## **Thai Enquirer News Summary**

### **Political News**

- The European Parliament has officially adopted a resolution condemning Thailand's deportation of Uyghur refugees to China and calling for an end to forced repatriations to countries where they may face persecution.

The resolution follows a debate on human rights and democracy in Thailand, specifically regarding the country's lèse majesté law (Article 112) and the treatment of Uyghur refugees.

- ❖ Members of the European Parliament urged the EU to use ongoing free trade agreement (FTA) negotiations with Thailand as leverage to push for legal reforms,

including amendments to Article 112, an end to the detention and deportation of Uyghur refugees, and Thailand's ratification of all core International Labour Organization (ILO) conventions.

- ❖ The resolution, passed on March 14, received 482 votes in favor, 57 against, and 68 abstentions. Additionally, the European Parliament called on the Thai government to allow the ILO access to all detained Uyghur individuals and to suspend its extradition treaty with China.

## Human rights breaches in Thailand, Sudan and Azerbaijan

On Thursday, the European Parliament adopted human rights resolutions on Thailand, Sudan and Azerbaijan.

### Violations of democratic principles and human rights in Thailand, notably the lese-majesty law and the deportation of Uyghur refugees

Parliament condemns the deportation of Uyghur refugees to China, and urges Thailand to halt any further forced returns to countries where peoples' lives are at risk. MEPs call on the Commission to leverage free trade agreement negotiations to press Thailand to reform the country's lese-majesty law, release political prisoners, halt the deportation of Uyghur refugees, and to ratify all core International Labour Organisation (ILO) conventions.

MEPs appeal to the Thai government to grant the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) unrestricted access to all detained Uyghur asylum seekers and provide transparent information on their status. They want Thailand to strengthen its institutions in line with human rights standards and to grant amnesty to all parliamentarians and activists persecuted or imprisoned under repressive laws, including through convictions for lese-

- The opposition met with the House Speaker and agreed in principle to remove the name of former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra from its censure motion. However, the opposition stated that the final wording of the motion would depend on whether the government agreed to its demand for 30 hours to question Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra during the censure debate.
  - ❖ Natthaphong said that the opposition would use other words to refer to Thaksin indirectly during the debate. "I believe Thaksin is still a public figure. If he wants to explain himself, the media is ready to give him attention. There is no need for him to explain in parliament," he added.
  - ❖ Earlier, House Speaker Wan Muhamad Noor Matha had refused to accept the censure motion unless the opposition removed Thaksin's name. The opposition argued that his name was included to highlight that Paetongtarn allowed her father to influence and dominate her role as prime minister.



- Yesterday, a meeting of the tripartite coordination committee was held to discuss the timeframe for the no-confidence debate. The opposition insisted on 30 hours for the debate, while the government side proposed a 20+10 format, allowing the opposition 20 hours and the government 10 hours. The debate is scheduled for March 24-25, with the vote to take place on March 26.
  - ❖ However, the committee will meet again on March 19 for further discussions, as each party needs to consult internally before finalizing their positions.



- After reports emerged that the opposition party would agree to withdraw former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra’s name from the no-confidence motion against Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra, following calls from various parties deeming it inappropriate—since the former prime minister would not have the opportunity to respond to the allegations during the parliamentary debate.
  - ❖ Prime Minister Paetongtarn appeared to be in a good mood. While walking from the Santi Maitri Building back to the Thai Khu Fah Building, she was heard humming a line from “Mai Chai Phuchai” (I am not the man) by DoobaDoo: “That man whom I secretly have a crush on.”
  - ❖ When asked by reporters if her good mood was due to the opposition agreeing to remove Thaksin Shinawatra’s name from the no-confidence motion, Prime Minister Paetongtarn responded, “There were reports about using the term ‘that man,’ in the motion. It just so happened that this song contains those words, so my

team and I were just playfully teasing each other. But I didn't want to sing out loud because I was afraid, I'd be off-key. That's all—nothing more to it.”



- At 08:30 PM on March 13, the Royal Gazette published an announcement from the Office of the Prime Minister regarding the latest military reshuffle, which involves the transfer and promotion of 306 officers across various divisions.
  - ❖ The reassignments include 83 officers from the Office of the Permanent Secretary for Defence, 49 from the Royal Thai Armed Forces, and 70 from the Royal Thai Army, while 64 officers from the Royal Thai Navy and 36 from the Royal Thai Air Force are also affected. Most of the appointments involve promotions for officers set to retire at the end of the year.
  - ❖ Among the notable appointments, Lt Gen Chaiyapruerk Duangprapat, a classmate of Army Chief Gen Pana Klaewplodthuk, has been promoted to Deputy Army Chief, positioning him for a potential future promotion to Army Chief in October. Meanwhile, Lt Gen Thitiphan Thanajaro, son of Gen Chettha Thanajaro, an advisor to the National Defence Studies Institute, has been appointed as the new Chief of the Army Training Command.



- The government needs to be very careful when appointing ministers after the Constitutional Court rejected the Cabinet's request to clarify qualifications for ministers, according to PM's Office Minister Chusak Sirinil. He suggested amending the charter to make qualification requirements clearer.
  - ❖ The request asked the court to decide whether the Prime Minister and Cabinet must follow specific qualifications when proposing individuals for royal appointment as

ministers. These qualifications include being honest and ethical, avoiding serious misconduct, and not having been sentenced to imprisonment unless it involves minor offenses or defamation.

- ❖ The court dismissed the request, saying it was only a consultation and not an actual issue related to the Prime Minister and Cabinet's duties and powers.



- A source from the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) revealed that on March 12, the NACC board reviewed a complaint filed by members of the Senate requesting an investigation into Justice Minister Pol Col Tawee Sodsong and Department of Special Investigation (DSI) Director-General Pol Lt Col Yutthana Praedam.
  - ❖ The complaint alleged that they abused their authority by classifying the alleged collusion in the Senate election as a special case under money laundering charges.
  - ❖ The matter was considered an urgent agenda item, and the board unanimously voted 7-0 to launch an investigation due to public interest.



## **Economic News**

- A source from the Ministry of Finance revealed that Tibordee Wattanakul, Director of the State Enterprise Policy Office (SEPO), is set to present a list of 19 publicly traded stocks currently held by the ministry to Deputy Prime Minister and Finance Minister Pichai Chunhavajira for consideration of divestment.



- ❖ The ministry no longer wishes to retain these shares. Since all are listed on the stock exchange, the decision does not require the cabinet approval and can be made at the discretion of the Finance Minister.
  - ❖ Lavaron Sangsnit, Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Finance, stated that SEPO has been instructed to select stocks from a total of 140 companies. These include shares in state enterprises, non-state enterprises, and stocks acquired through asset seizures in various legal cases.
- The Energy Policy and Planning Office (EPPO) is set to meet soon to review liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) prices before the current price freeze of 423 Baht per 15-kilogram (kg) cylinder will expire on March 31, 2025.
    - ❖ At present, the Oil Fuel Fund subsidizes retail LPG prices at 36.28 Baht per 15-kg cylinder. Previously, EPPO proposed gradually increasing the price by 1 Baht per kg to ease the fund's financial burden. The upcoming meeting will determine whether to extend the price freeze or restructure pricing. If subsidies are removed entirely, LPG prices would rise to 30.61 Baht per kg, bringing the actual retail price to 459.28 Baht per 15-kg cylinder.
    - ❖ The Oil Fuel Fund has been subsidizing LPG prices since April 2022, for nearly three years, with total expenditures reaching 46.185 billion Baht. The Oil Fuel Fund executive committee has set a maximum subsidy limit of 50 billion Baht, leaving only 3.815 billion Baht remaining.
    - ❖ As of March 9, 2025, the fund's financial status showed a deficit of 64.528 billion Baht.

- The consumer confidence index (CCI) dropped for the first time in five months last month amid worries about a slow economic recovery and the trade war, according to a survey conducted by the University of the Thai Chamber of Commerce (UTCC).
  - ❖ Thanavath Phonvichai, president of the UTCC, said the CCI for February was 57.8, down from 59 in January. This was the first time in five months the index decreased across all categories, he said. The decline was attributed to consumer concerns over the trade war ratcheted up by US President Donald Trump, leading to stock market corrections in Thailand and worldwide.
  - ❖ Consumers are also worried about the future, even though the Thai government has implemented economic stimulus measures, as they feel the economy is recovering slowly.

- Phatcharai Thaweewong, Director of Research and Communications at Colliers International Thailand, revealed that real estate transactions in 2024 have declined significantly. According to data from the Bank of Thailand (BoT), total land and property transactions nationwide during the first 10 months of the year amounted to 582.47 billion Baht, marking a 25.27% drop, which was the lowest in 15 years, due to the ongoing economic slowdown.
  - ❖ However, land transactions are still active, particularly in areas surrounding central business districts and along mass transit extension routes. Major developers

continue to focus on prime locations, with some plots in prime areas now being offered at prices exceeding 4 million Baht per square wah.

- The Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index closed yesterday at 1,159.64 points, down 0.42 points (-0.04%), with a trading value of approximately 32.46 billion Baht.
  - ❖ The index hit its lowest level in five years, falling below 1,160 points, amid light trading volume due to the lack of significant positive factors. Domestic factors, in particular, remain weak. Although the launch of the Thai ESGX fund provided some support, it is only short-term.



- ❖ Externally, the index continued to be pressured by ongoing uncertainty surrounding U.S. trade policies. Additionally, concerns about a potential U.S. recession remain after the latest inflation figures came in lower than expected.

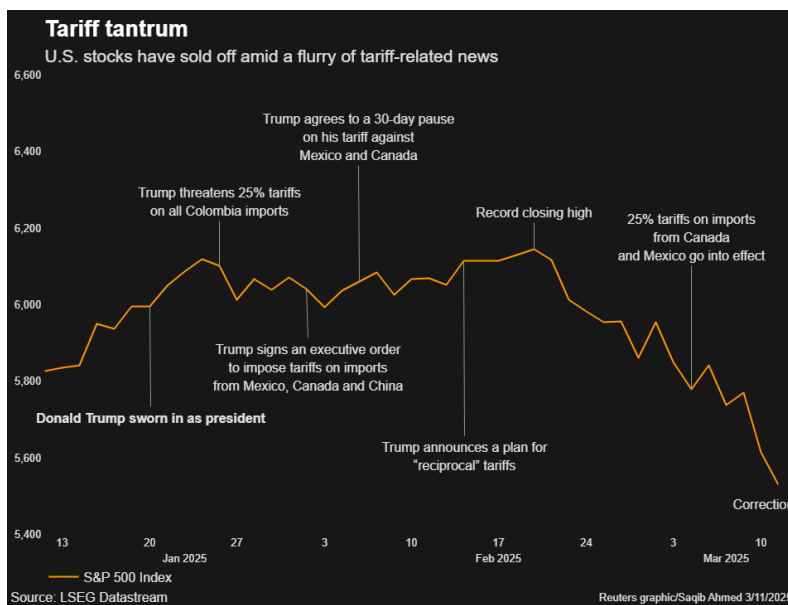

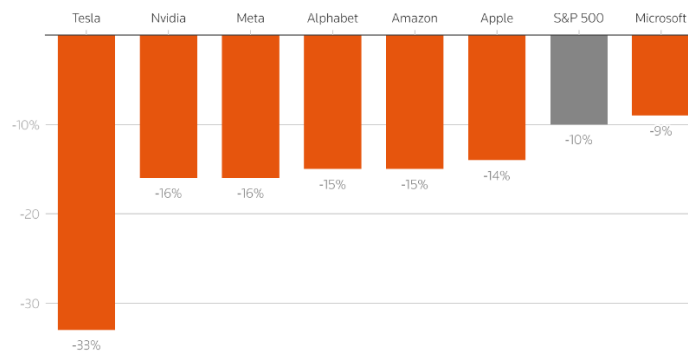
- The domestic equity market is likely to be impacted from the volatility in the global markets and the entering of the ‘correction’ phase by the US market amid US\$ 5 trillion in value being wiped out of the market.



- ❖ The sell off in the tech industry is likely to have a big impact on tech/chip related stocks, which have a relatively heavy weighting on the Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) as well.

#### Not so Magnificent Seven

The so-called 'Magnificent Seven' tech and growth stocks that led the market higher the past two years have mostly fallen more than the broader market since the S&P 500 peaked in February.

- Global Markets continue to roil in the ‘Tarriff War’ and this has sent the prices of precious metals such as GOLD reaching a new all-time high.



- Domestically gold prices fluctuated 9 times yesterday, surging by 300 Baht from the previous day. In the domestic market, gold bars were bought at 46,900 Baht and sold at 47,000 Baht, while gold ornaments were purchased at 46,056.08 Baht and sold at 47,800 Baht. Meanwhile, the gold spot price stood at \$2,988.50 per ounce.
  - ❖ Gold prices continued to rise amid concerns over trade tensions following U.S. President Donald Trump’s decision to impose a 25% tariff on steel and aluminum. In response, Canada and the European Union (EU) retaliated with tariffs on U.S. imports.

## General News

- Deputy Finance Minister Paopoom Rojanasakul provided an update on the progress of the Retirement Lottery project. The draft law has been reviewed and approved by the Council of State and is expected to be considered by Parliament within March.
  - ❖ The plan involves issuing digital scratch-off lottery tickets priced at 50 Baht each, with a total of 5 million tickets per draw. The lottery will be available to all Thai citizens aged 15 and above, with a purchase limit of 3,000 Baht per month. Draws will take place every Friday, and winnings will be transferred instantly via the PromptPay system.
  - ❖ The prize structure includes five first-place prizes of 1 million Baht each, 10,000 second-place prizes of 1,000 Baht each, and one jackpot prize. Any unclaimed jackpot prizes will roll over to the next draw.
  - ❖ All ticket purchases will be treated as individual savings within the National Savings Fund, with the full amount returned to participants upon reaching the age of 60.
  - ❖ Paopoom estimated that the Retirement Lottery will require an annual budget of 760 million Baht, or 60 million Baht per month, while generating approximately 13 billion Baht in annual savings, with the amount expected to grow over time
