Thai Enquirer News Summary

Economic News

- Today Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra will pay an official visit to Malaysia and co-chair the 7th annual consultation in Putrajaya, a city south of Kuala Lumpur. This will be her first official visit. She is scheduled to meet with Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim and co-chair the 7th Annual Consultation. Her Secretary General Prommin Lertsuridei will also attend the event to affirm the shared goal of “Common Peace and Prosperity” for both countries.

❖ The PM will also push forward ties in all areas to see tangible progress, especially in infrastructure development and the promotion of trade and economic cooperation to achieve the target of US\$30 billion in trade by 2027.

The visit will reaffirm the importance of Thai Malaysian collaboration at all levels, which is vital to attaining concrete outcomes.



- Worawat Narknawdee, also known as Acme Traderist, a cryptocurrency expert who holds over 11,000 BTC, revealed that he is pleased with former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra's support for Thailand using Bitcoin as a national reserve fund.



❖ He believed this would strengthen the country's digital economy and open up opportunities for Thailand to become a regional leader in blockchain technology. He also plans to lend Bitcoin to the government interest-free to be used as a reserve fund.

❖ Worawat also said he can gather a large group of international investors who hold digital currencies, especially Bitcoin, to support Thailand. He has also created the

digital currency ACT (ACET), which has been in operation for over 3 years, with a total trading volume of 395 million USD.

- ❖ Currently, there are over 156,000 ACT (ACET) coin holders worldwide. Earlier, in November, he proposed using Bitcoin as Thailand's reserve fund, and his idea has since been widely shared in both Thai and international media.
- The Ministry of Tourism and Sports reported that from January 1 to December 8, 2024, over 37.72 million tourists visited Thailand, generating more than 1.53 trillion Baht in tourism revenue.
 - ❖ The top 5 countries with the most visitors were
 - China with 6.32 million visitors
 - Malaysia 4.58 million
 - India 1.96 million
 - South Korea 1.72 million
 - Russia 1.55 million

With more than 20 days left in the high season, the number of tourists is expected to keep growing, the ministry expected.



- The Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index closed at 1,431.67 points on Friday, December 13, down by 8.22 points or 0.57%, with a trading value of 40.32 billion Baht.
 - ❖ The overall market sentiment leaned negative despite some support from expectations that the U.S. Federal Reserve (Fed), set to meet on December 18, might lower interest rates. However, concerns over potential impacts on Thailand from U.S. President-elect Donald Trump's proposed trade tariffs and the OECD's Pillar 2 global minimum corporate tax rate of 15% still weighed heavily on investors.

- ❖ Meanwhile, heavy selling pressure on DELTA shares made it the most traded stock of the day, with a turnover of 3.78 billion Baht. The stock closed at 151.50 Baht, down 4.00 Baht.
- ❖ Looking ahead to this week, investors are advised to closely monitor the Fed meeting, which is expected to reduce the interest rate by 0.25%, as well as the Bank of Thailand's Monetary Policy Committee meeting on December 18, which is expected to maintain the rate at 2.25%. The index is anticipated to have support at 1,420 points and resistance at 1,435 points.

- Finasia Syrus Securities reported that the Thai stock market is still subdued as investors wait for the outcomes of the Monetary Policy Committee meeting and the U.S. Federal Reserve meeting on Wednesday, December 18. The MPC is expected to maintain the current interest rate.
 - ❖ Meanwhile, investments from the Thai ESG funds, worth over 10 billion Baht, could boost the SET index by about 25 points. Although the Vayupak Fund 1 currently has low investment levels, it is expected to see more inflows soon.
 - ❖ The firm suggests keeping an eye on stocks such as AAV, BDMS, and CPALL.
- The move by CPAXT to invest 8.4 billion Baht in Happitat at the Forestias Co, Ltd, a mixed-use real estate development business, could be the first step for the company to venture into a property development business.
 - ❖ However, the move has also been seen as a bailout for Magnolia Quality Development Corporation (MQDC), an international property development owned by the Chearavanont family. The company is currently developing a mega project named The Forestias, a luxury mixed-use development project.
 - ❖ The number of maturing debentures issued by MQDC continues to raise concerns in the market despite the company making a statement earlier this year to counter talks in the market about liquidity crunch, stating that the company will meet obligations with its debentureholders with redemption of around 9.7 billion Baht at that time.

- ❖ MQDC currently has 45,161 million Baht of long-term debenture with maturity date ranging from 2025-28, according to ThaiBMA website, of which 7 debentures at a total amount of 22.5 billion Baht are due in 2025.
- The Chearavanont family is the only Thai family on Bloomberg's 2024 list of the World's Richest Families, ranking 19th out of 25.
 - ❖ The Waltons top the list again, with their wealth rising to \$432.4 billion after a surge in Walmart's stock. They are followed by the UAE's Al Nahyan family (\$323.9 billion), Qatar's Al Thani (\$172.9 billion), France's Hermès (\$170.6 billion), and the U.S.'s Koch family (\$148.5 billion) in fifth.
 - ❖ The Chearavanont family, owners of CP Group, joins the list for the first time with a net worth of \$44.1 billion.

Did you know?
Charoen Pokphand translates to "prosperity to consumers" in Thai.

Timeline

1921: Chia Ek Chor and his brother open a seed shop in Bangkok.

1970: Dhanin Chearavanont, the youngest of Chia's four sons, becomes the group's president.

2012: Company buys a stake in China's Ping An Insurance from HSBC for \$9.4 billion.

2020: Dhanin's grandson, Korawad, founds a tech startup whose clients include some of CP Group's units.

- Bangchak Corporation announced that it would maintain its retail petrol and diesel prices from December 28 to January 2 despite a potential increase in global oil prices. This decision was made to alleviate the burden on travellers who want to return home during the long holiday season.
- Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra is listed among the "100 World's Most Powerful Women 2024" by Forbes Magazine. PM Paetongtarn is in 29th place on the world list and the 3rd in Asia following Sandy Ran Xu, CEO of Chinese e-commerce giant JD.com (27th) and Nirmala Sitharaman, Minister of Finance and Corporate Affairs of India (28th).

- ❖ Other women leaders in the Southeast Asia region on the list include Ho Ching, Temasek Trust chairwoman (32nd); Sri Mulyani Indrawati, Minister of Finance of Indonesia (49th); Helen Wong, Group CEO of OCBC in Singapore (59th); and Jenny Lee, Senior Managing Partner of Granite Asia in Singapore (96th).
- ❖ Paetongtarn was listed in the “Time 100 Next” in the leader's category by Times magazine earlier.

- Suan Dusit Poll show that 54.99% of the 1,162 respondents do not believe that the government will be able to solve the country’s economic problems, compared to 45.01% who have confidence in the government.
- ❖ More than half of the respondents to a recent poll have little to no confidence in the government’s ability to tackle pressing economic problems, while more than 70% praise the “digital wallet” scheme as the government’s most outstanding policy delivery in its first three months in office.

- ❖ 70.84% of the respondents said that the most urgent issues for the government are cost of living, job creation and increasing personal incomes. 61.53% said illegal narcotics should be addressed as a priority, while 59.62% want the government to address the whole economic system.
- ❖ Regarding what the people expect from the prime minister, 49.14% want the government to improve the economy, reduce the cost of living and increase incomes.
- ❖ Pornphan Buathong, Chairperson of Suan Dusit Poll, stated that the survey results showed it is still too early to assess the three-month performance of Paetongtarn's government. Some respondents feel that the government's achievements so far are below expectations. While short-term policies have brought some satisfaction, the public expects more significant changes, especially since the government is supported by highly experienced advisors and is known for its focus on improving the livelihoods of Thai people.



Political News

- Members of the coalition partners of the Paetongtarn Shinawatra government have started to come out to defend their absence at the Cabinet meeting that took place on Wednesday December 11, 2024 after Thaksin Shinawatra, who is the former Prime Minister and father of incumbent Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra, came out to say that ‘he dislikes those who try to hide in the closet when decisions are to be made’.

- ❖ As many as 7 sitting ministers were missing at the Wednesday’s Cabinet meeting with 3 from Bhumajai Thai party, 2 from Ruam Thai Saang Chart party and 1 from the Pheu Thai party and Kla Tham party.
 - Bhumjai Thai party’s leader – Anutin Charnvirakul, later joined the meeting after his doctor’s appointment thus the Cabinet saw 6 Ministers missing it.
- ❖ Thaksin said that if ministers want to miss the Cabinet meeting and send their leave application, next time, they should also hand in their resignation letter.



- Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of the Interior, Anutin Charnvirakul, leader of the Bhumjai Thai Party, responded to comments made by Thaksin Shinawatra who mentioned that he did not like certain ministers who didn’t attend important Cabinet meetings.
 - ❖ Anutin said that he attends meetings and always stays in contact with everyone, adding he did not want to focus on minor issues and that there’s no need for him to clear things up with the Prime Minister.
 - ❖ When asked who Thaksin's comments were aimed at, Anutin shook his head and said it wasn’t about him. He also mentioned that the next Cabinet meeting, scheduled for Tuesday, December 17, would address the interests of both sides.



- Meanwhile Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra downplayed Thaksin Shinawatra's comments about ministers who missed the Cabinet meeting last Wednesday.
 - ❖ Thaksin, speaking at a Pheu Thai seminar on Friday, said some ministers from coalition parties were absent due to illness during the presentation of a royal decree on international tax measures, implying a lack of cooperation. He emphasized that coalition partners should work together as a team, and those who don't want to stay should make it clear.
 - ❖ Paetongtarn explained that many ministers have other commitments on Cabinet days, so she believes Thaksin's remarks were about encouraging unity and support, not targeting specific ministers. She doesn't expect any issues from his comments.
 - ❖ Arthit Ourairat, former House Speaker and founder of Rangsit University, who was a key supporter of the yellow-shirt movement, criticized Thaksin's comments. He argued that the father of the Prime Minister has no right or power to make threats against coalition partners during a political party seminar. He questioned whether this showed Thaksin's control over Pheu Thai and raised concerns about who is truly in control of the government.



- On Friday the premier, as the Pheu Thai Party leader, hosted a seminar in Hua Hin, Prachuap Khiri Khan province, with her father, former PM Thaksin Shinawatra, as a special guest speaker. Among those joining the trip was former PM Srettha Thavisin. Train No. 913, Royal Blossom, stopped at Bang Bamru Station to pick up Thaksin.
 - ❖ Thaksin told reporters before boarding the train that the former Thai Rak Thai party leader (himself) and Pheu Thai leader, Paetongtarn, his daughter, are essentially the same person, except that the latter has longer hair. He added his last train trip was in 2005, as he travelled to Ubon Ratchathani province to conduct a political campaign.



- Natthaphong Ruangpanyawut, a party-list MP and leader of the People’s Party, has invited key leaders of opposition parties to a dinner meeting on December 18 at Erk-Rerk restaurant, located opposite the Parliament building.



- ❖ This will be the 1st dinner gathering of opposition MPs since Natthaphong assumed his role as Leader of the Opposition. The meeting is expected to include discussions on the direction of their work during the parliamentary session and plans to submit a motion for a no-confidence debate against the government.
- ❖ The opposition coalition currently consists of 5 parties, including the
 - People’s Party
 - Palang Pracharath Party
 - Fair Party
 - Thai Progress Party
 - Thai Sang Thai Party.

It remains to be seen whether Gen Prawit Wongsuwan, leader of the Palang Pracharath Party, and Khunying Sudarat Keyuraphan will bring their MPs to join, as both have shown signs of supporting the government.



- Yesterday, an election was held for the position of Provincial Administrative Organization (PAO) Chief of Tak province. There were 2 candidates, including Atchara Thaweekueakulkit (No. 1) and Pol. Lt. Col. Anurak Chirajit (No. 2). According to the Tak PAO’s official Facebook page, the unofficial results showed Atchara leading with 98,601 votes, while Pol. Lt. Col. Anurak received 88,327 votes.
 - ❖ Atchara previously served as Deputy Chief of Tak PAO and is the wife of Thanat Thaweekueakulkit, a former MP of Tak. Pol. Lt. Col. Anurak, on the other hand, was an assistant to Chaiwut Thanakamanusorn, a former Minister of Digital Economy and Society.



- ❖ Meanwhile, in the PAO Chief election for Phetchabun province, unofficial results revealed that candidate No. 1, Akkharadet Thongjaisod, a former Phetchabun PAO Chief who resigned before the end of his term, secured a landslide victory with 263,545 votes, leading his opponent by 260,000 votes.



General News

- Heavy rain is still causing serious flooding in the South, especially in Nakhon Si Thammarat, where flash floods from the Luang Mountain range have hit Kiriwong village and nearby areas. People are being evacuated urgently as water levels keep rising and rivers overflow. In Surat Thani, heavy rain continues in several districts.

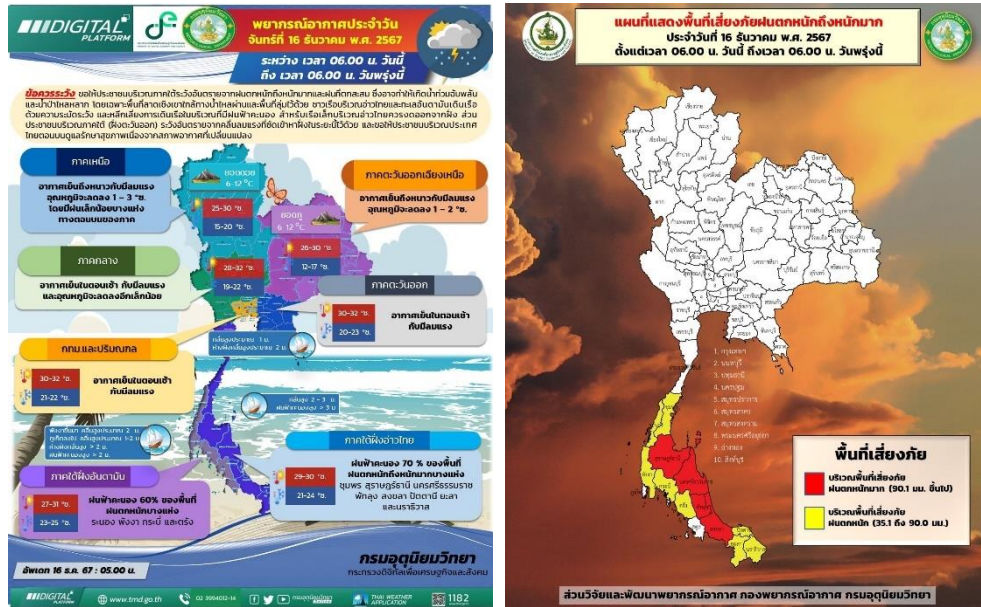


- ❖ Meanwhile, at 9:54 PM on December 15, a 2.8-magnitude earthquake was recorded in Nong Han, San Sai district, Chiang Mai, at a depth of 2 kilometers. No damage has been reported.



- The Meteorological Department warns that today, 12 provinces in Thailand will experience rain, with thunderstorms in 70% of areas. The northeastern monsoon will bring heavy rain to the southern region, causing a risk of flash floods and landslides.

- ❖ The sea will have waves as high as 3 meters. In northern Thailand, cold winds will bring temperatures as low as 12°C, with strong winds causing a 3-degree drop in temperature.



- 3 people were killed, and at least 48 others were injured, including five critically, when a bomb was thrown at a crowd at a Red Cross fair in Tak's Umphang District on Saturday night.

- ❖ Police in Tak have confirmed the arrest of two Myanmar youths in connection with the bombing incident. The suspects are Chomitu, a 17-year-old Thai national of Karen ethnicity, and Didi, a 16-year-old Myanmar national of Karen ethnicity. Didi, who allegedly threw the grenade, is a member of the Kaw Thoo Lei Army, a militant group opposing the Myanmar military operating across from Umphang District.



- A concrete counterweight from a crane fell on Rama IV Road in Bangkok, hitting a car and power lines. No injuries were reported. The incident occurred on Saturday in Bang Rak District. The block has been removed, and electricity staff are fixing the damage.

- ❖ The Thailand Structural Engineers Association confirmed that the concrete block that fell onto Rama 4 Road was not a crane counterweight, as initially thought, but part of the Sri Fueng Fung Building being demolished. Other debris consisted of large beams and columns that had been cut and lifted with a crane. The crane's sling slipped during the lift, causing the debris to fall to the fourth floor before dropping to the street below.



- Attapon Charoenchansa, director general of the National Parks, Wildlife, and Plant Conservation Department said that Phu Kradueng National Park in Loei province is expected to reopen by Christmas Day, after being closed following a fatal elephant attack on a tourist last week.
 - ❖ He also said, though, that it will only reopen once safety can be ensured.
