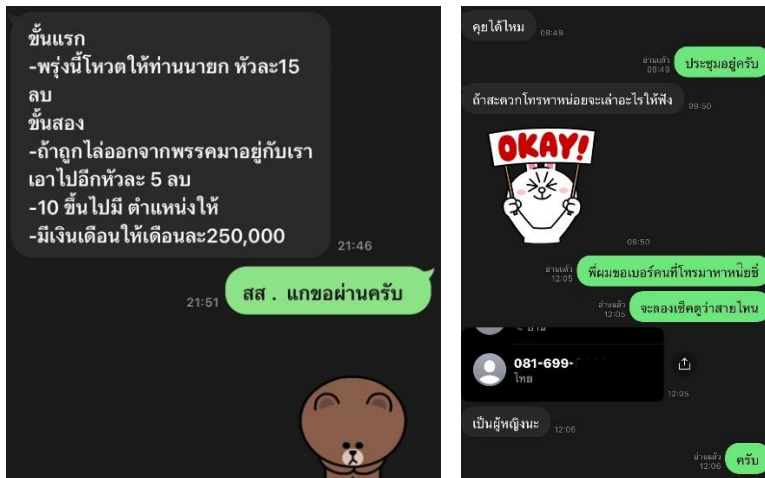

Thai Enquirer News Summary

Political News

- Details of what went around ahead of the no-confidence debate are starting to be revealed, with the MP of People's party posting screenshots of his conversation with someone who offered him loads of money to break away from the People's Party.
 - ❖ People's party MP from Rayong – Krit Silapachai, said that the night before the night of the voting there was someone who offered
 - 20 million Baht to vote for PM Paetongtarn Shinawatra

- 5 million Baht on top, if the person was kicked out of the party, then each MP who gets kicked out
- If there are more than 10 MPs who join and split, then the leader would get an ‘Ministerial’ seat.
- And a monthly salary of 250,000 Baht



- ❖ Krit came out to say that the number belonged to a ‘committee member’ of a political party whose family background is in petrol station and automotive industry and the party that was trying to approach was one that has ‘a lot of cobras’ according to Krit. Cobras are MPs who break away from their party and vote or side with the other side.
- Reports of possible cabinet reshuffle is likely to intensify now that the no-confidence debate is over.
 - ❖ There were calls for possible reshuffle and one of the ministries to be reshuffled is the Ministry of Interior and Ministry of Commerce.
 - ❖ Initial reports suggest the following ministries to be reshuffled in Pheu Thai quota
 - Ministry of Commerce
 - Ministry of Foreign Affairs
 - Ministry of Sport & Tourism
- The no-confidence debate outcome was as expected, Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra survived the no-confidence vote with 319 votes in favor, 162 against, and 7 abstentions.

- ❖ Paetongtarn stated that she did not seek support from cobra MPs, stating that the government already has overwhelming support. She also said that the decision to reshuffle the cabinet is at her discretion, and there are no plans to do so at the moment.



- The 319 votes came from coalition parties, smaller pro-government groups, and seven opposition MPs. Meanwhile, three government MPs were absent, including Chalerm Yubamrung (Pheu Thai) who had given prior notice, while Surapol Julsai (Ruam Thai Sang Chart) and Anurak Jureemas (Chart Thai Pattana) were on medical leave.

- ❖ Seven opposition MPs:

- Thai Progress Party Bangkok MP Chaiyamparwaan Manpianjit (facing charges in a rape case with a 25-year-old Taiwanese woman)
 - Palang Pracharath Party Chaiyaphum MP Kanchana Jangkhwa (former deputy secretary-general removed after attending the KLa Tham Party's HQ launch)
 - Thai Saang Thai Ubon Ratchathani MP Rampoon Tantiwanitchanon
 - Thai Saang Thai list MP Thakorn Tanthasit
 - Thai Sang Thai Yasothon MP Supaporn Salubri
 - Thai Saang Thai Udon Thani MP Rang Thurapol
 - Thai Saang Thai Udon Thani MP Adisak Kaewmongkolsap
- ❖ All 162 no-confidence votes came from opposition parties. The 7 abstentions included the House Speaker, two Deputy Speakers, and 4 Democrat Party MPs.

- The main opposition People's Party plans to investigate Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra for alleged tax evasion and her family's ownership of the luxury hotel Thames Valley Khao Yai, which is said to have been built illegally in a restricted area, according to party leader Natthaphong Ruengpanyawut.
 - ❖ The tax evasion claim involves Paetongtarn purchasing shares from her mother and five relatives, totaling 4.4 billion Baht, using promissory notes. People's Party MP Wiroj Lakkhanaadisorn argued that this could be an attempt to avoid paying over 218 million Baht in taxes. The Revenue Department stated that using promissory notes does not constitute tax evasion, while the Department of Lands confirmed that the hotel's title deeds were legally granted.



- The opposition leader and leader of the main opposition People's Party, Natthaphong Ruengpanyawut, and party deputy leader, Sirikanya Tansakun, approached Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra after the no-confidence vote for formalities and were photographed alongside her.



- Wiroj Lakkhanaadisorn, a party-list MP and deputy leader of the People’s Party, announced that on March 28, he will submit a petition to the Revenue Department. The petition seeks a formal written ruling or announcement clarifying the use of promissory notes by PM Paetongtarn Shinawatra.



- Chuan Leekpai, an MP from the Democrat Party, stated that his decision to abstain from voting has been his stance towards this government from the beginning and that he had already sought permission from his party.
 - ❖ Chuan commented on the Prime Minister's claim that his father was persecuted, saying he wasn't persecuted but attempted to escape justice. Thaksin went abroad to flee criminal charges for corruption. Society needs to understand the truth, Chuan said.



- The Constitutional Court has accepted a petition seeking a ruling on whether Deputy Prime Minister and Defense Minister Phumtham Wechayachai and Justice Minister Tawe Sodsong must vacate their positions over alleged ethical misconduct related to the June 2024 Senate election vote-fixing investigation.
 - ❖ The petition was filed by Senator Pol Maj Gen Chatrawat Saengphet and 92 other senators, the petition claims Phumtham and Tawe, in their roles on the Department

of Special Investigation's (DSI) Board of Special Cases, interfered in the election process by using the DSI to undermine the Election Commission, pressuring and intimidating Senate members.

- ❖ The petitioners argue this violates the separation of powers and ethical standards, warranting the ministers' removal.
- ❖ The Constitutional Court ruled the case falls under its jurisdiction, unanimously accepted the petition, and ordered the respondents to submit their defense within 15 days. However, it found no grounds to suspend them from their duties at this stage.



- Bhumjai Thai Party Khon Kaen MP Ekkarat Changlao said he is moving to the Kla Tham Party for personal reasons and "political suitability." He believes leaving Bhumjai Thai will allow him to perform his duties as an MP more freely.

He said once the leaders of the two coalition parties finish their discussions, he expects to be expelled from Bhumjai Thai and then formally introduced as a Kla Tham Party MP. He also said Bhumjai Thai leader Anutin Charnvirakul is not stopping him from switching parties since both are in the ruling coalition.

- ❖ Ekkarat added that he has been friends with Kla Tham de facto leader Thammanat Prompao for a long time and claimed that everyone in his constituency supports his move. Thammanat, in a separate interview, said he had already spoken with Anutin and that there was a mutual understanding. He also maintained that at least 10 opposition MPs are aligned with Kla Tham but did not name them.



- Yesterday The Constitutional Court also removed Somchai Lenglak from his position as senator.
 - ❖ The Election Commission (EC) had petitioned the court to disqualify Somchai following a ruling that barred him from participating in elections for 10 years due to a prior vote-buying offense. In September 2024, the Supreme Court convicted Somchai of election fraud during his candidacy for Constituency 9 in Songkhla in the 2023 general election. He had previously run as a candidate for the Palang Pracharath Party in the 2019 general election and the Bhumjaithai Party in 2023.



- The Supreme Court's Criminal Division for Political Office Holders has revoked the election rights of Mukdawan Leungsini, a Bhumjai Thai MP from Nakhon Si Thammarat, and ordered her to pay back 8 million Baht in election expenses.
 - ❖ The Election Commission (EC) filed the petition against Mukdawan after discovering evidence of vote-buying. She was accused of paying voters 500 Baht each to vote for her, totaling 25,000 Baht, and also giving money to attend her campaign speeches.
 - ❖ Mukdawan, 63, was elected as an MP on June 25, 2023, from District 8, Nakhon Si Thammarat. She received 23,393 votes, defeating candidates from the Palang Pracharat Party, the Move Forward Party, and the Democrat Party. In District 8, there are 117,640 eligible voters in 2023, with 90,014 casting ballots, a turnout rate of 76.52%. Candidates running in the by-election include representatives from the Democrat Party, Kla Thanatham Party, People Party, Ruam Thai Sang Chart Party, and the Bhumjai Thai Party.



- Dr. Amorn Leelarasamee, a member of the Medical Council, is investigating the case of Thaksin Shinawatra, who was allowed to receive medical treatment on the 14th floor of the Police Hospital for nearly six months, which led to him serving no actual prison time. The investigation also includes the medical staff at the Correctional Hospital who allowed Thaksin to transfer to the Police Hospital.
 - ❖ Dr. Amorn revealed that the investigation process of the special subcommittee has been completed, and a report is being prepared for submission to the Medical Council. A meeting is scheduled for April 10. If the Medical Council decides that further investigation is required, the subcommittee may be given another month to continue the investigation.



Economic News

- The Cabinet meeting today, postponed from Tuesday following the no-confidence debate, will cover several key agenda items.
 - ❖ The Ministry of Finance is set to propose a confidential agenda—a draft emergency decree amending the Securities and Exchange Act. The amendment aims to grant the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) greater authority to investigate criminal cases and penalize stock manipulation offenders, in an effort to restore investor confidence in the stock market.

- ❖ Additionally, the Cabinet will review the draft Entertainment Business Act, which has been revised by the Council of State. The Ministry of Finance and the Ministry of Interior have finalized their positions on the draft before presenting it for Cabinet approval.
 - The key points of the draft Entertainment Complex Business Act include several important regulations. The casino area within an entertainment complex is restricted to no more than 10% of the total land area designated for the complex.
 - Additionally, individuals under the age of 20 are prohibited from entering the casino. Thai nationals who wish to enter the casino must register and pay a fee of 5,000 Baht per visit. Furthermore, they are required to maintain a fixed deposit of at least 50 million Baht in a bank account for a minimum of six consecutive months.
- ❖ The Budget Bureau will also present details of the fiscal year 2026 budget before seeking budget allocations for the upcoming fiscal year.
- The electricity price will remain at 4.15 Baht per unit for the billing cycle from May to August 2025, the Energy Regulatory Commission (ERC) announced.
 - ❖ ERC Secretary-General Poonpat Leesombatpiboon stated that the commission's meeting had approved maintaining the fuel tariff (FT) at 36.72 satang per unit, in line with the proposal from the Electricity Generating Authority of Thailand (EGAT).
 - ❖ Combined with the base electricity rate of 3.78 Baht per unit, this results in an average electricity price (excluding value-added tax) of 4.15 Baht per unit for the billing cycle from May to August 2025, he said, adding that this is the same as the current billing cycle.
 - ❖ The ERC opened a public consultation on the calculation of the FT rate for the May-August 2025 period through its website from March 11 to 24. The feedback results showed that :
 - 21% of participants supported Scenario 1 (FT rate of 137.39 satang per unit)
 - 18% favored Scenario 2 (FT rate of 116.37 satang per unit)
 - 49% agreed with Scenario 3 (FT rate of 36.72 satang per unit).
 - Meanwhile, 9% proposed alternative FT rates.

- The Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index closed at 1,190.36 points yesterday, up 5.43 points (+0.46%) with a trading value of 26.58 billion Baht. Trading volume was low as investors awaited clarity on U.S. tax policies set to be announced on April 2. The index was supported by a 3.5-point gain in DELTA, which drove up the entire electronics sector, along with HMPRO's share buyback. DELTA was the most actively traded stock, with a turnover of 2.09 billion Baht, closing at 73.50 Baht, up 3.50 Baht.



- In the afternoon, power plant stocks gained after the Energy Regulatory Commission (ERC) decided to maintain electricity rates at 4.15 Baht per unit for the May-August period.

- ❖ For today, the index is expected to trade in a sideways-up pattern. Investors will be closely watching the Cabinet meeting, which will discuss the third phase of the 10,000-Baht cash handout, tourism stimulus through the "Half-Half" travel scheme, and the Entertainment Complex project. Support levels are at 1,181 and 1,187 points, with resistance at 1,200 points.

- ❖ Following the announcement, HMPRO's intraday trading peaked at 8.75 Baht before closing at 8.40 Baht, marking a 0.70 Baht increase (+9.09%) with a trading value of over 969.12 million Baht.
- ❖ The buyback price will not exceed 115% of the five-day average stock price before the purchase, with the 30-day average price (from February 10 to March 24, 2025) recorded at 8.16 Baht per share.



General News

- A female colonel and a physician were arrested for their central role in a drug corruption scheme at the Veterans General Hospital in Bangkok, causing an estimated financial loss of 80 million Baht.
 - ❖ According to the Central Investigation Bureau, police raided 18 locations in Bangkok, Lopburi, and Chonburi to crack down on those involved in the fraud. Colonel identified as Kanyarat (surname withheld) was arrested at her residence in Bangkok's Kiakkai neighbourhood. She faces charges of misconduct, embezzlement, and falsifying documents. Meanwhile, a physician at the Veterans General Hospital, identified as Brinda (surname withheld), was arrested at her residence in the Ladprao 71 area.
 - ❖ Both suspects were taken to the Anti-Corruption Division in Bangkok's Chatuchak district for questioning. The arrests followed a complaint by hospital director General Dechnitit Leungngamkham, who reported that the fraudulent activities had been ongoing since 2018. Kanyarat led the operation, orchestrating a scheme in which individuals were arranged to visit Brinda under the guise of receiving medical treatment. Brinda then prescribed medications—often in excess of what was necessary. These surplus drugs were later resold to clinics and pharmacies, with the proceeds distributed among those involved.
 - ❖ Financial investigations from 2018 to 2025 revealed that over 40 million Baht had been transferred into Kanyarat's account. The estimated total financial damage from the scheme stands at approximately 80 million Baht.
