Thai Enquirer News Summary

Economic News

- At today's Cabinet meeting, the Ministry of Transport will propose the progress of the “Homes for Thais” project and seek approval for the 1st phase construction of 5,700 units with a budget of 5 billion Baht.
 - ❖ Since registration opened in mid-January, the project has received 350,000 applicants, with 140,000 passing the initial pre-approval process.
 - ❖ The 1st phase of registration will close in mid-March, with 4 pilot locations, including at kilometer (Km) 11 near Central Ladprao, Thonburi (Siriraj area), Chiang Rak, Pathum Thani, and Chiang Mai.

- ❖ Another closely watched project is the Phase 3 of the 10,000 Baht digital wallet project for 2.7 million people aged 16–20. This project was approved by the Economic Stimulus Policy Committee yesterday but has not yet been submitted to the Cabinet for consideration today.
- ❖ Meanwhile, the Ministry of Interior’s draft Gambling Act, which aims to legalize online gambling and establish entertainment complexes, remains uncertain as to whether it will be presented at today’s meeting or not.
- The economy is expected to grow by at least 3% in 2025, said Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra after leading a meeting on economic stimulation with relevant agencies yesterday.



- ❖ She noted that the economy has shown signs of gradual recovery over the past year, with consumption, exports, and tourism driving growth. The Ministry of Finance projects 3% growth, but the government believes that, with the potential of the Thai economy and cooperation between the public and private sectors, growth could exceed 3%.
- ❖ During the meeting, the 3rd phase of the 10,000 Baht economic stimulus project was presented, focusing on laying the foundation for a digital economy. The aim is to keep stimulating the economy to address risks that may affect the purchasing power of the public.
- The government has sufficient funds for Phase 4 of the 10,000 Baht handout for people aged 21–60, with a combined budget of 150 billion Baht for Phases 3 and 4, according to Deputy Finance Minister Julapun Amornvivat.
 - ❖ In Phase 1, 14.5 million welfare cardholders and people with disabilities received cash via PromptPay. In Phase 2, 3 million elderly people received cash through PromptPay.

- ❖ For Phase 3, the initial target is 15-16 million people registered with the Thang Rath application. Distribution and payments are expected to be made through a new digital wallet system by the end of Q2, before the Songkran holiday. However, the government is now saying that Phase 3 will cover 2.7 million people aged 16–20 before another rollout for people aged 21–60 in Phase 4, leading to criticism that the budget has run out.
- ❖ The government said the 16-20 age group was chosen because they can quickly learn the digital wallet system. Most are students who can use the money to help their parents with education costs.



- Pakorn Nilrapunt, Secretary-General of the Council of State, stated that whether the draft Entertainment Complex Business Act will be presented to the Cabinet today depends on the Cabinet Secretary. He stated that the draft had already been submitted, as the government had designated it as an urgent bill requiring action within 50 days, with the deadline passing on March 6.
 - ❖ When asked whether the requirement for players to have at least 50 million Baht in their bank accounts, as proposed by the Council of State, remains in place, Pakorn confirmed that it does. However, he noted that the final details depend on the Ministry of Finance.

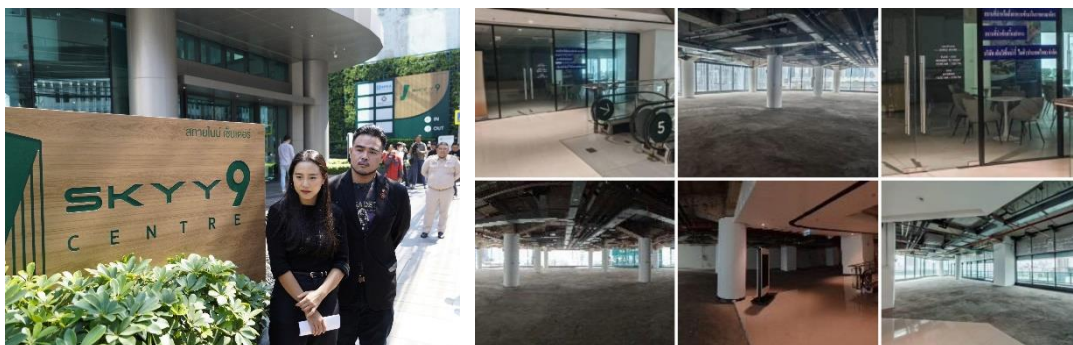


- Deputy Transport Minister Manaporn Charoensri stated that in today's Cabinet meeting, the Ministry of Transport will report on the progress of the draft Southern Economic Corridor (SEC) Act and the results of investor feedback from the Land Bridge project roadshow.

- ❖ The ministry expects to submit the SEC draft to Parliament in the next session, which starts on July 3. The SEC office is planned to be established by the end of 2025 to facilitate the Land Bridge project bidding process.



- The Social Security Office (SSO) spent 7 billion Baht to purchase a building worth 3 billion Baht, according to People's Party MP Rukchanok Srinork, a member of the Budget and Administration Follow-up Committee.
 - ❖ The overpayment for the building located in Bangkok's Rama 9 area, which was valued at 3 billion Baht during the pandemic, could have been intended to benefit those involved in the deal.
 - ❖ She called on the SSO to clarify the 4 billion-Baht difference between the actual value and the price paid and to explain who made the investment decisions.
 - ❖ Rukchanok also questioned how the SSO benefits from the deal and whether any political parties used the Social Security Fund as election campaign capital, as the purchase occurred before the 2023 general election. The former labor minister from the Palang Pracharath Party should provide more information about the deal.
 - ❖ The building, abandoned during the 1997 financial crisis, was purchased after being renovated by a company, just as the SSO revised its regulations and studied the market before making the investment. The renovation was completed in early 2022 and the building was immediately sold to the SSO. At the end of 2022, the building's rental occupancy was only 1%.



- The Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index closed yesterday at 1,177.44 points, down 24.59 points or 2.05%, with a total trading value of 34.24 billion Baht. The decline was mainly due to uncertainty surrounding the TISA (Thai Individual Savings Account) market stimulus measure, as investors awaited clarity from the Ministry of Finance.



❖ Among the most actively traded stocks:

- PTT closed at 28.25 Baht, dropping 1.50 Baht (5.04%), with a trading value of 2.68 billion Baht.
- AOT closed at 38.75 Baht, down 1.50 Baht (3.73%), with a trading value of 1.63 billion Baht.
- DELTA fell 4.75 Baht (5.85%) to 76.50 Baht, with a trading value of 1.63 billion Baht.
- CPALL closed at 50.50 Baht, down 1.50 Baht (2.88%), with a trading value of 1.56 billion Baht.
- KBANK remained unchanged at 148.00 Baht, with a trading value of 1.42 billion Baht.

- ❖ For today, the market is expected to continue its downward trend.
- ❖ Additionally, continued foreign investor sell-offs put pressure on key stocks, particularly PTT, AOT, and DELTA, along with other big-cap stocks.
- Yuanta Securities stated that the Thai stock market has fully entered a bearish phase, with many stocks now trading below their COVID-19 pandemic levels. Since the beginning of the year, Thai stocks have recorded a -14.15% return, the worst performance in the region.
 - ❖ The brokerage noted that the government may need to introduce additional economic stimulus measures to revive the market. It is expected that after the no-confidence debate later this month, the government will be able to operate more effectively and gradually roll out policies to boost consumer spending.
 - ❖ However, the Phase 3 digital money handout has not provided much market support, as the stock index continues to decline, aligning with regional trends. The most effective measures to drive a stock market recovery would be a ban on short-selling or the introduction of a Vayupak Fund 2, which could inject fresh capital into the market.
- Inside Thailand, a morning news analysis channel, has come out to say that there is an ongoing effort to change the shareholding structure of Bangchak Corporation Plc (BCP).
 - ❖ The news channel said that Capital Asia Investment (CAI), a private equity fund, has continued to take a bigger stake in the firm with CAI taking in 10% equity stake as of December 2024.
 - The news channel said that CAI is a nominee for Thai businessman to take control of BCP.

- Korsak Chairasmisak, Vice Chairman of CP ALL Plc, has continued to sell off his shares, recently selling another 1,145,100 shares at an average price of 52.50 Baht, totalling 60 million Baht. Following this transaction, his remaining holdings stand at 4.11 million shares, equivalent to 0.04% of the company's total voting rights.

- Today, Bangchak and PTT Station announced a 0.30 Baht per liter price reduction for all gasohol fuel types, except for E85, which will be reduced by 0.40 Baht per liter.

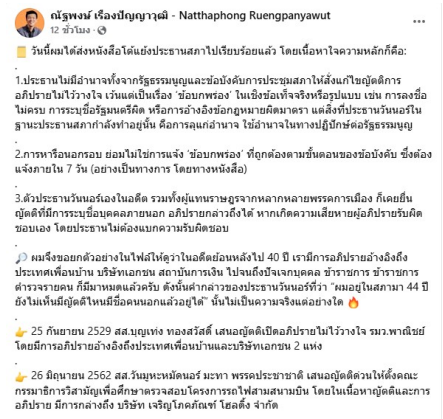
Political News

- Wan Muhammad Nor Mata, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, addressed the urgent letter sent to the opposition leader in the House, requesting the removal of external individuals' names from the motion for a no-confidence debate against the government.



- ❖ He insisted that he had not received any external requests but emphasized that the parliamentary rules do not cover individuals who cannot provide clarification in the House. He also stated that, in his 40 years as an MP, it was unprecedented to include outsiders' names.

- ❖ In response, Natthaphong Ruengpanyawut, opposition leader and head of the People's Party, also sent an urgent letter to Wan, defending the motion that included former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra's name, asserting it did not break any rules.



- People's Party Deputy Leader Rangsiman Rome questioned whether House Speaker Wan Noor had forgotten or was deliberately lying when he claimed he had never seen a motion with an outsider's name pass in over 44 years of his experience in parliament.
 - ❖ Rangsiman said parliament has mentioned outsiders in motions several times before. Party spokesperson Parit Wacharasindhu had earlier presented a motion involving political activists that mentioned outsiders' names and was accepted. He pointed out that Wan Noor himself proposed a motion in 2019 to set up a committee to study the three-airport railway, which mentioned Charoen Pokphand Holding. That motion was accepted by then-House Speaker Chuan Leekpai. By the same standard, including Thaksin's name in the opposition's no-confidence motion to show he is controlling the government should be allowed.
 - ❖ Rangsiman added that Wan Noor doesn't need to claim he's never seen such a motion in 44 years—he should first recall his own actions in 2019. Rangsiman emphasized that including Thaksin's name in the opposition's motion is legal, and the law does not give the House Speaker the power to decide whether an outsider's name can be included.
- Pol Maj Gen Chatwat Saengphet, a senator, announced that today at 3:00 PM, a group of 30 senators will submit a complaint to the National Anti-Corruption Commission against the Justice Minister and DSI Director-General Pol Lt Col Yutthana Praedam for alleged misconduct under Section 157 of the Criminal Code.
 - ❖ The complaint stems from the DSI's Special Case Committee's decision to accept the allegation regarding the 2024 Senate election as a special case involving money laundering.

- ❖ Chatwat said the allegation is baseless and politically motivated. The senators are also considering legal action against committee members who supported the decision.



- The National Anti-Corruption Commission has disclosed the asset and liability report of Gen Songwit Noonpackdee, Chief of the Defence Forces, upon completing three years in office.
 - ❖ Gen Songwit and his spouse declared total assets of 326.48 million Baht, with 100.54 million Baht belonging to Gen Songwit and 191.41 million Baht to his spouse. Their assets include cash, bank deposits, investments in various funds, land, amulets, and a significant collection of jewelry.



- A source from the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) revealed that the commission's board unanimously voted 7-0 to indict Mongkolkit Suksintharanon, a former MP from the Thai Sriwilai Party, for serious ethical misconduct. The ruling follows his use of a Facebook account under his name to post defamatory messages and images against Saksayam Chidchob, the former Minister of Transport.
 - ❖ Mongkolkit accused Saksayam of having an inappropriate relationship with an entertainer from a nightclub in Thonglor and falsely claimed that he was responsible for the spread of COVID-19. The NACC's investigation concluded that these allegations were false and severely damaged Saksayam's reputation.

- ❖ The NACC found that Mongkolkit’s actions violated ethical standards for MPs. As the next step, the commission will file a direct lawsuit with the Supreme Court, where Mongkolkit may face legal consequences and political repercussions.



General News

- Yesterday, a heated debate erupted on social media after Pol. Col. Tawee Sodsong, Minister of Justice, gave an interview clarifying the alleged suicide of Thitsan “Joe Ferrari” Utthanaphon, the former chief of Nakhon Sawan Police Station.
 - ❖ Tawee explained that Thitsan had voluntarily requested solitary confinement out of fear for his safety. However, the minister clarified that it was not an actual solitary cell but a standard room designed to hold 4-5 inmates, where Thitsan happened to be the only occupant.
 - ❖ Tawee further stated that on that particular day, an inmate from a neighboring cell, who was a woman, requested to move to Thitsan’s room because she was on her menstrual period and wanted to be separated.
 - ❖ A reporter immediately questioned how a female inmate could be in a male detention area, to which Tawee responded that the individual was LGBTQ+. However, when asked how a transgender woman could have a menstrual period, the minister appeared flustered and struggled to provide an answer. This led to widespread criticism and speculation across social media.



- Phadet Hringrot, Director of the Central Special Treatment Prison, signed an order removing Sitthiporn Kaewkambong from his position as head of Zone 7 inmate control. The decision follows allegations of issues between him and Thitisan.



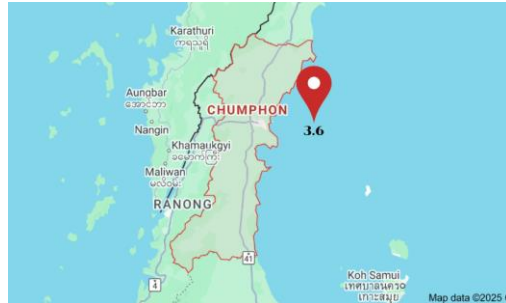
- A newly built footpath on Vibhavadi Rangsit Road collapsed yesterday while two pedestrians were walking on it. Fortunately, they were not seriously injured and managed to climb out and walk away.
 - ❖ After the incident was widely shared on social media, officials from Phayathai district office went to check the walkway. The hole was 2.5 metres wide, 3m long and 1m deep. The area was cordoned off for repair and pedestrians' safety, the office said.



- A 3.6 magnitude earthquake was detected in the Gulf of Thailand yesterday, about 49 kilometres from the shore of the southern province of Chumphon, according to the Earthquake Surveillance Division of the Meteorological Department. The tremor was located at a depth of about one kilometre below the sea bed and was caused by movement

of the Ranong fault, which stretches from the Andaman Sea through Ranong, Chumphon, Prachuap Khiri Khan and Phang-nga provinces.

- ❖ Kittisak Boriboonkaset, head of the public disaster prevention and mitigation office in Chumphon, said that no damage has been reported and the tremor was only lightly felt in some areas.
