,382.68 points, up 4.96 points (+0.36%) with a trading value of 40.24 billion baht. The market sentiment was positive, driven by strong first-quarter 2024 earnings reports from listed companies and optimism for the 2nd and 3rd quarters. Shares in the electronics sector, such as DELTA, and the petrochemical sector, such as PTTGC, rose on this positive news.
 - ❖ Analysts expected the market to test the 1,400-point level this week after successfully breaking above 1,380 points. Investors are advised to closely watch the release of first-quarter 2024 GDP figures by the Office of the National Economic and Social Development Council today. Support levels are seen at 1,375-1,370 points, while resistance levels are at 1,385-1,395 points.
 - ❖ The brokerage forecasts a gradual economic upswing for Thailand in 2024, with a projected GDP growth of 2.7% (excluding the digital wallet project) compared to 1.9% in 2023. The GDP is expected to rise by 0.5%, 2%, 3.2%, and 5% in each quarter, respectively.

 CP Group, Thailand's largest agricultural and retail conglomerate, has seen most of its companies report profits but data for Q1 2024 shows that they have seen a mixed bag of rise and fall.

- ❖ CPALL saw its revenues rise by 9.55% year-on-year (YoY) and 0.19% Quarter-on-Quarter (QoQ).
- ❖ CPF saw revenues drop by 2.64% YoY and 5.14% QoQ
- ❖ TRUE saw revenues drop by 6.89% YoY and 0.27% QoQ
- ❖ CPAXT saw revenues rise by 5.65% YoY and drop of 1.24% QoQ



- Prime Minister Srettha Thavisin's working visit to Milan, Italy, officially ended yesterday. He met with Nicola Doninelli, Executive Director of Corporate and Investment Banking of Intesa Sanpaolo Bank, which has over 900 branches abroad, to seek support for investment in mega-projects, especially the land bridge project and the issuance of Sustainability linked Bond (SLB) by the Thai government.
 - ❖ A simple Google search of the bank indicates that the bank has not been involved in any infrastructure deals in Asia, except a renewal energy deal for a Singapore based firm for US\$ 600 million, but one has to believe the Prime Minister.



- ❖ Following this, Srettha met with Luciano Galimberti, President of the Association of Design Industry, and visited the Association of Design Industry Museum (ADI). He expressed his desire to provide space for Thai designers and proposed to organize a Milan designer exhibition in Thailand.
- ❖ In addition, he met with F1 executives and visited the Autodromo Enzo e Dino Ferrari race track in Bologna, Italy. Formula 1 holds the rights to organize the FIA Formula One World Championship, which covers 24 races in 21 countries on 5 continents. The Thai government is studying the feasibility of hosting Formula One in Bangkok in 2027 or 2028.



❖ Srettha also posted on his X account that he chose a pastel-colored cotton shirt from the Foundation for the Promotion of Supplementary Occupation and Related Techniques to match his leather jacket, making it suitable for all occasions. Earlier, there were also pictures of him leading a group wearing cotton shirts while walking in Milan.





- The Japan National Tourism Organization (JNTO) reported an increase in Thai tourist arrivals to Japan during the first four months of 2024. Over 466,200 Thai visitors visited Japan during this period, marking a 27.5% growth compared to the same period in 2023. However, this figure still falls 9.1% short of pre-pandemic levels in 2019.
 - ❖ April, a peak tourist season coinciding with Thailand's Songkran holiday and Japan's cherry blossom season, saw a particularly strong influx of Thai travellers.

Over 142,500 Thai tourists visited Japan during this month, representing a 17.7% increase compared to April 2023 but still 13.5% below the 2019 figure.

❖ According to JNTO, Thailand remains the sixth-largest source of foreign visitors to Japan.

- Isetan, a well-known Japanese department store chain, is reportedly planning to re-enter the Thai retail market in the form of a supermarket within the One Bangkok complex, a mixed-use development spearheaded by billionaire Charoen Sirivadhanabhakdi.
 - ❖ This news comes after Isetan (Thailand) Co., Ltd. officially announced the termination of its department store operations at CentralWorld shopping mall on August 31, 2020, due to the expiration of its lease agreement with Central Pattana Plc, the mall's operator. The closure marked the end of Isetan's 28-year presence in Thailand, which began in 1992 at CentralWorld.

General News

- The Golden Boy is set to return on May 20 and will be publicly displayed at the National Museum Bangkok on May 21, said the Ministry of Culture.
 - ❖ The Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York, known as the MET, is returning the statue, which dates back approximately 1,000 years, after its origin has been confirmed.
 - ❖ Discovered in Buriram's Lahan Sai District during an archaeological dig at Prasat Ban Yang in 1975, the sculpture was illegally smuggled out of Thailand before finding its way to the MET, they added.
