## **Thai Enquirer News Summary**

### **Economic News**

- Yesterday, Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra convened a meeting with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), the Stock Exchange of Thailand, and the Department of Special Investigation (DSI) to discuss the current stock market situation and accelerate measures to restore investor confidence.
  - ❖ The meeting also reviewed high-impact cases, such as the STARK stock scandal. The government aims to tighten regulations, improve oversight of free float shares, and enforce stricter penalties, including delisting companies that break the regulations from the stock exchange.

- ❖ SEC Secretary-General Pornanong Busaratrakul stated that since the beginning of 2025, the SEC has taken legal action in 15 cases involving 40 offenders. Additionally, the commission is revising disclosure regulations for listed company executives, particularly regarding the use of shares as collateral in financial transactions.



- Bloomberg reported that Thailand’s stock market support campaign through the Vayupak Fund is failing. Over the past seven months, despite raising 150 billion baht (approximately \$4.5 billion), the fund has provided only minimal support to the SET index, which has already dropped over 16% this year.
  - ❖ This decline makes it the worst-performing index in the world among the 92 tracked by Bloomberg. In the past 12 months, foreign investors have withdrawn \$4.2 billion (around 140 billion baht) from the Thai stock market—the largest outflow in Southeast Asia.
  - ❖ Factors driving this downturn include concerns over the government’s ability to stimulate the economy, high household debt, political uncertainty, and corporate scandals involving listed companies.

### World’s Biggest Stock Rout Deepens as Thai Market Rescue Falters

An ambitious campaign to revive Thailand’s battered stock market is falling flat, as entrenched pessimism about the economy accelerates a foreign funds exodus.

Seven months after \$4.5 billion was newly injected into the Vayupak Fund, analysts have been left perplexed by how little it’s helped the benchmark SET Index. The stock gauge has tumbled more than 16% this year, making it the world’s worst performer among 92 indexes tracked by Bloomberg. Over the past 12 months, foreigners pulled out \$4.2 billion, the most across Southeast Asia.

- Reports indicated that five major IPOs have decided to postpone their fundraising plans on the Thai stock market. This comes as the Thai stock index has dropped over 16.17% since the beginning of 2025, with no clear signs of recovery despite government efforts to introduce supportive measures. The companies that have withdrawn their IPO plans include:

- Big C Retail Corporation Plc (BRC) – a subsidiary of Berli Jucker Plc (BJC) under the conglomerate of Charoen Sirivadhanabhakdi.
- SCG Chemicals Plc (SCGC) – a subsidiary of The Siam Cement Plc (SCC).
- CPF Global Food Solution Plc (CPFGS) – a subsidiary of Charoen Pokphand Foods Plc (CPF) under the business empire of Dhanin Chearavanont.
- WHA Industrial Development Plc (WHAID) – a subsidiary of WHA Corporation Plc (WHA).
- Boonthavorn Retail Corporation Plc (BOON) – part of the Boonthavorn Group.



- At today's Cabinet meeting, the Ministry of Finance will propose a draft ministerial regulation outlining the criteria for calculating the value of assets subject to inheritance tax. The review aims to update the inheritance tax law, which has been in effect for over a decade. To date, the tax has generated 4 billion baht in revenue.
  - ❖ Additionally, the ministry will present measures to address farmers' debt issues.
- Former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra proposed that the state buy all the people's debt from the banking system and allow them to repay it gradually. This would give debtors a

chance to start fresh, removing their names from the credit bureau. This plan wouldn't require government funds, as private investors could step in.

- ❖ Thaksin also said he returned to Thailand thanks to His Majesty's mercy, emphasizing that his life is now dedicated to the monarch for allowing him to reunite with his family and the people.
- ❖ He expressed his desire to work for the country and help make the nation prosper under the reign of King Rama X. Thaksin believes that for this to happen, the people must work together to strengthen politics and govern with wisdom and fairness. He added that if the country prospers, future generations will enjoy a better life, and this could start by alleviating household debts, hence his idea of buying back their debts.



- The Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index closed at 1,170.12 points yesterday, down 3.64 points (-0.31%), with a trading value of 35.90 billion baht.
- ❖ The index traded within a narrow range in negative territory for most of the session, as investors awaited the outcomes of key central bank meetings, including the U.S. Federal Reserve (Fed), the Bank of Japan (BOJ), and the Bank of England (BoE). These banks are expected to assess the economic impact of policies under U.S. President Donald Trump before making any major decisions. Meanwhile, profit-taking was seen in China Play stocks following their gains last week.

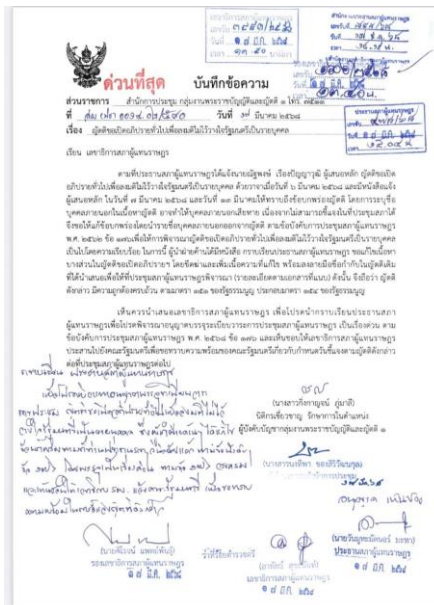
- ❖ For today's outlook, the market is expected to remain range-bound. Domestically, investors are watching Thailand's export figures, which remain strong in the short term but face risks from ongoing trade tensions. The support level is projected at 1,160 points, with resistance at 1,185 points.

- Sansiri Plc is set to launch a super-luxury condominium project under the "Billionaires' Row" concept, offering panoramic views of Bangkok from a prime location opposite Lumpini Park. Situated in the Sarasin area, at the intersection of Witthayu, Lang Suan, and Ratchadamri roads, the development will include both a residential tower and an office building.
    - ❖ Sansiri acquired the land in 2020 at a record-breaking price of 3.9 million baht per square wah, making it the most expensive land transaction in Thailand. This surpasses the previous record set by SC Asset Corporation, which won a 2-rai land auction in Soi Lang Suan for 3.1 million baht per square wah in 2018.
    - ❖ The selling price for the new project will be announced soon, with completion and ownership transfers expected in 2029.
    - ❖ Real estate analysts note that land prices in Bangkok's central business district, including the Sarasin area, have surged by 400% over the past decade.

**Political News**

- House Speaker Wan Muhamad Noor Matha announced that opposition leader Natthaphong Ruengpanyawut, a party-list MP and leader of the People's Party, has submitted a no-confidence motion against Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra. The motion was revised to remove former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra’s name, replacing it with the term “a family member.”
  - ❖ After reviewing the motion, the House Speaker confirmed that it complied with parliamentary regulations and ordered it to be included in the meeting agenda. The matter will now be coordinated with the Cabinet.
  - ❖ As for the debate schedule, the initial plan remains unchanged, with the parliamentary session set to begin at 9:00 AM on March 24. The time allocation for each side’s debate will be determined through discussions among the three-party whips on March 19.



- The opposition revised the no-confidence motion, changing references to former prime minister Thaksin Shinawatra from "father" of the prime minister and his name to "a family member."

โดยพวกรัฐสภาเห็นว่า นางสาวแพทองธาร ชินวัตร เป็นผู้ผิดการณ์อันไม่อาจไว้วางใจให้บริหารราชการแผ่นดินในฐานะนายกรัฐมนตรีได้เสียตั้งแต่เมื่อแรกเข้าดำรงตำแหน่งนายกรัฐมนตรี และมีความประพฤติที่ไม่เหมาะสมในการดำรงตำแหน่งผู้นำฝ่ายบริหารด้วยประการทั้งปวง ทั้งขาดภาวะผู้นำ ขาดวุฒิภาวะ ขาดความรู้ความสามารถ และขาดเจตจำนงในการบริหารราชการแผ่นดินที่จะแก้ปัญหาให้แก่ประเทศไทยและประชาชน ส่งผลให้ทำลายภาพลักษณ์และความเชื่อมั่นของประเทศชาติ จึงขอลอยตัวอยู่นอกรัฐสภาและไม่มีความรับผิดชอบต่อตำแหน่งหน้าที่เพียงเพราะเห็นแก่ผลประโยชน์ของตนเอง ครอบครัว และพวกพ้องเป็นสำคัญ อยู่เบื้องหลังนโยบายของส่วนรวม

- Yesterday the main opposition People's Party launched a campaign , ahead of the censure debate in parliament next week, accusing major political figures of selling out the country for their own benefit. The campaign, called “Deal Laek Prathet” (Trading deals with the country), alleges that powerful figures make trade-offs for political deals at the expense of the Thai people, who are suffering significant losses.

- ❖ One of the “deals” it mentioned alleges that “someone” was allowed to return home, apparently referring to former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra, who came back after nearly two decades of self-imposed exile. The party also questions the extent of the damage caused to Thailand by the deal to make Paetongtarn, Thaksin’s daughter, prime minister. It also criticised Paetongtarn and the Pheu Thai Party for failing to deliver on many of their campaign promises, including the digital wallet scheme.
- ❖ On its Facebook page, the party posted an illustration of Paetongtarn sitting on the debris of the Democracy Monument. She extends her hand towards a man holding puppet strings. Behind him are piles of money and a set of unbalanced scales.
- ❖ Meanwhile The Pheu Thai Party's official social media page posted a response urging the People’s Party not to go off track from the debate. Instead, it called on them to focus on the government's performance review.



- Yesterday in Phitsanulok, former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra addressed a gathering of Red Shirt supporters. During his speech, he commented on the no-confidence debate, stating that it was originally intended to target only the Prime Minister but was later expanded to include him.
  - ❖ He noted that the opposition's first plan was to name him directly, which would have violated parliamentary rules. However, after he pointed out that his current position is referred to as "S.T.R.," the opposition adopted that term instead.
  - ❖ Thaksin further remarked that while some may interpret "S.T.R." as meddling in everything, his supporters should see it as standing for "Sut Tee Rak" (Most Beloved). He added that he wishes to serve the people and is willing to be involved in everything, as long as it benefits the country.



- The joint parliamentary session voted 304-150 with one abstention to seek a Constitutional Court ruling on whether parliament has the authority to amend Section 256 of the constitution to establish a Charter Drafting Assembly to rewrite the junta-drafted constitution.





- ❖ The 304 votes came entirely from the ruling coalition parties, along with 32 votes from independent senators. Additionally, three votes in favor came from MPs of the opposition Thai Sang Thai Party. On the opposing side, 150 votes against the motion were cast by MPs from the People’s Party, the Fair Party, and 12 senators from the "New Breed" group. Meanwhile, there were 124 abstentions, with 120 of them coming from senators in the "Blue Group."
- ❖ If the court decides a referendum is required before debating the amendment, there will be three referendums for the charter rewriting, further delaying the process. If the court decides it is not required, only two referendums will be needed, making it possible to begin and potentially complete the rewriting before the next general election in 2027.
- The joint parliamentary session voted 415-163 with 12 abstentions to reject the main opposition People's Party bill aimed at transferring corruption cases against military officers to the Central Criminal Court for Corruption and Misconduct Cases.
  - ❖ The bill, introduced by People’s Party MP Wiroj Lakkhanaadisorn, proposed revising the organic law on corruption prevention and suppression as part of the party’s initiative to overhaul and limit military power. It aimed to transfer corruption cases currently under the jurisdiction of the military court to the aforementioned court.
  - ❖ Most MPs from the ruling Pheu Thai Party opposed the bill, with only Nan MP Cholnan Srikaew supporting it. The majority of Bhumjaithai Party MPs also voted against the bill, except for Nakhon Phanom MP Alongkot Maneekart, who voted in favor. Most coalition partners and senators also opposed the bill.
- Banyong Pongpanich, Chairman of Kiatnakin Phatra Financial Group, posted a photo of former Prime Ministers Srettha Thavisin and Abhisit Vejjajiva attending the Carabao Cup final between Newcastle and Liverpool at Wembley Stadium in London, UK.
  - ❖ Srettha is a Liverpool supporter, while Abhisit supports Newcastle.



## General News

- Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra met with relevant agencies to discuss the construction of the elevated road on Rama 2 Road and find out why recurring accidents are happening, which has raised safety concerns during construction and in the future.
  - ❖ She said these incidents have affected road users and residents nearby and have made traffic problems worse due to ongoing accidents. The government is taking this issue seriously and is working to address it urgently, including legal action and compensation. Clear and immediate measures are needed. She instructed agencies to thoroughly investigate the matter, inspect all contractors, both main and subcontractors, and proceed with civil lawsuits. The project's consultants must also be checked, and criminal proceedings must follow legal procedures.
  - ❖ She noted that Transport Minister Suriya Juangroongruangkit previously said the construction of the Rama 2 Bridge must be completed. However people's safety is more important and such incidents must never happen again.



- Worawut Hiranyapaisansakul, Secretary of Italian-Thai Development Plc (ITD), submitted a report to the Stock Exchange of Thailand addressing the collapse of a concrete beam at the Rama III-Dao Khanong-Bangkok Outer Western Ring Road expressway project.
  - ❖ As a representative of the ITD-VCB joint venture, the company confirmed its commitment to providing compensation to the victims. The project is covered by insurance, including 7.359 billion baht for construction work, 100 million baht for the expressway authority's property, and 100 million baht for third-party liability. ITD assured that the incident would not impact the project's construction progress.
  - ❖ Yesterday, ITD shares closed at 0.28 baht, down 0.01 baht (-3.45%).
