Thai Enquirer News Summary

Political News

- The news of the day just started – the ongoing meeting of the Department of Special Investigations (DSI) which is looking at the collusion of the election of the 140+ senators who are allegedly aligned to the dark BLUE political party.
 - ❖ The outcome could determine what happens next in Thai politics as the dark BLUE political party's de-facto leader held a meeting on March 2, 2024, with the de-facto leader of Pheu Thai party.

- ❖ If the DSI decides to accept the case of the June 2024 Senate elections, then there could be greater implication as the DSI would be considered overruling the authority of the Election Commission (EC).
- ❖ The EC has reportedly sent a letter that would only give the DSI the authority to investigate any kind of money related transactions that took place.
- ❖ The only case that the DSI can accept is that of money laundering (which falls under its authority).
- The DSI needs 15 members to accept the case under its wings but the likelihood of such vote being in favor of the Pheu Thai party seems very highly unlikely because many of the government officials who are on the 22-member board have already said that they would not attend the meeting or others have sent their assistants to attend the meeting.



- Meanwhile the Election Commission confirmed it will not send a representative to the meeting because they have already provided a clear written response. The EC emphasized that they have the authority to make a decision under Section 49 of the EC law.

- ❖ Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Défense Phumtham Wechayachai declined to comment on the EC's decision not to attend the meeting, stating briefly, "Let's wait for it to happen first."

- Senator Pol Maj Gen Chatrawat Saengphet, former Buriram police chief, has threatened legal action against the Department of Special Investigation (DSI) if it accepts alleged vote-fixing in the June 2024 Senate election as a special case. He claimed it could challenge the constitutional monarchy system.
 - ❖ Chatrawat argued that the DSI should review its jurisdiction, as accepting the case may exceed its legal authority. When asked about petitioning for the removal of DSI Director-General Yutthana Praedam, Chatrawat stated that the director has not broken the law.
 - ❖ Senators from the Blue Faction argued that the DSI lacks authority and that the Election Commission (EC) should handle the case. The DSI maintains it can investigate the case due to potential charges of sedition, criminal conspiracy, and money laundering.



- Meanwhile First Deputy Senate Speaker Gen Kriangkrai Srirak, a former deputy Army chief and ex-commander of the 4th Army Region, said he is a close friend of Bhumjai Thai leader Anutin Charnvirakul but is not affiliated with the party. He clarified that there is no "Blue Faction" in the Senate linked to Bhumjai Thai, only groups of senators who share similar views. Opinions are normal in a democracy. While decisions are based on majority rule, minority views are still heard.

- ❖ His comments came after accusations of bloc voting in the Senate, with the "Blue Faction" often receiving around 150-160 votes. This followed an investigation by the DSI into alleged vote-fixing in the June 2024 Senate election, where 138 of 140 candidates later became senators.
- ❖ Kriangkrai emphasized that his friendship with Anutin comes from their shared experience in a military study course at the National Defence College.
- Deputy Prime Minister and Bhumjai Thai leader Anutin Charnvirakul confirmed that he and Newin Chidchob met with Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra and her father, Thaksin, at the former prime minister's mansion in Bangkok on March 2, 2025 (Sunday).
 - ❖ Anutin said he invited Newin to join the monthly meeting with Thaksin. He denied any deal-making between Bhumjai Thai and Pheu Thai, describing the discussions as general talks about the censure debate and government policies.
 - ❖ Asked about the government's decision not to extend the MotoGP contract in favor of a Formula 1 race, Anutin said the issue was not discussed as it's still some time away. Newin had criticized the government's focus on F1, saying local demand for MotoGP was higher. The government plans Thailand's first F1 race in 2028, while MotoGP is held at Newin's Chang Circuit.
 - ❖ Regarding the rift between Bhumjai Thai and Pheu Thai over issues like charter rewriting, alleged vote-fixing in the Senate election, the entertainment complex bill, the cannabis control bill, and land dispute cases, Anutin said no such discussions took place, emphasizing that he and Thaksin are in regular contact and there are no issues between the parties.



- The Supreme Administrative Court is expected to deliver a final ruling in the case of former prime minister Yingluck Shinawatra, who appealed against an order requiring her to pay 35 billion Baht in compensation for damages caused by fraudulent government-to-government (G-to-G) rice contracts.

- ❖ Prawit Boothiam, a vice president of the Supreme Administrative Court, stated that the court had been reviewing the case since 2021 and had made significant progress. The case would be concluded within this year.
- ❖ In 2017, the Supreme Court sentenced Yingluck in absentia to 5 years in prison for mismanagement of the rice scheme. She had already fled the country, fearing that the military regime, which ousted her government in 2014, would impose a severe sentence. Following the ruling, the Finance Ministry issued an order requiring Yingluck to pay 35 billion Baht in compensation for the fraudulent G-to-G rice contracts. However, Yingluck appealed against the order to the Central Administrative Court, which ruled in April 2021 that the compensation order was invalid.



- The Bhumjai Thai Party is fielding Onuma Boonsiri, the wife of its former MP for Bueng Kan's Constituency 2, Suwanna Kumphiro. He was banned from running for 10 years for holding an entertainment event to influence voters during election campaigning.
 - ❖ In addition to the ban, the Supreme Court ordered him to pay around 10 million Baht in compensation for the cost of organizing the election on May 14, 2023, which was later nullified. Despite these circumstances, the party has moved forward with his wife's candidacy in the upcoming by-election set for March 30.



- Last night, an explosion occurred in Yala province. Two pipe bombs were thrown at a checkpoint near the roadside railroad tracks, with one failing to detonate. Initially, 7-8 people were reported injured and were taken to Yala Hospital.
 - ❖ Authorities are currently investigating the incident and collecting evidence.



Economic News

- Yesterday in Berlin, Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra gave a speech at the Amazing Thailand Networking Event with the Prime Minister of Thailand during ITB Berlin 2025. She declared that 2025 would be the Amazing Thailand Grand Tourism and Sports Year, aiming to attract 39 million international tourists to Thailand, generating 98 billion euros in revenue. She also expects 10.62 million European tourists to contribute 24.22 billion euros to the country.
 - ❖ The Prime Minister invited tourists to participate in Thailand’s year-round events, starting with the Summer Festival Maha Songkran in April, the Pride Month celebrations in June, the Loy Krathong, and the Amazing Thailand Countdown. Thailand will also host major global sports events such as the FIVB Women’s Volleyball World Championship 2025 and the SEA Games 2025.



- The Ministry of Tourism and Sports updated the latest tourism situation. From January 1 to March 2, 2025, Thailand welcomed over 7 million international tourists, generating 343 billion Baht in revenue. This was a 5.9% increase year-on-year (YoY).

❖ The top 5 countries with the highest number of tourists are:

- China 1,053,138 tourists
- Malaysia 879,864 tourists
- Russia 504,449 tourists
- South Korea 389,482 tourists
- India 367,542 tourists



- Sunthorn Sathaporn, President of the Housing Business Association, stated that on March 6, three real estate associations, including the Housing Business Association, the Thai Real Estate Association, and the Thai Condominium Association, will meet with Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance Pichai Chunhavajira to inquire about the progress of the property stimulus measures they previously submitted.

❖ This is to help the real estate market that is still recovering and to prepare for the upcoming Home and Condo Expo, set for March 20-23, which is expected to increase demand for homes.

❖ The urgent measure they are requesting is the extension of the 0.01% reduction in transfer and mortgage fees, as it helps reduce costs for homebuyers by 30,000 Baht per million.

- Yesterday (March 5), the Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index rose by 29.32 points to close at 1,206.96 points, with a strong trading value of 50.706 billion Baht. The gains were led by China Play stocks following the Chinese government's announcement of economic stimulus measures to achieve 5% growth.



- ❖ Key performers included SCC, which surged 12.36% to close at 150 Baht; PTTGC, up 9.62% to 17.10 Baht; SCGP, rising 9.92% to 14.40 Baht; IVL, gaining 9.04% to 20.50 Baht; BANPU, increasing 6.73% to 4.44 Baht; and IRPC, climbing 7.95% to 0.95 Baht.

- ❖ Dao Securities (Thailand) recommended stocks expected to benefit from China's economic recovery, particularly in petrochemicals, packaging, upstream energy, logistics, rubber, and food exports to China. Among the petrochemical stocks highlighted were PTTGC, IVL, IRPC, SCC, and SCGP.
- ❖ Today, the market is expected to move sideways after rebounding above 1,200 points. Resistance is set at 1,210-1,215 points, while support is at 1,190-1,200 points.

- Yesterday, a big lot transaction was recorded for Bangchak Corporation Plc (BCP), involving 123 million shares with a total value of 4.531 billion Baht. The average transaction price was 36.57 Baht per share, 5.01% lower than the market price.
 - ❖ Meanwhile, BCP closed at 38.50 Baht per share, up 0.50 Baht or 1.32%, with a total trading value of 4.615 billion Baht.
- The “Vayupak Fund 1” reported its investment status as of December 30, 2024, with total assets valued at 470 billion Baht. A key area of investor interest is the fund’s investments in the stock market, which include a total of 84 securities, primarily large-cap stocks within the SET100 index.
 - ❖ The top 10 stocks in which the Vayupak Fund has invested are PTT, SCB, TTB, KTB, ADVANC, AOT, BCP, GULF, DELTA, and BDMS. The fund also holds other notable stocks such as TRUE, CPF, IVL, MINT, TLI, BTS, KKP, and PR9.

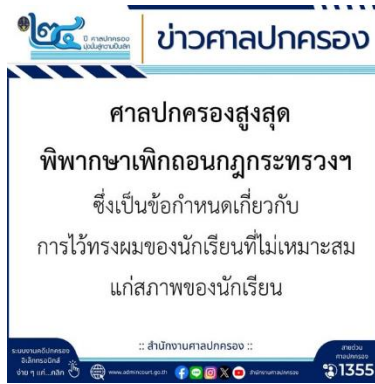

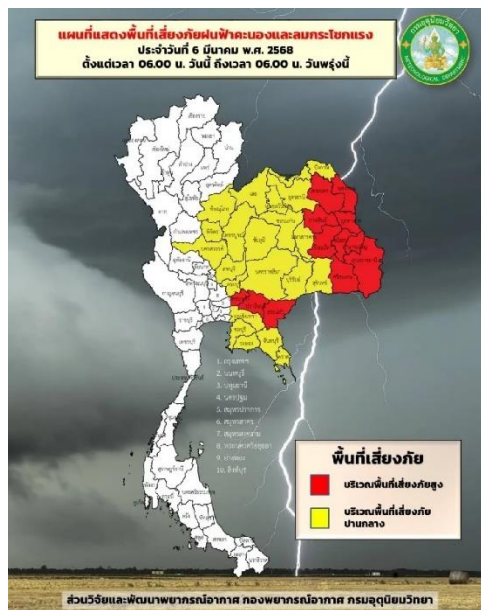
General News

- The Supreme Administrative Court has ruled to repeal Ministerial Regulation No. 2 (1975), which imposed restrictions on student hairstyles and the use of cosmetics. The court found that the regulation limited students' personal freedom and did not consider social changes or the development of identity during adolescence.
 - ❖ The court also cited the Child Protection Act (2003), which prioritizes the best interests of children and prohibits actions that harm their well-being. It determined that the regulation was outdated, violated students' rights, and did not account for the diversity of gender identities. The ruling follows a 2020 lawsuit filed by student representatives from the Education for Liberation group, challenging the regulation. The Ministry of Education was the defendant in the case.
 - ❖ Although the Ministry has abolished subordinate legislation on student hairstyles, allowing schools to set their own rules, some teachers still forcibly cut students' hair without consent. This suggests that some teachers fail to recognize the legal issues, which led to the lawsuit.



- The Meteorological Department has released the top 10 highest temperatures for March 5. The highest temperature recorded was 40.2°C in Buachum sub-district, Chai Badan district, Lopburi province.
- ❖ The weather forecast for today predicts heavy rainstorms in 39 provinces, with extremely hot weather, including in Bangkok and its surrounding areas.
