Thai Enquirer News Summary

Political News

- The no-confidence debate is set for March 24–25, with the opposition given 28 hours and the government 7 hours.

- ❖ Pakornwut Udompipatskul, Deputy Leader of the People's Party and opposition chief whip, announced that the no-confidence debate will begin at 08:00 on March 24. The opposition will have 28 hours, the government and coalition parties 7 hours, and the meeting chair 2 hours for their respective speeches.
- ❖ The debate is set to run until 23:30 on March 25, with the vote scheduled for March 26. A key condition agreed upon by all parties is that if the opposition has not used their full time by the end of March 25, they will be allowed to extend their speeches past midnight, which may delay the vote until March 27. The government has assured there will be no unnecessary protests, and all parties will limit disruptions to ensure a smooth debate.



- Deputy Transport Minister Manaporn Charoensri added that government protests will be limited to one hour per day, with 5 hours set aside for the Prime Minister and ministers to respond. The opposition has been instructed to focus directly on the Prime Minister's performance and avoid discussing external individuals unless necessary.
 - ❖ The opposition will use 17 hours on March 24 and 11 hours on March 25, totaling 28 hours. The vote will take place at 10:00 on March 26. If the opposition does not finish using their allotted time, the chair has promised to allow them to complete it, which all parties have agreed to. When asked if the debate would continue until 05:00 on March 25, Manaporn said it would depend on how the debate is managed by both sides.
- Meanwhile Sirikanya Tansakul commented on the upcoming no-confidence debate, stating that the latest schedule requires discussions to run from 8:00 AM until 5:30 AM the following day. She noted that while this timing might reduce interruptions from MP objections, it also means the public may miss the live broadcast since few people would be watching TV at that hour.
 - ❖ "We've compromised so much that I don't know how we could possibly step back any further. Debating until 5:30 AM? I'm honestly frustrated with whoever negotiated this schedule. How did we end up with this? We'll need to bring tents,

blankets, mosquito nets, and pillows because the parliament is full of mosquitoes. Might as well bring pajamas and prepare for an overnight stay," Sirikanya remarked.



- Yesterday, Pintongta Shinawatra Kunakornwong, daughter of former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra, posted a photo on her personal Instagram account, @aimpintongta. The image showed Thaksin paying respects to Phra Kruba Boonchum Yannasampanno.
 - ❖ Reports indicated that on March 18, Thaksin traveled to the residence of a prominent individual in Bangkok.



- The government said Chinese authorities did not ask to review Thai media photos or content regarding the Uyghur refugees deported from Thailand to China. They only requested that their faces be blurred to protect their privacy.
 - ❖ Thai media members accompanied the Thai delegation to Xinjiang to verify the well-being of the Uyghur refugees and confirm the Thai and Chinese governments' claims that the refugees will be safe and will not face persecution, prosecution, or repression.



- ❖ Defense Minister Phumtham said Thailand had to follow legal procedures since the man was arrested for illegal entry, resulting in 11 years of detention. He apologized, explaining that no country had offered to resettle the refugees. Thai authorities accepted China’s assurances of safety for its citizens, making the return possible.
- ❖ The delegation visited Uyghur man’s home. The man said he was misled into traveling abroad 10 years ago. After arriving in Thailand, he realized he had been deceived and wanted to return home.



- Yesterday evening, an incident occurred in which an assailant riding a motorcycle threw a pipe bomb at a checkpoint in Taluban subdistrict, Sai Buri district, Pattani province. Fortunately, no officers were stationed at the checkpoint, so there were no injuries or fatalities.
- ❖ Authorities have since collected bomb fragments and other evidence to investigate and identify the perpetrators. It is believed that this attack was carried out by insurgent groups operating in the Sai Buri area, aiming to create unrest in the region.



Economic News

- At 10:30 AM today, Watergate Pavillion Co., Ltd. announced the schedule for a press conference to clarify the facts regarding the SKYY9 building (ICE Tower) issue. Phatthana Phromphat, an executive of Watergate Pavillion, will provide information at the main conference room of the Ratchada One building.



- ❖ According to the Agency for Real Estate Affairs (AREA) said that The SKYY9 building on Rama 9 Road, purchased by the Social Security Office (SSO) for 7 billion baht, has been valued at 3.5-3.6 billion baht.
- ❖ The SSO's investment in the building has raised concerns among MPs from the People's Party, who questioned why it was bought for approximately 7 billion baht when it was valued at around 3 billion baht during the COVID-19 pandemic.

They also questioned why the SSO, which lacks expertise in property development, would make such an investment. AREA's latest report appears to confirm the MPs' concerns regarding the building's price.

- Deputy Finance Minister Julapun Amornvivat addressed the idea of a government measure to purchase public debt from banks, stating that there are no concrete details yet. He noted that Deputy Prime Minister and Finance Minister Pichai Chunhavajira has been considering the initiative for a long time, and it is likely to materialize under the current administration.



- ❖ Meanwhile, Sirikanya Tansakun, a list MP and deputy leader of the People's Party, raised concerns about the scale of the debt purchase. She pointed out that former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra suggested acquiring all the debt. However, banks do not sell distressed debt to asset management companies at full value. If such a large sum is required, even pooling resources from various asset management firms would not be enough to cover the cost.
- ❖ She also questioned the claim that no government funds would be used, asking whose money would finance the initiative. Bond market fundraising has seen both successes and failures across different countries. Sirikanya urged the media to seek further clarification from Thaksin.



- Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra responded lightheartedly to the controversy surrounding her taking her children for a walk on the lawn in front of the Thai Khu Fah building while protesters gathered over the issue of the invasive black chin tilapia.

- ❖ Wiroj Lakkhanaadisorn, a list MP from the People’s Party, criticized the prime minister, suggesting she was oblivious to the problems faced by the public. In response, Paetongtarn gave a slight smile before clarifying that people are multifaceted. She stated that concerns over the black chin tilapia issue had already been discussed, and the Department of Fisheries had been instructed to take action.
- ❖ She stated that spending time with her children did not interfere with her duties, adding that on busier days, she sometimes could not see them just like any working parent. She encouraged everyone to take care of their health and manage their time wisely, as balancing work, family, and national responsibilities benefits all aspects of life.



- Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra on Wednesday urged Thais to wear “elephant pants” featuring distinctive patterns representing their provinces to celebrate the Songkran water festival. She made the call before chairing the first meeting of the National Soft Power Strategies Committee at Government House.



- ❖ The prime minister herself wore blue elephant pants from Kanchanaburi, which feature a pattern of Jullien’s golden carp.
- ❖ Meanwhile The government's soft power committee has allocated 183 million baht to organise the 2025 Maha Songkran World Water Festival, in line with the administration’s “Golden Year of Thai Tourism” vision. The celebration would

include parades, music concerts, an Electronic Dance Music festival, temple fair, and food fair.

- ❖ Sports and Tourism Minister Sorawong Thienthong said that the 2025 Maha Songkran World Water Festival, set to run from April 12-16 at Bangkok's Sanam Luang, is expected to generate at least 26.564 billion baht to Thailand from the anticipated 4.8 million visitors joining the event.
- The Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index closed yesterday at 1,189.66 points, up 13.49 points (+1.15%), with a trading value of 42.72 billion baht. The index rebounded strongly, supported by buying in blue-chip stocks, outperforming regional markets. This rally was particularly driven by Union Bank of Switzerland's decision to upgrade its investment outlook on the Thai stock market from "Neutral" to "Overweight."
 - ❖ In terms of valuation, the Thai market's price-to-earnings (P/E) ratio has declined to around 12 times, while the earnings yield gap has risen to 6%.
 - ❖ For today's outlook, the market is expected to trend sideways with an upward bias, with support at 1,155 points and resistance at 1,190 points, followed by the next resistance at 1,210 points.

- Union Bank of Switzerland (UBS) has upgraded its outlook on the Thai stock market from "Neutral" to "Overweight," marking its most positive stance in five years. The shift comes as selling pressure from policy-related factors and company-specific issues begins to ease, political uncertainties subside, and government stimulus measures, along with a recovery in the tourism sector, support long-term market growth.
 - ❖ At the same time, Thai stocks remain attractively priced, trading at lower levels compared to the COVID-19 crisis period. Key financial metrics, including return on equity (ROE) and return on invested capital (ROIC), are strong, with a promising growth outlook.
 - ❖ UBS has identified eight high-potential stocks, including AOT, CPALL, CRC, KBANK, KTB, PTTEP, PTTGC, and TRUE. Among them, AOT stands out with

the highest growth potential, offering an upside of up to 77% from its current price.

- On March 19, a total of three big lot transactions were recorded for shares of Bangkok Corporation Plc (BCP), amounting to 61 million shares with a total value of 2.3 billion baht. The average transaction price was 38 baht per share, representing a 1.33% premium over the market price.
 - The volume of these big lot transactions closely matches the 66.9 million BCP shares, equivalent to a 4.8612% stake, held by Capital Asia Investments Pte Ltd (CAI), a Singapore-based fund.
 - Yesterday, BCP shares closed at 37.50 baht, up 0.25 baht or 0.67%, with a total trading value of 2.44 billion baht.

- A review of Kasikornbank (KBANK)'s major shareholders list, following the latest book closure on March 13, revealed that Gulf Energy Development Plc (GULF) has become the fifth-largest shareholder. GULF holds 77 million KBANK shares, representing a 3.25% stake in the company's total voting rights.
 - If GULF retains these shares until the ex-dividend (XD) date on April 17, it will be entitled to receive a regular dividend of 8 baht per share for 2024, along with a

special dividend of 2.50 baht per share, totaling 10.50 baht per share. This would result in a dividend payout of approximately 808.50 million baht for GULF in the second quarter of 2025.

- ❖ Yupapin Wangwiwat, Deputy Chief Executive Officer and Chief Financial Officer of GULF, stated that the investment in KBANK is a general investment. She noted that KBANK is a highly liquid stock with low P/BV and P/E ratios and has maintained a consistent dividend payout since 2020. The company expects to receive approximately 808.5 million baht in dividends in Q2 2025.



- The U.S. Federal Reserve (Fed) recently announced that it will maintain the benchmark interest rate at 4.25%-4.50% and is expected to lower interest rates by 0.50 percentage points by the end of this year. Following the announcement by Fed Chairman Jerome Powell, gold prices surged to a new all-time high. The spot price of gold increased by 0.5%, reaching \$3,047.80 per ounce.
 - ❖ Yesterday Gold prices were highly volatile, with the Gold Traders Association adjusting prices 13 times throughout the day. By the market close, gold prices had risen by a total of 250 baht from the previous day.
 - ❖ For 96.5% gold jewelry, the buying price was 47,284.04 baht per baht-weight, while the selling price was 49,050.00 baht. Gold bars were bought at 48,150.00 baht and sold at 48,250.00 baht per baht-weight. Meanwhile, the gold spot price stood at \$3,029.50 per ounce.
 - ❖ Hua Seng Heng reported that gold prices continued to rise, surpassing \$3,000 and reaching an all-time high of \$3,038. The surge was driven by escalating trade wars and heightened tensions in the Middle East, prompting investors to buy gold as a safe-haven asset.

- The South Bangkok Criminal Court sentenced Kris Narongdej, board chairman of Raimon Land, to 3 years and 6 months in jail for embezzlement involving 35 million baht belonging to his younger brother, Nop.
 - ❖ The lawsuit, initiated by Nop, alleged that Kris, along with CBNP and its board members, engaged in embezzlement. Following their mother's death in 2016, Kris, Nop, and Korn Narongdej became co-owners of a property in Samut Prakan leased to third parties. Kris allegedly withheld Nop's rightful share of rental income despite repeated requests for inheritance distribution. Nop claimed that the defendants conspired to deprive him of payments exceeding 35 million baht. The court sentenced Kris to 44 months of imprisonment for 11 counts of wrongdoing, each carrying a four-month sentence. Kris was granted bail with a 400,000 baht bond.
 - ❖ Nop also filed a complaint with the Judicial Commission against a chief judge and deputy chief judge, alleging judicial misconduct, including a judge's repeated visits to Kris's residence. Despite a favorable ruling, over 3.4 billion baht in dividends remain frozen due to a temporary protection order.
 - ❖ Kris's lawyer, Picha Pomkai, argued that the matter was a family dispute and that the rental income was directed to the estate, not Kris's personal account. They intend to appeal the judgment.

General News

- The lower house voted 365-0 to pass a bill allowing advertising on alcohol products on its third reading. A key point in the draft is the amendment to Section 32 of the Alcohol Beverage Control Act, which banned the advertisement of alcoholic beverages, including the display of names or logos that promote their qualities or encourage consumption.
 - ❖ Pheu Thai list-MP Chanin Rungtanakiat Chanin Rungthankeerati, deputy chair of the committee reviewing the bill, highlighted that the previous enforcement of Section 32 had caused issues, particularly with the public being sued for taking photos with alcoholic product logos and small businesses being unable to promote their products, limiting their growth.
 - ❖ The amendment now allows small businesses and community-based alcohol producers to advertise or discuss their products. They may display product images, logos, ingredients, production methods, sources, or product features, following guidelines set by the committee. This change is expected to help promote community-based alcohol products and boost their international recognition.

Section 32. No person shall advertise or display, directly or indirectly, the name or trademark of any alcoholic beverage in a manner showing the properties thereof or inducing another person to drink.

Advertisements or public relations provided by the manufacturer of any kind of alcoholic beverage shall only be made for giving information thereof or giving social creative knowledge without displaying any illustration of such alcoholic beverage or its package, except for the display of a symbol of such alcoholic beverage or that of its manufacturer as prescribed by the Ministerial Regulation.

The provisions of paragraph one and paragraph two shall not apply to any advertisement broadcast from outside of the Kingdom.

- The Expressway Authority of Thailand (EXAT) announced that the entrance to the Dao Khanong toll plaza on the Chalerm Mahanakorn Expressway for vehicles heading into the city will open tomorrow at 06:00. However, the area will be closed daily from 21:00 to 05:00 for construction on the Rama 3 – Dao Khanong – Outer Ring Road Expressway (Western Bangkok) until the project is completed.
