#### Thai Enquirer News Summary

#### **Political News**

- Prime Minister Srettha Thavisin will be conducting official visits to Maha Sarakham and Roi Et provinces on May 5-6. Following that, he will embark on a series of provincial tours to meet with the public, starting on May 10.
  - \* The tour schedule is as follows:
    - ➤ May 10: Suphan Buri province
    - ➤ May 11: Kanchanaburi province
    - ➤ May 12: Ratchaburi province, the constituency of Napintorn Srisunpang, Deputy Minister of Commerce from the Bhumjai Thai Party.

- ➤ May 13: Phetchaburi province
- ➤ On May 14, Srettha will hold a mobile Cabinet meeting in Phetchaburi province.
- May 15-24 Srettha is set to be back on his global tour with the plans to be in Europe during this period.
- ❖ Furthermore, he will host a monthly "PM Meets the People" program, where he will interact with the public through NBT television, MCOT radio stations, and social media channels. The first episode will air on May 11 to discuss his work, policies, and upcoming overseas travel plans scheduled for May 15-24.



• The Pheu Thai Party will host a major event today, titled "10 เดือนที่ไม่รอ ทำต่อให้เต็ม 10" to reaffirm its commitment to fulfilling all the policies it campaigned on during the last election. The event will commence at 10:00 AM at the Pheu Thai Party headquarters and will be live-streamed on the party's Facebook, YouTube, and Instagram pages.



• Today Srettha will lead his new cabinet ministers to an audience with His Majesty the King at 18.00 hrs. today to take their oath of office at the Ampornsathan Throne Hall, Dusit Palace. The cabinet ministers include:

- > Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance Pichai Chunhavajira
- Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Transport Suriya Jungrungreangki
- ➤ Minister of Foreign Affairs Maris Saengiamphong
- ➤ Minister of Public Health Somsak Thepsuthin
- ➤ Deputy Minister of Agriculture and Cooperatives Atthakorn Sirilatthayakorn
- > Deputy Minister of Finance Paopoom Rojanasakul
- Ministers of Prime Minister's Office: Pichit Chuenban, Jakkapong Sangmanee, and Jiraporn Sinthuprai.
- Pichit Chuenban is still facing complaints because he was previously sentenced by the court in 2008 to 6 months in prison without probation in a 2 million Baht bribery case and had his lawyer's license revoked.
  - ❖ While the Office of the Secretary to the Cabinet previously requested the Office of the Constitutional Court to provide an opinion on this issue, it did not inquire about his qualification under Article 160(4) regarding integrity and severe ethical misconduct, causing Pichit's status as a minister to still await a ruling from the Constitutional Court.



- The National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) is investigating the qualifications of Prime Minister's Office Minister Pichit Chaimongkol and the possible intentions of Prime Minister Srettha Thavisin, who made the appointment, according to Niwatchai Gasemmongkol, Secretary-General of the NACC.
  - ❖ The NACC is examining the petition filed by Former Democrat MP for Bangkok, Watchara Phetthong, who requested the NACC to investigate Srettha for possible

- severe ethical misconduct in the appointment. This is due to concerns that Pichit might not be qualified for the position given his previous conviction.
- Niwatchai emphasized the necessity to scrutinize Pichit's qualifications, Srettha's intentions in making the appointment which could potentially violate regulations, and to verify with the agencies from which the government claimed to have sought recommendations before making the appointment.
- Srettha stated on Tuesday that the Council of State had already assessed the legality of the appointment before Pichit's name was submitted for royal endorsement.



- The latest 15-day extension for the submission of their defense statement in its dissolution case is still too short, said main opposition Move Forward Party leader Chaithawat Tulathon.
  - ❖ The Constitutional Court yesterday granted a second postponement for the submission of the statement to May 18. The two previous postponements were each for 15 days.
  - ❖ Chaithawat said the party still needed more time to prepare legal documents and witnesses. They might request another extension if the latest one is insufficient.
  - ❖ He pointed out that the EC cannot solely rely on the court's previous verdict to request the dissolution of the party without additional evidence. He highlighted that extensions for the submission of statements are normal in legal cases. He also noted that in other cases with less severe punishment, extensions of 30 days at a time were allowed, akin to the situation in Pita's iTV case.



- Move Forward Party MP Natcha Boonchaiinsawat critisized Thaksin Shinawatra, the former Prime Minister, for visiting Phuket and preparing to visit Nakhon Ratchasima. He stated that this might lead the public to perceive that Thailand now had more than two prime ministers.
  - ❖ He also criticized Yingluck Shinawatra who was reported to be preparing to return to Thailand in October. If she indeed returned, Natcha believed she would use the same tactics as her brother, which would put the most pressure on Srettha Thavisin, the current Prime Minister.
- The Royal Thai Air Force is still deliberating between the Gripen and US fighters for the next fighter jet purchase, said Commander-in-Chief ACM Panpakdee Pattanakul.
  - ❖ The first instalment of the 19 billion Baht budget, allocated for purchasing four fighters over four fiscal years, has been included in the 2025 budget and approved by the cabinet.
  - ❖ The Air Force will make a decision in June regarding which aircraft they will procure. They want either the US F-35 or Sweden's Gripen E/F. The Air Force has previous experience with F-5, F-16, and Gripen jets. Last year, it was reported that the US had declined to sell F-35 jets to Thailand due to issues with training and technical requirements, so it remains unclear which US aircraft the Air Force is currently considering.
  - ❖ ACM Panpakdee said the Air Force will commence decommissioning fighters in 2029, potentially reducing its squadrons from six to three by the end of the process, with only two main squadrons remaining, including the 7th in Surat Thani and the 4th in Nakhon Sawan. Since each squadron comprises 12 fighter jets, the replacement of old jets with new purchases needs to commence promptly, he added.
- Everyone, including Progressive Movement leader Thanathorn Juangroongruangkit and his group, can conduct activities and events to invite people to apply as candidates for the upcoming senate election, said Election Commission (EC) Secretary-General Sawang Boonmee.

- ❖ He also said the EC has been monitoring the situation leading up to the registration for the election and so far, none of the people who declared their interest to apply for the election, and no media agency has violated any of the EC's regulations since the regulations for the introduction of the candidates only apply to the candidates, not members of the media or media agencies.
- ❖ His comments came following widespread criticisms that the EC's regulations for the introduction of the candidates were too restrictive, including not allowing candidates to post on social media about themselves or give an interview to the media once they become a candidate, according to Somchai Srisuthiyakorn, a former member of the EC.





- Pol Lt Gen Kamronwit Toopkrajang, Chief Executive of the Pathum Thani Provincial Administrative Organization, has submitted his resignation letter to the Pathum Thani Governor. He also said the chief executives of Nakhon Sawan and Ang Thong are contemplating similar actions.
  - ❖ Pol Lt Gen Kamronwit stated that he is resigning due to the election rules which prevent him from disbursing the budget to prepare for the annual flooding season. His term is set to conclude on December 19, and he expressed frustration that he cannot undertake substantial actions within six months prior to the term's end, including budget disbursement within two months of its conclusion.
  - ❖ He further noted that the chief executives of Nakhon Sawan and Ang Thong, provinces situated along the Chao Phraya River, are also considering resigning for the same reasons—they are unable to assist people with anticipated flooding due to these restrictions.








## **Economic News**

- A meeting of the working group on the debt relief program for small farmers will be held at the Ministry of Finance on May 15 to discuss the 2<sup>nd</sup> phase of the project.
  - ❖ The 1<sup>st</sup> phase of the program helped to suspend debt for 2.1 million farmers with outstanding debts of no more than 300,000 Baht, for a total amount of 280 billion Baht.
  - ❖ Another 1.8 million farmers have applied to join this program, for a total amount of 250 billion Baht. It is expected that the details of the program will be finalized and submitted to the Cabinet for approval by October of this year.
- The Export-Import Bank of Thailand still expects the export value to expand in 2024 despite a 0.2% drop to US\$ 70.9 billion in Q1 of 2024. Export value contracted by 1% last year.

- ❖ The bank stated that all of Thailand's main economic engines are now expanding together. It anticipates that the exports of food, beverages, home appliances, gadgets, and eco-friendly products will perform well this year.
- \* Rising geopolitical tensions remain a primary concern. However, the global economy and global trade growth are still expected to expand by 3.2% and 2.8%, respectively. Increasing trends in global oil and commodity prices are expected to support the prices of Thai export goods.
- ❖ Dr. Rak Vorrakitpokatorn, President of EXIM Thailand, suggests that Thai entrepreneurs become more adaptable and explore more opportunities abroad. They should elevate the quality and value of goods to penetrate markets with a demand for Thai products.
- ❖ Furthermore, they should stay updated with the latest news and information while adhering to environment-related trade measures in exports to key markets such as the US, EU, China, Japan, and India, which together represented 51% of Thailand's total export value in 2023.



- The nationwide 400 Baht daily minimum wage, expected to come into effect in October, is predicted to result in higher product prices and could potentially lead to the closure of SMEs unable to cope with the hike, according to the Employers' Confederation of Thai Trade and Industry (EconThai).
  - ❖ The last nationwide wage hike occurred in December 2023, raising the wage by 2 to 16 Baht, from 328-354 Baht per day to 330-370 Baht per day.

- ❖ Tanit Sorat, vice-chairman of EconThai, suggested that any wage hike should be based on the output of each province rather than a uniform rate nationwide. The increase from 330 to 400 Baht per day would represent a 20% rise for businesses in the three southernmost provinces, potentially burdening some SMEs with increased production costs.
- ❖ Tanit argued that a flat rate could hinder investment in suburban areas due to cheaper logistic costs near major cities. Additionally, he warned that foreign companies in labor-intensive industries might seek alternative locations with lower labor costs for production bases. Moreover, SMEs are still grappling with the impact of cheap Chinese imports. He also cautioned that while a sudden wage hike might benefit workers in the short term, it could ultimately lead to higher prices and continued calls for further wage increases in the future.
- ❖ He advocated for adjusting the daily minimum wage in line with inflation and implementing changes gradually, rather than using it as a political tool for gaining popularity.



- Myanmar Now reported that the Myanmar junta has banned males from working abroad, potentially affecting the workforce in Thailand. Currently, there are around 2.3 million workers from Myanmar in Thailand, constituting the largest group of migrant workers in the country.
  - ❖ Despite Myanmar Now's report that the ban came into effect on May 1, a source from Myanmar told Thai Enquirer that it has yet to be officially announced. However, it is anticipated to be announced soon, and the reason for the ban is believed to support the enforcement of the military conscription law.
- The Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) ended yesterday's trading session at 1,363.25 points, a slight decline of 4.70 points or -0.34%. The total trading value was 48.88 billion Baht.

- ❖ The market movement mirrored the cautious sentiment observed in regional markets following the outcome of the US Federal Reserve's (Fed) meeting. While the Fed maintained its current interest rate policy, the absence of clear signals regarding future rate hikes prevented significant negative reactions for the SET index.
- ❖ As the earnings season progresses, with 20% of listed companies having released their financial results, stocks with better-than-expected performance have helped support the market and limit the extent of the decline.
- ❖ Among the gainers were ICT stocks, led by ADVANC and TRUE. Additionally, food export stocks also benefited from the recent Baht depreciation. However, energy stocks weighed on the market, pressured by the decline in crude oil prices.
- ❖ For today, the market is expected to continue its sideways trading pattern as investors await the release of 1st-quarter 2024 earnings reports from energy companies. Support and resistance levels are projected at 1,350 points and 1,370 points, respectively.

- The Department of Special Investigation (DSI) concluded its investigation into the alleged stock manipulation of More Return Plc (MORE) and filed charges against 42 individuals yesterday. These individuals face three serious charges, including jointly manipulating the price of MORE stock, colluding to defraud securities companies, and operating as a gang of criminals.
  - ❖ The investigation revealed that the suspects engaged in coordinated efforts to manipulate the trading volume and price of MORE stock, causing it to rise significantly beyond the company's actual financial standing. This resulted in losses exceeding 800 million Baht for investors.
- B.Grimm Power Plc (BGRIM) announced an investment of roughly US\$ 3.39 million to acquire a 40% shareholding in ThreeEightSix Holdings Ltd, an independent power producer, aiming to penetrate the clean energy market in the Middle East.


- ❖ This investment focuses on commercial and industrial solar assets located within a region that includes the member states of the Gulf Cooperation Council, with a goal of meeting the growing demand for renewable energy in the region, said Harald Link, president of BGRIM. The company sees potential in the Middle East's renewable energy industry, which aligns with various countries' policies, he said.
- Gold prices exhibited a volatile trading pattern yesterday, initially rising by 350 Baht before experiencing nine successive declines of 50 Baht each throughout the day.
  - ❖ At the market close, gold bars were sold at 40,250 Baht and bought at 40,150 Baht. For gold ornaments, the selling price was 40,750 Baht and the buying price was 39,431.16 Baht.
  - ❖ Hua Seng Heng, a leading gold dealer in Thailand, attributed the price fluctuations to a previous sharp decline that saw gold prices fall below \$2,300. Additionally, the US Federal Reserve's decision to maintain its interest rate at 5.25-5.50% and no signs for rate hikes at the upcoming June meeting influenced the market.
  - ❖ Another factor contributing to the price movements was the sale of 1.15 tons of gold by SPDR Gold Trust (SPDR). Investors are also closely monitoring the ongoing ceasefire negotiations in Gaza, with the United States and Egypt actively pushing for a new round of talks.



#### **General News**

• A small fire broke out on the 6<sup>th</sup> floor of a building inside the Royal Thai Police (RTP) headquarters complex. Smoke was billowing from a balcony in Building 1 within the police headquarters complex in Bangkok's Pathumwan area at about 2pm.

- ❖ Officers rushed to the site, which was next to the office of RTP inspector-general Pol General Kraiboon Suadsong, where they found a burning pile of unused materials like pieces of wood, plastic tubes and metal pipes from an awning. It took about 10 minutes to put out the fire.
- ❖ The site was checked by a team of forensic specialists, led by Pol Lt-General Trairong Phiewphan, chief of the Office of Police Forensic Science, and Pol Maj-General Wathee Assawutmangkoon, commander of the Central Forensic Science Division.
- ❖ After inspecting the scene, Trairong told reporters that many cigarette butts, both old and new, had been found near the heap of waste materials. He said he believes the fire was sparked by a lit cigarette butt thrown by a police officer who was stealthily smoking near the fire exit.
- The Meteorological Department has issued a warning of heatwave conditions in the upper parts of Thailand from May 3 to May 7. The weather across Thailand will remain intensely hot between this period, with temperatures reaching up to over 43 degrees Celsius in certain areas.



- Phachi Hospital, which is located about 600 meters away from a chemical warehouse in Phachi district, Ayutthaya province, where a fire broke out on Wednesday, has been forced to close its doors.
  - ❖ According to reports, air quality tests conducted showed that levels of pollutants inside the hospital exceeded safe limits. Nearly 600 people were also reported to have been affected by the fire.



- A Thai maid claimed that her French madame, who was found shot dead in her luxury villa on Koh Samui, had bequeathed to her 50 million Baht of her total wealth estimated at 100 million Baht. Catherine Delacot, 59, was found dead on a bed beside a swimming pool of her villa in Koh Samui on Monday.
  - ❖ Her maid Natthawalai, from Sakhon Nakhon province, showed police a Line message she claimed her madame sent to her, saying she was leaving for her assets worth 50 million.
  - ❖ Natthawalai, or "Tim", told police that the Line message stated that her late boss gave her the villa and the two rai (0.32 hectare) plot beside it, a luxury car, some jewellery in the safe box and some cash in the bank account to her. The message also asked her to take care of Delacot's three kittens and also left two other rented villas to her ex-husband, Vincent.
  - So far, police have not yet wrapped up the case but they see suicide as a possibility. They suspect the woman shot herself dead after being diagnosed with cancer. A pistol was found near her body. But the suspected suicide could not be recorded on the house security camera because of the pool camera's angle.
  - ❖ Tim has been serving her French madame for 17 years after being introduced to Delacot by a friend of the French woman. Delocot and her ex-husband travelled to Koh Samui 12 years ago to do the home renting business.





- The 6-round boxing match between the legendary Manny 'PacMan' Pacquiao and Muay Thai icon Buakaw Banchamek will still take place within this year, though it may not happen in Thailand, said Vinij Lertratanachai, the chief executive of Fresh Air Festival.
  - His remarks followed the indefinite postponement of the fight, originally scheduled for April 20.
  - ❖ Vinij highlighted the significant production costs and insufficient support for hosting the fight in Thailand. However, he expressed confidence that arranging the fight elsewhere would be feasible. He said an official announcement would be made later. The pay-per-view match is estimated to cost \$25 million to set up.
