Thai Enquirer News Summary

Earthquake Tragedy

- The Bangkok Metropolitan Administration reported that at least 18 people have died in Thailand as a result of the powerful earthquake which struck Myanmar on Friday, while 78 people remain unaccounted for as of Sunday.
 - ❖ The number included the 10 people who were killed at the site of the new State Audit Office building in Chatuchak district, which collapsed as the earthquake shook the capital. The body of the 10th victim was pulled out of the rubble on Saturday.

- ❖ 78 workers remain unaccounted for as of Sunday, while 8 people are currently receiving treatments for injuries sustained from the collapse of the 30-storey building.

- Buildings around the city are being inspected for possible damage and so far only 2 buildings have been labelled as ‘inhabitable’ by the BMA.
 - ❖ A residential condominium with 1,140 units in Chatuchak district. Of these, 570 units have been sold. About 600 residents live there, and 112 people need help.
 - ❖ A building in Phra Khanong district with 1,913 units. 322 units have been sold. There are 395 residents, and 25 people need assistance.
 - ❖ So far, 11,675 reports of damaged buildings have been submitted through Traffy Fondue. A team of more than 130 volunteer engineers, split into 20 teams, has inspected 315 buildings.
- As for the State Audit Office denied rumors of redesigning its building, confirming that the construction complies with the Building Control Act. The State Audit Office denies rumours of changing the design of its building in Bangkok’s Chatuchak district on Sunday, confirming that the construction was in line with the Building Control Act.
 - ❖ The statement on its Facebook page came after the building, which was under construction, collapsed on Friday afternoon due to the impact of an earthquake centred in Mandalay, Myanmar.
 - ❖ According to the statement, the building design focused on facilitating the State Audit Office’s work and was suitable for the location on a 10-rai 3-ngan plot of land. The Forum Architects and Meinhardt (Thailand) were responsible for the building design, with a budget of 73 million Baht in 2018. The Cabinet had approved a budget of 2.56 billion Baht for the construction on 4 February 2020. The office then hired a contractor under the Public Procurement and Supplies Administration Act BE 2560 (2017).

- ❖ The bidder who won the contract for construction was the ITD-CREC joint venture, comprising Italian-Thai Development (ITD) and China Railway Number 10 (Thailand). The joint venture made the lowest bid of 2.13 billion Baht, of which the State Audit Office had already paid 966.8 million Baht in 22 installments.



- Four Chinese nationals who were found removing documents related to the collapsed building in Chatuchak have been detained, questioned, and released. Local authorities have filed a police complaint against them for unauthorized entry into a restricted area, and they will be summoned later.
 - ❖ The building, under construction as part of the new State Audit Office project, was being developed by a joint venture between Italian-Thai Development and China Railway Number 10 (Thailand). The documents have been seized. One individual, a project director, claimed they were taking the documents for an insurance claim. All four are employees of the joint venture, and the documents were stored in a container at a parking lot used temporarily by the company. They did not have permission to enter.
 - ❖ A review of 32 sets of documents revealed contractor records, RFIs, clarification documents, inspection notices, subcontractor papers, and documents related to electrical and transportation engineering. Authorities are investigating whether removing any documents could affect the ongoing investigation into the collapse. Unauthorized entry into a restricted area could result in up to three months in prison, a fine of up to 6,000 Baht, or both.



- Industry Minister Akanat Promphan expressed shock after inspecting the steel used in the collapsed building in Chatuchak. He noted irregularities but did not provide further details.
 - ❖ The ministry has collected six different types of steel for further inspection, mostly from one producer. The focus will be on determining whether the steel meets the required standards and if the labels and sizes match specifications.
 - ❖ The building, part of the new State Audit Office project, is being developed by a joint venture between Italian-Thai Development and China Railway Number 10 (Thailand).
 - ❖ The ministry said that for such projects, standard rebars (steel bars with ridges) are required in sizes DB16, DB20, and DB25 to reinforce concrete. Using substandard rebar can weaken the structure, making it brittle and more likely to break during strong impacts or earthquakes, potentially leading to collapse.



- Dr Premsak Piayura, a senator, revealed that he will raise an urgent question to Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra during the Senate meeting on March 31 regarding the earthquake on March 28.
 - ❖ The question will focus on the issue of the lack of a warning from the responsible agencies, such as the Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation and the National Broadcasting and Telecommunications Commission, despite having multiple channels for public alerts.



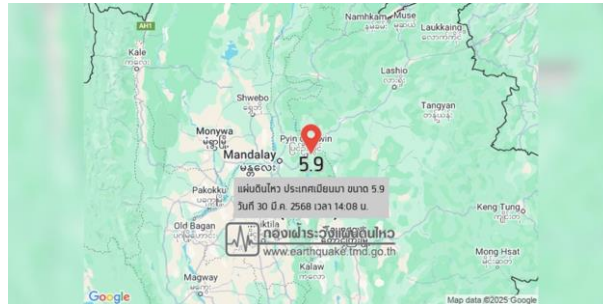
- Super Poll conducted a survey on public opinions about the earthquake, with a sample of 1,091 people who experienced the earthquake between March 29 and 30. The findings showed that when asked about the first sources of information about the earthquake, most people (93.7%) received news from people at the scene, acquaintances, or word of mouth.
 - ❖ Additionally, 88.7% of respondents got information from social media platforms like Facebook, X, Line, and Instagram, while 65.8% mentioned colleagues and organizations.



- ❖ When asked about the public's desire for government agencies to improve and be better prepared for emergencies, 87.1% expressed a need for monitoring at-risk areas, live communication from the government, and for the Prime Minister to go live immediately in response to emergencies. Furthermore, 84.9% wanted relevant agencies to clarify and address any doubts or concerns from the public on all issues.



- On March 30, the Earthquake Monitoring Division of the Meteorological Department reported an earthquake at 2:08 PM with a magnitude of 5.9. The epicenter was located in Myanmar, 332 kilometers northeast of Pang Mapha district in Mae Hong Son province, at a depth of 10 kilometers.
 - ❖ The tremors were felt in some areas of Mae Hong Son, with three noticeable shakes. No damage has been reported so far. However, on the previous day, there were 15 other earthquakes with epicenters in Myanmar and Thailand.



Economic News

- Today, the Ministry of Finance, the Stock Exchange of Thailand, and the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) will hold a press conference in the morning before the SET index opens for trading.
 - ❖ The aim is to restore confidence and reaffirm the stability of Thailand's capital market. Meanwhile, the Bank of Thailand (BoT) is scheduled to report on the country's economic and financial situation.
 - ❖ The Ministry of Finance has announced relief measures through seven state-owned banks, with private banks including Siam Commercial Bank, Kasikornbank, Krungsri, and TMBThanachart Bank also introducing similar measures. These urgent support programs will assist individuals and SME business owners affected by the earthquake, offering loan repayment deferrals and new loans for home repairs and business recovery.



- Tomorrow, April 1, the Tourism Authority of Thailand and the Ministry of Tourism and Sports will hold a press conference at Government House to announce the plans for Songkran 2025 celebrations in Bangkok, Chiang Mai, and across the country as originally scheduled.
- Anusorn Tamajai, Dean of the Faculty of Economics at the University of the Thai Chamber of Commerce, expected the earthquake to have a severe impact on the economy in the second quarter. He initially predicted that GDP for Q2 may contract compared to the first quarter, which was projected to grow by nearly 4%.
 - ❖ Although the earthquake occurred at the end of Q1, its effects will be more evident in early Q2. Concerns are also rising over the stability of infrastructure and high-rise buildings, including dams, elevated roads, bridges, and skyscrapers in Bangkok and surrounding areas.
 - ❖ The tourism sector will be directly affected, while condominiums and high-rise buildings with poor construction standards will be harder to sell. Many owners are expected to offload their properties, driving condo prices down significantly, with buyers shifting toward low-rise housing instead.



- Thianprasit Chaiphattranon, President of the Thai Hotels Association, revealed that following the earthquake, 8-10% of tourists across Thailand requested early check-outs, particularly in Bangkok, Chiang Mai, Chiang Rai, and Ayutthaya.
 - ❖ Some tourists have even changed their destinations to Pattaya or Phuket. The association expects this to have a short-term impact on foreign tourists' confidence

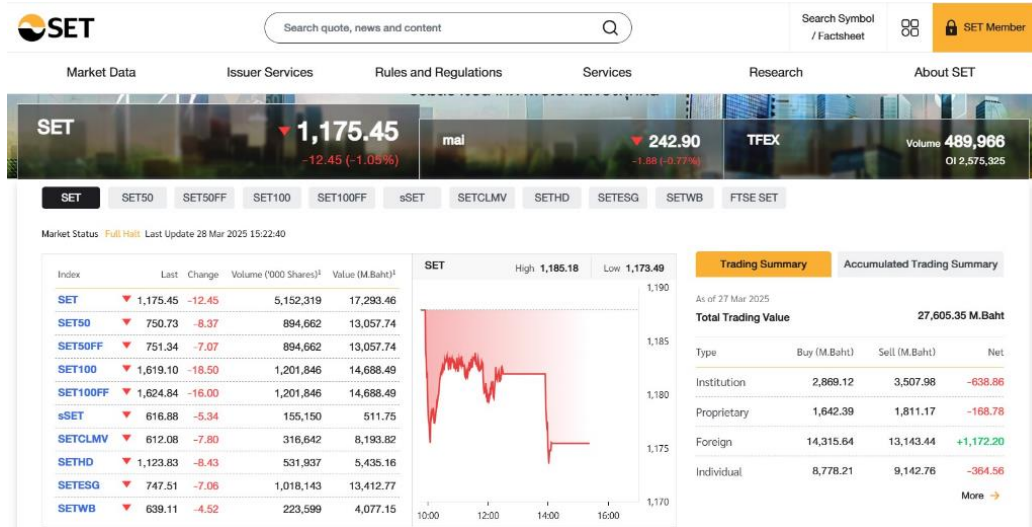
in safety over the next two weeks, leading to a loss of 10-15% in hotel and tourism revenue.

- ❖ The association also predicts that the earthquake will affect tourism during the Songkran festival, making it quieter than in the past two years. It is estimated that it will take about a month to return to normal.
- ❖ As for the target of 39-40 million foreign tourists for the year 2025, it seems very difficult to reach the goal set by the government, Thianprasit said. It is expected that this year's numbers will be similar to 2024, which ended at 35.54 million tourists.



- Investors are keeping an eye on the Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index today after an earthquake in Myanmar sent tremors across 57 provinces in Thailand, including Bangkok. The quake led to the collapse of a new office building under construction for the Office of the Auditor General, resulting in injuries and fatalities, as well as damage to several high-rise buildings on March 28.
 - ❖ In response, the SET decided to close the afternoon trading session earlier than usual, with the index closing at 1,175.45 points, down 12.45 points, with a trading value of 17.293 billion Baht.
 - ❖ Yuanta Securities noted that this was the strongest earthquake in over 100 years, making it difficult to compare with past events. The most severe natural disaster previously affecting Thailand was the 2004 tsunami, during which the SET Index was in an upward trend, leading to only a short-term dip before recovering.
 - ❖ However, the current market is in a downward trend, and investor sentiment is still pressured by the pending U.S. trade tax policy, expected to be clarified on April 2. As a result, the Thai stock market may react negatively today.
 - ❖ Pi Securities analyzed past events, particularly the 2004 tsunami, and found that the SET index fell by 2.2% after the market reopened but recovered to pre-tsunami levels within four trading days. Given Thailand's economy, valued at 18 trillion

Baht, and the real estate market worth 1.1 trillion Baht (about 6% of GDP), the economic downside from this event may be limited.



- On March 28, shares of MCOT Plc (MCOT) surged 23.31%, closing at 4.02 Baht with a trading value of over 149 million Baht. The rise was driven by speculation on the development of MCOT's 50-rai plot of land in the Ratchada area, which is currently under study. Investors anticipate that the land could be turned into an entertainment complex.
 - ❖ Phathiyut Chaisawang, Acting Director-General of MCOT, stated that there have been no discussions about developing the land into an entertainment complex. The initial terms of reference (TOR) are open-ended, with no restrictions on project types. Proposals for development are expected to be accepted within this year.
- Over the past 3 trading days, shares of PTT Oil and Retail Business Plc (OR) have steadily increased. The price rose by 0.60 Baht on March 26, closing at 11.10 Baht, then increased by 0.30 Baht on March 27 to 11.40 Baht. On March 28, the stock gained another 0.50 Baht, closing at 11.90 Baht.
 - ❖ There are reports that OR is preparing a share buyback, aligning with its parent company, PTT, which officially announced a buyback on March 20 after similar rumors surfaced in the market earlier.
 - ❖ Currently, OR shares are trading at 11.90 Baht, below their IPO price of 18 Baht and lower than the company's previous valuation.

Political News

- Wisut Chaiyanarun, a Pheu Thai MP and chairman of the government whip, stated that the Cabinet has submitted details and a draft of the Entertainment Complex Bill.
 - ❖ The government whip has scheduled a meeting on March 31 to review the details. If the review is completed on April 9, the agenda will be expedited to align with the ongoing session. If the review of the draft law on April 9-10 attracts significant interest from members, the discussion will continue until it concludes.
 - ❖ Julapun Amornvivat, Deputy Finance Minister, mentioned that the government is pushing for the completion of the law to ensure that private investors gain confidence in investing in entertainment complexes, as delays in investment have been a concern.
 - ❖ He also noted that drafting the Entertainment Complex Bill is expected to take about one year to complete and come into effect. The project is expected to generate at least 100 billion Baht in investment per location.



- Jatuporn Prompan, an activist, who is currently leading a protest at the Chamai Maruchet Bridge near the Government House, stated that he has heard that online gambling will be discussed at the Cabinet meeting this Tuesday.
 - ❖ If it becomes a ministerial regulation, it can be implemented immediately. Therefore, on Tuesday at 9:00 AM, he will organize a rally to oppose online gambling and casinos.

- The Royal Gazette website published a royal decree announcing a by-election for a Member of Parliament for Nakhon Si Thammarat province, District 8, on Sunday, May 4, 2025.
 - ❖ This by-election follows a petition filed by the Election Commission to the Supreme Court regarding Mukdawan Leungsinil, a member of Parliament from the Bhumjaithai Party, for alleged involvement in electoral misconduct. The Supreme Court ruled to revoke her eligibility to run for office for 10 years, resulting in the need for a new election.
- Nida Poll reported that Paetongtarn Shinawatra, leader of the Pheu Thai Party, is most favoured for the post of prime minister while the People's Party remains the most popular political party in a survey for the 1st quarter of 2025.
 - ❖ Asked who they would support for the post of prime minister today, the answers were as follows:
 - 30.90% were for Paetongtarn "Ung-Ing" Shinawatra of the ruling Pheu Thai Party, the current prime minister. The respondents said they admired Pheu Thai's policies and wanted to give Ms Paetongtarn and her party a further opportunity to prove their commitment.
 - 22.90% for Natthaphong Ruengpanyawut of the People's Party. He was favoured for representing a new generation of leadership, with qualities such as transparency, honesty, and policies that resonate with the public.
 - 23.50% said they were yet to find anyone suitable for the post
 - ❖ Meanwhile when asked which political party they presently support, the People's Party came first with 37.10%, followed by the Pheu Thai Party 28.05% and "no suitable political party" 13.75%.
 - ❖ In the previous Nida poll, Natthaphong was the most favoured choice for the position of prime minister, narrowly leading Ms Paetongtarn, and his party had a substantial lead over the ruling Pheu Thai Party.



General News

- Four Thai fishermen from the Sor Charoenchai 8 fishing boat, detained by the Myanmar navy since November, have been granted clemency, released, and returned to their families. They had been sentenced to four to six years in prison and fined by a Myanmar court for unlawfully entering and fishing in Myanmar waters.
 - ❖ The case stems from a November 30, 2024, incident when a Myanmar warship fired on three Thai fishing boats near Koh Phayam, Ranong, killing one crew member and capturing 31 others—four Thai and 27 Myanmar nationals. Two boats, Ranong 333 and Sor Charoenchai 8, were seized, while some crew members jumped overboard to escape, resulting in one drowning.
 - ❖ Their release comes ahead of Thailand’s hosting of the BIMSTEC Summit from April 2- 4, which Myanmar junta leader Min Aung Hlaing is expected to attend at Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra’s invitation.



- ❖ Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra posted in her Facebook the Myanmar government issued an order to pardon the imprisoned fishermen, as a sign of the good relationship between Myanmar and Thailand. She thanked the Myanmar government for the decision and said she has instructed the foreign minister to arrange for the rapid and safe return of the Thais to their families.
- Three hundred and nineteen organizations, including Defend Myanmar Democracy, have called on the Thai government to uninvite Myanmar junta leader Min Aung Hlaing from the BIMSTEC summit in Bangkok from April 2 to 4. Meanwhile, Myanmar's military continues airstrikes on quake-hit Sagaing in Shan.
 - ❖ The groups urge Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra and BIMSTEC leaders to take a firm stand against Myanmar's illegal military leadership by: Preventing Min Aung Hlaing from attending the summit. Excluding Myanmar's military representatives from all BIMSTEC meetings and activities.
 - ❖ Since the February 1, 2021, coup, Myanmar's military has carried out mass killings, airstrikes on civilian areas, and detained over 28,900 people. With 4,631 airstrikes and over 2,600 civilian deaths, these actions violate international law. The military's conduct is widely viewed as terrorism, and over 3 million people are displaced.
