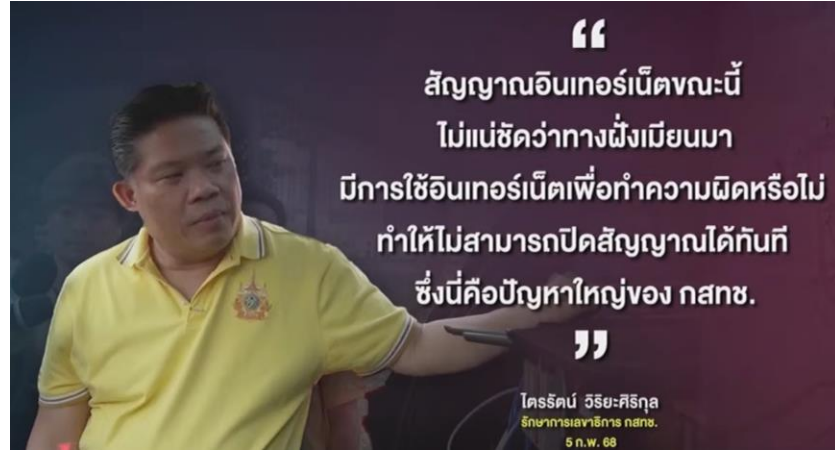

## **Thai Enquirer News Summary**

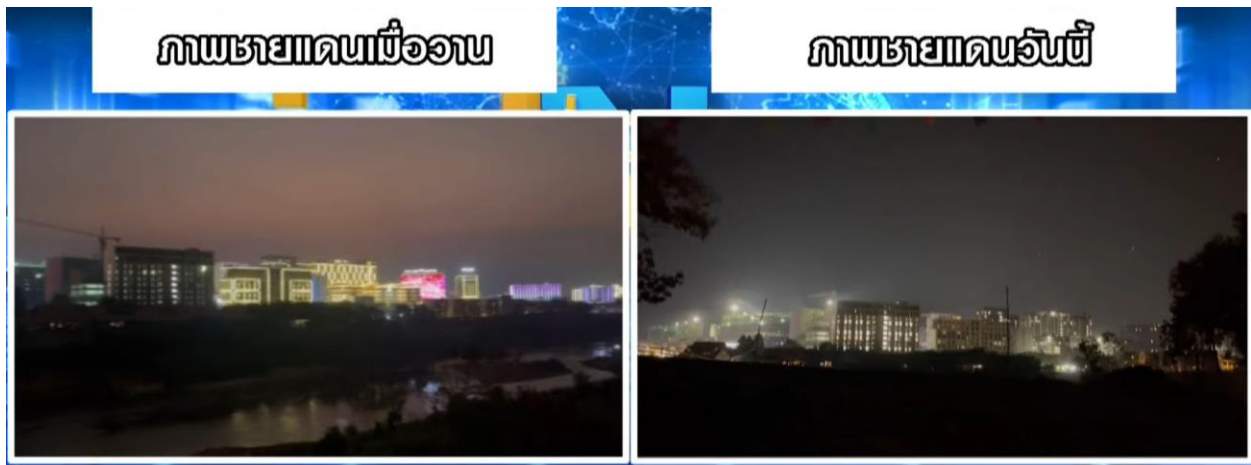
### **Economic News**

- Efforts to control the ‘call center’ gangs operation in the bordering provinces with Thailand has hit another snag, this time the National Broadcasting & Telecommunication Commission (NBTC), the body in-charge of cutting off internet broadcasting, to Myanmar, has come out to say that it does not have proof of the ‘misuse’ of the internet that Thailand is providing to those towns bordering Thailand.
  - ❖ Trairat Viriyasirikul, Acting Secretary General of the NBTC, has come out to say that such a move to cut off internet would require more than just an order said MCOT news this morning.

- ❖ The move by Trairat of NBTC comes despite the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Defence – Phumtham Wechayachai, having issued orders on Tuesday night to cut off electricity/oil & gas and telecommunication to the border towns in Myanmar.



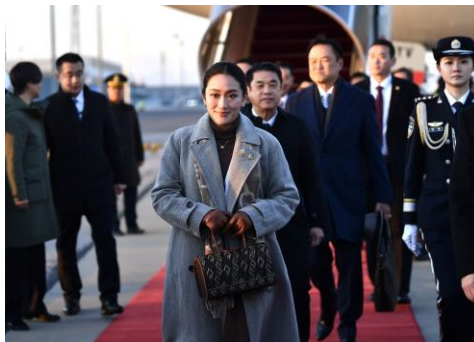
- Meanwhile after a tussle between Bhumjai Thai party controlled – Ministry of Interior and Pheu Thai led government, the Thai authorities cut off electricity and fuel supplies to 5 border areas in Myanmar to disrupt the call center gangs.
  - ❖ However, reports from the town of Tachileik, Myanmar, across from Mae Sai, Chiang Rai, indicate that the area still remains brightly lit. This is because Myanmar had previously signed an agreement with Laos to import electricity for use in Tachileik, and over 70% of the town is powered by this electricity, so there has been no impact on the area.
  - ❖ Meanwhile, in the Thai-Myanmar border area of Mae Sot, Tak province, near the Myanmar towns of Myawaddy and Shwe Kokko, electricity usage in Shwe Kokko has been reduced by 40%. The iconic China View building, which used to shine brightly at night, is no longer lit up.



- In Mae Sot opposite Myawaddy in Myanmar, the Thai Myanmar Friendship Bridge and the border checkpoint are still functioning normally for imports and exports, including the cargo terminal in Mae Sot.
  - ❖ However, the temporary suspension of oil exports at the second Thai Myanmar Friendship Bridge and the cargo terminal has impacted fuel stations in Myawaddy. The situation has caused long lines of people in Myawaddy rushing to stock up on fuel.



- Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra has arrived in Beijing for an official visit from February 5 to 8. During the visit, the Thai delegation will discuss topics including tourism, transborder haze, green and digital transitions, the Land Bridge project, the Thailand-China high-speed railway, and transnational crime prevention with the Chinese government and businesses.
  - ❖ The talks will also highlight 50 years of diplomatic relations between Thailand and China.



- ❖ In the morning of today, the Prime Minister is scheduled to meet with Chinese President Xi Jinping and Zhao Leji, Chairman of the National People's Congress.
- Despite Trade War 2.0, the Joint Standing Committee on Commerce, Industry, and Banking (JSCCIB) maintains its 2025 economic growth forecast for Thailand at 2.4%-2.9%, with exports expected to grow 1.5%-2.5% and headline inflation to range from 0.8% to 1.2%.

- ❖ JSCCIB chair Kriengkrai Thiennukul noted that a new round of the trade war began with the U.S. imposing tariff hikes on Mexico, Canada, and China, prompting retaliatory measures. The trade war is pressuring Thailand's manufacturing sector as surplus foreign goods flood the domestic market due to supply chain decoupling. A Ministry of Commerce study, based on JSCCIB's white paper, identified the most affected industries: steel, plastics, electrical appliances, dietary supplements, clothing, glass, and cosmetics.
- ❖ Thailand's economy faces limited growth in 2025, with trade barriers and a strong Baht weighing on exports. Competition from foreign goods is intensifying, while weak domestic demand presents further challenges. Chinese goods blocked from the U.S. market may flow into Thailand, heightening price competition.



- The Federation of Thai Industries' 43<sup>rd</sup> CEO Poll, conducted in January 2025, found that most surveyed executives support adjusting import tax structures to keep domestic manufacturers competitive amid an intensifying trade war. However, most oppose a VAT increase for now.
- ❖ The survey of 125 CEOs across 47 industry groups and 76 provincial industrial councils found that executives prioritize economic and social structures in tax reform policy. They noted that Thailand's shift to an aged society and rapid technological changes have slowed economic growth.

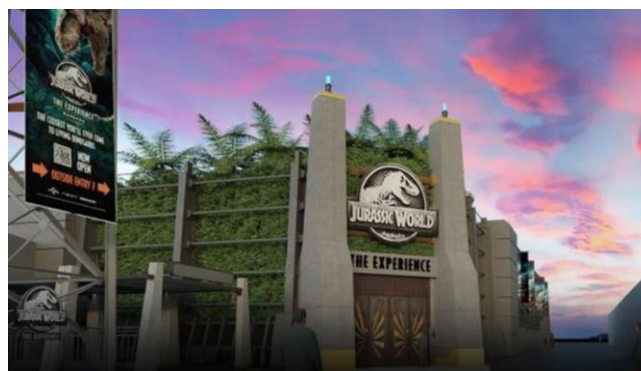




- Today, the Central Criminal Court for Corruption and Misconduct is set to announce its verdict in a case where True Digital Group Co., the provider of the True ID app, sued Dr. Pirongrong Ramasoota, a commissioner of the National Broadcasting and Telecommunications Commission (NBTC), for misconduct in office.
  - ❖ This is related to a warning issued about advertisements in the True ID app. The trial has already been postponed twice.
  - ❖ Recently, the Chulalongkorn University Faculty of Communication Arts Student Council's Facebook page posted a statement expressing its stance on the case. They also encouraged the public to follow the case and show support for Dr. Pirongrong by using the hashtags #saveพิรงรอง and #freeกสทช, along with a link for people to sign a petition supporting the NBTC's duties.

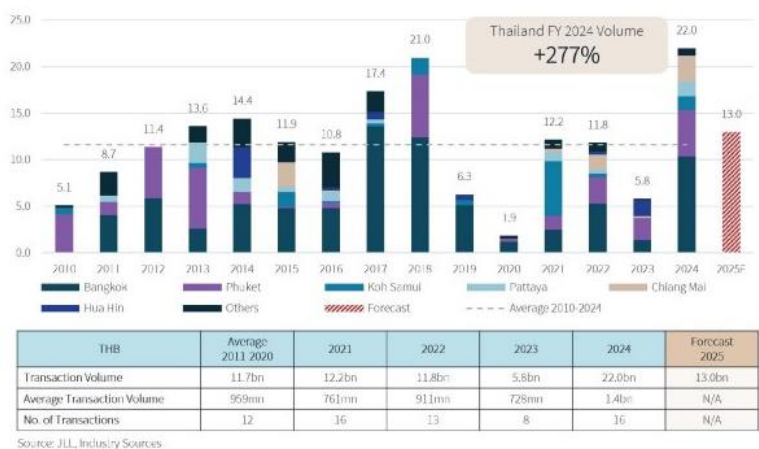


- The Board of Investment (BoI) has approved an investment project to build "Jurassic World", a Bangkok-based theme park featuring animatronic dinosaurs, to promote tourism. The 1.2-billion-Baht project, spanning 4,000 square metres, is set to be located in Asiatique The Riverfront, an open-air mall on the banks of the Chao Phraya River.
  - ❖ Asset World Attraction and Retail, a subsidiary of Asset World Corp (AWC), received the green light from the BoI to push ahead with the investment. The project, named "Jurassic World: The Experience", is the first of its kind in Southeast Asia. The company wants to develop this tourist attraction into a new landmark for Bangkok and Thailand.



- Jones Lang Lasalle (Thailand) reported that in 2024, the company provided investment advisory services totaling 38 billion Baht. The hotel investment market in 2024 saw transactions worth over 22 billion Baht across 15 deals, exceeding the average of 10 billion Baht per year since 2010.
  - ❖ In terms of location, Bangkok accounted for nearly 50% of the transaction value, followed by Phuket and Chiang Mai. A notable deal was the purchase of the Hyatt Regency Sukhumvit hotel, marking the largest single-asset transaction in history. Looking ahead to 2025, the company forecasts that transaction values will exceed 13 billion Baht, approximately 12% higher than the national average since 2010.

- Yesterday, the Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index closed at 1,286.74 points, down 14.28 points (-1.10%) with a trading value of 42.23 billion Baht.



- ❖ The market saw a sharp decline, mainly pressured by a steep drop in DELTA shares, along with other stocks. Although concerns over the trade war have already been priced in, the Thai market fell more sharply than markets in countries directly

affected by the trade war. Over the past three months, the SET has dropped more than 11%, reflecting a significant decline in investor confidence.

- Yesterday, shares of Delta Electronics (Thailand) Plc (DELTA) closed at 114.50 Baht, dropping 8.50 Baht (-6.91%). The decline came after the Stock Exchange of Thailand began a public consultation from February 4 to 17 on changes to how the SET50 and SET100 indices are calculated. The proposed adjustments aim to reduce the impact of large-cap stocks on the indices.
  - ❖ Currently, the total market capitalization of the SET50 is 11.7 trillion Baht, while the SET100 stands at 13.1 trillion Baht. DELTA is the only stock in these indices with a weighting above 10%, holding a 13% share of the SET50 and 12% in the SET100, with a market cap of 1.56 trillion Baht.
  - ❖ If the new calculation method is implemented, DELTA's influence on the market may decrease, potentially making its stock price more volatile.
  - ❖ Each 1-Baht change in DELTA's stock price directly moves both the SET index and the SET50 index by 1 point.
- On February 5, gold prices surged by 400 Baht compared to the previous day's closing price. The Gold Traders Association opened the market with an immediate jump of 150 Baht, followed by 13 adjustments throughout the day, totaling 14 changes.
  - ❖ By the market's close, gold jewelry was bought at 44,585.56 Baht per Baht-weight and sold at 46,000 Baht, while gold bars were bought at 45,400 Baht and sold at 45,500 Baht. The gold spot price stood at \$2,865.00 per ounce.
  - ❖ Gold prices continue to hit record highs due to growing concerns over the trade war. This follows China's announcement of new tariffs on U.S. imports, including a 15% tax on coal and LNG and a 10% tax on crude oil, agricultural equipment, and certain vehicles. These tariffs will take effect on February 10 as a response to U.S. trade policies.
  - ❖ Hua Seng Heng expects gold prices to keep rising.

- At 10:30 AM today, Poonpong Naiyanapakorn, Director of the Trade Policy and Strategy Office at the Ministry of Commerce, will announce Thailand’s inflation rate for January 2025. The announcement will be streamed live on Facebook at <https://www.facebook.com/TPSO.MOC>.
  - ❖ Earlier, the Ministry of Commerce predicted that inflation for January 2025 would rise by 1.25%. For the first quarter, the average inflation rate is expected to be slightly above 1%, before dropping below 1% in the second and third quarters. It is then expected to rise again to above 1% in the fourth quarter. Overall, inflation for 2025 is projected to be between 0.3% and 1.3%, with a midpoint of 0.8%, based on an expected economic growth rate of 2.3% to 3.3%.
  - ❖ In December 2024, inflation rose by 1.23% compared to December 2023, marking the ninth consecutive month of increase. For the entire year of 2024, inflation rose by 0.4%.

### **Political News**

- The National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) is expected to complete its investigation into 44 former MPs from the dissolved Move Forward Party (MFP) within 1-2 months.
  - ❖ The MPs, including former leader Pita Limjaroenrat and People's Party leader Natthaphong Ruengpanyawat, are accused of ethical misconduct for proposing changes to the lese-majeste law, which the Constitutional Court ruled could undermine the monarchy. If guilty, they could face a lifetime political ban.



- ❖ Saroj Phuengramphan, NACC Secretary-General, said the case is being treated collectively, but each individual's actions will be reviewed separately. A clearer picture is expected by the end of the year.
- ❖ However, this does not mean charges will be filed immediately, as formal notice must 1<sup>st</sup> be given to allow the accused to respond. Afterward, the case will be reviewed to determine if the response is valid and whether the allegations have merit. Saroj expects the case to be clearer within this year, unless further investigation is needed.



- The meeting of the NACC committee voted 5 to 2 in favor of selecting Suchart Trakulkasemsuk as the new chairman through a secret ballot. Meanwhile, Ekavit Watchawalkul, also nominated for the position, received 2 votes.
  - ❖ The next step will be to propose the name to the President of the Senate for royal approval and appointment.



- After the People's Party's former candidate for Chiang Mai's PAO chief filed for a recount due to a high number of invalid ballots, former candidates in Nakhon Nayok and Samut Prakarn have also requested recounts in their provinces, citing similar issues and vote-buying allegations.
  - ❖ Jakkapan Jintanaphakanon, former candidate for Nakhon Nayok, petitioned the Election Commission (EC) for a recount in Ongkharak District, where 6,449 people voted, but over 1,096 ballots were spoiled—about one-sixth of the total. Meanwhile, the margin between him and the winner was around 950 votes, while 5,800 invalid ballots were reported in the province.
  - ❖ Noppadol Somyanontanakul, former candidate for Samut Prakarn, filed a complaint about irregularities in vote counting and vote-buying. He presented evidence, including witness testimonies, video clips, and Line chats, showing vote-buying of 200 Baht per person in several districts.
  - ❖ He believes the EC will review this evidence and plans to submit more as it's gathered.



- The lower house voted 312-84 to pass the Strengthening and Protection of Ethnic Way of Life bill in its 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> readings. The bill will now go to the upper house for consideration.
  - ❖ It aims to recognise the rights of about 60 ethnic groups in Thailand. Its key objectives include protecting ethnic rights, setting up mechanisms to enforce these protections, establishing an ethnic people's council for policy participation, creating an ethnicity database, and designating zones to preserve cultural heritage, natural resources, and the environment.
  - ❖ Before the final vote, lawmakers removed Section 27, which would have exempted ethnic protection zones from forest laws. Some government MPs argued this could violate the constitution and forestry laws. Meanwhile People's Party MPs and the majority of the vetting committee members opposed it. The main opposition said Section 27 was key to balancing state and community cooperation and ensuring officials worked with locals to manage forests. Without it, they warned, over 10 million people could be displaced under current forest laws.
  - ❖ Despite these arguments, the lower house voted 268-154 to remove the exemption before passing the bill.

- Prominent pro-democracy activist Jatupat "Pai Dao Din" Boonpattaraksa, 33, was sentenced to 2 years and 8 months in prison by the Khon Kaen Provincial Court for sedition related to his political speeches during a protest on September 10, 2020. He was granted bail pending appeal.

- ❖ The court ruled that the messages on the banners at the protest and Jatupat's speech referenced the monarchy, infringed upon royal authority, and were not protected as expressions of opinion under the constitution.
- ❖ The court found Jatupat guilty under Section 116 of the Criminal Code, sentencing him to 3 years in prison. The sentence was then increased by one-third due to a prior conviction. However, due to the beneficial nature of Jatupat's testimony in the latest case, his sentence was reduced by one-third, resulting in a final term of 2 years and 8 months. The charge of violating the emergency decree was dismissed.

## **General News**

- The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) says no chlorate-contaminated soft drinks from a Coca-Cola bottling plant in Europe have been imported here.
  - ❖ Last month, Coca-Cola recalled some soft drinks in Europe after detecting high levels of chlorate in products from its plant in Ghent, Belgium. Chlorate is produced when chlorine-based disinfectants are used in water treatment and food processing.
  - ❖ FDA deputy secretary-general Lertchai Lertvut sought to allay what he said was growing public concern in the wake of the recall reports. The FDA investigated



and found no Coca-Cola soft drinks from the Belgian plant were imported here. Most soft drink imports come from other Asean countries, such as Laos and Singapore.

- ❖ Coca-Cola said the recall was focused on Belgium, Luxembourg and the Netherlands.
