## Thai Enquirer News Summary

### **Political News**

- Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra will preside over today's cabinet meeting before traveling to attend the ASEAN Summits in Vientiane, Laos, from October 8-11.
  - ❖ The meeting's agenda includes the appointment of Chatchai Bangchuadm, Deputy Secretary-General of the National Security Council (NSC), as the new Secretary-General.
  - ❖ The Ministry of the Interior is also expected to propose the appointment of several high-ranking officials, as 30 civil servants are set to retire. This includes the

Director-General of the Department of Public Works and Town & Country Planning, three inspectors, and 25 provincial governors.

- ❖ Reports indicated that the list of civil servants from the Ministry of the Interior is being rejigged since Unsit Sampuntharat took office as Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of the Interior. He has been in discussions with Anutin Charnvirakul, the Minister of the Interior, following the 66th birthday celebration of Newin Chidchob, the party leader of the Bhumjai Thai Party, on October 4.



- Deputy Prime Minister Anutin Charnvirakul, leader of the Bhumjai Thai Party, denied reports suggesting that he and the de-facto leader of Bhumjai Thai party - Newin Chidchob, met with former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra at Thaksin's mansion in Bangkok.
  - ❖ Anutin stated that he 1<sup>st</sup> learned of these claims through the news and dismissed them as 'nonsensical.' When asked about the report's accuracy, he questioned its source and then shook his head.
  - ❖ Newin is regarded as the shadow leader of the Bhumjai Thai Party, while Thaksin is seen as the shadow leader of the Pheu Thai Party. Thaksin was previously betrayed by Newin, who led a group of 23 MPs from the People Power Party to support then-Democrat leader Abhisit Vejjajiva in forming a coalition government. The conflict between the two appears to have eased, as Bhumjai Thai and Pheu Thai are now in government together.



- Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra appointed Teerapong Wongsiwawilas and Nattawut Saikuar as advisers.
  - ❖ Nattawut is a former co-leader of the Red Shirts and the former director of the Pheu Thai Family during the 2023 election campaign. He also served as deputy minister of agriculture and commerce during the Yingluck administration.
  - ❖ Teerapong sits on the boards of MCOT, PTT Exploration and Production, and Krungthai Bank, and he is the Permanent Secretary of the Prime Minister's Office.



- Acting National Police Chief Pol Gen Kitrat Phanphet has been officially appointed as the 15th National Police Chief, as expected.
  - ❖ Pol Gen Kitrat, who has served as the acting police chief since October 1st, was one of the three candidates considered by the Police Commission, chaired by Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra.
  - ❖ The other two candidates were Pol Gen Kraiboon Suadsong, the inspector-general, and Pol Gen Thana Chuwong, the deputy national police chief.
  - ❖ Aged 58, Pol Gen Kitrat will serve in the office until end of September 2026.



- Minister Attached to the Prime Minister's Office Chousak Sirinil stated that the draft amnesty bill will be postponed from this week's parliament consideration. This delay is necessary to allow for discussions with all parties involved, as various political parties have submitted their own draft legislation to the House, Chousak said.
  - ❖ Regarding the draft of the Referendum Act, it is believed that the Senate has sent the draft back to the House of Representatives for consideration. This draft will be reviewed by the House before establishing a joint committee between the House and the Senate. Chousak said it is still undecided whether there will be one or two referendums.
- Former prime ministers Thaksin and Yingluck Shinawatra have sponsored the opening of two kitchens in Chiang Mai's Muang district to provide cooked meals to flood victims.
  - ❖ Thaksin has provided funds to set up a kitchen at the Paed Kao Plaza in Nong Hoi subdistrict, where lunch boxes will be prepared for distribution among flood victims. The aim is to ensure that everybody stranded in the floods is fed, especially since most of them cannot venture out to buy food.
  - ❖ Chiang Mai is the home province of both Thaksin and Yingluck, who is still in self-exile.





## **Economic News**

- Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra held a roundtable meeting between the Thai government and senior executives from 6 leading global companies to support Thailand's tourism industry. The invited companies were Grab, Agoda, Expedia, IHG, Marriott International, Trip.com Group, and Thai Airways.
  - ❖ The Prime Minister stated that by 2025, the government aims to increase tourism revenue by 7.5% or to 3.4 trillion Baht. The goal is to attract 40 million international tourists and generate more than 205 million domestic trips nationwide. Various projects will be implemented to promote tourism and achieve these targets, including the Amazing Thailand Grand Tourism Year 2025 project.



- The 4<sup>th</sup> quarter will require at least 10.5 million foreign tourist arrivals, or a 25% year-on-year increase, in order to reach the 36.7 million tourists targeted for 2024, according to the Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT).
  - ❖ TAT governor Thapanee Kiatphaibool said attracting at least 3.5 million foreign arrivals per month during the last 3-months of the year remains achievable, attributed to numerous promotions, events and an increase in seat capacity, particularly from new routes. The new inbound flights are from many countries such as China, India, Saudi Arabia, Russia, the UK, Germany, Poland and Australia.
  - ❖ She said The TAT is closely monitoring risks, particularly natural disasters, the strong Baht and conflict in the Middle East, and has included these factors in its 2025 tourism stimulus plan.
- Yesterday, the Vayupak Fund 1 (VAYU1) closed its 1<sup>st</sup> day of trading at 10.10 Baht, up by 0.10 Baht or 1.00%, reaching a high of 10.20 Baht and a low of 10.00 Baht, with a total trading value of 2.66 billion Baht.
  - ❖ Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance Pichai Chunhavajira who presided over the opening ceremony for VAYU1's first day of trading on the Stock Exchange of Thailand, expressed satisfaction with the fund's price performance.

He noted that VAYU1 received strong interest from both retail and institutional investors due to its fixed annual return of 3.0% minimum and up to 9.0% maximum over a 10-year period.

- ❖ VAYU1 is set to pay its first dividend for the three-month period from its listing date on September 30 to the end of December 2024, with the expected dividend payout of no less than 3% scheduled for February 2025.



- Headline inflation rose by 0.61% year-on-year in August, up from 0.35% in July and below the market expectation of 0.74-0.8%. The increase was primarily due to higher energy and food prices, including diesel and vegetables, influenced by the impact of flooding on agricultural outputs, according to the Ministry of Commerce. For the first nine months of 2024, headline inflation increased by 0.2%.
  - ❖ Core inflation climbed to 0.77% YoY in September, compared to 0.62% in August, with a cumulative rise of 0.48% over the first nine months of the year.
  - ❖ The ministry revised its inflation target for 2024 to 0.2-0.8%, down from 0-1%, while the midpoint remains at 0.5%. This adjustment reflects lower-than-expected crude oil prices and a stronger Thai Baht. New inflation targets for 2024 are based on GDP growth of 2.3-2.8%, average Dubai crude oil prices of \$75-85 per barrel, and an exchange rate of 34.50-35.50 Baht per dollar.
  - ❖ The ministry will also monitor tensions in the Middle East, as escalating conflicts could affect global oil prices and domestic fuel costs, significantly influencing inflation rates. Regarding the 10,000 Baht handout, the ministry stated it has not driven inflation.

- Today, gasoline prices increased for all types by 0.40 Baht per liter, while diesel prices remain unchanged.
  - ❖ Global oil prices have been rising steadily, with West Texas Intermediate (WTI) crude for November delivery gaining \$1.74, or 2.34%, to reach \$76.12 per barrel.
  - ❖ This increase is driven by growing concerns over the situation in the Middle East. Analysts warn that oil prices could surge to \$200 per barrel if Israel attacks Iran's oil infrastructure and forces Iran to retaliate by closing the Strait of Hormuz.
- Yesterday, the Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index closed at 1,452.20 points, up by 7.95 points (+0.55%), with a trading value of 49.39 billion Baht.
  - ❖ There was significant buying activity in the retail and food sectors, including stocks like CPALL, CPF, and CRC, which is believed to be driven by purchases from the Vayupak Fund. However, the overall market did not see a strong surge.
  - ❖ As for today's outlook, the index is expected to trend sideways with an upward bias due to the Vayupak Fund's continued investment. The Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) meeting is also expected to maintain interest rates, making the banking sector still attractive for investment. Particularly, KBANK stocks are likely to see further buying from the Vayupak Fund.



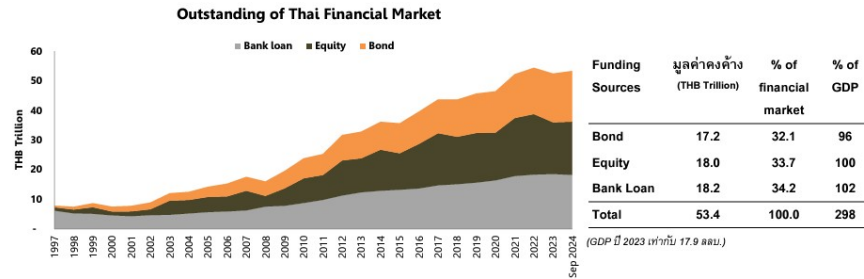

- Yesterday, the stock price of Thonburi Healthcare Group Plc (THG) surged by 15.59% before closing at 21.50 Baht, up by 2.90 Baht, with a total trading value of over 144.89 million Baht.
  - ❖ This followed rumors that the THG board had removed Dr. Thanathip Supapradit from his position as CEO and was preparing to appoint Dr. Dr. Paiboon Eksangsri, CEO of Vibhavadi Hospital Group under Ramkhamhaeng Hospital Plc (RAM), as



his replacement. Dr. Paiboon is also currently serving as the new President of the Private Hospital Association.

- ❖ According to sources, Dr. Thanathip’s dismissal is likely tied to a scandal within the THG group, as he was closely associated with Dr. Boon Vanasin, the former Chairman and founder of THG. It is expected that THG will notify the Stock Exchange of Thailand soon.
- Somjin Sornpaisarn, Managing Director of the Thai Bond Market Association (ThaiBMA), stated that by the end of Q3 2024, the Thai bond market had an outstanding value of 17.2 trillion Baht, reflecting a 3.9% growth from the end of 2023, driven by an increase in government-issued bonds.
  - ❖ Meanwhile, the issuance of long-term corporate bonds amounted to 704.15 billion Baht, with over 94% of these bonds rated as investment grade. The top three industries issuing the highest amount of long-term corporate bonds were the financial and securities sector, the real estate sector, and the energy sector.
  - ❖ Additionally, there were defaulted corporate bonds totaling 1.876 billion Baht in the first nine months of 2024, along with deferred payment bonds amounting to 26.89 billion Baht.

- Thai Auto Tools and Die Plc (TATG) has officially listed on the Market for Alternative Investment (mai) under the Industrials (INDUS) sector.

- ❖ Investors are watching closely to see if the company's stock price will rise above the IPO price of 1.25 Baht. Brokers have set a fair value target of 1.98 Baht per share, with projected revenues of 3.21 billion Baht and 3.43 billion Baht for 2024 and 2025, respectively, representing 7% growth in both years.
- ❖ Net profits are forecasted at 82.8 million Baht in 2024 and 102.9 million Baht in 2025, showing strong growth of 77.5% (from a low base) and 24.3%, respectively.



### **General News**

- A royal cremation ceremony will be held today for the 23 teachers and students of Wat Khao Phaya Sangkharam School in Uthai Thani province who lost their lives in a devastating school bus fire accident at the beginning of this month.
  - ❖ General Surayud Chulanont, the President of the Privy Council, will preside over the ceremony, which is expected to conclude by 8:00 PM.



- Yesterday, a car fell off the Chalong Rat Expressway, resulting in a fatality near the Chatu Chote Road at the intersection heading towards Lam Luk Ka and Bang Pa-In.

- ❖ An initial investigation revealed that the deceased was traveling from Bang Na to return home in the Lam Luk Ka area when the vehicle collided with a concrete barrier before dropping from the expressway, which is about five stories tall.



- The Bangkok Metropolitan Administration has issued a warning about rising water levels in the Chao Phraya River due to tidal surges and the increased drainage through the Chao Phraya Dam, particularly from October 13 to 23.
  - ❖ Residents living outside the flood barriers along the river are advised to move their belongings to higher ground and closely monitor the water situation. As for the water levels in the four main dams of the Chao Phraya River Basin, the total volume is approximately 19.65 billion cubic meters, which is 79% of their combined capacity. The dams can still accommodate an additional 5.22 billion cubic meters of water.
  - ❖ Meanwhile Chao Phraya Express Boat announced on Facebook that it will temporarily suspend pick-up and drop-off services at the Krung Thon Bridge (Sang Hi) pier starting October 10 due to high water levels. Services will resume once water levels return to normal.

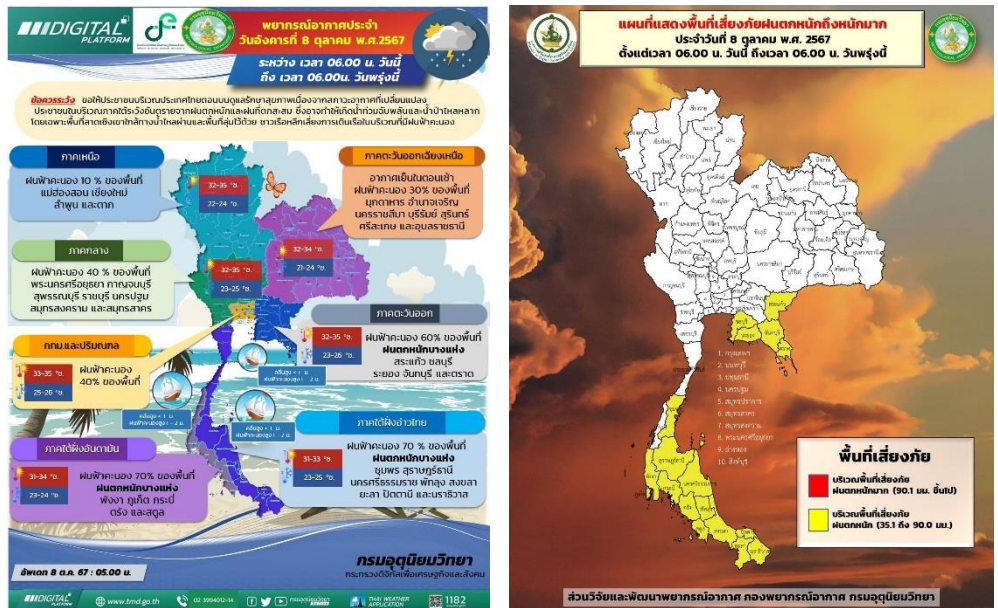

- The Meteorological Department forecasts that today, October 8, easterly winds will cover almost the entire country, bringing increased rainfall that will affect 42 provinces.



- A group of approximately 200 victims, who were reportedly deceived into purchasing goods from Thadagold Diamond Mall, filed complaints with the Technology Crime Suppression Division, urging the arrest of the suspects and accomplices involved in the case.

- Recently, the Royal Thai Police discovered a significant number of complaints submitted through the online reporting system related to fraud involving the sale of goods by the company.
- The suspects allegedly used TikTok to entice viewers into purchasing gold. Some victims reported not receiving the products or receiving items that did not match the advertisements. This was found to be a coordinated scheme, with connections to over 500 cases and damages exceeding 85 million Baht.
