Thai Enquirer News Summary

Political News

- News reports are buzzing that if on March 6th the Department of Special Investigation (DSI) decides to accept the case of the collusion of the June 2024 Senate elections, then it could possibly lead to a political party being on the verge of being disqualified.
 - ❖ As per the rules of the election, any political party involved in backing or helping those contesting the ‘election’ of the Senate, could be in breach of article 92 of the charter and thus could be disqualified.
 - ❖ As many as 140+ of the nearly 200 Senators are reportedly backed by a ‘dark BLUE’ party (read BJT).

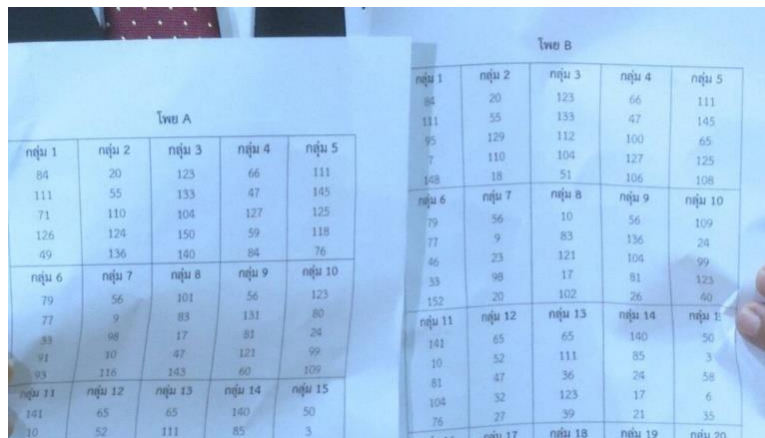


- Yesterday the Subcommittee on International and Special Crimes of the Department of Special Investigation (DSI) has recommended that the Board of Special Cases consider the alleged vote-fixing in the June 2024 Senate election as a special case, according to Pol Lt-Col Surawut Rang sai, DSI’s Deputy Director-General and chairperson of the subcommittee.
 - ❖ The subcommittee consists of 9 DSI officers and 4 representatives from the Office of the Attorney General (OAG), the Royal Thai Police, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and the Ministry of Social Development and Human Security.
 - ❖ Pol Lt-Col Surawut explained that the subcommittee convened to carefully review the legal aspects of the case, particularly the authority of the DSI and the Election Commission (EC), as well as the scope of investigative powers.
 - ❖ The subcommittee concluded that there was sufficient evidence to classify the case as a special case, due to its potential impact on public order. Possible charges include sedition, criminal association, and money laundering. The recommendations will be presented to the Board of Special Cases for further consideration on March 6. The subcommittee’s role was to review the case and offer recommendations, with the final decision remaining with the board.



- Backup senators showed lists of candidate numbers allegedly pre-selected in the June 2024 Senate election.

- ❖ Akarawat Phongthanachalitkul, a backup senator, said lists were distributed before voting at Muang Thong Thani, and EC officials allowed them inside, raising concerns among election inspectors. Complaints were filed on election night, but the EC took no action. Inspectors later reported the case to the Ombudsman and the DSJ.
- ❖ He stated EC Secretary-General Sawang Boonmee allowed candidates to bring documents, including lists showing 20 groups with numbers to indicate selections. He dismissed First Deputy Senate Speaker Gen. Kriangkrai Srirak’s claim that lists were needed for memory, calling it election fraud. He alleged candidates were paid 20,000 Baht before traveling and 30,000 Baht after returning. If over 120 complied, additional payments exceeded 100,000 Baht.



- Meanwhile the Election Commission issued an urgent statement clarifying claims made by Akkarawat Pongthanachalitkul, a representative of the reserve senators’ group 10, regarding Secretary-General Sawang Boonmee.

- ❖ The commission denied the allegation that Senate candidates were allowed to bring notes into the voting venue, stating that the claim was untrue.

สำนักงานคณะกรรมการการเลือกตั้ง ขอเรียนชี้แจงว่า กรณีอนุญาตให้ผู้สมัครสมาชิกวุฒิสภานำไทยเข้าไปในสถานที่เลือกสมาชิกวุฒิสภา ไม่เป็นความจริง โดยมีรายละเอียดดังนี้

1. นายแสวง บุญมี เลขาธิการคณะกรรมการการเลือกตั้ง ในฐานะผู้อำนวยการการเลือกตั้งประจำเขตเลือกตั้งที่ 30 (3) แห่งพระราชบัญญัติประกอบรัฐธรรมนูญว่าด้วยการได้มาซึ่งสมาชิกวุฒิสภา พ.ศ. 2561 บัญญัติว่า “จัดทำเอกสารหรือข้อมูลแนะนำตัวของผู้ได้รับเลือกจากการเลือกตั้งจังหวัดเพื่อให้ผู้ได้รับเลือกได้ตรวจสอบและใช้ประโยชน์ในการเลือก ทั้งนี้ ให้ใช้เอกสารหรือข้อมูลที่ได้รับมาจากผู้อำนวยการการเลือกตั้งจังหวัด” ประกอบด้วย 145 ของระเบียบคณะกรรมการการเลือกตั้งว่าด้วยการเลือกสมาชิกวุฒิสภา พ.ศ. 2567 ที่กำหนดว่า “ก่อนวันเลือกตั้งระดับประเทศไม่น้อยกว่า 3 วัน ให้ผู้อำนวยการการเลือกตั้งจังหวัดหรือผู้ที่ผู้อำนวยการการเลือกตั้งจังหวัดมอบหมาย จัดทำเอกสารหรือข้อมูลแนะนำตัว (สว. 3) ตามข้อ 144 ของแต่ละกลุ่มที่อยู่ในเขตจังหวัดของตน พร้อมทั้งแจ้งให้ผู้ได้รับเลือกตั้งระดับจังหวัดมารับเอกสาร เพื่อให้ผู้ได้รับเลือกตั้งระดับจังหวัดนำมาในวันเลือกตั้งระดับประเทศ”

2. การให้ผู้มีสิทธิเลือกตั้งระดับประเทศ นำเอกสารหรือข้อมูลแนะนำตัวของผู้สมัคร (สว. 3) เข้าไปในสถานที่เลือกสมาชิกวุฒิสภาทั่วประเทศ เมื่อพิจารณาตามคำพิพากษาของศาลปกครองกลาง ได้มีคำพิพากษาในคดีหมายเลขคดีที่ 753/2567 คดีหมายเลขคดีที่ 91/2567 และคดีหมายเลขคดีที่ 771/2567 คดีหมายเลขคดีที่ 972/2567 ลงวันที่ 24 พฤษภาคม 2567 พิพากษาเพิกถอนข้อ 7 ของระเบียบคณะกรรมการการเลือกตั้งว่าด้วยการแนะนำตัวในการเลือกสมาชิกวุฒิสภา พ.ศ. 2567 (ฉบับที่ 2) พ.ศ. 2567 ที่กำหนดว่า “เอกสารแนะนำตัวจะแจกจ่ายหรือนำเข้าไปในสถานที่เลือกไม่ได้” เมื่อพิจารณาตามคำพิพากษาของศาลปกครองกลาง และข้อ 145 ของระเบียบคณะกรรมการการเลือกตั้งว่าด้วยการเลือกสมาชิกวุฒิสภา พ.ศ. 2567 (ตามข้อ 1) ผู้สมัครสมาชิกวุฒิสภา สามารถนำเอกสารหรือข้อมูลแนะนำตัวของผู้สมัคร (สว. 3) เข้าไปในบริเวณสถานที่เลือกได้

3. การนำเอกสารหรือข้อมูลแนะนำตัวของผู้สมัครสมาชิกวุฒิสภา (สว. 3) เข้าไปในสถานที่เลือกเป็นแนวทางปฏิบัติเช่นเดียวกัน ดังผลการเลือกสมาชิกวุฒิสภาระดับอำเภอ ระดับจังหวัด และระดับประเทศ

4. สำนักงานคณะกรรมการการเลือกตั้ง ได้มีหนังสือแจ้งผู้อำนวยการสำนักงานคณะกรรมการการเลือกตั้งประจำจังหวัดและกรุงเทพมหานคร, 168 จังหวัดและหน่วยงานเกี่ยวกับการประชุมและขึ้นบัญชีการปฏิบัติหน้าที่ของคณะกรรมการประจำเขตเลือกตั้งที่ 30 ลงวันที่ 15 พฤษภาคม 2567 ลงไปให้ในเมื่อสมาชิกวุฒิสภา ได้กรรมการประจำเขตเลือกตั้งที่ 30 และมีมติเลือกว่า “สามารถนำเอกสารหรือข้อมูลแนะนำตัวของผู้สมัครสมาชิกวุฒิสภา (สว. 3) ที่ออกจากรับบริพัตรพิจารณาเลือกเท่านั้น” ที่ผู้อำนวยการการเลือกตั้ง รมอบ ให้เข้าไปในเขตเลือกตั้งแล้ว

- The Senate meeting on Tuesday, March 4, will consider a motion on issues in the justice system and law enforcement, proposed by Pol Maj Gen Chatwat Saengphet. The motion concerns political interference. It also raises concerns about cases involving Chinese investors and special medical privileges granted to certain inmates.
 - ❖ Reports suggest this motion is a response to the DSI’s ongoing investigation into allegations of collusion and bloc voting in last year’s Senate election. The Special Case Investigation Committee is set to meet on March 6 to review the findings.
- Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra responded to opposition claims that she lacks leadership by suggesting they should first evaluate their own leadership qualities. After a Cabinet meeting on Monday, she confirmed she is ready to address all questions during the no-confidence debate at the end of March.
 - ❖ The opposition, led by the People’s Party, accused her of lacking maturity, skill, and determination, and allowing her father, former PM Thaksin Shinawatra, to influence her government.
 - ❖ Paetongtarn stated that leadership is ultimately decided by the people. She also said she already prepared evidence based on “facts and legal basis” to show her performance.
 - ❖ When asked if the no-confidence debate would be a chance to communicate directly with the public, she agreed, calling it an opportunity for people to understand both the facts and her as a Gen-Y prime minister.



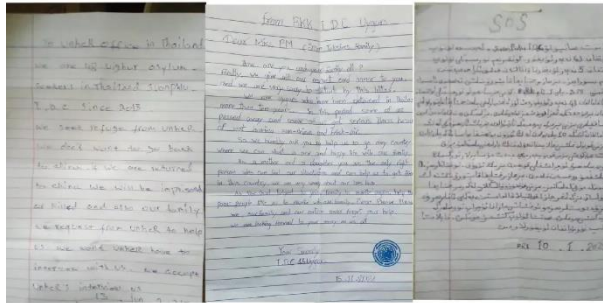
- Wisut Chaiyanarun, a party-list MP from the Pheu Thai Party and Chairman of the Government Whip, commented on the opposition's no-confidence motion, which aims to push for a dissolution of the parliament, saying,
 - ❖ “It's a daydream. Be careful, as it might lead to the dissolution of the opposition party itself.”
 - ❖ In response, Pakornwut Udompipatskul, a list MP from the People’s Party and Chairman of the Opposition Whip, retorted, “It's not funny.”

- ❖ Recently, Wisut tweeted via X app, responding to Pakornwut, urging the opposition to focus on their actions and stop playing politics outside the parliament.



- Parit Wacharasindhu, a party list MP and spokesperson for the People’s Party, stated that the opposition must further discuss the scheduling of the no-confidence debate with the 3 party whips.
 - ❖ He anticipated that the Speaker of the House will arrange a meeting within this week after the meeting agenda is set. However, the opposition insisted that one day is insufficient for the debate. According to historical records, even when debating only the prime minister, such as in 1996 and 1997, the debate lasted 3-4 days.
 - ❖ During Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha’s administration, when the Pheu Thai Party was in opposition, the party even wanted a 30-hour debate on the prime minister. Based on this information, the debate must exceed one day, Parit insisted.
- The Department of Corrections (DoC) has dismissed claims by an opposition MP that Uyghurs detained in Klong Prem Prison sent letters opposing deportation to China.
 - ❖ The DoC said that information about 3 letters – allegedly written by the detained Uyghurs and a relative that was unveiled on Friday by Fair Party MP Kannavee Suebsang -- was fabricated. An investigation by Klong Prem Prison found no evidence confirming the letters' authenticity, and detainees have denied writing the letters.
 - ❖ At the same time, the DoC said the prison stamps on the letters were also found to be fake. The findings indicated that no Uyghur detainees at the facility had sent such letters in November last year as alleged.
 - ❖ Klongprem Prison officials have also compared the detainees' actual handwriting with that in the letters claimed by Kannavee, and they are found to be completely different, according to the DoC.

- The Election Commission (EC) has approved the election plan for a new Member of Parliament in Constituency 2 of Bueng Kan province to fill a vacant seat. The election is scheduled for Sunday, March 30, with candidate registration open from March 5-9.
- MotoGP, the motorcycle racing that has been taking place in Buriram for donkey number of years, seems to be on the verge of becoming a political football.
 - ❖ The state support for this event that generates more than 5 billion Baht in revenues each year, is set to dry up.
 - ❖ The state has injected more than 2.7 billion Baht over the past 8-years in supporting the event.
 - ❖ Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra came out to accept that it may be considered to be a ‘political’ issue but insisted that it was more of a financial decision that the Ministry of Tourism & Sports has to make.

Economic News

- On Monday, Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra held a discussion with Pichai Chunhavajira, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance (MOF), and Prommin Lertsuridej, Secretary-General to the Prime Minister, following a Cabinet meeting. The discussions focused on the progress of economic stimulus measures aimed at boosting GDP growth by 3-3.5%, as assigned to the finance minister.
 - ❖ The MOF collaborated with several national agencies, including the Office of the National Economic and Social Development Council (NESDC), the Bank of Thailand (BoT), the Budget Bureau (BB), and the Office of the Public Sector Development Commission (OPDC).
 - ❖ The Prime Minister concluded by stating the government plans to consult with the private sector through the Joint Standing Committee on Commerce, Industry and Banking (JSCCIB) to finalize the economic stimulus plan within two weeks.
 - ❖ Reporters highlighted that investors are closely watching the economic plans, questioning their efficacy in reviving the economy after Thai GDP grew only 25% in 2567, the lowest in the region.



- Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra left for Berlin to attend “ITB Berlin 2025,” the world’s largest travel trade show. During the 6-day visit, Paetongtarn will meet with Team Thailand in the European Union and the Thai Ambassador to Germany to follow up on policy implementations. This will be the fair’s 58th edition, with Thailand participating for 50 consecutive years.
 - ❖ Representing Thailand are 160 tourism business operators and entrepreneurs from five regions across the country, who will contribute to promoting a positive image of Thai tourism.
 - ❖ The Thai Pavilion this year highlights new perspectives on Thai products and services, promoting international recognition of Thai tourism through the “Amazing Thailand” brand. The year 2025 has been designated as the “Amazing Thailand Grand Tourism & Sports Year 2025” under the theme “Sustainable Thailand Soft Power.”
 - ❖ ITB Berlin 2025 will be held from March 4-6, 2025, at Berlin ExpoCenter City in Berlin, Federal Republic of Germany.



- Deputy Prime Minister and Finance Minister Pichai Chunhavajira stated that the transition of matured long-term equity funds (LTFs) to the Thai sustainable equity fund (Thai ESG 2) is still being finalized. Once completed, it will be submitted to the Cabinet for consideration.
 - ❖ For now, the tax benefits of Thai ESG 2 remain unchanged, with a maximum tax exemption cap of 500,000 Baht. Investors can claim a deduction of 300,000 Baht in the first year, with the remaining amount gradually deductible in subsequent years until the full 500,000 Baht is used.
- The Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index closed at 1,188.41 points yesterday, down 15.31 points (-1.27%) with a trading value of 45.01 billion Baht. The decline was partly driven by lower-than-expected earnings from listed companies. Large-cap stocks, including DELTA, ADVANC, BBL, and CPALL, saw declines, weighing on the index.



❖ Additionally, concerns over trade tensions contributed to market pressure. The U.S. moved up the implementation of higher import tariffs on Mexican goods to March 4, raising fears of a global economic slowdown. Meanwhile, China is preparing to retaliate against the U.S. by increasing tariffs on American agricultural products.

- DELTA recorded the highest trading value at 2.67 billion Baht, closing at 71.25 Baht, down 6.00 Baht.
- ADVANC followed with 2.28 billion Baht in trading value, closing at 271.00 Baht, down 5.00 Baht.
- BBL saw 1.97 billion Baht in trading, closing at 148.50 Baht, down 3.00 Baht.
- CPALL traded at 1.91 billion Baht, closing at 52.50 Baht, down 1.50 Baht.

- Jiraporn Thongtan, Head of Investor Relations at CP All (CPALL), expects first-quarter 2025 earnings to grow year-over-year, supported by the government’s 10,000-Baht cash handout and the Easy E-Receipt program, which is driving more foot traffic to 7-Eleven stores. The company also anticipates a gross profit margin increase of 0.2-0.3% in 2025-2026.
 - ❖ For 2025, CPALL has set an investment budget of 12-13.6 billion Baht. This includes 3.8-4.6 billion Baht for expanding 7-Eleven stores, an increase of 1 billion Baht from the previous year. The company aims to open 700 new stores in Thailand, 20-30 in Cambodia, and up to 10 in Laos, adding to the 15,245 stores operating as of the end of 2024.
 - ❖ Additionally, CPALL has allocated 2.9-3.5 billion Baht for store renovations, 4-4.1 billion Baht for new projects, and 1.3-1.4 billion Baht for IT and fixed assets.

- Somchai Pornrattanaajareon, Honorary Advisor to the Thai Wholesale and Retail Association, stated that all brands of ready-to-use coconut milk will see 2 price increases in March. The price hikes are due to a shortage of coconuts, which require imports from countries like the Philippines.
 - ❖ To make sure coconut milk is available in more stores, manufacturers are limiting how much each retailer can buy. However, the price increases may still lead to higher costs for food and desserts that use coconut milk.

General News

- Pol. Lt. Col. Siriwich Kasemsap, Director of the Human Trafficking Case Division at the Department of Special Investigation (DSI), revealed that an arrest warrant has been requested for Maj. Gen. Mong Chit Tu, leader of the BGF armed group, in a human trafficking case.
 - ❖ The DSI Director-General has signed off on the case summary and submitted the evidence to the Office of the Attorney General. While details cannot yet be disclosed, it is confirmed that Thai individuals were also involved.



- High-ranking state officials are implicated in an alleged drug theft at the Veterans General Hospital. One suspect confessed, revealing a network of six teams, coordinated from Lopburi, involving retired nurses, hospital staff, and active doctors and nurses. The Office of Public Sector Anti-Corruption Commission and the War Veterans Organization are investigating. Evidence shows wrongdoing, but further investigation will take time.
 - ❖ Dechnithit Luangngamkham, the director of the organization, said the corruption may have lasted nearly 10 years, involving patients and high-ranking military officials. Hundreds of people are believed to be involved, and the damage is significant. The operation included transporting patients from Lopburi to the hospital in groups of 10-20 to take medications, with many patients repeating monthly visits.
 - ❖ Civil servants, whether retired or active, will be questioned if financial links are found. Dechnithit emphasized that no one is above the law. Around 20 individuals, including senior civil servants, are expected to face charges.
- Lisa performs Live and Let Die as part of the James Bond tribute at the 97th Academy Awards.
 - ❖ Attending the 97th Academy Awards at the Dolby Theatre in Los Angeles, the singer and rapper turned heads in a sleek black tuxedo dress layered over a long white shirtdress, designed by Markgong.

- ❖ The ensemble featured a tailored black coat with a notch lapel collar, padded shoulders, full-length sleeves, a front button closure, and a floor-length hem. Underneath, she wore a white shirt dress with a pleated bodice, collared neckline, front button closures, and a floor-grazing hem. Completing the look, she wore black flared pants with a high-rise waist and bell-bottom silhouette. To add a pop of color, she accessorized with a red floral brooch and paired the outfit with gold hoop earrings, rings, and black pumps.
