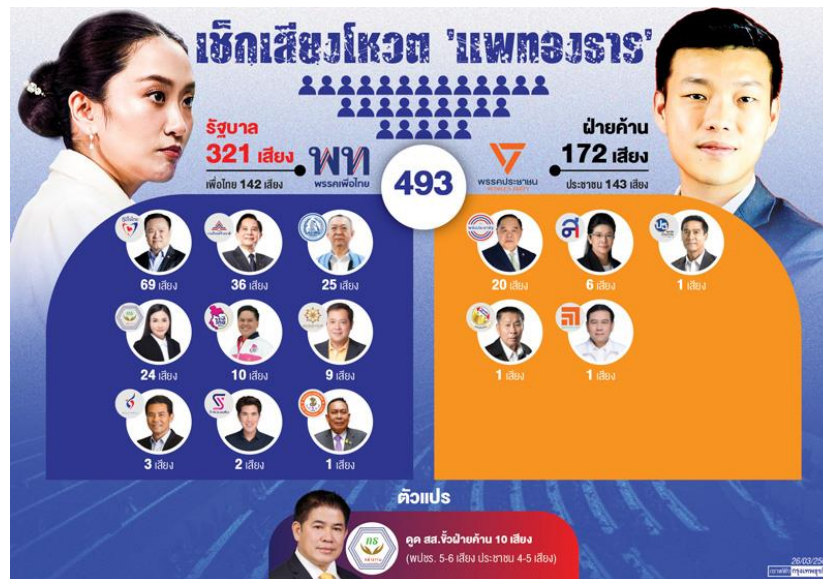

Thai Enquirer News Summary

Political News

- The 2-days of no-confidence debate will see the voting take place today at 10:00 hrs.
 - ❖ The House has a total of 493 members, with 322 from the ruling coalition and 171 from the opposition.
 - ❖ To remain in office, Paetongtarn must secure at least 247 votes.
 - ❖ Before the vote, the Pheu Thai Party will hold an internal meeting at 08:00 AM, followed by a joint meeting of coalition parties.

- ❖ Earlier, Capt. Thamanat Prompow, chief advisor of the Kla Tham Party, stated that 10 opposition MPs were expected to support Paetongtarn. Among them is Kanjana Jangwah, an MP from Chaiyaphum under the Palang Pracharath Party (PPRP), who had previously participated in Kla Tham Party's activities.
- ❖ Additionally, the Thai Sang Thai Party, which holds 6 seats, is expected to give 5 votes in the PM's favor. This could bring the government's total backing to 329 votes.

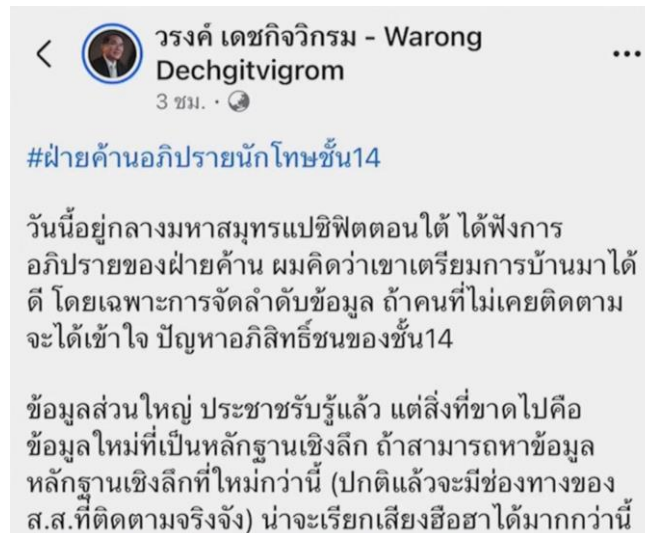


- Last night, after the debate concluded, Paetongtarn posted a group photo with government officials, accompanied by the song Jub Mue Kan Wai (Hold Hands Together) by Bird Thongchai McIntyre.

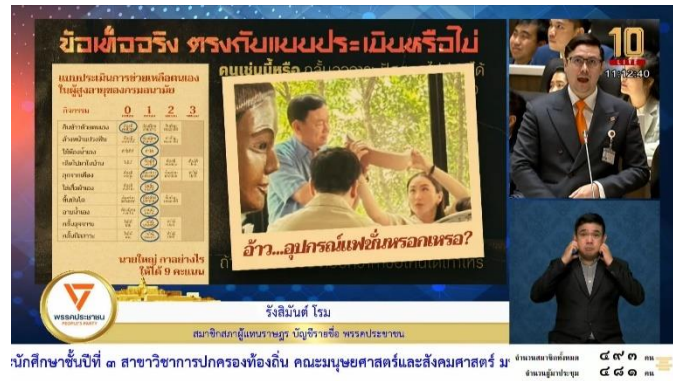


- Some of the vocal critics of the Pheu Thai party government have come out to criticize the lack of new evidence in the various allegations laid out by the opposition People's Party, with some saying that all the information laid out were widely available in the media but no tangible new evidence were shown.

- ❖ Warong Dechgitvigrom, the leader of the Thai Pakdee party, a royalist party, who former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra has sued for 100 million Baht defamation case, has come out to say that the opposition did not do a good job in their debate for hammering the Pheu Thai party and also the issue of the special treatment that Thaksin got on the 14th floor of the Royal Thai police hospital.



- Opposition MP accused Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra of making “a devil’s deal” to bring her father, former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra, back from self-exile abroad without serving any time for his corruption convictions, while raising doubts about his illness during detention.
 - ❖ People's Party Deputy Leader Rangsiman Rome criticized the decision to allow Thaksin to serve his one-year sentence in a premium ward on the 14th floor of the Police General Hospital and under home detention, calling it a violation of the rule of law to protect the interests of the Shinawatra family.
 - He accused Paetongtarn of using her power to cover up wrongdoing by state officials during Thaksin's detention, creating a deception to let her father return to the power-sharing arrangement in the coalition government.
 - ❖ He also questioned why Thaksin's reported health issues, used to justify his hospital detention, were never properly examined. He pointed to an example where Thaksin was sent for shoulder surgery on October 23, 2023, for a torn tendon.
 - He pointed to the fact that Thaksin was able to welcome former Cambodian Prime Minister Hun Sen, who visited him during his home detention, and a photo showing Thaksin took off his neck brace while at a restaurant on March 14, 2024.



- Meanwhile Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra rose to categorically reject the “devil’s deal” allegations, stating they were “100% untrue.” She emphasized that her father ranks among those in the country who have suffered the greatest injustice.



- ❖ She countered the accusations by noting that when her father returned to Thailand last year, she was not yet Prime Minister and had no authority to direct any government officials. She added that even if the People’s Party had formed the government, then, her father would still have returned.
- ❖ As for her father’s actual medical condition, which the opposition claimed was fake, she said no matter how she explained it, the opposition wouldn’t believe her, so she suggested waiting for the Medical Council’s investigation findings. She could only share her perspective as a daughter.
- People’s party MP Chayaphon Satondee claimed the military’s information operations (IO) expanded under PM Paetongtarn Shinawatra, targeting opposition MPs, media, and NGOs. He cited army documents revealing a Special Security Task Force and cyber team monitoring High-Value Targets (HVTs) using fabricated information.
 - ❖ The cyber team, led by Gen. Thammanoon Withee, carried out over 84,000 cyber-attacks in 2024 alone, targeting figures like Pol. Gen. Sereepisuth, Pita Limjaroenrat, and Pannika Wanich. Chayaphon also revealed an army strategy predicting political unrest until 2031 and an ISOC document from October 2024.

- ❖ During his speech on the military and the institution, MP Chayaphon faced strong protests from government MPs. Deputy Speaker Phichet Chueamuangphan, who was presiding over the session, had to warn him, stating that if he continued discussing the institution, he would no longer be allowed to speak. After several protests, Phichet allowed Chonlapol to continue but without using slides.
- ❖ Later, Chayaphon and MPs Pakornwut Udompipatskul and Wiroj Lakkhanaadisorn from the opposition held a press conference to confirm that the documents presented were genuine, coming from both police and military sources. However, they expressed disappointment at being prohibited from speaking fully and stated they would continue to share information through their party's social channels.



- Piyabutr Saengkanokkul, Secretary-General of the Progressive Movement and former Secretary-General of the Future Forward Party, posted on Facebook summarizing the no-confidence debate.
 - ❖ He stated that the issue was not about the vote or whether the opposition MPs performed well. Rather, it was about the Pheu Thai Party declaring itself in parliament as a representative of the "old power." He argued that if the public wanted change, they could no longer vote for Pheu Thai. This issue is more important than asking the Prime Minister to resign or dissolving the parliament.
 - ❖ Piyabutr further stated that the next challenge is whether the People's Party can earn the trust of the people. He emphasized that the People's Party must win in a landslide to bring change to Thailand. He said that nearly two decades have been wasted. Now is the time to move forward for the majority of the country's people.



- Security agencies in Thailand’s southern border provinces issued an urgent radio alert to all local police stations yesterday, instructing them to maintain the highest level of vigilance. Intelligence reports indicated that coordinated attacks were planned for multiple locations at 9:00 PM, with heightened risks expected from March 25 to 27.
 - ❖ Additionally, civilian sources reported that an armed group led by Mahama Sa-i had ordered its members to scout targets in Mayo district, Pattani, in preparation for attacks on security personnel.
 - ❖ There are also reports that, until March 31, group members may be active in several areas of Pattani, planning to carry out attacks using improvised explosive devices, shootings, ambushes on military and police bases.

Economic News

- Pinsai Suraswadi, Director-General of the Revenue Department, responded to concerns raised by Wiroj Lakkhanaadisorn, a party-list MP and deputy leader of the People’s Party, during the no-confidence debate against Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra. The debate focused on tax issues related to her acquisition of shares worth over 4.4 billion Baht from relatives through a sales contract using a P/N (Promissory Note).
 - ❖ He explained that a P/N functions like a loan agreement, meaning the tax obligation arises only when the note is repaid in cash. Paetongtarn stated that the payment will be made in 2026, at which point the seller will be responsible for paying the applicable taxes.
 - ❖ Meanwhile, Wiroj stated he will continue to scrutinize the Revenue Department’s decision and will use parliamentary mechanisms and the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) to ensure transparency in the matter.



- Tourism and Sports Minister Sorawong Thienthong reported that during the past week (March 17-23), the number of international tourists visiting Thailand slowed to 589,370, a 7.36% decrease from the previous week. This was due to a drop in arrivals from China, India and Malaysia, as well as the off-season for long-haul markets.



❖ Meanwhile from January 1 to March 23, a total of 8.88 million foreign tourists visited Thailand, generating 434 billion Baht in revenue. The top 5 top countries were:

- China 1,259,391 visitors
- Malaysia 1,057,438
- Russia 667,905
- India 498,341
- South Korea 475,124



- Car production, domestic sales, and exports dropped by 13.6%, 6.7%, and 8.3% year-on-year in February, according to the Federation of Thai Industries' Automotive Club.
 - ❖ In 2024, Thailand produced 1.47 million cars, down 19.95% from the previous year, with the initial target set at 1.9 million.
 - ❖ The 2025 target is 1.5 million vehicles, with 1 million units aimed at exporting and 500,000 for the domestic market.
 - A total of 115,487 vehicles were produced in February 2025, down 13.62% from February 2024.
 - ❖ Surapong Paisitpattanapong, spokesperson for the association, said the decline was driven by a 21.26% drop in production for the domestic market, particularly a 42.10% decrease in pickup truck output, reflecting lower sales.
 - Export production fell 9.48%, with passenger car output down 47.01%, in line with weaker overseas demand.
 - ❖ For January–February 2025, total production stood at 222,590 units, down 19.29% year-on-year.

- Prachin Eamlumnow, Chairman of the 46th Bangkok International Motor Show, announced that this year's event will run from March 26 to April 6 at Impact Muang Thong Thani. Under the theme The Talk of Sensuous Automotive, the show features 54 automotive companies from Europe and Asia.
 - ❖ Several new electric vehicle (EV) brands making their debut in Thailand include ZEEKR, OMODA & JAECOO, CHERY, KINGGEN, JUNYAO, RIDDARA, and GEELY. The event also showcases in-car navigation technology from HUAWEI and electric motorcycles from YADEA. Organizers expect a revenue increase of more than 10% compared to last year when total car bookings reached 53,400 units.

- ❖ The overall automotive industry is expected to remain sluggish this year due to an unclear economic recovery in Thailand, global uncertainties, and stricter loan approvals from financial institutions amid high household debt. However, demand for both new and used cars is still expected to continue.



- Yesterday, the Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index closed at 1,184.93 points, down 5.13 points or 0.43%, with a trading value of 30.77 billion Baht. The index moved sideways with a downward bias, lacking new factors while still facing risks from trade war concerns. Although U.S. President Donald Trump signaled a softer approach to trade measures, Thailand could still face tariffs or retaliatory taxes next week.



- ❖ The market was also pressured by declines in tourism stocks after Chinese tourist numbers fell below market expectations. Additionally, petrochemical stocks faced selling pressure after recent gains, adding to the market's decline.
- ❖ For today, the index may continue to drop if no supporting factors emerge. The support level is set at 1,180 points, with resistance at 1,193 points.

- ❖ From the beginning of the year until March 25, the SET index has dropped by 215 points or 15.36%. Foreign investors sold a net 2.75 billion Baht worth of Thai stocks yesterday, bringing total foreign net sales for the year to 37.11 billion Baht.

- Sarath Ratanavadi, CEO of Gulf Energy Development Plc (GULF), announced that the merger with Intouch Holdings Plc (INTUCH) will officially take effect on April 1. The new company will operate under the name Gulf Development Plc, retaining the stock ticker GULF. Trading of its shares on the Stock Exchange of Thailand will resume on April 3.
 - ❖ The company has set a 5-year investment budget of 100 billion Baht, with 60-70% allocated to clean energy projects. In 2025, it plans to invest over 20 billion Baht and aims for revenue growth of 20-25%.
 - ❖ The new entity will directly hold a 40% stake in Advanced Info Service Plc (ADVANC), generating at least 3.5 billion Baht in annual profit share. It expects to receive over 6 billion Baht per year in cash flow and dividends. The company will focus on four main business areas, including energy, infrastructure, digital services, and other investments.

General News

- Pimol Srivikorn, President of the Taekwondo Association of Thailand, was elected as the new Chief of the Thai National Olympic Committee. He received enough votes.



- ❖ Before the voting, Thai Olympic Secretary-General Gen. Wit Devahastin na Ayudhya and Suchai Pornchaisakudom, president of the Lawn Tennis Association of Thailand and another candidate for the position, walked out of the meeting. They cited concerns over the unfair representation of Olympic athletes in the election. Despite this, the voting proceeded as the meeting still had the necessary quorum.
- ❖ Two new Olympic athlete representatives, Tawin Hanprab and Tanyaporn Prucksakorn, did not use their voting rights, as Gen. Wit and Suchai opposed their representation. Instead, the previous Olympic athlete representative, Chanathip Sonkham, was granted voting rights, following advice from Patama Leeswadtrakul, an International Olympic Committee member and President of the Badminton Association of Thailand. The voting was conducted openly.
- ❖ Pimol is the first civilian, not a military officer or a government official, to hold a position since the establishment of the Thai National Olympic Committee in 1948 or 77 years ago. The most recent term was held by Gen Prawit Wongsuwan for two terms from 2017 to 2024.
- Meanwhile it was reported that Gen Vitch Devahasdin Na Ayutthaya, Secretary-General of the Thai National Olympic Committee, sent a letter to the International Olympic Committee (IOC) to request an investigation into the recent election.

I am writing this to you to report a controversial incident in the NOC Thailand election earlier this morning, local time. The situations are as follows:

We have 8 agenda for this Annual General Meeting for all 37 sports federations, as members of the Olympic Council. The last agenda was the Election, at which point, an Election Chairman was proposed and agreed to be Prof. Dr. Charoen Vatanasin, with one legal counselor, and three scrutineers. The situations went badly when Prof. Dr. Vatanasin produced a letter, dated 20 March (5 days earlier) from the Olympian Association indicating the changes of two athletes, replacing the current ones, which was considered to have certain impact on the election. As the documents for this AGM was mailed out on 12th of March, one candidate team asked that Prof. Dr. Vatanasin would not allow the changes to be effective prior to the election, which was promptly ignored. Therefore, this candidate team walked out as this was not according to the Constitutions.

The process went on until we now have the new Executive Committee for NOC Thailand. However, the controversy above already resulted in a walkout of a large portion of the associations. Thus, I consider the situation to be part of the biased election.

Therefore, I request your reviews on this matter urgently whether the election process should be nullified and voided, and the election to be staged for its proper and completeness once again.
