Thai Enquirer News Summary

Political News

- Today at 6:00 PM at the Rosewood Hotel in Bangkok, Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra, as the leader of the Pheu Thai Party, will host a dinner with the leaders of the coalition parties. This special meeting comes ahead of the no-confidence debate scheduled to begin on March 24.
 - ❖ Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of the Interior Anutin Charnvirakul, as the leader of the Bhumjaithai Party, stated that the Prime Minister likely did not arrange the meeting only to prepare for the no-confidence debate. It is more of an opportunity for the coalition party leaders to meet regularly, to ensure effective cooperation and coordination.

- ❖ When asked whether the meeting would focus on ensuring unity in votes, he mentioned that all coalition parties were well aware of what needed to be done. The Bhumjaithai Party has already made it clear after having supported the government 50 times.



- Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra commented on the upcoming no-confidence debate, where the opposition is expected to question her for 28 hours, possibly extending until 5:30 AM. She joked that she will need energy drinks and said she might not last until 5:30 AM.
 - ❖ Regarding the opposition's focus on the alleged "deal to trade the country," she viewed it as an attempt to create drama. She urged the opposition to use reason rather than emotions and expressed confidence that the coalition parties will continue to support the government.
- Anusorn Iamsa-ard, a list MP from the Pheu Thai Party, stated that the upcoming no-confidence debate will not have MPs specifically assigned to defend the PM but will defend the meeting rules instead.
 - ❖ The team will be led by Prayut Siripanich, a list MP, along with Suthin Klangsaeng, a list MP, and Dr. Cholnan Srikaew, an MP from Nan of the Pheu Thai Party.



- Today, PM Paetongtarn will visit a checkpoint in Phayuha Khiri district, Nakhon Sawan, to monitor efforts in drug suppression. Nakhon Sawan is one of 25 provinces with severe drug problems.



- Meanwhile yesterday evening, former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra dined at his favorite restaurant, China Town Scala Shark Fins in Yaowarat, accompanied by Pheu Thai party-list MP Kokaew Pikulthong and a group of close business associates. During his visit, Thaksin took a stroll along Yaowarat Road, where many locals and tourists approached him for selfies. This marked his first visit to Yaowarat in 19 years.
 - ❖ On March 23, Thaksin is scheduled to attend the wedding celebration of Jakrapob Penkair, former Minister to the Prime Minister’s Office, and Supraipol Penkair at Hua Lamphong Railway Station in Bangkok, following their same-sex marriage registration on February 7.



- Justice For All, a US-based human rights organization, criticized the government for participating in a propaganda tour aimed at downplaying the realities faced by Uyghurs repatriated to China. The organization claims that the effort, led by the Chinese Communist Party (CCP), seeks to cover up genuine human rights concerns with scripted narratives and manipulated information.
 - ❖ They said the Thai delegation, led by Deputy Prime Minister Phumtham Wechayachai and Justice Minister Tawee Sodsong, along with a group of journalists, was promoted as an assurance of the well-being of repatriated Uyghurs.

However, Justice For All insists that the visit was a staged effort to obscure the ongoing persecution faced by Uyghurs under the Chinese regime.

- ❖ According to Justice For All, the Thai government's participation in the tour amplifies CCP propaganda rather than supporting truth and human rights. The organization criticized the tour as an insult to the countless Uyghurs who have disappeared, been imprisoned, or tortured after being forcibly returned. It was described as not only dishonorable but also deeply dangerous.



- Pattana Promphat, the son of former health minister Santi Promphat and deputy leader of the Palang Pracharath Party (PPRP), denied that he was involved in the Social Security Office (SSO)'s purchase of the SKYY9 building on Rama 9 Road, stating that his company bought the building and later sold it to AGRE 101 for 2 billion baht before it was sold to the SSO.



- ❖ The SSO's investment in the building has raised concerns among People's Party MPs, who questioned why it was purchased for approximately 7 billion baht when it was valued at around 3 billion baht during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- ❖ Pattana , an executive of Watergate Pavilion, said the company bought the property in 2017. At that time, the building was in a dilapidated condition and uninhabitable. It had been an old building owned by multiple parties, and the plan was to renovate it into office space. Financial and real estate industry contacts later introduced potential investors, one of which was AGRE 101, a company raising funds from foreign investors. On August 23, 2019, the ownership was transferred to the buyer, and payment was completed without any issues.

- ❖ Concerning the 7 billion baht price, Pattana stated that the building was well-renovated and of good quality but declined to comment on the valuation. Regarding whether AGRE 101 had any connection to the Phromphat family, Pattana denied it.

Economic News

- Deputy Prime Minister and Finance Minister Pichai Chunhavajira stated that the government is working on resolving the 13 trillion baht household debt currently within the financial system. This does not include the debts of over 9 million cooperative accounts, affecting about 5 million individuals, with non-performing loans (NPLs) totaling 1.22 trillion baht.



- ❖ Previously, the government introduced the “You Fight, We Help” debt restructuring program as a first step, mainly targeting home loans. However, many individuals with unsecured debts, such as consumption loans and credit card debts, did not participate in the program. The next phase will focus on these groups, especially debts below 100,000 baht, which make up 35% of total NPLs, or about 427 billion baht.
- ❖ To address these debts under 100,000 baht, a joint effort will be required between debtors, banks, debt management officials, and the government, which will

support the management costs. This initiative will also help these individuals clear their bad credit records with the National Credit Bureau (NCB).

- ❖ However, the issue will not be resolved within 3-6 months, and the government has set a timeline for debt restructuring over the next 1-2 years.



- The National Credit Bureau reports that only 25% of loan applications are approved, while household debt has exceeded 16 trillion baht.
 - ❖ Puey Ungphakorn Institute of Economic Research analyzed financial data from over 27 million borrowers, using information from the Credit Bureau and the data shows that only about 25% of people have the financial health to qualify for a loan under current approval standards. The remaining 75% face challenges due to stricter lending criteria.
 - ❖ The total amount of consumer debt reported to the Credit Bureau stands at 13.6 trillion baht. When including loans from cooperatives, the Student Loan Fund, and other sources, total household debt has reached 16.3 trillion baht.

- The Bank of Thailand (BOT) has announced a temporary relaxation of its Loan-to-Value (LTV) regulations for housing loans. The revised rules allow for a 100% LTV ratio for mortgages under specific conditions, including second and subsequent homes below 10 million baht, and all properties over 10 million baht for the first home.

- ❖ This temporary measure will be in effect for loan agreements made between 1st May 2025 and 30th June 2026. While acknowledging that Thailand's existing LTV rules are already relatively lent internationally, the BOT considers this temporary easing a way to alleviate the high supply overhang and cautiously stimulate the broader economy without significantly threatening financial stability.
- ❖ Finance Minister Pichai Chunhavajira said the government was planning to announce a reduction in transfer and mortgage registration fees within a month to support the sector, a key economic engine. A cut on ownership transfer fees and mortgage registration fees to 0.01% for houses valued up to 7 million baht ended last year.

- The banking sector is abuzz with talks of a potential "big deal" between state-owned banks Krungthai Bank (KTB) and TMBThanachart Bank (TTB). The merger aims to strengthen the financial sector and create Thailand's most powerful "Super Bank."
 - ❖ If the merger goes through, the newly formed bank is expected to become the country's largest bank, with total assets of over 5.36 trillion baht, including KTB's 3.64 trillion baht and TTB's 1.72 trillion baht.



- The Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index closed at 1,181.71 points yesterday, down 7.95 points (-0.67%), with a trading value of 44.63 billion baht. Although the index briefly climbed to 1,200 points during the day, it reversed due to profit-taking and moved into negative territory.
- ❖ Selling pressure from DELTA, GULF, and INTUCH weighed on the index, while the market had already priced in the U.S. Federal Reserve’s decision to maintain interest rates, which was widely expected and not a major surprise. On the domestic front, there was some positive sentiment for real estate stocks after the Bank of Thailand temporarily eased loan-to-value (LTV) regulations.

- ❖ For today, the index is expected to move sideways, with resistance at 1,200 points and support at 1,170 points.
- Listed companies on the Stock Exchange of Thailand have released their 2024 annual financial statements. Focusing on the SET100 index, which includes the largest and most liquid stocks, the top 15 companies with the highest year-on-year net profit growth—ranging from 30% to 10,000%—have been identified.
 - ❖ Leading the list is Jasmine Technology Solution Plc (JTS), which reported a 2024 net profit of 594 million baht, a staggering 10,295% increase from 6 million baht in 2023.



- Gold prices were highly volatile yesterday. The Gold Traders Association adjusted prices 11 times, ending the day 200 baht higher than the previous day.
 - ❖ By the market close, gold bars were bought at 48,350 baht and sold at 48,450 baht, while gold ornaments were bought at 47,481.12 baht and sold at 49,250 baht. The gold spot price stood at \$3,035.50 per ounce, with further increases expected.

- Central Pattana (CPN) has announced plans to invest over 120 billion baht over the next five years, from 2025 to 2029, through new mega projects and developments across Thailand. This includes the launch of major projects like Central Park, which will open later this year.
 - ❖ The company is also investing in three new projects: The Central Phaholyothin, a new business hub in northern Bangkok; Central Northville, a large mixed-use development in Nonthaburi; and Central Khon Kaen Campus, the second Central shopping center in Khon Kaen. Other developments are planned in key areas like Rama 1, Rama 9, and Ploenchit.
 - ❖ By 2025, CPN expects to have 135 projects across various sectors, including 30 mixed-use developments in prime locations. Retail projects scheduled to open in 2025 include Thep Raksak Community Mall (March), Central Park (August), and Central Krabi (October).



General News

- Deputy Prime Minister and Finance Minister Pichai Chunhavajira has denied any involvement in the controversy surrounding Dew Arissara Thongborisut, the famous singer

and actress accused of borrowing items worth 62 million baht from renowned businesswoman May Wassana Inthasang and failing to return them.

- ❖ The issue centres around a unique Lotus Arts De Vivre emerald necklace, valued at 26 million baht, which was allegedly pawned to an individual with a name beginning with the letter "P." Speculation suggests that this individual may be a government minister.
- ❖ Pichai clarified, "I don't know any of the people involved in this issue, and I'm not concerned with it. I've heard about it, but I have no involvement whatsoever." He further emphasized, "I don't care about these matters. Look, I don't even wear a wristwatch. Honestly, I'm not involved."
- ❖ There are five other ministers whose names begin with "P", they are Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra, Energy Minister Pirapan Salirathavibhaga, Labour Minister Phiphat Ratchakitprakarn, Education Minister Permpoon Chidchob and Commerce Minister Pichai Nariphaphan.
- ❖ On the Hone Krasae show, Noom Kanchai, the host, surprised viewers by showing the Lotus Arts De Vivre Zambian Emerald & Diamond necklace, valued at 26 million baht, which May had been searching for. The necklace has now been returned.



- The Thailand Consumers Council (TCC) and the Lawyers Council have discussed holding accountable those responsible for the recent collapse of the Rama 2 Bridge, as well as other incidents prior, considering demanding over 4.4 billion baht in compensation for 144 deaths and more than 1,400 injuries since 2023.
 - ❖ The TCC and the Lawyers Council have met to discuss the legal steps for holding responsible parties accountable for the March 15 collapse of the elevated bridge on Rama 2 Road. The collapse resulted in multiple injuries and the loss of six lives.

- ❖ Wichien Chubthaisong, president of the Lawyers Council, concluded by stating that the Lawyers Council will pursue all aspects of the case. While the focus will initially be on civil and administrative lawsuits, criminal cases will also be monitored.
