Thai Enquirer News Summary

Political News

- Collusion in the election of the June 2024 Senate election or not.

Well, today, the Sub-Committee on Special Case Screening will hold its first meeting to discuss legal issues related to the alleged collusion in the Senate's election. The findings will be presented to the full Special Case Committee on March 6.

- ❖ Yesterday, online information claimed to list over 1,200 individuals the DSI plans to question.

- ❖ Sources from DSI revealed that nearly 100% of the names in the leaked documents matched those the investigators had planned to call for questioning. These 1,200 names are the ones that are supposed to be the ones who colluded to elect the 150+ out of 200 senators for the Blue faction.
- ❖ Senator Wuttichat Kalyanamitra stated that he never thought the Senate was politically divided. He also noted that over 70% of senators have already been questioned by the Election Commission.



- The debate on how many days the no-confidence debate will last continues to remain a mystery.

The no-confidence debate against Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra remains a debate to look into. The opposition – People’s Party, wants it to be for 5-days, while the ruling coalition says that with just 1 person being targeted it should be only 1-day debate.

Phattarapong Leelaphat, Deputy Spokesperson for the People’s Party, commented on the government's chief whip’s statement that the no-confidence debate would be held for only one day. He said that the only way the debate could be limited to one day is if Prime Minister Paetongtarn resigns after the 1st day of the debate.

- ❖ The opposition's proposal for a 5-day debate is based on the belief that if the government is confident that the Prime Minister has been working hard as she claimed, there is no reason to fear the debate.
- ❖ He also criticized the one-sided information presented in the Prime Minister’s TV program, suggesting it wastes resources. The government still has almost a month to prepare responses for the Prime Minister, Phattarapong said.

- A no-confidence motion against Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra has been proposed to House Speaker Wan Muhamad Noor Matha for consideration before it is placed on the parliamentary agenda, according to Pol Sub Lt Arpath Sukhanunth, secretary-general of the House of Representatives.
 - ❖ Pol Sub Lt Arpath said that the verification process for the no-confidence motion filed by the opposition parties against PM Paetongtarn had been completed. The verification process involved the checking of signatures and the content of the motion, which has now been submitted to Wan for consideration before it is included in the agenda.
 - ❖ When asked whether the motion referred to former prime minister Thaksin Shinawatra who was perceived as an outsider under regulations, Pol Sub Lt Arpath responded by saying that the decision rests with the House Speaker and his deputies to deliberate such matters during the debate.


The verification process did not offer the removal of any content from the motion. The motion has been submitted to the House Speaker for a listing in the agenda.



- The Senate meeting on Tuesday, March 4, will consider a motion on issues in the justice system and law enforcement, proposed by Pol Maj Gen Chatwat Saengphet. The motion concerns political interference. It also raises concerns about cases involving Chinese investors and special medical privileges granted to certain inmates.
 - ❖ Reports suggest this motion is a response to the DSI's ongoing investigation into allegations of collusion and bloc voting in last year's Senate election. The Special Case Investigation Committee is set to meet on March 6 to review the findings.
- At today's Cabinet meeting, officials are expected to report on the recent repatriation of 40 Uyghurs to Xinjiang. Deputy Prime Minister and Defense Minister Phumtham Wechayachai, along with Justice Minister Pol. Col. Tawee Sodsong and Foreign Minister Maris Sangiampongsa, will provide updates on the matter.
 - ❖ National Security Council Secretary-General Chatchai Bangchud and Deputy National Police Chief Pol. Gen. Kraiboon Suadsong, who returned to Bangkok

early this morning, will present a summary and a 1.52-minute video titled 11-Year Mission Possible to show the process of the repatriation operation.

- ❖ Tawe also revealed he has discussed plans to travel to Xinjiang within 15-30 days to monitor the well-being of the repatriated Uyghurs, as promised by the Chinese government. Thai media will be invited to observe the visit.
- The Chinese Embassy in Bangkok issued a statement yesterday, criticizing the double standards being applied by western governments and international human rights organisations over the repatriation of Uyghurs to China, while remaining silent over a major western country's deportation of more than 270,000 refugees from its territory.
 - ❖ In a Q&A style statement, issued in response to the condemnation of Thailand by the United Nations, the US, Germany and the United Kingdom, among other western countries, for the deportation of 40 Uyghurs back to Xinjiang in China, the Chinese Embassy said that illegal immigration is an internationally-accepted offence and deportation is merely the standard enforcement of the law of the host country.
 - ❖ The deportation of the Uyghurs, who had been held in detention in Thailand for two decades, was at the request of the Chinese government and was an exercise in cooperation between the two countries in the enforcement of their laws.
 - ❖ The embassy also said that this group of Uyghurs could not be repatriated sooner because it was being blocked by a number of major countries and some anti-China groups.

โฆษกสถานเอกอัครราชทูตสาธารณรัฐประชาชนจีนประจำประเทศไทยตอบคำถามสื่อ กรณีส่งตัว 40 ชาวจีนกลับประเทศ

ในหลายวันที่ผ่านมา ผู้สื่อข่าวได้ติดต่อสอบถามเข้ามาอย่างมาก เกี่ยวกับกรณีการส่งตัวชาวจีน 40 คนกลับประเทศ ผ่านช่องทางทางการติดต่อของสถานเอกอัครราชทูตสาธารณรัฐประชาชนจีนประจำประเทศไทย โฆษกสถานเอกอัครราชทูตสาธารณรัฐประชาชนจีนประจำประเทศไทยได้รวมคำถามประมวลคำตอบต่อไปนี้

1.ประเทศและองค์กรระหว่างประเทศบางแห่งแถลงว่า การที่ประเทศไทยส่งตัวชาวจีนที่ลักลอบเข้าเมืองโดยผิดกฎหมายจำนวน 40 คนกลับประเทศจีน ถือเป็นกรณีเกิดกฎหมายระหว่างประเทศและอนุสัญญาระหว่างประเทศ

คำตอบ: ประเทศไทยและจีนมีหลักฐานยืนยันได้ว่า คนจีนทั้ง 40 คนที่ถูกส่งตัวกลับครั้งนี้ไม่ใช่ผู้ลี้ภัย แต่เป็นผู้ลักลอบเข้าเมืองโดยผิดกฎหมาย และรัฐบาลไทยได้ปฏิบัติตามคำขอของรัฐบาลจีน โดยเป็นความร่วมมือที่ยึดมั่นในแนวทางการบังคับใช้กฎหมายระหว่างประเทศ ว่าด้วยการปราบปรามผู้ลักลอบอพยพและเข้าเมืองผิดกฎหมาย ทั้งนี้ ตามหลักมาตรฐานสากล ต่างเป็นที่ยอมรับกันมา การลักลอบเข้าเมืองโดยผิดกฎหมาย คือ อาชญากรรมอย่างหนึ่ง ดังนั้น การส่งตัวผู้ลักลอบอพยพและเข้าเมืองโดยผิดกฎหมายกลับประเทศ จึงถือเป็นการบังคับใช้กฎหมายปกติของประเทศไทยที่อำนาจอธิปไตย ดังจะเห็นได้ว่า ในมีนาคมปี 2567 ที่ผ่านมามีประเทศไทยได้ดำเนินการส่งกลับผู้ลักลอบเข้าเมืองอย่างผิดกฎหมายไปยังประเทศต้นทางมากกว่า 270,000 คน



- The US and Japan have warned their citizens of a possible terrorist attack in Thailand after 40 Uyghur refugees, who had been held at the Immigration Detention Center in Suan Phlu for over a decade, were deported to China.
 - ❖ The US Embassy noted that similar deportations have led to violent attacks in the past, including the 2015 bomb attack at the Erawan Shrine in Bangkok, which killed

20 people and injured 125. The shrine was targeted due to its popularity with Chinese visitors. The embassy advised US citizens to exercise extra caution, especially in crowded places, and to review their personal security plans.

- ❖ The Japanese Embassy also urged Japanese citizens in Thailand to stay alert, particularly near tourist attractions, event venues, restaurants, hotels, shopping centers, public transportation, and religious sites, where large crowds could be targeted by terrorists.
- ❖ Last year, Japanese and US citizens were the 8th and 9th largest visitor groups to Thailand, with 1.09 million and 1.05 million visitors, respectively.



- A Suan Dusit Poll conducted a nationwide survey on "Thailand's Political Index for February 2025" from February 24-28, 2025. The survey found that the average score for Thailand's political index was 5.02, slightly down from 5.06 in January 2025.
 - ❖ The government politician with the most prominent role was Paetongtarn Shinawatra with 46.08%. For the opposition, the leading figure was Natthaphong Ruengpanyawut with 48.24%. The most popular government achievement was the crackdown on call center scams, receiving 43.64%, while the most favored opposition achievement was pressing for action on cross-border electricity cuts, which received 45.23%.



- Most Thai people are dissatisfied with the performance of the Pheu Thai-led government and Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra during their first six months in office and doubt they will be able to address the country’s pressing problems, according to the NIDA Poll.

❖ The poll shows that 20% of the respondents are totally dissatisfied with the performance of the government, 34.58% are quite dissatisfied, while 12.82% said they are very satisfied. Regarding the performance of the prime minister, 22.28% said they are very dissatisfied, 32.60% are quite dissatisfied, 31.76% said they are quite satisfied and 13.36% said they are very satisfied.

❖ Regarding public confidence in the government's ability to address the country's problems, the poll shows 36.41% of the respondents are not very confident, while 26.26% said they have no confidence in the government at all. 12.29% said, however, that they are very confident in the government, while 25.04% said they somewhat confident.

❖ The ministries in which the public have the most confidence are:

- Public Health 49.47%
- Education 47.33%
- Tourism and Sports 47.18%
- Social Development 45.50%
- Energy 44.96%

❖ The ministries which the public think have under-performed the most are:

- Commerce 62.44%
- Labour 61.22%
- Interior 60.31%
- Justice 59.92%
- Defence 58.17%



Economic News

- The Cabinet meeting has been moved from Tuesday, March 4, to Monday, March 3, as Prime Minister Paetongtarn will attend the ITB Berlin 2025 tourism promotion event in Germany from March 4-8.
 - ❖ The Finance Ministry will propose a measure to support the Thai capital market by allowing investors with maturing long-term equity funds to automatically transfer their units to the new Thai ESG fund. Investors will receive a five-year tax deduction starting in 2025 (for filing in 2026), with a maximum exemption of 500,000 Baht.
 - ❖ In the 1st year, they can claim up to 300,000 Baht, with the remaining balance deductible over the following years. This aims to stabilize the stock market amid declines, partly caused by LTF redemptions. As of early this year, about 180 billion Baht remained in LTFs.
- Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra appeared in the second episode of her television program Opportunity Thailand with PM Paetongtarn, titled Empowering Thais.
 - ❖ She addressed concerns about Thailand’s economic growth, citing data from the National Economic and Social Development Council (NESDC). While some worry

that Thailand's economy is lagging behind in ASEAN, she stated that in reality, the country's GDP still grew by 3.2% in Q4 2024 and 2.5% for the full year.

- ❖ This growth was driven by the visa-free policy, government investments, and investment promotion efforts. She assured that the government would continue pushing these policies to further increase GDP, which in turn means more money in people's pockets.
- ❖ "We want everyone to prosper and have more spending power, which will benefit the country—it's a win-win. Please continue to support us. Sometimes I feel discouraged, but never for long. There is still much development needed in the country. This is a year of opportunity, and everyone must have hope and a fair chance," the Prime Minister said.



- Former finance permanent secretary Somchai Satjapong was voted the new chairman of the board of the Bank of Thailand yesterday, by the selection committee.



- ❖ Chairman of the committee, former finance permanent secretary Sathit Limpongpan, said that they considered the qualifications of Somchai, who was nominated by the Finance Ministry, and Dr. Surapol Nitikraipot, nominated by the central bank. The committee voted in favour of Somchai, but he declined to disclose the vote.
- ❖ Sathit has already informed Finance Minister Pichai Chunhavajira about the selection committee's choice, adding that he expects Somchai's selection will be submitted to the cabinet for approval next week, before it is submitted to His Majesty the King for endorsement.

- TikTok plans to invest an additional US\$8.8 billion (over 300 billion Baht) in Thailand over the next five years, according to Helena Lerch, Vice President of Public Policy.
 - ❖ Thailand has 50 million TikTok users, with more than 3 million accounts using TikTok Shop. The company has hired around 1,000 people in Thailand. The investment will focus on data hosting to improve user data management in Thailand and Southeast Asia. The government also supports TikTok's innovation efforts, particularly in AI, content production, and skill development for Thai workers.

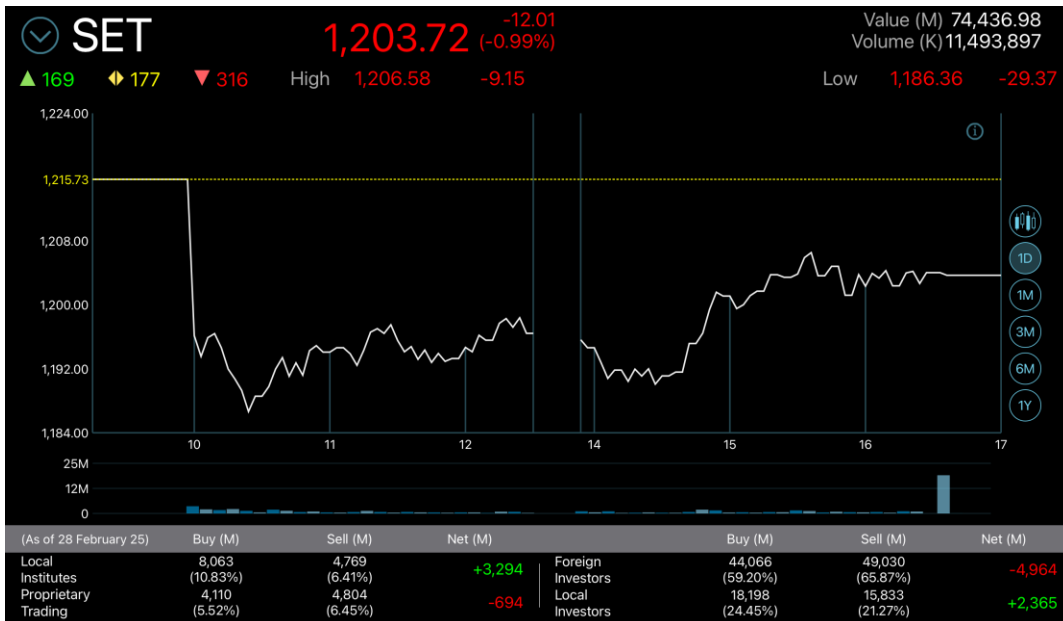


- The Council of State has sent the revised draft bill to legalize casinos inside entertainment complexes to the government. The bill is now collecting feedback from various agencies. After that, the Secretariat of the Cabinet will present it to the Cabinet for consideration, likely on March 11, before it goes to Parliament.
 - ❖ Nattacharee Anuntasilpa, Secretary-General of the Cabinet, said the Ministry of Finance and the Ministry of Interior must 1st confirm the submission in writing before it is presented to the Cabinet.
- Today at 9:00 AM, protesters will march to Government House to voice their opposition as the Cabinet meets. Three protest groups rallied outside Government House, vowing to stay until the government scraps its plan to legalise casinos and online gambling.
 - ❖ The three groups – the Network of Students and People for Thailand’s Reform, the Dharma Army, and the Centre of People for Monarchy Protection – initially gathered at Chamai Maruchet Bridge before setting up a stage and sound system in front of the Prince Chumphon Monument.
 - ❖ To prevent the protesters from entering the Government House compound, police placed containers to block Rama V Road, adjacent to the Prem Prachakorn Canal, on one side of the compound.

- ❖ Pichit Chaimongkol, a leader of the groups, said the protesters aimed to voice their opposition to the government’s plan to legalise casinos and online gambling in Thailand. The Cabinet is expected to give final approval to a bill allowing entertainment complexes with casinos during its weekly meeting on 11 March. He stated that the rally would continue until their demands were met.



- On Friday, February 28, the Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index closed at 1,203.72 points, down 12.01 points (-0.99%), with a trading value of 74.44 billion Baht. The decline was driven by selling pressure in the electronics and telecommunications sectors, as well as a downturn in line with global markets.



- ❖ Foreign investors were net sellers of more than 4.96 billion Baht on Friday alone.
- ❖ Investor sentiment remained pressured by the ongoing U.S. trade war, as the country moved forward with import tariffs on goods from Canada, Mexico, and China, set to take effect on March 4. This raised concerns about a potential global economic slowdown.

- ❖ In response, investors adjusted their portfolios by selling risk assets and shifting funds into safe-haven assets, particularly bonds and cash, to mitigate risks while awaiting further developments.

- Shares of Hana Microelectronics Plc (HANA) fell nearly 20% on Friday after the company reported a loss for the year 2024.

- ❖ Shares of HANA ended the day down 4 Baht/share or 19.90% to 16.10 Baht/share after the disappointing earnings report.



- Super Poll released a survey on whether Thai people's lives have improved, stayed the same, or worsened. When asked about their overall living conditions, most respondents (67.6%) said their lives were bad—32.2% said it remained bad, while 35.4% said it had worsened. Meanwhile, 12.5% said their lives were the same but good, and 19.9% said they had improved.

- ❖ Reasons given for those who felt their lives remained bad or worsened included no noticeable improvement, rising prices and cost of living, increasing debt and expenses, fewer job opportunities with good pay, declining quality of life, pollution issues, accidents, worsening social problems, and poor public services.
- ❖ On the other hand, those who felt their lives had improved or remained good cited higher incomes, a better cost of living, income matching expenses, and improved welfare benefits.

- Amid loud cheers from Thai and international motorsport fans, a record-breaking 224,634 spectators attended the opening round of the 2025 MotoGP season at Chang International Circuit in Buriram over the past weekend, generating over 5.04 billion Baht in economic activity. However, just hours later, the Facebook page Lung Nevin announced that Thailand would not renew its MotoGP hosting contract.
 - ❖ Nevin Chidchob stated on his page that Thailand has hosted MotoGP for seven consecutive years, with Chang International Circuit providing the venue free of charge each year and remaining willing to continue doing so if the government keeps organizing the event. Ticket sales and sponsorship revenue have gone entirely to the government.
 - ❖ “I have just received official confirmation from the Sports Authority of Thailand that the government will fund MotoGP for the last time in 2026 and will not renew the contract. This is disappointing because the government invests no more than 500 million Baht per year, with private sector support of at least 300 million Baht annually. Yet, the event generates over 5 billion Baht, boosting businesses and the economy. However, since the government has made its decision, we must accept it. I want to inform Thai MotoGP fans that next year will be the final Thai GP unless the Ministry of Tourism and Sports and the government reconsider,” he said.

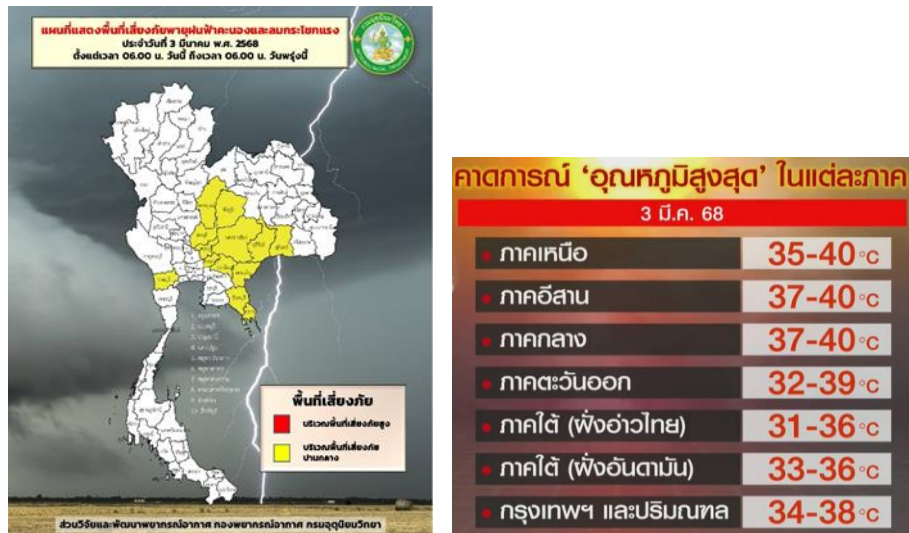
