## Thai Enquirer News Summary

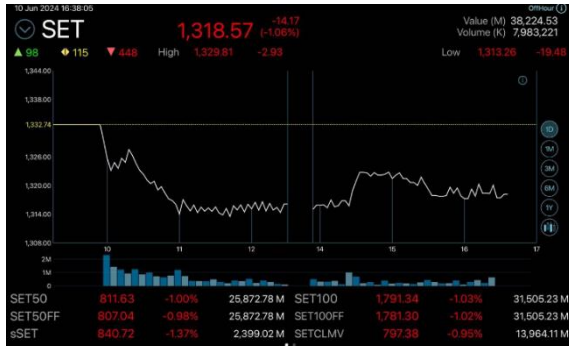
### **Economic News**

- Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance Pichai Chunhavajira disclosed that the Economic Cabinet meeting has set a goal to boost Thailand's GDP growth to 3% in 2024, up from the forecasted 2.4%. This will be driven by 3 key initiatives:
  - **Tourism Sector:** The target for this year is 35.7 million tourists, with plans to increase this number by 1 million to 36.7 million. This is expected to contribute 0.12% to GDP growth.
  - **Government Spending:** The total investment budget for 2024 is 850 billion Baht. Currently, 51% of the budget is either disbursed or awaiting contract signing. Accelerating the disbursement to 70% is projected to boost GDP by 0.24%.

- Private Sector Investment: The government will launch new measures to promote private sector investment to attract 300-400 billion Baht in investments this year.



- The Cabinet will meet today to discuss the following.
  - SME Development Bank's loan guarantee scheme under the PGS 11 program, with a maximum loan amount of 40 million Baht per borrower and a total program budget of 50 billion Baht.
  - Government Savings Bank's 5 billion Baht loan scheme for small entrepreneurs under the Prime Minister's Ignite Thailand" policy.
  - The Ministry of Commerce, Ministry of Agriculture and Cooperatives, and Ministry of Energy's short-term plan to address the low prices of palm oil.
- Yesterday The Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index dropped by 14.17 points, or 1.06%, to 1,318.57 points, the lowest in nearly 4-years amid rising political uncertainty. The last time the index traded around this level was in March 2020, during the COVID-19 pandemic.
  - ❖ Brokers attributed the drop to political uncertainty, particularly the Constitutional Court's verdict against Prime Minister Srettha Thavisin, which could lead to the dissolution of parliament, creating a political vacuum and an inevitable delay in the disbursement of the fiscal 2025 budget.
  - ❖ PM Srettha stated that he has already submitted his defense statement to the court, which is set to meet tomorrow (Wednesday). It is expected that the court will provide a timeline for the verdict on that day.

- Shares of Nex Point Plc (NEX) fell 26.81% yesterday to close at 2.02 Baht with a trading value of 871.10 million Baht. The drop came after the company announced a capital increase of nearly 9 billion shares. The capital increase is expected to be completed by July 1, 2024, and the company will disclose the names of specific investors to shareholders and the public through the Stock Exchange of Thailand.
  - ❖ NEX also announced that it will hold a joint press conference with Energy Absolute Plc (EA) on June 12 to discuss plans for sustainable business growth.

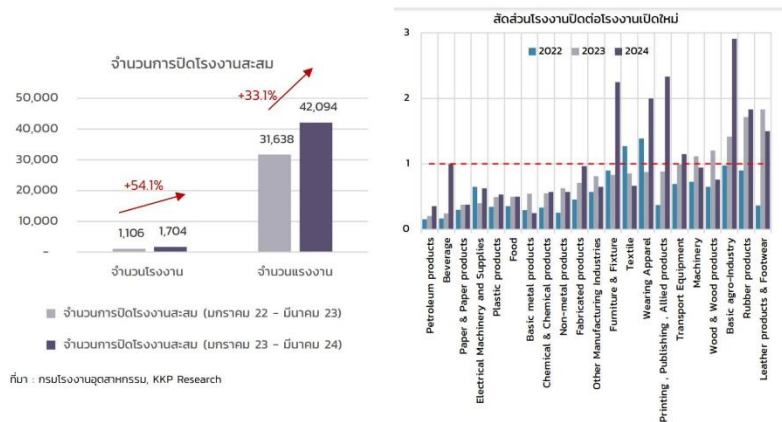
- The Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) has revoked Zipmex Co., Ltd.'s license to operate as a digital asset exchange and broker. The decision comes after the SEC found that Zipmex did not have the adequate financial standing to continue operating its business. The SEC had previously ordered Zipmex to suspend its operations and rectify its financial situation, but the company failed to comply.
  - ❖ The revocation of Zipmex's license is effective as of May 28, 2024. The SEC also ordered Zipmex to return all customer assets within 15 days.
  - ❖ Previous news reports had suggested that people close to now advisor to Prime Minister Srettha Thavisin – Wissanu Krua-Ngam, such as his son, was an 'advisor' to Zipmex.

- Jakkaphong Jakrajutatip, CEO and Managing Director of JKN Global Group Plc (JKN), has vowed to repay all bondholders in full within 5-years, along with an additional 1.7% annual interest.
  - ❖ According to her, JKN will make a 50% principal repayment, totaling over 3.378 billion Baht of the total 6.768 billion Baht bond debt, in the first 4-years. The remaining 1.690 billion Baht will be repaid to bond holders in the 5<sup>th</sup> year. Jakkaphong said repayments are expected to begin in Q2/2025.
  - ❖ In addition, Jakkaphong revealed that Legacy Holding Group (Mexico), owned by Mexican businessman and Latin American billionaire Raul Rocha Cantu, a strategic partner of JKN, has expressed interest in investing another US\$ 50 million or around 1.75 billion Baht in the company as working capital and for business restructuring purposes.
- 12 trucking and logistics associations, along with hundreds of citizens and farmers from the Northeast region, will gather at the Government House today at 10:00 AM to petition the Prime Minister to address the non-stop increase in diesel prices, which currently stand at 32.94 Baht per liter, close to the 33 Baht per liter cap.
  - ❖ The group suggested the government cap the diesel prices at 30 Baht per liter. They have given a 10-day deadline for the government to respond. If no action is taken, they said they will escalate their protest and announce a 9% increase in freight rates. If customers do not use their services, they will stop operating altogether. They claim that over 1,020 trucks in the North, Northeast, and South have already been repossessed by finance companies due to unbearable losses.
- The Department of Labour Protection and Welfare in Chachoengsao province is currently on high alert following the recent closure of Subaru and Suzuki manufacturing plants in Thailand.
  - ❖ The department reported that the automotive industry, particularly auto parts manufacturers, is facing a challenging situation with more than 39,321 workers from 137 factories at risk of losing their jobs. This is due to the downturn and stagnation of the internal combustion engine automotive industry.
  - ❖ KKP Research said that the Thai industrial sector is currently in a weak state, as reflected by the continuous contraction of the production index for over a year, the increase in factory closures, and the rising bad debts in the manufacturing sector.

- ❖ Between January 2023 and March 2024, at least 1,704 factories have shut down, impacting 42,094 employees, compared to 1,106 factories between January 2022 and March 2023, affecting 31,638 employees. The future outlook is expected to worsen, with the industrial sector facing significant structural changes, including technological advancements in certain product types, increased competition from Chinese goods, and the likelihood of escalating international trade barriers.



- Brokers say that the decision by Suzuki Motor (Thailand) to close its auto manufacturing plant in Thailand by the end of 2025, while continuing sales and after-sales services by importing vehicles from plants in ASEAN, Japan, and India, is expected to have a significant impact on KKP Bank, which is the largest lender to Suzuki.
  - ❖ The closure is expected to push down Suzuki used car prices, which, in turn, would impact KKP's NPLs stemming from repossession.
- Eight firms have submitted bids for the 10-year-old rice from the rice-pledging scheme. The announcement of the successful bidders will be made on June 13.

- ❖ The selection process is expected to be completed by the end of June.



## **Political News**

- Lawyers for Thaksin Shinawatra have submitted a new petition against the Office of the Attorney General (OAG)'s decision to charge the paroled former prime minister with lese majesty. The petition argues that the police investigators who examined Thaksin's interview with South Korean media that was deemed as insulting the monarchy acted under orders from the National Council for Peace and Order (NCPO) junta, which seized power in the 2014 coup.
  - ❖ Thaksin faces formal indictment on June 18 for breaching Article 112 of the criminal code and computer crime, linked to his 2015 interview in Seoul, where he allegedly claimed certain privy councilors were behind the coup against his sister Yingluck's government.
  - ❖ The petition asserted that police investigators were pressured and intimidated by the NCPO and that Thaksin did not mention the monarchy or express contempt towards the royal family in the interview. It also urged the OAG to review its decision to indict Thaksin.
  - ❖ The prosecutor has scheduled Thaksin to report himself on June 18 at 09:00 AM after his previous appointment on May 29 was postponed due to a COVID-19 infection. This case has a statute of limitations of 15 years and will expire in 2030.



- Meanwhile Prime Minister Srettha Thavisin has submitted his written defence to the Constitutional Court related to a case in which he was accused of breaching political ethics and the charter.
  - ❖ Srettha said that the defence submitted to the court on Friday explains why he appointed Pichit Chuenban as PM's Office minister despite his so-called questionable background.
  - ❖ A group of 40 senators had submitted a petition with the court in May asking that Srettha be removed from office for allegedly breaching political ethics and the charter by giving a ministerial post to Pichit, who had once been convicted.



- The drug dealing convict and current Minister of Agriculture and Cooperative - Thammanat Prompow, who is also the Secretary General of the Palang Pracharath Party (PPRP), commented on the remarks made by Thaksin Shinawatra that ‘people from Ban Pa’ had caused conflicts within the country, which many interpreted as referring to the multi-million dollar worth watch borrowing from dead friends - Gen Prawit Wongsuwan, the leader of the PPRP.
  - ❖ Thammanat stated that Thaksin did not mention anyone by name and urged people not to overthink it. He said that he speaks with the Prime Minister weekly and that the ties within the coalition government are still strong. He clarified that any implications in Thaksin’s comments should be addressed directly to Thaksin.
  - ❖ Regarding the upcoming dinner meeting hosted by the PPRP for the coalition government, Thammanat mentioned that they are waiting for the coalition parties to decide on a date in June. The venue in Bangkok is already prepared.



- Yesterday, Prime Minister Srettha assigned Deputy PM Pichai to discuss with leaders and key members of the coalition parties.
  - ❖ The purpose was to prepare for the upcoming parliamentary session from June 19-21, which will consider the draft of the 2025 annual budget bill and the referendum bill.
- A total of 23,645 senatorial candidates made it to the provincial-level election on June 16. The complete list can be found here: <https://senator.ect.go.th/>.



- ❖ Caretaker senator Somchai Swangkarn stated that the next round of voting in the Senate election will show that there are several individuals who were hired to take part in the process simply to vote for candidates backed by certain political parties or interest groups.
  - ❖ Somchai who has repeatedly claimed that there are concerted attempts to manipulate the outcome of the Senate election, said a review of the results of district-level voting on Sunday showed many applicants failed to receive any votes while others received overwhelming support.
  - ❖ The situation was the result of a loophole in the organic law governing the Senate election, which allows candidates to vote for themselves and/or for other candidates. He alleged some of those who received zero votes on Sunday may have been bankrolled to join the race by a political party or interest group, simply so they can vote for other candidates.

### **General News**

- A massive fire broke out in Chatuchak early this morning gutting as many as 118 shops, mostly in the area where live animals were kept.
  - ❖ Reports suggests that 1,000s of birds, dogs, cats and other animals were burnt to death.
  - ❖ The fire reportedly started because one of the shops had left the fan on all night to help the animals, he was selling to remain cool, but the fan overheated prompting a fire that has taken a huge toll.



- Yesterday, a malfunction with the air conditioning system caused a three-hour ordeal for passengers on QR204. The flight was carrying a group of 49 Thai boxing athletes, along with team officials, media personnel, and other international athletes returning from the 2024 Muay Thai World Championship in Patras, Greece. They were traveling from Athens to Doha, Qatar.
  - ❖ The interior became so hot that some passengers experienced nosebleeds, while others needed oxygen masks to breathe. Ultimately, passengers protested until the captain agreed to open the door, allowing passengers to disembark from the plane onto the Athens Airport in Greece.
  - ❖ video clips showed smoke billowing from the rear of the aircraft.



- Today is the deadline for the government to respond to the demands of marijuana advocacy groups. If the government does not clarify its stance, the advocacy groups will escalate their protests, according to the Writing Thailand's Cannabis Future group.
  - ❖ The group said they will move their protest site near Government House if the government fails to respond by 10:00 AM. Their primary demand is for the government not to re-list marijuana as a narcotic or to introduce new ministerial regulations to control it. Instead, they are urging the government to pass a Cannabis Act to regulate its use through parliament.
