## Thai Enquirer News Summary

### **Economic News**

- During yesterday's Cabinet meeting, PM Srettha instructed the Ministry of Finance and the Ministry of Labor to collaborate on crafting urgent economic relief and stimulus measures for the remaining period of 2024. These measures are intended to address the ongoing closure of industrial establishments and provide support to affected businesses and workers. The proposed measures could include financial or tax incentives and are expected to be presented to the Cabinet for approval at the next meeting.
  - ❖ Additionally, the Cabinet has tasked Deputy Finance Minister Julapun Amornvivat with spearheading a study of the proposed entertainment complex project.



- Yesterday the cabinet approved a 122 billion Baht increase in the 2024 fiscal budget to help fund the 10,000 Baht digital wallet policy. The fund will be added to the central budget. The draft bill is expected to be introduced in parliament around July or August.
  - ❖ Approximately 14.98 million low-income earners who registered with the state welfare card scheme could be the first group of people to receive the 10,000 Baht from the policy, as stated by Chai Watcharong, the government spokesperson.
  - ❖ This is because the disbursement of the central budget within the 2024 fiscal budget to fund the policy must commence within the current fiscal year. This implies that registration for this group might have to begin earlier than anticipated to ensure they receive the funds before the end of September.
- More than 14.95 million foreign visitors visited Thailand between January 1 and June 2, generating over 709.34 billion Baht in tourism revenue, according to the Ministry of Tourism and Sports.
  - ❖ The top five nationalities of visitors were Chinese (2.94 million), Malaysian (2.06 million), Indian (855,558), Russian (853,532), and South Korean (813,397).
  - ❖ The ministry maintains its target of attracting 35 million foreign visitors this year, as stated by Tourism and Sports Minister Sermsak Pongpanit.



- The cabinet has approved tax incentives to stimulate domestic tourism during the low season. The measures aim to boost MICE activities and tourism in secondary cities.
  - ❖ The Ministry of Finance expects the tax measures to result in a 1.5 billion Baht reduction in tax collection, but they are anticipated to generate more income than the loss in tax revenue. The government's target for tourism revenue this year is 3.5 trillion Baht, including 1 trillion Baht from domestic tourists and 2.5 trillion Baht from foreign visitors.
  - ❖ The measures include:
    - Tax Incentives for Seminars: Corporations can deduct seminar expenses incurred within the country from May 1 to November 30. Double deduction for seminars in specified tourist areas. 1.5 times deduction for seminars elsewhere.
    - Tax Incentives for Secondary City Tourism: Claim expenses for tours or accommodations in secondary provinces up to 15,000 Baht from May 1 to November 30.
  - ❖ Deputy Finance Minister Paopoom Rojanasakul said the ministry will introduce more stimulus measures for the tourism industry and other industries to the cabinet within the next 1-2 weeks.
- The Thai Bond Market Association (ThaiBMA) revealed that bond issuance for the 1st five months of 2024 has plummeted by 35% compared to the same period in 2023, reaching a total of 361 billion Baht. This decline is attributed to businesses increasingly using alternative financing sources, such as bank loans, which offer lower interest rates compared to bond issuance.
  - ❖ Despite the anticipated reduction in interest rates, businesses remain hesitant to issue bonds due to the current high interest rate environment. They are opting to wait for more clarity regarding the interest rate trajectory before committing to bond issuance.
  - ❖ Meanwhile, the ThaiBMA maintains its annual bond issuance target of 900 billion to 1 trillion Baht. This projection is based on the expectation that a large portion of existing bonds worth 540 billion Baht will mature in the second half of the year



- The Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index closed yesterday at 1,337.32 points, down 8.34 points (-0.62%), with a trading value of 45.87 billion Baht. The index initially rose in early trading but then fell into negative territory, following the trend of most Asian stock markets. This was due to the lack of new supporting factors and continued selling pressure from foreign investors, especially in large-cap stocks with significant market weight.
  - ❖ Concerns about political uncertainty in Thailand continue to overhang the market, putting further pressure on prices.
  - ❖ For today, the market is expected to trade sideways in a range. Resistance is seen at 1,340-1,345 points, while support is seen at 1,325-1,330 points.

- Kawin Kanjanapas, CEO of BTS Group Holdings Plc (BTS), has denied rumors that the group plans to sell its shares in JAYMart Group Plc (JMART). He reiterated that BTS has no intention of selling its JMART shares and remains committed to investing in the company. He also stated that there has never been a policy to instruct VGI Plc (VGI) or Rabbit Holdings Plc (RABBIT) to sell their JMART shares.
  - ❖ Currently, the BTS Group holds 0.96% of JMART shares through Metha Asset Management Plc, while VGI is the largest shareholder with 13.66% and RABBIT holds 10.21%.

- ❖ BTS's share price fluctuated throughout yesterday, awaiting the outcome of an analyst meeting with management. The price closed at 4.60 Baht, down 4.17%, with significant selling pressure pushing the price to a low of 4.56 Baht. BTS was the most actively traded stock on the market yesterday, with a trading value of 3.94 billion Baht.
- Stock price of GMM GRAMMY soars to the ceiling +30.17% on Tuesday after securing a deal with Tencent.
  - ❖ GMM Grammy's stock price hit the ceiling at 7.50 Baht per share, increasing by 1.75 Baht or +30.17% on June 4, 2024, compared to the previous day's price. This comes after GRAMMY notified the stock exchange on May 31 that it had sold a 10% stake in GMM Music to the Tencent group, a giant technology company from China, for 2,570 million Baht. The total valuation of GMM Grammy could be estimated as 25,700 million Baht.
  - ❖ This deal aims to extend the Spin-off plan to unlock the value of GMM Music and prepare for an IPO through business expansion, growth creation, artist development, and Know-how exchange between partner organizations, as well as expanding business opportunities to new markets, including China.
- MAGURO Group Plc (MAGURO) will officially list and commence trading on the main stock exchange today. The company operates three restaurant brands, including MAGURO Japanese and sushi restaurants, SSamthing Together premium Korean grill restaurants, and Hitori Shabu sukiyaki and shabu restaurants. The company currently has a total of 27 branches.
  - ❖ In 2023, MAGURO reported total revenue of 1.04 billion Baht, an increase of 57.06%, and a net profit of 72.48 million Baht, a growth of 131.12% from the previous year. For the 1st quarter of 2024, the company reported revenue of 296.88 million Baht, an increase of 25.63%, and a net profit of 20.13 million Baht, a growth of 3.55% from the same period of the previous year.
  - ❖ Brokerages are optimistic about the company's stock price, expecting it to trade above the IPO price of 15.90 Baht per share. They have set target prices of 21.40-25.00 Baht per share.
- Chinese EV automaker BYD seems to be gaining market share in the domestic auto market with more than 50% gain in market share in the 1<sup>st</sup> 5 months of 2024.
  - ❖ Legacy automakers such as Toyota lost more than 17% in sales during the same period while Honda lost 4.7%



### Political News

- Move Forward Party leader Chaithawat Tulathon disclosed that on June 4, the party had submitted a clarification statement to the Constitutional Court in response to the charges of sedition, totaling over 100 pages. The party will subsequently request a hearing and submit a witness list. He said the duration of the process will depend on the Constitutional Court, but he believed that the eventual ruling will not solely be based on legal grounds but will also be influenced by political reasons.
  - ❖ On June 9, former Move Forward party leader Pita Limjaroenrat will provide a detailed explanation of the entire clarification statement, which will outline the party's eight-point defense against the accusation. The party maintains that its election policy has no intention of overthrowing the government.
  - ❖ Reports indicated that certain Move Forward MPs have begun discussing with MPs from the government parties. However, due to fears of being called "snakes," no one has dared to publicly talk about it.



- Meanwhile Parit Wacharasindhu, MFP spokesman and party-list MP, said the Move Forward Party plans to hold a press conference on Sunday to disclose more details about what was submitted to the court. Asked why the party chose Sunday when district-level voting in the Senate election is scheduled, he said it was the most convenient time.



- Paetongtarn Shinawatra, leader of the Pheu Thai Party, addressed rumors that Pheu Thai party members were unhappy with the appointment of Wissanu Krea-ngam as an advisor to the Prime Minister. She asserted that Wissanu had joined the government with good intentions, having previously served under the Thai Rak Thai Party administration and possessing important legal expertise.
  - ❖ Paetongtarn urged party members to accept and understand the appointment, as advisors are crucial to the government's ability to deliver on its policies and drive progress. She also called for unity and support for Prime Minister Srettha Thavisin, stating.
  - ❖ “If the Prime Minister cannot survive, the coalition cannot survive, and Parliament cannot survive. Therefore, let us work together to overcome any challenges that strengthen the government.”





- Wissanu Krea-ngam attended his first Cabinet meeting yesterday. In the afternoon, he met with Phrommin Lertsuriyadet, Secretary-General to the Prime Minister, and Natjaree Anantasin, Secretary-General of the Cabinet, to discuss the preparation of a response to the Constitutional Court regarding the Prime Minister's appointment of Pichit Chuenban as Minister Attached to the Prime Minister's Office. The 15-day deadline for the response falls on June 8.
  - ❖ Wissanu addressed the opposition from members of the Pheu Thai Party, stating that he is not bothered by their resistance. He emphasized that he is not seeking personal gain and would leave the position if the opposition intensifies.
  - ❖ Regarding rumors that his motivation for joining the government was to receive a kidney transplant at Rama 9 Hospital, Wissanu firmly denied these claims. He clarified that he does not require a kidney transplant and has informed his doctor, who concurs. He explained that kidney transplants necessitate the use of immunosuppressive drugs, which increases the risk of contracting other illnesses.



- Srettha declined to comment on the Pheu Thai Party's attempt to push an amnesty bill through the House of Representatives, which would include pardons for lese majeste convictions. He stated, "I don't want to talk about this anymore."



- Talks about former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra absconding the country continues to swirl around the country as he has not been seen since May 29<sup>th</sup> when he was supposed to appear in-front of the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) to hear charges against him for lese majeste.



- ❖ Rumors started on Friday and continues until today with questions being asked to Prime Minister Srettha yesterday who said that Thaksin had stayed outside for more than 17 years, he does not think that Thaksin would go back to being outside Thailand again.
- ❖ Srettha said he met with Thaksin's daughter Paetongtarn on June 4. Paetongtarn assured him that her father was doing well and that she was confident he had not left the country.
  - "I believe that he is willing to fight for his case because he has been living abroad for 17 years, which is already too long," PM Srettha said.
- ❖ Thaksin is supposed to attend a ceremony on June 8<sup>th</sup> in Thanyaburi but it is yet to be seen if he will attend this ceremony or not.
- The Suan Dusit Poll's May 2024 Thai Political Index survey found an overall average score of 4.72 out of 10, up from 4.63 in April. The highest-scoring indicator was the performance of the opposition, with an average score of 5.20. The lowest-scoring indicator was poverty alleviation, with an average score of 4.32.
  - ❖ The most prominent government politician chosen by the poll respondents was Prime Minister Srettha Thavisin, with 45.56%, while the most prominent opposition politician was Pita Limjaroenrat, with 56.77%. The most popular government action of the month was the freeze on diesel and cooking gas prices and the reduction of electricity bills, with 47.61%. The most popular opposition action was the scrutiny of the government's work, with 52.05%.
  - ❖ Pornpan Buathong, a Suan Dusit Poll researcher, stated that the public's perception of the performance of both the government and the opposition has improved, particularly the opposition's performance in following up on the 10-year rice auction, and digital wallet. Meanwhile, the government's score increased slightly due to the freeze on diesel and cooking gas prices, the reduction of electricity bills, and the economic stimulus measures.

- The National Press Council of Thailand said two reporters have accepted money from their sources. This stems from Pol. Gen. Surachate Hakparn's claim in September 2023 that he regularly pays around 3 to 4 reporters who have been covering his investigations.
  - ❖ Pol. Gen. Surachate said he paid them approximately 10,000 Baht for food and accommodation each time they reported on cases under his jurisdiction because he knows that they have low wages and he wanted to help them.
  - ❖ The council said one of the reporters confessed to having received the 10,000 Baht from Pol Gen Surachate twice. However, the reporter said the suspended deputy national police chief did not request anything. Their council said their actions were against journalist ethics, but since one of them has already resigned in October 2023 and another does not belong to an agency, no further action has been taken on their part.



คณะกรรมการสภาการสื่อมวลชนแห่งชาติได้ประชุมพิจารณาผลการสอบสวนดังกล่าวเมื่อวันที่ 14 พฤษภาคม 2567 ถึงข้อเท็จจริงเป็นที่ยืนยันว่า นักข่าวที่ถูกพาดพิงถึง 2 ราย ที่ไม่มีสังกัดและไม่มีสังกัด มีการรับเงินจากกองทุนบัญชาการตำรวจแห่งชาติตามข่าวจริง และการกระทำดังกล่าว เป็นการละเมิดข้อบังคับว่าด้วยจริยธรรมแห่งวิชาชีพสื่อมวลชน สภากาชาดสื่อมวลชนแห่งชาติ พ.ศ.2564 ข้อ 26 ที่ระบุว่า "ผู้ประกอบวิชาชีพสื่อมวลชนต้องละเว้นการรับเอาทรัพย์สินจำนนมีค่า หรือผลประโยชน์ใดๆ เพื่อใช้กระทำการหรือไมกระทำการใดอันจะขัดต่อการปฏิบัติหน้าที่เพื่อให้ประชาชนได้รับรู้ข้อมูลข่าวสารอย่างถูกต้องรอบด้าน" แต่เนื่องจากนักข่าวทั้ง 2 ราย ไม่มีต้นสังกัด หรือลาออกจาดต้นสังกัดแล้ว จึงมีมติให้ยุติเรื่อง แม้ว่าจะมีผู้บัญชาการตำรวจแห่งชาติที่เป็นต้นเรื่องจะไม่ได้มาให้การกับคณะกรรมการตรวจสอบข้อเท็จจริงก็ตาม แต่มีหลักฐานจากเจ้าหน้าที่ตำรวจที่เกี่ยวข้องว่า มีการจ่ายเงินแก่นักข่าวจริง

อนึ่ง คณะกรรมการสภาการสื่อมวลชนแห่งชาติยังเห็นชอบกับข้อเสนอแนะของคณะกรรมการตรวจสอบข้อเท็จจริงที่ว่า องค์กรสื่อมวลชนต้องไม่ว่าจ้าง ไม่ซื้อข่าวและไม่สนับสนุนนักข่าวอิสระที่มีพฤติกรรมละเมิดจริยธรรมแห่งวิชาชีพ ขณะที่นักข่าวอิสระต้องเปิดเผยตัวตนให้ชัดเจนว่าเป็นผู้ประกอบวิชาชีพสื่อมวลชนและไม่หลีกเลี่ยงการถูกกำกับดูแลด้านจริยธรรมจากองค์กรวิชาชีพสื่อมวลชน นอกจากนี้ องค์กรสื่อมวลชนควรพิจารณาให้ผลตอบแทนและสวัสดิการแก่นักข่าวอย่างเหมาะสมและเพียงพอต่อการดำรงชีพ โดยเฉพาะการซื้อข่าวจากนักข่าวภูมิภาคหรือนักข่าวท้องถิ่นต้องให้ค่าตอบแทนเหมาะสมและมีสัญญาที่ชัดเจนอีกด้วย.
