#### Thai Enquirer News Summary

#### **Economic News**

- Global markets continued their downward trajectory amid ongoing 'Trade War' between the world's largest and 2<sup>nd</sup> largest economy (USA & China).
  - ❖ Market volatility continued all across Asia this morning after both

- US President Donald Trump's 90-day pause on the tariff hike gives countries more time to prepare for trade talks, and negotiating as an ASEAN bloc is also an option, said Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra.
  - ❖ She said the pause applies to most countries, and it's just a matter of time before each one gets a turn to talk. The government is already looking at all aspects of the negotiation, and most of the preparations are done what remains is finding the right time to begin talks. A specific date has not been set yet.
  - ❖ Asked whether talks as part of ASEAN would be more effective, the Prime Minister said all options are being considered. If joining with ASEAN makes a stronger impact, that would be a good thing, but Thailand also needs to do its part on its own.



- The International Monetary Fund (IMF) is urging Thailand to strengthen household financial security to mitigate the country's persistently high household debt.
  - ❖ In its Country Focus report published on April 9, the IMF said more than half of Thai workers are not formally employed, which deprives them of job security and social protection. This leaves Thai households vulnerable to economic shocks and income disruptions, often needing to borrow to cover their basic living expenses.
  - ❖ Even though Thailand's household debt-to-GDP ratio declined to 89% from its peak level during the pandemic, the ratio remains historically high. The IMF advises household debt policies strike a balance between reducing household burdens and maintaining economic stability.
- Deputy Prime Minister and Finance Minister Pichai Chunhavajira said the Stock Exchange of Thailand's temporary measures, which reduced the ceiling and floor limits for SET, mai, and TFEX stocks from 30% to 15% and temporarily banned short selling, will be in place only until April 11.
  - ❖ Although the Thai stock market dropped significantly, along with global markets due to the U.S. tariff measures, Thailand was one of the first countries in the region

- to see its index bounce back into positive territory yesterday, showing that the country was well-prepared.
- ❖ Meanwhile, many brokers have suggested that the SET extend the temporary trading control measures, as they have had a positive impact on the market over the past three days.
- Pichai also said he has approached Sathit Limpongpan, former Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Finance, to serve as chairman of the selection committee for the next Governor of the Bank of Thailand (BoT), replacing Sethaput Suthiwartnarueput, whose term ends in September 2025. He expects to receive a response from Sathit soon.
  - ❖ As for the proposal to appoint Somchai Sujjapongse, also a former Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Finance, as the new chairman of the BoT board, more details will need to be prepared before presenting the nomination to the Cabinet for approval. A preliminary review of his qualifications found no issues, Pichai said.



• The Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index closed yesterday at 1,133.95 points, up by 45.77 points or +4.21%, with a trading value of 50.22 billion Baht. The index jumped nearly 50 points in one day, following global markets.



- ❖ This came after U.S. President Donald Trump announced a 90-day delay in reciprocal tariffs on several countries, except China, and reduced tariffs to just 10% for countries that do not retaliate. As a result, regional markets rose around 5%, while the Thai stock market increased by about 4.2%.
- ❖ Stocks that may benefit from expectations that Thailand will negotiate to import more goods from the U.S. include PTTGC, which may import ethane to help lower production costs; CPF, which could benefit from importing corn to reduce animal feed costs; and BANPU, which may import gas to support its U.S.-based company, BKV.



❖ Today, the SET index is expected to move in a sideway-up trend, with support at 1,130 points and resistance at 1,175 points.



- The Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) reported that Alpha Chartered Energy Co., Ltd. purchased shares of Bangchak Corporation Plc (BCP) on April 9.
  - ❖ The transaction involved 84.45 million shares, equal to 6.13% of the company's total voting rights. The shares were bought through InnovestX Securities and Maybank Securities Pte. Ltd., while a big lot transaction came from Capital Asia Investments Pte. Ltd.
  - ❖ This brought Alpha Chartered Energy's total shareholding to 275 million shares, or 20.00%, making it the largest shareholder, up from 191 million shares, or 13.87%.

- ❖ Yesterday, BCP shares closed at 36.25 Baht, unchanged from the previous day. During the session, the share price moved between 36.25 and 37.50 Baht, with a trading value of 135.21 million Baht.
- The consumer index of the University of the Thai Chamber of Commerce (UTCC) fell to 56.7 in March from 57.8 in February.
  - ❖ UTCC president Thanavath Phonvichai said that Thai consumer confidence dropped for a second straight month in March to hit its lowest level in five months due to higher living costs, sluggish economic growth and concern over US trade tariffs. It's clear that the fallen confidence index was driven by the trade war, which may cause problems for Thai exports and tourism and slow economic recovery.
  - ❖ Thailand is among the countries in Southeast Asian nations hardest hit by US President Donald Trump's measures, with a much bigger than expected 36% tariff. However, a 90-day pause on the US tariffs announced overnight will give officials more time to prepare a response. If Thailand could negotiate to bring the tariffs down to 10%, the damage could be around 100 billion Baht to 150 billion Baht (US\$2.93 billion to \$4.40 billion), lowering growth by 0.7-0.9 percentage points.

- The Department of Labor Protection and Welfare (DLPW) reminded employers that April 13-15 is a traditional Songkran holiday. If employees are required to work on these days, their holidays should be rescheduled.
  - ❖ Most businesses have declared these dates as holidays under the Labor Protection Act of 1998, allowing employees to visit family and participate in traditional activities.
  - ❖ This comes amid reports that some Chinese-run factories in Chonburi and Rayong are requiring overtime during Songkran, with supervisors instructed to assign overtime. Reportedly, employees who refuse will receive a warning and a sevenday suspension.





#### **Political News**

- Political Earthquake on the last day of the parliamentary session.
  - Comments made Chaichanok Chidchob Bhumjai Thai's secretary-general and son of the party's de facto leader Newin Chidchob opposing the bill to legalize casinos within entertainment complexes do not affect the relationship between Bhumjai Thai and the ruling Pheu Thai Party, said Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra.
    - ❖ She said she understood that it was Chaichanok's personal opinion and, as an MP, he has the right to express it in parliament. She added that it was up to Bhumjai Thai to resolve any internal disagreements.
    - ❖ Bhumjai Thai leader Anutin Charnvirakul said Chaichanok's views did not reflect the party's official stance and confirmed the party still supports the bill. He said that as a party member and secretary-general, Chaichanok is expected to follow the party's resolution.
    - Regarding concerns about communication within the coalition with some parties still not on the same page about the bill, raising doubts about how the public can understand the government's position the Prime Minister said she accepted the point and would address it by holding more discussions with coalition leaders.



- Adisorn Piengkes, party-list MP from the Pheu Thai Party, stated on his personal Facebook that if coalition partners cannot work together, they should leave the government.
  - ❖ He said that Pheu Thai supports the Bhumjai Thai Party in being part of the coalition government, having been given the Interior Ministry and the Ministry of Education.
  - ❖ He asked, "Honestly, do you not want to be in the government anymore? If you don't want to, just give the position back. As a member of the coalition, Pheu Thai has feelings too. You can't just insult us like this."



• Fireworks (word) in the parliament

An MP of People's Party was escorted out of the parliament yesterday after the speaker of the house could not take his arguments anymore.

Yesterday, the House of Representatives held a meeting chaired by First Deputy House Speaker Pichet Chuamuangphan. During a live verbal question session, Bangkok MP Nattacha Boonchaiinsawat from the People's Party protested against Pichet, after his question regarding the blackchin tilapia issue was postponed until the last day of the session, while all questions from coalition MPs were addressed.

❖ Pichet tried to calm the situation, explaining that Deputy Agriculture Minister Akara Prompao had to leave the meeting soon due to other duties. This caused objections from Natthacha and other members, leading to a heated exchange. Pichet eventually asked officials to escort Natthacha out to calm down, though the argument continued for a while.

❖ Finally, Akara stood up to explain that the Prime Minister had approved a 98-million-Baht budget, and the Department of Fisheries already had a plan to solve the blackchin tilapia problem. Pichet then quickly moved the meeting forward to the next agenda item.



- The Criminal Court for Corruption and Misconduct Region 9 sentenced Kij Leekpai, former Mayor of Trang Provincial Administrative Organization, for his involvement in corruption regarding the lease of the Na Kluai Pier for maritime operations.
  - ❖ After considering the case, the court found the defendant guilty, sentencing him to 5 years in prison and a fine of 120,000 Baht. However, due to the defendant's testimony, his sentence was reduced by one-third, resulting in a 3-year and 4-month prison sentence, along with a 68,000 Baht fine. The prison sentence is suspended for 2 years.
  - ❖ Kij Leekpai, 89 years old, is the older brother of Chuan Leekpai, former Speaker of the House of Representatives and former Prime Minister.



- Yesterday at the Five Provinces Bordering Forest Preservation Foundation, Gen Prawit Wongsuwan, party-list MP and leader of the Palang Pracharath Party, held a Buddhist merit-making ceremony for Songkran.
  - A Party executives, MPs, and members joined the event and took part in the traditional water-pouring ritual to ask for blessings in a lively atmosphere.





### Earthquake Tragedy

• In a bizarre explanation, the State Audit Office (SAO) claimed it was unaware that China Railway No. 10 Engineering Group was involved in the construction of its collapsed building, despite the contract being awarded to the ITD-CREC joint venture, which includes Italian-Thai Development and the Chinese firm.



- ❖ Deputy Auditor General Sutthiphong Boonnithi said all procedures followed legal requirements. The SAO invited 24 firms to submit design proposals; only three responded. Forum Architect and Meinhardt (Thailand) scored highest, leading to a 73-million-Baht design contract.
- Nineteen firms were then invited to bid for the project management role, with five submitting proposals. For construction, 16 firms joined the bidding process. ITD-CREC won, with no evidence of collusion. He insisted the SAO had no knowledge of the Chinese company's role, as ITD had always represented the joint venture.
- In a meeting with the Committee on Budgeting Study and Budget Administration, Deputy Auditor General Sutthiphong Boonnithi continued to claim that all materials used in the construction of the building met the required standards during inspections.
  - Sutthiphong said the building, classified as a high-rise structure under the Building Control Act, required professional design services. The SAO hired Forum Architect and Meinhardt (Thailand) for a budget of 73 million Baht. The ITD-CRCC

Consortium (comprising Italian-Thai Development and China Railway No. 10) won the bidding, with the contract signed on September 23, 2020. The total contract value was 2.56 billion Baht, later reduced to 2.14 billion Baht after adjustments. The construction was slated to take three years, with 36 work phases.

- Regarding the use of luxury materials, Sutthiphong said that the design was intended to reflect the high-level status of SAO officials and their administrative needs. He said that future projects would aim for cost reductions if current expenses were deemed high. The STRONG Association Against Corruption found that before the collapse, the office had planned to spend 97,900 Baht on an office chair, 90,000 Baht on a dining table, 165,000 Baht on a sofa, and 165,000 Baht on a carpet for the building.
- ❖ On the matter of cement and steel quality, Sutthiphong said the contriution used certified materials, including TIS-compliant steel. He noted that structural adjustments and tests were conducted according to standards, ensuring all materials met the required specifications.
- The Facebook page "LIRT: Legislative Information Resources of Thailand" (<a href="https://www.facebook.com/LIRT20">https://www.facebook.com/LIRT20</a>), managed by the Secretariat of the House of Representatives, has revealed the salaries and benefits of the State Audit Commission (SAC).
  - ❖ The SAC Chairman receives a monthly salary of 83,090 Baht and a position allowance of over 55,000 Baht. The Auditor General and the six other commissioners each receive a salary of 81,920 Baht and a position allowance of 50,000 Baht. The Chairman is allowed to have two advisors, while each commissioner and the Auditor General can have one advisor.
  - ❖ In addition, there are several benefits. The Chairman and Auditor General receive a daily allowance of 3,100 Baht, a clothing allowance of 9,000 Baht, and first-class travel privileges. They also receive health insurance coverage of 40,000 Baht per year.
  - ❖ As for the question of why the Office of the Auditor General (OAG) needs a new 30-story building, LIRT explained that the OAG currently has 3,209 staff members and 782 temporary employees, with 1,584 based at the headquarters.





#### **General News**

- The 20-Baht flat fare for electric trains will be implemented across all 8 lines, but only for Thai citizens in the initial phase, Transport Minister Suriya Juangroongruangkit said.
  - ❖ The implementation for all eight lines in Bangkok and surrounding areas is expected to start on September 30. The lines include the Red, Purple, Green, Gold, Yellow, Pink, Blue, and Airport Rail Link.
  - ❖ In the initial phase, only Thai citizens with a 13-digit ID can access the flat fare, which will require registration through the "Tang Rath" app in August. Passengers can use existing cards but must register them via the app to qualify for the 20-Baht fare. The system will cover all routes and interchanges, with payment made through cards like MRT Plus, EMV, or Rabbit cards.
