Thai Enquirer News Summary

Political News

- Today at 09:30 AM, a joint session of Parliament will be held to consider a motion requesting the Constitutional Court to rule on the proposed amendments to the Constitution.
 - ❖ If Parliament votes in favor, the matter will be sent to the Constitutional Court to determine whether a referendum is required for the amendments and how many times it should be held. If the Court agrees to review the case, Parliament must postpone further consideration of the amendment draft.

- ❖ Nanboonthida Somchai, an MP from Ubon Ratchathani and spokesperson for the Bhumjai Thai Party, stated that the party is ready to support the motion to refer the matter to the Constitutional Court to avoid any issues.
- ❖ Regarding the party's absence from the previous parliamentary session, she explained that the party believed at the time that it would conflict with a Constitutional Court ruling. However, the discussion on March 17 is not about amending the Constitution but rather about referring the matter for judicial interpretation.



- Sorawong Thienthong, the Minister of Tourism and Sports and Secretary-General of the Pheu Thai Party, announced that on Friday, March 21, Prime Minister Paetongtarn will arrange a dinner with coalition party leaders before the no-confidence debate begins.
 - ❖ Ruam Thai Sang Chart Party will host the event at the Rosewood Bangkok Hotel, and attendance will be limited to coalition party leaders only.
 - ❖ This follows a discussion at a similar dinner on February 25, where it was agreed to meet again once the debate date was set, in order to prepare for the opposition's motion.
- Sorawong Thienthong, the Minister of Tourism and Sports and Secretary-General of the Pheu Thai Party, also said that the government is ready to clarify the work of each ministry. However, if the debate touches on matters outside the government's scope, it will be considered a violation of the rules, and it will be the duty of MPs to protest to ensure the debate follows parliamentary procedures.
 - ❖ Regarding the time allocated for the no-confidence debate, the opposition initially requested 30 hours, but the government proposed 7 hours for itself and 23 hours for

the opposition. The opposition has yet to agree. The 3-party whip will meet on March 19 to discuss the matter further.



- Thai officials, including 2 ministers, will visit Xinjiang from March 18-20 to check on the Uyghur refugees they deported.
 - ❖ The 25-member delegation includes Deputy Prime Minister Phumtham Wechayachai, Justice Minister Tawe Sodsong, and NSC Secretary-General Chatchai Bangchud, who were involved in the deportation. Also joining the group are Deputy Police Chief Pol. Gen. Kraiboon Suadsong.
 - ❖ The delegation will arrive in Kashi, southwestern Xinjiang, on March 19. They will visit the Uyghur community and meet local leaders. On March 20, they will visit the Law Enforcement and Case Management Center and the Id Kah Mosque, where they will discuss with religious leaders and have dinner with them.
 - ❖ The visit aims to demonstrate that the Thai government handled the deportation transparently, in accordance with its agreement with China. The Thai government spent months reviewing the situation to ensure the Uyghurs' safety and that the deportation complied with human rights standards. The Thai government plans to conduct regular visits to address international concerns and clarify its approach.



- Over the weekend, the US announced a new visa restriction policy against Thai officials over the deportation of Uyghur refugees to China.
 - ❖ US Secretary of State Marco Rubio said the policy targets current or former government officials involved in sending Uyghurs or other ethnic or religious

groups with protection concerns back to China. The US is committed to stopping China's efforts to pressure governments to send Uyghurs and other groups back to China, where they face torture and forced disappearances.



- Freedom House downgraded Thailand's ranking from "partly free" to "not free," placing it alongside China.
 - ❖ The nonprofit organization, based in Washington, D.C., stated that Thailand's status worsened because the Constitutional Court dissolved the leading opposition party and authorities repatriated activists, refugees, and asylum seekers to countries where they faced harm.
 - ❖ After five years of direct military rule, Thailand transitioned to a military-dominated, semi-elected government in 2019. Protests for further democratic reform in 2020 and 2021 led to repressive tactics, including arbitrary arrests, intimidation, lèse-majesté charges, and harassment.
 - ❖ While the 2023 elections were relatively open, the military-appointed Senate blocked the Move Forward Party from forming a government and later dissolved it. The second-largest opposition group, the Pheu Thai Party (PTP), joined a coalition government with military-aligned parties. However, its initial prime minister was removed by the Constitutional Court over an ethics violation, showing the ongoing power of unelected institutions.



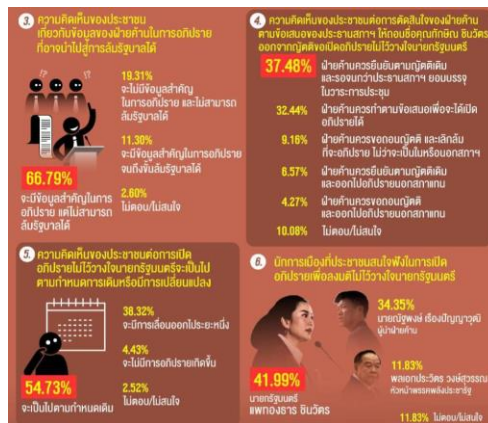
- Chaiyong Maneerungsakul, a member of the Senate, revealed that over the past 3 months, 5 military officers in Bannang Sata district, Yala province, have been severely injured or killed by snipers from the BRN armed group.
 - ❖ He expressed concern that if the Internal Security Operations Command (ISOC) in the southern region does not take action to protect officers, it could pose a danger to high-ranking personnel. He has called for the use of drones to assist in patrolling military village routes and providing security for local defense units.
 - ❖ Sources have reported that Abdulmana U-seng, a BRN operative, has smuggled a number of improvised explosive devices into Narathiwat province with plans for bomb attacks targeting entertainment venues, government buildings, and weakly defended administrative outposts. The attacks are expected to occur within the final 15 days of Ramadan.



- Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra topped the list of politicians from whom respondents want to hear in the upcoming no-confidence debate, followed by opposition leader Natthaphong Ruengpanyawut who is the leader of People's Party, and Palang Pracharath leader Prawit Wongsuwan.
 - ❖ NIDA Poll stated that 41% of respondents want to hear the prime minister speak, while 34.35% were interested in Natthaphong, leader of the People's Party, and 11.83% in Prawit. Meanwhile, 66.79% believe that the opposition will present important information, but will not be able bring down the government. Another 19.31% feel that the opposition lacks strong enough arguments to succeed in the motion, while 11.30% believe the opposition will prevail.
 - ❖ Asked whether they think there would be turmoil during the debate? 49.08% said some turmoil, 26.26% No turmoil at all and 24.66% said a lot of turmoil.

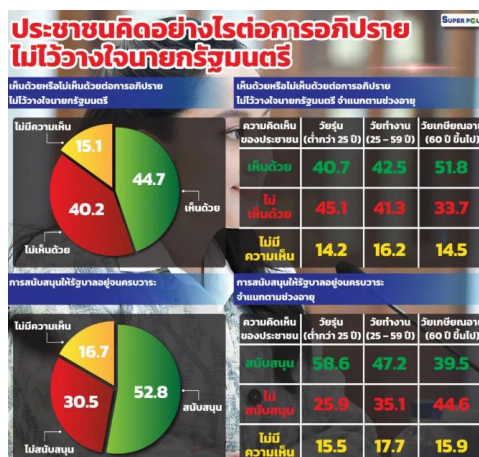


❖ Regarding the opposition’s decision to remove former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra’s name from the censure motion, at the request of the House Speaker, 37.48% disagreed, saying the opposition should have stuck to the original plan, while 32.44% agreed, arguing that the no-confidence debate would not have taken place otherwise.



• The Super Poll Research Center released a survey on public opinions regarding the no-confidence debate against Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra. The results show that 44.7% of respondents support the no-confidence debate, while 40.2% oppose it.

❖ When asked about support for the government to complete its term, more than half, or 52.8%, expressed support, while 30.5% disagreed.



- Yesterday, former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra presided over the royal cremation ceremony for Potjanee Na Pombejra, the mother of Khunying Potjaman Damapong. The ceremony was attended by members of the Shinawatra and Damapong families, along with several prominent political figures.



Economic News

- Deputy Prime Minister and Finance Minister Pichai Chunhavajira stated that on March 18, the Thai Bankers' Association committee will hold a joint meeting, which he will attend to listen and discuss various issues.
 - ❖ Topics include liquidity in the financial system, debt management, and loan-to-value (LTV) measures. The meeting is also expected to address interest rates, as commercial banks have yet to lower their rates despite the Bank of Thailand reducing the policy rate to 2.00% per year.

“I’ll be there to greet everyone and listen in. If the discussion moves to a confidential matter, I’ll step out of the room,” he said.
 - ❖ Regarding real estate stimulus measures, Pichai said he would push for an extension of the transfer and mortgage fee reduction to 0.01%, which expired on December 31, 2024.

- ❖ He also aims to accelerate the relaxation of LTV rules, stating that this needed coordination between commercial banks and the Bank of Thailand.



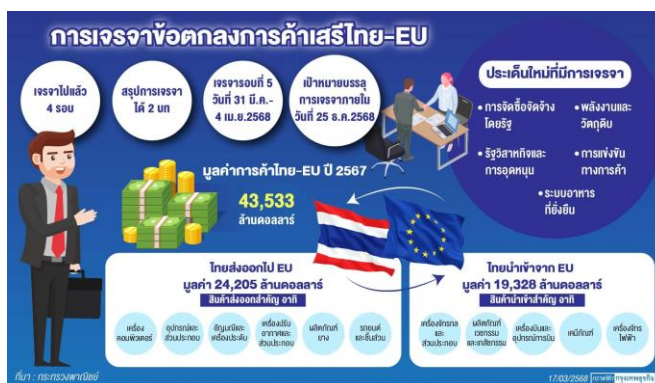
- Former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra pushed for lowering electricity costs to 2.5 Baht to attract foreign investment in datacenters, AI, and cloud systems.
 - ❖ He said Thailand has the potential to become a hub for blockchain and cryptocurrency, with plans underway to create a sandbox in Phuket for cryptocurrency transactions, including stablecoins linked to government bonds. Progress is expected within three months. Clean energy is essential to attract investors, and reducing electricity costs from the current 4.12 Baht to 2.5 Baht is necessary to stay competitive in the low-cost clean energy market.
 - ❖ He is also exploring ways to integrate AI in Thailand, such as using it to assist doctors in district hospitals with diagnosis and assessment. Thaksin stressed that Thailand must start adopting new technologies now to avoid falling behind. He also wants to see the establishment of a data safe zone in Bangkok, known as a Digital Embassy, to gather datacenters from various countries within the next 12 months.



- Aat Pisanwanich, an expert in international economics, assessed that the European Parliament's stance on human rights, labor, and environmental issues could delay negotiations on the Free Trade Agreement (FTA) between Thailand and the EU.
 - ❖ He stated that Thailand must clarify its position, particularly on the issue of Uyghur refugees, to prove that it does not violate human rights. Compared to Vietnam,

which signed the EU-Vietnam FTA without human rights and labor concerns, Thailand is expected to be 4-5 years behind in reaching an agreement.

- ❖ Furthermore, during the 5th round of FTA negotiations between March 31 and April 4, human rights issues are likely to be discussed in greater detail. If Thailand does not address these concerns, the negotiation process for the FTA could become more challenging.



- On Friday, March 14, the Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index closed at 1,173.76 points, up 14.12 points (+1.22%), with a trading value of 38.6 billion Baht.



- ❖ The market saw a strong rebound, supported by Global Play stocks, particularly in the petrochemical sector, including SCC, PTTGC, and SCGP. Investors were optimistic that the Chinese government would announce economic stimulus measures this week. Additionally, petrochemical stocks had previously declined significantly, making their valuations more attractive and drawing speculative buying. The positive movement in Dow Jones' futures and the strengthening of the Baht also contributed to the market's gains.

- ❖ The Thai stock market had been on a downward trend in recent weeks, but the clearer outlook on the establishment of the Thai ESGX fund, which is expected to bring in new capital, encouraged investors to return.
- ❖ Looking ahead, the market is expected to move within a limited range this week as investors await the U.S. Federal Reserve's meeting on March 18-19, where interest rates are expected to remain unchanged. The SET index is projected to have support at 1,160 points and resistance at 1,185 points.

- Sunhavut Thamchuanviriyaya, Group CEO of Millennium Group Corporation (Asia) Plc (MGC), announced that the company's board has approved a share repurchase plan under the treasury stock program.
 - ❖ The plan allows MGC to buy back up to 30 million shares, with a par value of 0.50 Baht per share, representing 2.7% of total outstanding shares. The total buyback budget is capped at 100 million Baht, and the program will run for 6 months from March 18 to September 17, 2025.
 - ❖ The move aims to boost investor confidence as MGC's stock price is currently below its book value. Looking ahead, the company expects its total revenue to grow by 10% in 2025, compared to 20.33 billion Baht in 2024.

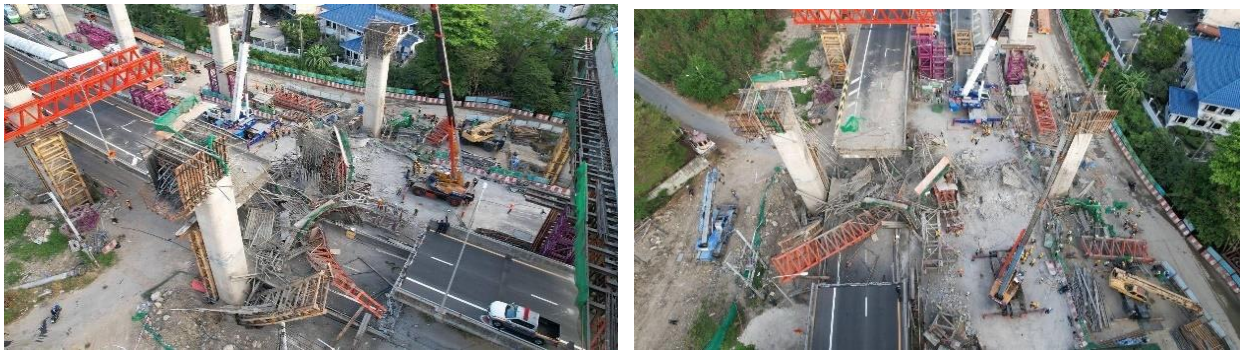
General News

- At 10:00 AM today, Prime Minister Paetongtarn will hold a meeting at the Government House with relevant agencies to discuss the collapse of the under-construction bridge on the Rama 2 - Dao Khanong - Bangkok Outer Western Ring Road expressway project.



- ❖ The incident, which occurred on Rama 2 Road, resulted in multiple deaths, injuries, and missing people.
 - ❖ Surachet Laophulsuk, Governor of the Expressway Authority of Thailand (EXAT), stated that the exact cause of the collapse has yet to be determined. However, an initial assessment suggests that the structure may have failed under the weight of the concrete.
 - ❖ He stated, “Resigning from responsibility does not bring the dead back to life”.
 - ❖ A team of experts will conduct an investigation, with conclusions expected within 20 days after the site is cleared. If negligence or wrongdoing is found, legal actions will be taken.
- The death toll from the collapsed concrete beam of an under-construction expressway bridge near Rama II Road in Bangkok's Chom Thong District has risen to 6. A Myanmar worker also died from injuries while receiving treatment at Taksin Hospital. The six victims include three Thais—an engineer and two workers—and three Myanmar workers.

- ❖ Transport Minister Suriya Jungrungreangkit ordered The Expressway Authority of Thailand (EXAT) Governor Surachet Laophulsuk to form a committee to investigate the cause of the accident and establish safety measures to prevent future incidents.
- ❖ Discussions with the Comptroller General's Department are ongoing to finalize measures by April 2025. Contractors found responsible for violations will be immediately suspended and banned from bidding on future projects. Similar penalties for supervisors will also be considered.
- ❖ Suriya assured that all construction projects along Rama 2 Road are expected to be completed before the end of 2025 to improve travel convenience.

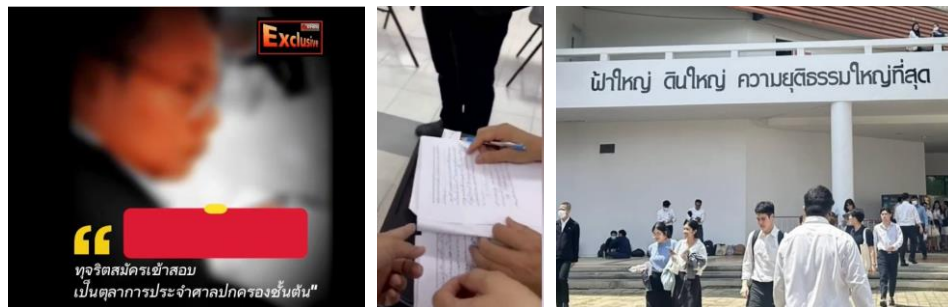


- The accident, the 1st major one in 2025 (after 5 major accidents in 2024), has pushed the closure of the expressway from Dao Khanong onwards into the city and vice-versa.
- ❖ The Bangkok inbound expressway is closed for 7-days and the outbound is expected to be closed for 1-month (or even more) as a major section of the outbound expressway has collapsed after the incident.



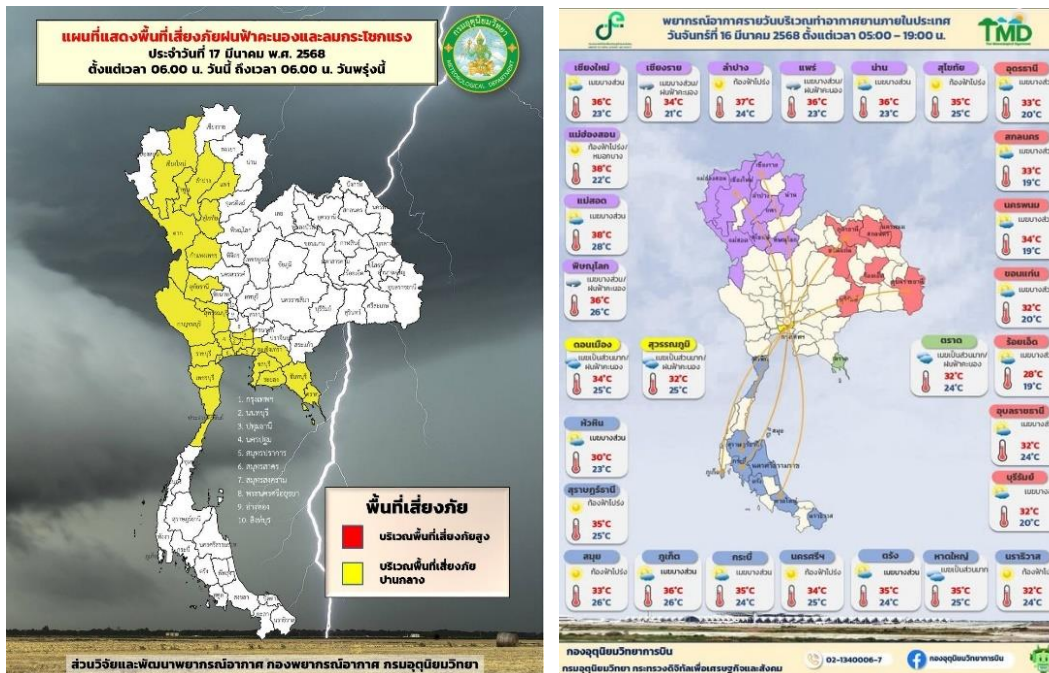
- Yesterday, a video went viral online showing a police officer with the rank of Police Colonel being caught bringing cheat sheets into an Administrative Court judge examination on March 15 at Thammasat University, Rangsit campus. The incident sparked widespread criticism on social media.

- ❖ Meanwhile, recent reports indicate that the officer has filed a complaint, alleging that the exam proctor assaulted him.



- The Meteorological Department forecast that today, temperatures in upper Thailand will drop by 5°C. Bangkok will experience a 30% chance of rain.

- ❖ From March 16 to 20, the weather will be unstable. In the northeastern region, temperatures will drop by 5-8°C, while other regions will see a decrease of 2-4°C. This is expected to be a cold snap out of season.
