Thai Enquirer News Summary

Economic News

- Trump announced a 90-day pause on most tariffs and raised tariffs on Chinese imports to 125%. White House press secretary Karoline Leavitt stated that more than 75 countries have reached out to negotiate.
 - ❖ During this period, there will be a 90-day suspension of reciprocal tariffs as negotiations continue, with the tariff rate temporarily reduced to a universal 10%.

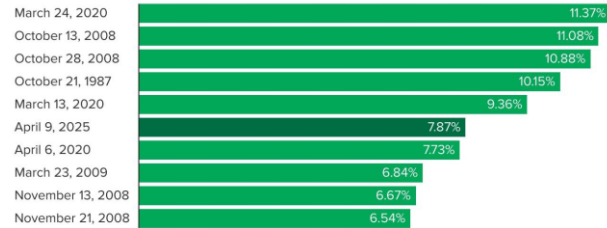
Based on the lack of respect that China has shown to the World's Markets, I am hereby raising the Tariff charged to China by the United States of America to 125%, effective immediately. - Deputy Prime Minister and Finance Minister Pichai Chunhavajira said the Thai government is ready to negotiate with the United States regarding the increased import tariff of 36% on Thai goods. He said the negotiation will take place at an appropriate time.
 - ❖ Offering the U.S. a 0% tax proposal is not the answer, he added, because the U.S. has had a large trade deficit of around 1.3 trillion dollars annually due to years of heavy imports.
 - ❖ If the talks fail and the global economy enters a severe recession, Thailand must prepare a backup plan. This includes restructuring the country's financial framework by adjusting the public debt ceiling to allow for more investment. Pichai noted that Thailand has seen little domestic investment over the past 20 years. The government may also need to inject funds into the economy, but not through continuous cash handouts.
 - ❖ “The public debt ceiling—whether it’s 60%, 70%, or even 80%—doesn’t matter as long as we can repay it. That kind of debt if spent on investment will help build a strong economy and give returns. But this crisis is bigger than COVID-19. Some estimates say that if it’s not addressed, the global economy could shrink by 3%, and Thailand’s GDP could drop by 1–1.5%,” he said.



- The Thai government has devised a strategy to negotiate with the US in response to President Donald Trump's tariff policies. The aim is to rebalance bilateral trade relations under the concept "how Thailand makes the US stronger, safer and more prosperous," a source from the Finance Ministry said on Wednesday.
 - ❖ In response to the 36% reciprocal tariff imposed on Thailand, the government has outlined a four-level negotiation mechanism and framework for talks with the US:
 - Level 1 – The Prime Minister (or a designated representative) will engage in talks with Trump.
 - Level 2 – Commerce Minister Pichai Nariphaphan will negotiate with Jamieson Greer, the United States Trade Representative (USTR), or the Foreign Minister will engage with Howard Lutnick, US Secretary of Commerce.
 - Level 3 – Thailand's ambassador to Washington DC will negotiate with a Forward Team based in the US.
 - Level 4 – A Working Group will be established comprising representatives from both the public and private sectors.
 - ❖ A source said The USTR has already responded to Pichai via email regarding the talks that both parties are currently in the process of scheduling the negotiations. The government has appointed Finance Minister Pichai Chunhavajira to lead the discussions, given the cross-ministerial scope of the issue — involving the Finance, Commerce, Agriculture and Industry ministries, as well as the Board of Investment (BOI).
 - ❖ The first phase of negotiations will focus on macro-level economic and trade relations under the concept "how Thailand makes the US stronger, safer and more prosperous."
- Foreign Affairs Minister Maris Sangiampong addressed the recent call by Malaysian Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim, who, as ASEAN chair, spoke with four ASEAN leaders on April 6 without including Thailand. He clarified that the Malaysian Prime Minister contacted Thai Prime Minister Paetongtarn the following day.
 - ❖ It was also reported that on April 10, Malaysia's Trade Minister invited trade ministers from Thailand and other ASEAN countries to join a video conference at 8:30 AM to discuss trade policy with the United States.



- During this Songkran Festival, Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra is scheduled to open the Maha Songkran World Water Festival 2025 on April 12 at Sanam Luang. The event will be attended by government ministers and members of the diplomatic corps.
 - ❖ On April 13, she will travel to Chiang Mai to open the World Songkran Thapae Chiangmai event on Tha Phae Road, followed by the opening of “My Water World Songkran Festival 2025” at Maya Lifestyle Shopping Center.
 - ❖ The Prime Minister will be accompanied by former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra. They plan to spend the long holiday together with their family and join the traditional water blessing ceremony at their private residence in Mae Rim district.



- The Revenue Department collected 966.2 billion baht in the first half of the fiscal year (October 2024 - March 2025), up 36.2 billion baht (3.9%) from last year and 10.2 billion baht (1.1%) above the target. In March, the department's collection reached 170.5 billion baht, 6.6 billion baht (4%) higher than the same month last year and 1.1 billion baht (0.6%) above the estimate.
 - ❖ Pinsai Surasawadee, Director-General of the Revenue Department, highlighted that VAT from domestic consumption remains a major driver, with collections up 7.6% from last year. The department has also signed Advance Pricing Arrangements with foreign tax authorities to ensure fair corporate tax revenue from cross-border transactions.
 - ❖ As of April 3, 2028, 11.1 million individual tax returns have been filed, with 4.4 million refund requests (39%). The department has processed 83% of refunds and is working to expedite the remaining cases.

- Asian Development Bank (ADB) has published its Thailand outlook in 2025 with an increase in GDP forecast this year to reach 2.8%, a slight uptick from its earlier expectation of 2.7%. The Thai economy is projected to maintain its growth momentum, with a GDP expansion of 2.8% in 2025 and 2.9% in 2026. Tourism will remain the primary driver of this economic growth, with tourist arrivals expected to rise to 39.5 million in 2025 and 41 million in 2026.
 - ❖ This growth in tourism will be supported by visa-free schemes, rising demand, expanded airline routes, and increased flight frequencies. However, private consumption is expected to slow to 2.7% in 2025 due to high household debt burdens.
 - ❖ Despite the positive outlook, risks are tilted to the downside, primarily due to uncertainty surrounding new U.S. trade policies that could affect merchandise exports and foreign direct investment. Persistently high household debt, which remains above the critical 80% level, and the slow income recovery among vulnerable populations could also challenge private consumption and investment.
- The Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index closed yesterday at 1,088.18 points, up 13.59 points or 1.26%, with a trading value of 50.88 billion baht. The index moved in a volatile range, dropping in the morning but rebounding in the afternoon.



- ❖ Buying returned to large-cap stocks after prices had dropped significantly, making their valuations more attractive. This helped lift the SET index, which moved in the opposite direction to most Asian markets that declined. The trade war remains a key factor causing market volatility, as investors are still concerned and closely

watching trade talks between countries and the United States, especially with China.

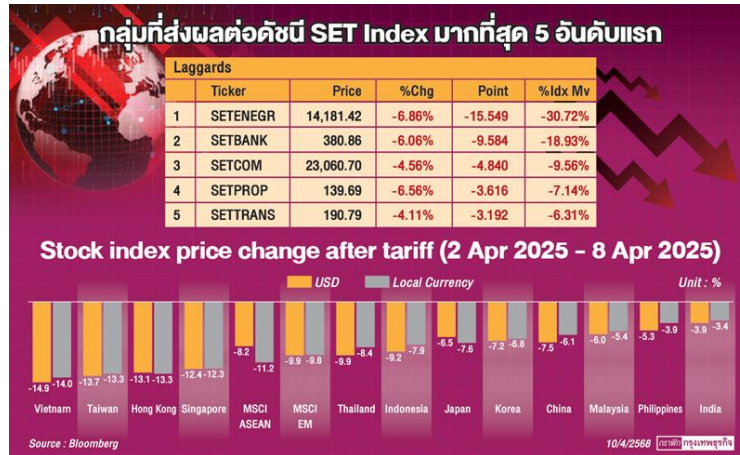
- ❖ The most actively traded stock was GULF, which closed at 42.25 baht, up 2.25 baht or 5.63%, with a trading value of 3.8 billion baht. This followed reports that Sarath Ratanavadi, CEO and major shareholder of GULF, spent 1.6 billion baht to buy 35.5 million GULF shares on the market to show confidence in the company's growth and future.

- Assadet Kongsiri, Director and Manager of the Stock Exchange of Thailand, revealed that the analysis team has estimated that profits from listed companies directly linked to exports to the U.S. market account for only 2% of the total revenue of all listed companies.
 - ❖ Earlier, the SET stated that the total sales of listed companies on both the SET and mai in 2024 amounted to 18 trillion baht. Therefore, exports to the U.S. market represent about 2% of total revenue, or around 360 billion baht.
 - ❖ Regarding the temporary trading control measures, which are in effect until April 11, 2025, the SET will need more time to analyze the data before deciding whether to extend the measures, make them stricter, or ease some rules, such as for example, adjusting the ceiling & floor limits back to the original 30%.



- Yesterday, there were two big lot transactions of Bangchak Corporation Plc (BCP) shares, totaling 84.30 million shares, with a combined value of 3.12 billion baht. The average price was 37 baht per share, which was higher than the market price. BCP shares closed at 36.25 baht, up 2.50 baht or 7.41%, with a trading value of 3.29 billion baht.
 - According to reports, there is a possibility that Alpha Chartered Energy Co., Ltd. was the buyer in these big lot transactions. The company had previously increased its holdings in BCP, including a big lot purchase on March 19, 2025, of 62.90 million shares, or 4.56%.
 - Before that, Alpha held 35.44 million shares, or 2.57%, bringing the total to 98.34 million shares or 7.14%. On March 31, the company bought another 43.38 million shares, or 3.15%, increasing its total to 161.05 million shares, or 11.69%.
 - If yesterday's big lot was also purchased by Alpha Chartered Energy, it would raise its total holding to 245 million shares, making it the second-largest shareholder of BCP.
- The Minburi Civil Court has issued a temporary injunction ordering Nestlé to stop producing, outsourcing, selling, or importing instant coffee products under the Nescafé trademark in Thailand. As a result, Nestlé is currently unable to take orders for Nescafé products from retailers.
 - This follows a lawsuit filed by Chalermchai Mahagitsiri, one of the shareholders of Quality Coffee Products Co., Ltd. (QCP).
 - In response, Nestlé issued a statement saying it had already terminated its licensing agreement with QCP in 2021. The decision to end the contract, effective December 31, 2024, was supported by an international arbitration ruling.

- ❖ Nestlé plans to file an objection with the Minburi Civil Court and will provide complete information to support its case. The company also noted that the court's order could affect small businesses, such as cafés and street coffee vendors, who may no longer have access to Nescafé products.



Political News

- Bhumjaithai MP for Buriram, Chaichanok Chidchob — son of the party's de facto leader Newin Chidchob — told parliament he does not support the bill to legalise casinos within entertainment complexes.
 - ❖ Meanwhile Party leader Anutin Charnvirakul clarified that this was Chaichanok's personal opinion and does not represent the party's official stance. He said Chaichanok, as an MP, has the right to voice his views during debate. However, as a party member and secretary-general, he is expected to follow the party's resolution.
 - ❖ Anutin reaffirmed that the Bhumjaithai Party, as a whole, supports the bill, which is expected to be tabled in the next parliamentary session.



- Chusak Sirinil, Minister attached to the Prime Minister’s Office and deputy leader of the Pheu Thai Party, said that everyone has the right to express their opinion.
 - ❖ When asked whether a public referendum will be held, he said the proposal would have to go to the Cabinet, as it would require a budget of over 3 billion baht. As for whether the referendum would be held for the proposed constitutional amendment at the same time, he said that it will be decided later.
 - ❖ He emphasized that when the government announced its policies to Parliament, it was done as a coalition government. The policy is not owned by any one party.

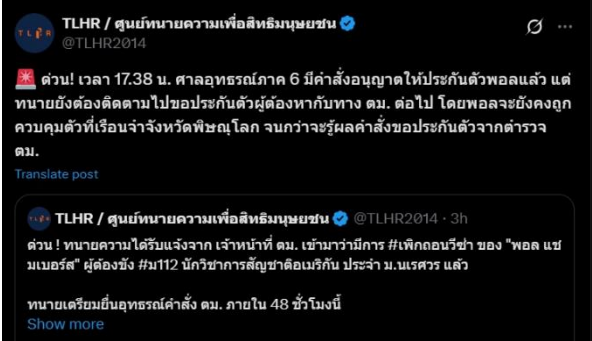


- The Constitutional Court has agreed, by 5:3 votes, to consider a motion for the court to rule on the duties and authorities of parliament in amending the country’s Constitution, in accordance with Section 210.
 - ❖ The urgent motion was jointly proposed to parliament by Senator Premsak Piayura and Pheu Thai MP Wisut Chainaroon on March 17th.
 - ❖ Parliament accepted the motion and submitted it to the Constitutional Court on March 21st. Responding to the request on April 2nd, the court instructed the two lawmakers to submit minutes of the parliamentary meeting and to discuss the matter to the court within 15 days.
- The Constitutional Court has accepted a revised petition seeking a ruling on whether Deputy Prime Minister and Defense Minister Phumtham Wechayachai and Justice Minister Tawee Sodsong should be removed from office over alleged ethical misconduct in the June 2024 Senate election vote-fixing investigation. However, the court found no grounds to suspend them from office at this time.

- ❖ The petition, filed by Senator Pol Maj Gen Chatrawat Saengphet and 91 other senators, accuses Phumtham and Tawee of using their positions on the Department of Special Investigation's Board of Special Cases to interfere in the election process, undermining the Election Commission and pressuring Senate members.
- The Constitutional Court also has rejected a petition against the Election Commission (EC) over alleged mismanagement of the 2024 Senate election. The petition, filed by Nathaporn Toprayoon, a former adviser to the Ombudsman, claimed that the EC violated the complainants' rights by organizing an unfair election that did not comply with the law, affecting public order.
 - ❖ After reviewing the case, the court ruled that the complainants were not directly affected by the EC's actions. It stated that the EC acted within its legal authority, and any rights violations could be pursued through other legal channels. As a result, the petition was unanimously rejected.
- Paul Chambers, an American academic at Naresuan University who has been accused of royal defamation by the 3rd Army Region, has been released from pretrial detention. He was previously granted bail by the Appeals Court Region 6 in connection with charges under Section 112 of the Criminal Code (lèse-majesté) and the Computer Crime Act.



- ❖ He has now been granted temporary release from immigration detention. His lawyer is scheduled to appeal the Immigration Bureau's decision to revoke his visa today.
- ❖ Human Rights Watch has called for the immediate release of Paul Chambers. The organization also highlighted the growing number of lese-majeste prosecutions in Thailand, where at least 272 people have been prosecuted in recent years for insulting the monarchy. Many of those arrested, including those for writing or reposting content online, have been detained without access to bail. Human Rights Watch warned that the increased use of lese-majeste laws stifles free expression and puts pressure on authorities to avoid questioning such charges.



Earthquake Tragedy

- Wednesday marked the 13th day of the search operation following the collapse of the under-construction building in Chatuchak district during the March 28 earthquake in Myanmar. The latest death toll stood at 22.
 - ❖ One major development was the arrival of a crane with the ability to lift a weight of up to 1,000 tonnes, which will help move large debris obstructing rescue efforts. This crane, along with the country's largest backhoe, is expected to significantly increase the speed and effectiveness of the search.
 - ❖ According to the Royal Thai Police, the Institute of Forensic Medicine at Police General Hospital has received the 22 bodies and a number of body parts. 18 of the bodies have been identified, and 14 have been returned to their families.



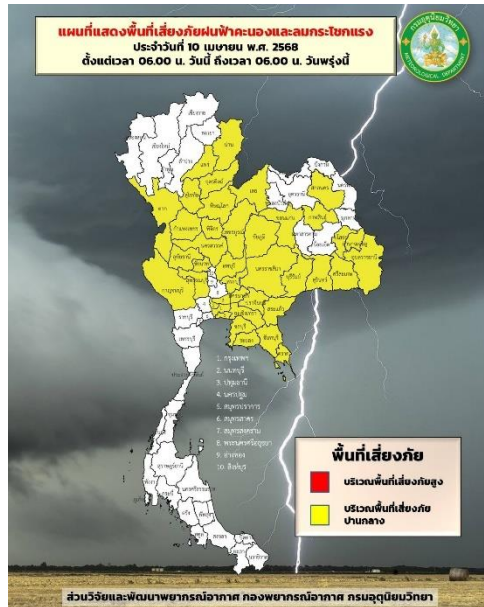
- Today at 1:00 PM, a religious ceremony and prayer will be held to dedicate merit to those who lost their lives, those who were injured, and the survivors. The ceremony also aims to boost the morale of all involved officials and to pray for a safe recovery of those still trapped inside.

- ❖ Somdet Thongchai, Assistant Abbot of Wat Traimitr Withayaram, will lead the ceremony.

- The Meteorological Department forecasts that most parts of upper Thailand will be generally hot today, with some areas in the North experiencing extreme heat. Thunderstorms and strong winds are still expected in 52 provinces. From April 12 to 14, people are advised to watch out for a summer storm that may affect upper Thailand.

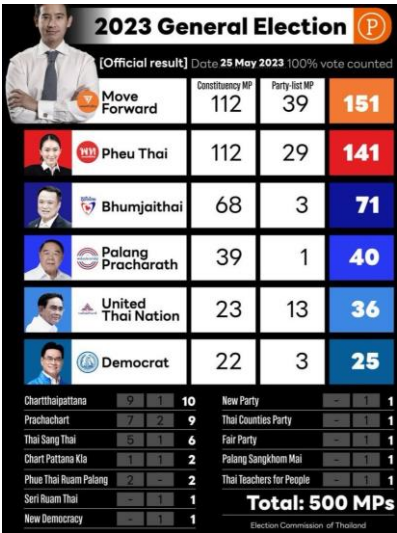
